

#### THE BORDERPLEX REGION


- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 869 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH.

The three Super Sectors with the **GREATEST** employment for the El Paso MSA in November 2024 were:


- 1. Trade, Transportation, and Utilities

- 3. Information


These three Super Sectors represented 9% of the total nonfarm employment.



#### **EMPLOYMENT in November 2024**
















#### Industries Sectors that lost jobs






#### ACTIVE UI CLAIMANTS BY WEEK BORDERPLEX REGION 11/1 to 11/30







#### Women's earnings as a percentage of men's earnings




In both El Paso County and Texas, women's earnings are consistently below men's earnings in every occupational category, highlighting a persistent gender pay gap.

The gender pay gap is particularly large in production, transportation, and material moving occupations, where women earn less than 65% of men's earnings. Even in healthcare practitioners and technical occupations, where the gap is smallest, women still earn less than men, with earnings reaching only about 85% of men's.

WSB addresses the gender equity and wage gap by providing new initiatives tailored to assist women in succeeding in the workforce. We offer resources such as childcare, training assistance and job search assistance, among others.
