A Message from Principal McKillop



Dear Parents:

As a teacher, and now as an Elementary School Principal, parents frequently ask me what they can do to get their child to read at home?

It is a question that my own mother struggled with when I was a child. Motivating reluctant readers to open a book for their own enjoyment can be a difficult task today, but not an impossible one.

One simple step that you can take to help your child gain a greater interest in reading is to read yourself. By exhibiting to your child that you make time in your busy schedule to read, indicates that you value reading.

Invite your child to read with you or share what you're reading with them. Whether it is a newspaper column, magazine article, or a how-to book, the important thing is that they see your interest.

Reading with your child doesn't have to be you reading to them. Just as they do in school, each of you can read your own book and then share what you've read or learned with each other.

Modeling good reading habits is a valuable technique that can be used at home to motivate your reluctant reader.

Another way to generate interest in reading is to provide your child with a new book or children's magazine. The winter season is an ideal time to pick up a book for your child. (The PTA PARP Program is coming up in February) A book is an excellent gift that will last a lifetime.

After the novelty of a new game from the holidays wears off, and before the weather is warm enough to use that new scooter or bike, books are perfect for wintertime entertainment.

The winter season is a wonderful time to begin or continue reading with your child. So, on your next trip to the library or on your next trip to Target why not pick up a book for your child. And while you're there pick one up for yourself. A book is an excellent gift that will last a lifetime.

I wish the entire East Lake School community a very Happy New Year, one that is filled with health, happiness and plenty of reading.

The East Lake Pta hosted yet another successful picture day in September! Students and teachers were dressed to impress. Thank you to all parent volunteers!



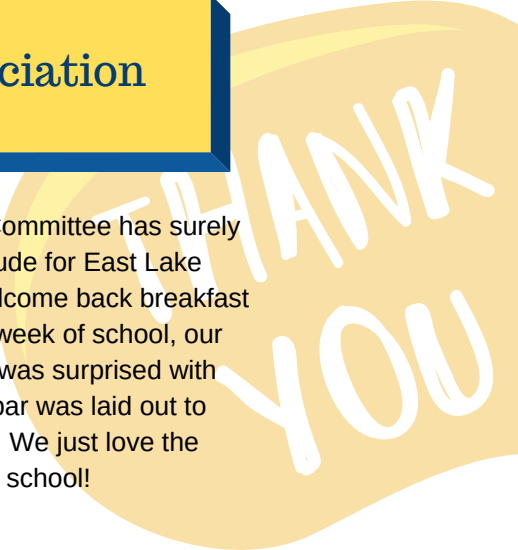

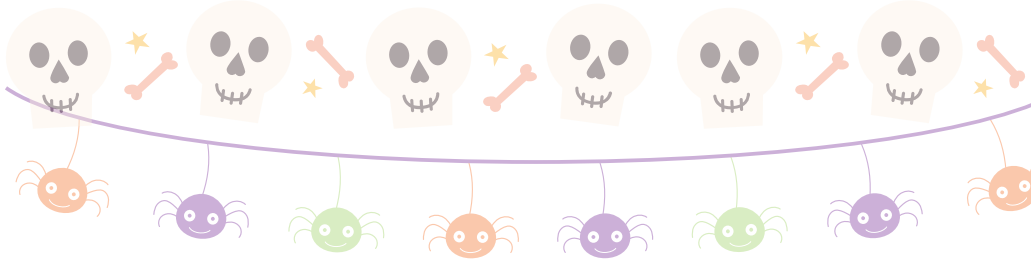

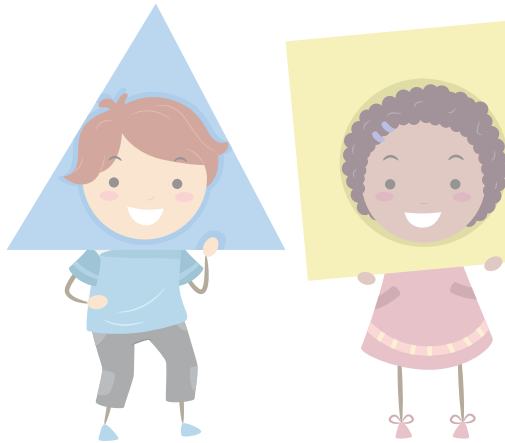
