### 1st Semester Reflections



s the conclusion of my first semester as your H-F principal quickly approaches, I have taken time to reflect on the excitement of academic excellence, growing school spirit, a sense of collective belonging and many firsts for myself. I believe in our collective ability

to leverage our expertise to influence, inspire and empower our students to be the best version of themselves. This first semester has proven that to me time and again! Here are my top four reflections so far.

**#1. Academic Excellence:** Despite the pandemic, we have reconnected with our students while engaging them in rigorous coursework. In the academic excellence category, we celebrate seniors **Fatima Hernandez** and **Faye Wettstein** as National Merit Commended Scholars, placing them in the top two percentile in the country on the PSAT/NMSQT! And, we have 64 Vikings who qualified as Illinois State Scholar Finalists!

**#2. School Spirit:** Students who love their school and feel connected perform better academically and build important relationships and social skills to be successful in life. This sense of belonging is high as we had the most kids attend Homecoming within the last 20 years with nearly 1,600 students attending the dance. As we look forward to two incentive-based social events encouraging students to consistently arrive to class on time and perform well academically, there is great enthusiasm and commitment from students. These include a freshman-only social and a school-wide evening event.

**#3.** A Sense of Belonging: Coupled with school spirit, high expectations and support create a sense of belonging and reduce disciplinary issues. Compared to the same time frame last school year, major discipline incidents have decreased by 65%. This is a testament to the connections among our students, staff and families!

**#4. Communication:** A major focus for H-F is enhancing communication to assure students, families, staff and community have the information they need and are engaged in our school community. Initial results of the *Your VOICE Matters* survey conducted indicate our students, families and faculty feel like communication is substantially improving. We are putting the finishing touches on a strategic communication plan based on the findings from the survey and focus groups, which will be rolled out in the second semester.

None of these accomplishments would be possible without the continued support and partnership between home, community and school. I am grateful for the support of all who care for our students as they build the core competencies of our **Profile of a Viking!** Go, Vikings!

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# **H-F UNIFED PROGRAM**

## 2X National Banner Champion School

Because of its commitment to inclusion, H-F was renamed a National Unified Champion School by Special Olympics this fall. H-F is one of only two schools in the state of Illinois to receive this status.

Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools is a program for preschools through universities that intentionally promotes meaningful social inclusion



by bringing together students with and without intellectual disabilities to create accept-

ing school environments, utilizing three interconnected components: Special Olympics Unified Sports, inclusive youth leadership and wholeschool engagement.

H-F was first named a Champion School during the 2018-19 school year. The school's status was recently renewed as H-F has maintained its commitment to inclusion and for consistently meeting the 10 standards of inclusion, set forth by Special Olympics North America.

The Unified program at H-F includes four competitive sports — Unified Soccer, Unified eSports Unified Basketball and Unified Track & Field — and a physical education course: Unified PE. The program is led by Katie Rice, instructional assistant; Gail Smith, director of Activities; Dr. Angela Taylor, director of Special Education; and David Dore, Special Education department chair.

## **Unified Soccer: 2022-23 State Champions**



n Nov. 5, H-F celebrated its first **Special Olympics Unified Soccer State Championship**, then quickly celebrated its second! Both the **H-F Red Unified Soccer** and the **White Unified Soccer** teams finished in

1st Place in their divisions at the state tournament, held in Schaumburg.

The White team defeated Andrew High School 3-2, then faced Hoffman Estates High School for the final game, besting them 4-3. In another set of close matches, the Red team beat Matea Valley High School 5-4, then topped

Neuqua Valley High School in the final 3-2. The teams were led back to campus with an escort by Flossmoor's police and fire departments and greeted by a cheering crowd at the North Building.



## A Safe & Supportive Learning Environment



providing a school environment where students and staff feel safe to learn, to take academic risks, and to feel supported by their teachers and peers is paramount to success at Homewood-Flossmoor High School. It's a responsibility that H-F leaders take very seriously.

Over the summer, an internal safety audit was conducted that led to the enhancement of a number of safety protocols for the 2022-23 school year including:

- the addition of two Deans' Assistants to be present in hallways;
- an increase in pay for Police Liaison officers to remain competitive in attracting and retaining these important safety staff members;
- analysis of the physical plant, including the placement of security cameras; and
- the review of safety procedures resulting in a revised visitor's protocol, requiring a single-entry point procedure for visitors at the South Building.

H-F has strong relationships with local law enforcement. Working together, both the school and local police departments regularly review the school's safety plan, which includes implementing required safety drills and debriefing after security exercises.

In addition to the physical safety of the school environment, H-F is committed to the psychological safety of our students and staff. Social workers, school counselors and school psychologists work closely with students, staff and families to assure the behavioral health needs of students are tended to. The newly


implemented **H-F Resiliency Project** focuses on proactive intervention to identify and address students' at-risk indicators before they become severe problems, while also increasing their protective factors.

In addition to covering the standard social- and emotional-learning indicators, the **Terrace Metrics** tool that H-F uses also measures risk factors (i.e. depression, anxiety, victimization, ostracism) and protective factors (i.e. resiliency, grit, hope). Measuring both is critical: reducing even one risk indicator can improve academic performance by 20%; strengthening one protective factor can cut those risks by half.

Through this year's *Viking Compass* advisory periods, social workers administer the Terrace Metrics assessment for each of our nearly 3,000 students. From that assessment, a report is generated that shows how the students are doing in each of the protective and risk factors. Tiered services and lessons are then implemented to meet the unique needs of each student.

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Tier 1 interventions involve focused lessons in Viking Compass class to address indicators that appear on the reports of the majority of students in the class, as well as schoolwide focus on specific topics that are universal. Each parent also receives the report for their child, along with a library of videos and articles to help the parent understand and work with their child to address the indicators. Social workers and school counselors are also available to speak individually with parents to assist them in helping their children.

Tier 2 interventions focus more closely on small groups of students whose reports indicate similar indicators and are organized by school social workers who lead discussions and teach lessons. Individual sessions with social workers and school counselors are also available to assist students.

*Tier 3* interventions — for students who present needs beyond the scope of school resources — are referred to outside behavioral health providers for more acute support.

The H-F Resiliency Project is aimed at improving all students' academic performance and expanding all students' resiliency, positively impacting their personal growth. This team of highly qualified staff has seen the behavioral health needs of our students and has stepped up to make a true difference in their lives through thoughtful, compassionate and researched-based interventions.

## H-F FINANCES BY THE NUMBERS

## 2022-23 Budget

The 2022-23 school district budget is balanced with projected revenue of \$63,495,588 and projected expenditures of \$62,312,909. This represents a slight surplus.





Highlights include instructional enhancements in technology and renovation construction to enhance science, culinary, and fashion design programs as we prepare students for future career paths. Roofing projects, resurfacing of the indoor track, and an increase for contractual purchased services including utilities, transportation, cleaning services, professional development, and field trips are included in the budget.

## **Property Tax Abatement**

H-F has abated property taxes for the past 5 years as part of the state's Property Tax Relief Grant. This grant allows the district to receive additional Evidence-Based Funding from the state while abating taxes to the taxing body.

Since 2018, H-F has abated \$12.1 million, anticipates abating another \$3.8 million and recently applied for another grant that would allow us to abate another \$2.1 million if approved.

Two H-F seniors recognized by National Merit Corp.

Fatima Hernandez and Faye
Wettstein have been named Commended Students in the 2023 National Merit Scholarship Program.
A letter of commendation from the school and National Merit Scholarship Corporation, which conducts the program, were presented to the two H-F seniors in October.

Approximately 34,000 Commended Students across the nation are being recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2023 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students placed among the top 50,000 out of 1.6 million students who entered the 2023 competition by taking the 2021 PSAT/NMSQT last school year.

Both seniors are studying as part of H-F's Class of 2023 International Baccalaureate cohort. Fatima also takes *Project Lead the Way* classes, and Faye also studies AP Art History and Ceramics/Sculpture at H-F.

## — 2019-2024 Strategic Plan Update —

n 2019, the District 233 Strategic Plan was established, utilizing data-based research and community input. As we emerge from the pandemic and transition administrative leadership, we are committed to the beliefs and hopes embedded in the original plan with an eye on the evolving needs of our students, staff and community. Our Strategic Plan is in line with the school district's long history of serving a diverse, vibrant community and its tradition of academic excellence. The updated goals & objectives are below:

### **Goal I: Future Ready**

Students will graduate college-, career- and life-ready.

### **Indicators of Success**

- By the end of the 2023-24 school year, 66% of students will have a minimum 2.8 GPA.
- By the end of the 2023-24 school year, increase the number of students attending 95% of the time from 77.3% to 82%.
- Increase the percentage of students meeting the ISBE ELA indicator by 5% (from 33% to 38%).
- Increase the percentage of students meeting the ISBE Math indicator by 3% (from 95.8% to 98.8%).
- Increase the percentage of students meeting at least three ISBE career indicators by 8% (from 1% to 9%).
- 90% percent of students will complete their freshman year with five full credits and no more than one F in a subject.

**Objective 1:** Implement equity-centered curriculum and instructional programming that prepares students for post-secondary success.

**Objective 2:** Ensure that all students reach their maximum potential and are college- and career-ready for the development of career pathways.



### **Goal 2: Student Supports**

Students will be supported academically, behaviorally and socially-emotionally throughout their high school journey.

### **Indicators of Success**

Academic Intervention Indicator

• 75% of students in academic interventions will accelerate their learning annually.

Behavioral Intervention Indicator

 75% of students in behavioral interventions will show an increase in resiliency indicators and a decrease in risk indicators.

**Objective 1:** Provide a Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) for all students to meet or exceed the expectations of the core curriculum and the H-F College and Career framework.

**Objective 2:** Strengthen the school community through building positive relationships and personal social-emotional competencies.

# Goal 3: Professional Excellence

Students will engage with culturally competent staff in an inclusive learning environment, characterized by innovation, collaboration and high expectations.

### **Indicators of Success**

- The Equity Committee is established, represented by individuals from a diverse set of backgrounds and experiences and meets on a regular basis to focus on the 4 goals of the equity plan.
- Professional learning related to Equity Education is occurring during Institute Days, professional learning communities and summer professional learning.
- Pathways to becoming an educator have been reviewed, and a new process has been developed that includes: (1) formal relationships with university partners for student-teacher placements; (2) development of an educational pathway for high school students; and (3) development of an H-F IA/SS pathway, which supports adult learners through the certification process.

**Objective 1:** Recruit, develop and retain a culturally competent staff to further advance the achievement of all students.

**Objective 2:** Actively recruit to hire a high-quality, diverse faculty that reflects all aspects of the diversity within our community.


# **ALUMNI UPDATE**

## Amazing Alumni Accomplishments

Our H-F alumni have been doing some amazing things!

- Congratulations to **Michael Calloway**, '13, on receiving his First Officers pilots wings from United Airlines. Michael's interest in aviation was evident back in high school, when he was instrumental in inviting members of the Tuskegee Airmen to visit **Jon Elfner**'s Social Science class back in 2011.
- **Kenneth Choi**, '89, has become H-F's first alum to be named a Sexiest Man Alive! He was featured in *People Magazine*'s 2022 Sexiest Man issue this fall, as part of the Fox TV's *9-1-1* cast. Ken who has been a cast member since the show debuted in 2017 portrays firefighter/paramedic Howie "Chimney" Han.
- **Mike Day**, '68, joins the list of H-F alumni authors with the recent publication of his book, *The World Has a Big Backyard*, which is about his travels around the world. Mike retired in 2019 as executive vice president of the Science Museum of Minnesota.
- Former H-F Football Coach & Athletic Director **John Wrenn** will be inducted into the National High School Association Coaches Hall of Fame in July 2023. During his 10 years at H-F, Coach Wrenn had a 99-18 winning record; his 23-year high school coaching career overall record is 223-46!
- Perhaps most notable of all this fall is the Class of 1987's **Michelle Chen**. As an engineer at the Applied Physics Lab at Johns Hopkins U., Michelle led a team of scientists and engineers for the past 10 years to develop the autonomous navigation techniques for NASA's DART Mission, which

successfully tracked and changed the course of an asteroid on Sept. 26. The mission is one of NASA's Planetary Defense Coordination Office's goals to protect Earth from a future asteroid disaster. In media interviews after the successful event, Michelle credited her H-F Calculus teacher, Jack Wayne, with nurturing her inquisitiveness in math and science. Her other past projects include developing electro-mechanical prosthetic limbs and using image processing of X-rays to detect prostate tumor cells and to measure the bone density of astronauts returning from outer space.
