COURSE & GREENS

WHY BUNKERS DON'T BEHAVE LIKE THE BEACH

The bunker looked innocent enough — until you stepped into it. Suddenly the sand felt different, your confidence disappeared, and the green felt miles away. Sound familiar?

Every golfer has experienced it. One week the bunker plays soft and forgiving, the next it's firm, damp, or unexpectedly compacted. Same bunker, completely different outcome — and no, it's not out to get you.

Unlike beaches, bunkers are carefully engineered playing surfaces. Each one is built with specific sand depths, drainage systems, and shaping to create a fair challenge rather than an unfair penalty. So what changes? Quite a lot.

Rain causes sand to settle and firm up. Dry spells loosen it. Foot traffic compacts certain areas, especially when golfers enter and exit from the same spots or rake sand out of play. Over time, this affects how the bunker plays — sometimes from one day to the next.

Our course maintenance team spends countless early mornings reshaping faces, redistributing sand, and managing drainage to keep bunkers consistent and playable — even if they don't always feel forgiving.

So next time you find yourself staring down a bunker shot and questioning your club choice, remember: it's not bad luck — it's weather, wear, and a few hundred footprints before yours. A proper rake on the way out doesn't just help the next golfer... it might help you next week.

We look forward to next week's fixtures, with the weather forecast not being kind to us at the moment.


