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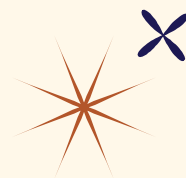

Kawennáhere Devery Jacobs is an award-winning actor, filmmaker and one of Hollywood's most exciting rising stars. As a socially conscious voice from Kahnawà:ke Mohawk Territory, they use their platform to advocate for Indigenous and LGBTQ2S+ rights.

Best known for starring as one of the leads in the Emmy®-nominated series *RESERVATION DOGS*, Jacobs earned a Gotham Award and back-to-back Critics' Choice Award nominations. She also wrote and directed on the series, penning two of the most acclaimed episodes.

Recently, Jacobs wrapped production on the highly anticipated comedy film *OH. WHAT. FUN.* for Amazon MGM.

Her producorial feature debut, *BACKSPOT*, which is also executive produced by Elliot Page and directed by D.W. Waterson, premiered at TIFF and SXSW. The film achieved "Certified Fresh" status on Rotten Tomatoes,

Jacobs is currently writing her debut feature film *HIGH STEEL*, which was selected as part of the 2025 Sundance Directors Lab.

Skilled Trades (Construction & Carpentry, Electrical, Plumbing, Welding)

With ongoing housing, infrastructure, and community development projects, tradespeople are consistently needed. Carpentry programs in Kahnawà:ke show the demand is already recognized locally.

2



Health & Social Services (Nurses, PSWs, Social Workers, Mental Health Specialists)

There is a growing need for both clinical and community-based health professionals, especially in elder care, mental health, and addictions support. The Kateri Memorial Hospital Centre and local service organizations face workforce shortages.

Early Childhood Educators & Teachers

With a young population and strong emphasis on Kanien'kéha language and culture, there's demand for educators, particularly in immersion and culturally rooted programs.

Information Technology (IT Support, Cybersecurity, Digital Media)

As organizations, businesses, and governance in Kahnawà:ke digitize operations, skilled IT professionals are increasingly needed. There's also growing opportunity in digital entrepreneurship and e-commerce.

Business & Entrepreneurship (Management, Finance, Marketing)

Kahnawà:ke has a strong culture of entrepreneurship (cafés, trades, social enterprises, gaming, e-commerce). Skilled managers, accountants, and marketing professionals are needed to help local businesses grow sustainably.

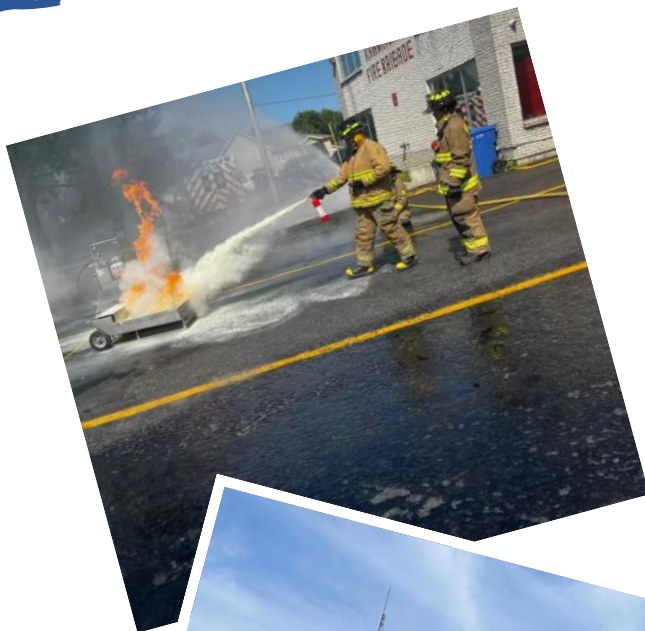


Paramedic

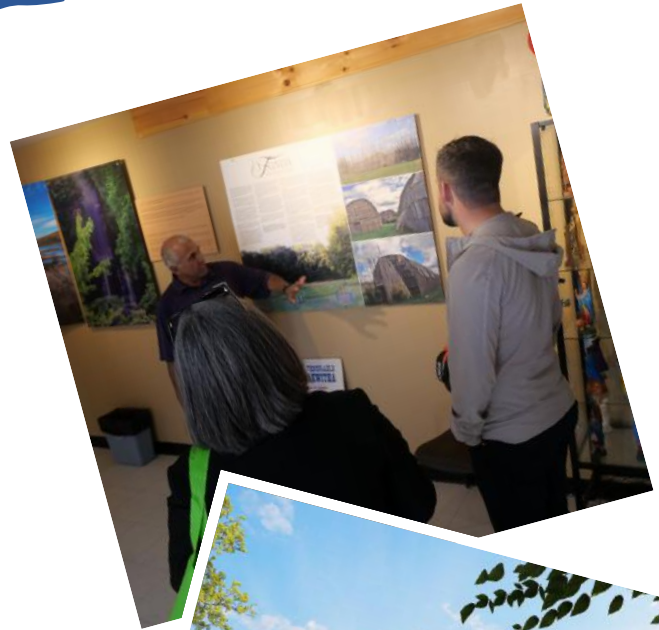

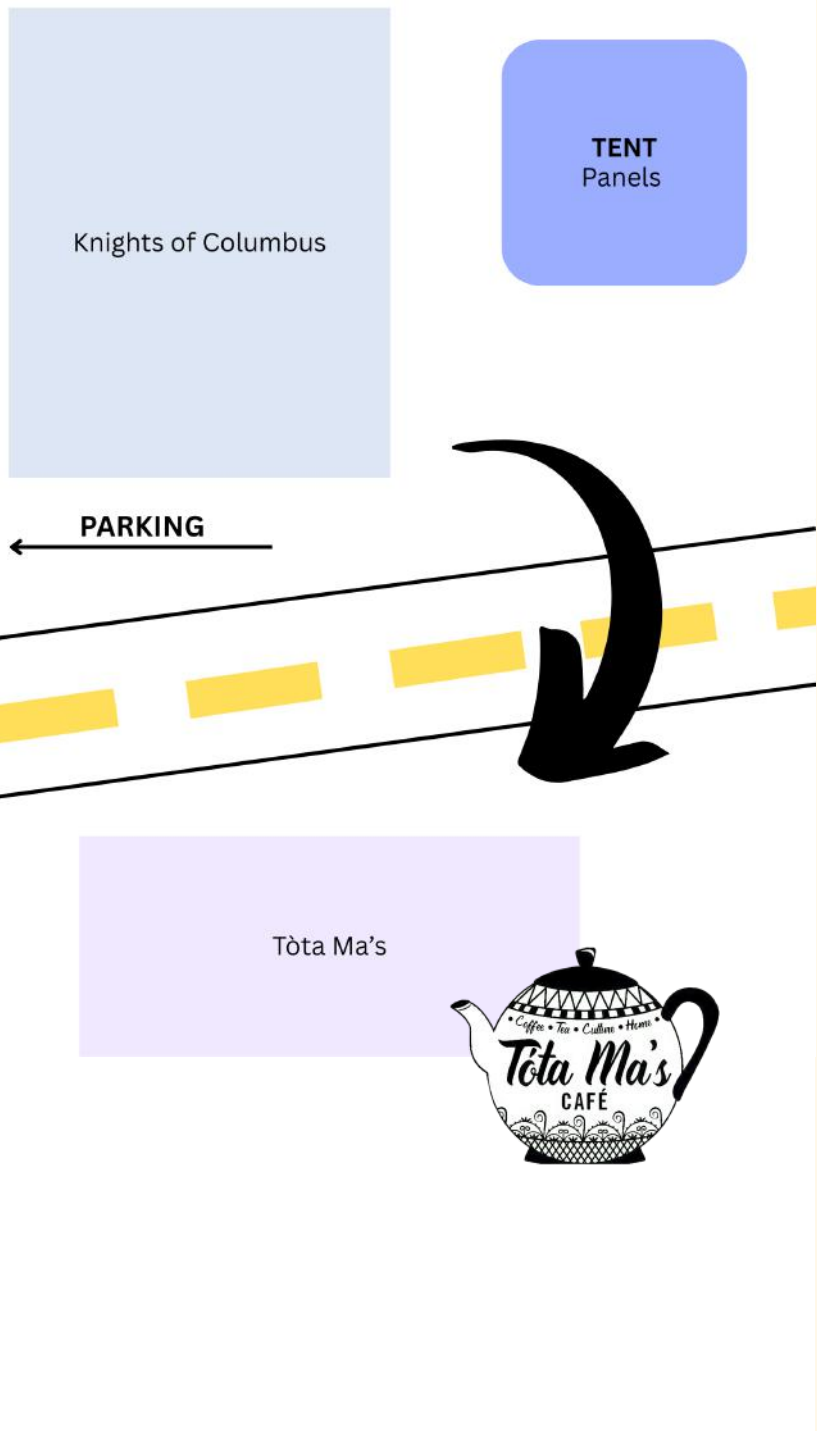
