- THE LABOR FORCE DECREASED BY 1,661 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS DECREASED BY 3,311 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 1,650 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- INDIVIDUALS WHO FILED FOR UNEMPLOYMENT INCREASED BY 307 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE TOP THREE UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMANT OCCUPATIONS WERE OFFICE AND ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT, SALES &

- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 800 NONFARM JOBS FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH



The three Super Sectors with the least employment for the El Paso MSA in May 2023 were:


- 1. Financial Activities















Of the **1,597 total** Borderplex claimants, 28 are from the rural areas reflected on the data provided.















TOP UI CLAIMANTS BY ZIP CODE 5/1 to 5/31















UI CLAIMANTS DEMOGRAPHICS - BORDERPLEX REGION








UI CLAIMANTS DEMOGRAPHICS - BORDERPLEX REGION 5/1 to 5/31






In the Works

From 2016 to 2021, the educational attainment for women has improved overall.

- More women are attaining a degree. In these five years, more women have associate's, bachelor's, and graduate/professional
 degrees. At these educational levels, women have about the same attainment as men.
- However, more women have less than a high school diploma than men. There has been an improvement in getting more educational
 opportunities to women, but there is still some work to do.
