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FACULTY OF PSYCHOLOGY

Faculty of Psychology is one of the faculties in Universitas Gadjah Mada (UGM) located in Sosio Humaniora Street, Bulaksumur, Karang Malang, Caturtunggal, Depok, Sleman. Currently, Faculty of Psychology is chaired by Rahmat Hidayat, S.Psi., M.Sc., Ph.D. as the Dean alongside Galang Lufityanto, M.Psi., Ph.D., Psikolog (Vice Dean for Academic and Student Affairs), Dr. Sumaryono, M.Si., Psikolog (Vice Dean for Finance, Human Resource, and Assets), and Dr. Wenty Marina Minza, M.A. (Vice Dean for Research, Community Service, and Partnership).

There are four program studies offered by UGM's Faculty of Psychology, which are Sarjana Psikologi (consits of the Regular Undergraduate Program in Psychology and the International Undergraduate Program), Magister Psikologi Profesi (Master of Professional Psychology Program), Magister Psikologi (Master of Arts in Psychology), and Doctoral Program in Psychology.

1. Sarjana Psikologi (Undergraduate Program)

The Undergraduate Program in Psychology consists of the Regular Undergraduate Program and the International Undergraduate Program. Indrayanti, M.Si., Ph.D., Psikolog mainly manages the program. All courses in this program are delivered in Indonesian, and these consist of mandatory to elective courses. Each year there are around 292 new students admitted to this program through several pathways that comprise SNMPTN, SBMPTN, UM UGM, UMPI, and PBU. The majority of students in this undergraduate program are Indonesians. The administration office for the regular undergraduate program can be found in Building A on the first floor.

The International Undergraduate Program (IUP) was established in 2016 to facilitate the internationalization effort of our faculty and UGM in general. Since 2021, Elga Andriana, S.Psi., M.Ed., Ph.D. has been leading this program. To be admitted to this program, applicants are required to undertake entry tests comprising Gadjah Mada Scholastic Test (GMST) (\geq 450), AcEPT (Academic English Proficiency Test)(\geq 268), Essay Writing, and Interviews. All IUP classes are delivered in English.

2. Master of Professional Psychology Program

This master's program is a structured professional education in psychology with PKPP or professional work practice, thesis writing, and a thesis defense as part of its curricula. Chaired by Dr. Yuli Fajar Susetyo, S.Psi., M.Si., Psikolog, this program has three main majors; clinical psychology, industrial and organizational psychology, and educational psychology. Graduates from this program are awarded the title of *Magister Psikologi/M.Psi*. (Master of Psychology) and are certified psychologists (*psikolog*) by HIMPSI (Indonesian Psychological Association).



2 Center for Indigenous and Cultural Psychology (CICP)

2 Center for Public Mental Health (CPMH)

LIFE AS AN EXCHANGE STUDENT AT THE FACULTY OF PSYCHOLOGY

Starting your journey as an exchange student at the Faculty of Psychology can be challenging. Below are some ideas to help you cope with the challenges of student life, and hopefully, they will ease your process of adaptation during your study here.

1 Don't hesitate to ask your classmates

As a member of the class, don't hesitate to ask your friends for help because they will be more than happy to help you. Saving the contact number of your class representative would be very helpful to catch up with anything related to class activities such as class rescheduling, etc.

2 Take a Bahasa Indonesia course

One of our alumni suggests that exchange students should take a Bahasa Indonesia course at UGM's Faculty of Cultural Sciences. This course is helpful to increase your understanding of the language as some lecturers spontaneously use Indonesian words or terms in class.

3 Understand the course and class system

At UGM, there is a variety of classes. Make sure you understand the system of each class you take. For example, you should know the minimum requirement of presence in class as a requirement for taking the final examination.

4 Take a break from studying

Studying could be pretty intense sometimes, and to release the stress, you can go on a short trip, such as sightseeing, hiking, camping, or shopping, to any of the tourist attractions in Yogyakarta and its surroundings. Your classmates, OCIA, or IUP staff would be a good place to start for asking where to go.

5 Stick to your goal

After you have a break and your body is refreshed, don't forget your main goal in this exchange program. When you finish your study at the Faculty of Psychology, you will have achieved your goals with the addition of having great experiences.

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TYPES OF VISA

1. Visitor Visa

a. Visa on Arrival (VoA) Validity period: 30 days

You can apply for a visa upon arrival in Indonesia if you come from one of the listed countries. A Visa on Arrival is valid for 30 days. This visa can be extended at a local Immigration Office for one time so that you can stay for another 30 days.

Entry requirement for Visa on Arrival:

- 1. Your passport must be valid more than six months from your entry date into Indonesia
- 2. Round trip tickets
- 3. Minimum of one blank page in your passport

b. Visa through Indonesian Embassy/Consulate

(VKSB) Validity period: 60 days

You can apply for a visitor visa at an Indonesian Embassy or Consulate in your country, or the guarantor (OIA UGM) can apply for this visa (on your behalf) to the Directorate General of Immigration in Jakarta, Indonesia. With this visa, you can stay in Indonesia for up to 60 days. This visa can be extended at an Immigration Office four times, and for each extension, you will be given another 30 days to stay. There are two types of visitor visa: 1) single entry and 2) multiple entry. You can apply based on your purpose and the frequency of your visits.

You can use this visa to visit UGM for a summer school, seminar, art and cultural event, short training, and other activities as long as you do not exceed the validity time of your visa.

Entry requirements for VKSB:

- Your passport must be valid for more than six months (or 18 months for multiple entry) from your date of entry into Indonesia.
- Round Trip tickets Minimum of one blank page in your passport
- A sponsor letter (provided by OIA UGM)

Procedure:

Request sponsor letter to OIA UGM Submit all required documents to chosen Indonesian Embassy/consulate

TYPES OF VISA

2. Limited Stay Visa (VITAS)

This type of visa is appropriate for foreigners coming to Indonesia for longer periods of stay. VITAS will be converted to Limited Stay Permit (ITAS) once you arrive in Indonesia.

You are suggested to apply for a VITAS to come to UGM if your purpose is to join a **student exchange program**, **degree program** (undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate program), and other programs that require a long period of stay in Indonesia (usually six months, one year, or two years).

There are a number of different types of VITAS depending on the purpose of the visit (working, research, or study). For students, you will need VITAS 316 for the study purpose. You will be informed in detail and assisted by UGM's OIA in obtaining a VITAS suitable for you.

In general, the entry requirement for VITAS are as follow:

- A copy of your passport
- An application
- A sponsor letter (provided by UGM's OIA)
- A letter of recommendation (issued by a relevant institution*, assisted by UGM's OIA)
- Visa Authorization/Telex Visa (issued by the Immigration Office, assisted by UGM's OIA)

*For <u>study</u> purposes, the recommendation is issued by the Ministry of Research, Technology, and Higher Education.

*For <u>research</u> purposes, the recommendation is issued by the Ministry of Research, Technology, and Higher Education or the Indonesian Institute of Science (LIPI).



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
LIMITED STAY PERMIT (ITAS)

ITAS is an electronic identity card for a limited stay in Indonesia. If you come to Indonesia with a VITAS, UGM's OIA will assist you in converting your VITAS to ITAS.

The required documents for ITAS are as follows.

- Completed immigration forms (in Bahasa Indonesia, filled out by OIA)
- A sponsor letter written by the Head of UGM's OIA (provided by OIA)
- Your passport and a copy of relevant pages of your passport
- A copy of your visa/VITAS
- A copy of your study permit
- Two passport photos (3×4 cm with red background)
- A letter of domicile (a letter written by the head of the subdistrict that certifies your residential address)
- A power of attorney that authorizes OIA officer to process the visa on your behalf.

Procedure of VITAS conversion to ITAS



ITAS Extension

You are suggested to process your ITAS extension one month before its expiry date.

The required documents for the ITAS extension are as follows:

- A sponsor letter from OIA
- A copy of the sponsor's ID (provided by OIA)
- A letter for study permit extension (provided by OIA)
- SKTT from *Dinas Dukcapil* (OIA will provide a sponsor letter to obtain it)
- A copy of your passport, a sticker visa, and your latest ITAS
- An academic transcript from the faculty
- Two passport photos (3×4 cm with red background)
- Completed *perdim* forms numbers 24, 25, and 27 (at the Immigration Office)

Procedure of ITAS Extension:



EXIT PERMIT ONLY (EPO)

ITAS holders are required to apply for EPO (Exit Permit Only) before leaving Indonesia. EPO will deactivate your ITAS; therefore, students will need a new visa to enter the country in the future. You need to apply for EPO by yourself at the Immigration Office where you are registered (Yogyakarta Immigration Office). EPO must be processed immediately prior to your departure date. You can start processing your EPO two weeks prior to your departure date.

The following are the documents that you need to apply for your EPO.

- 1. Your passport
- 2. A copy of your passport
- 3. A copy of your passport page containing your ITAS stamp
- 4. Your printed ITAS
- 5. A copy of your flight ticket
- 6. Immigration forms (you will get this at the Immigration Office)
- 7. A sponsor letter (from UGM's OIA)
- 8. A copy of your sponsor's ID

Once you submit all these documents, you will be handed a receipt with a pickup date on it. On the stated date, please return to the Immigration Office and pick up your passport with an EPO stamp on it. Check the stamp to make sure that it is the correct date of your departure.

Important: You can leave Indonesia from any port in any city (for example, you can leave Indonesia from Jakarta or Denpasar, Bali). However, please be informed that you still have to pick up your passport at the Immigration Office in Yogyakarta within seven days prior to your departure date.

IMPORTANT

Report to OIA upon Arrival in Yogyakarta

- International students are required to report to UGM's Office of International Affairs (Address: Bulaksumur F12-13, UGM Campus, Sleman, D.I. Yogyakarta, Indonesia – Google Maps: http://bit.ly/OIAUGM) maximum of one week after arrival in Indonesia. Its purpose is mainly to convert the VITAS into ITAS. This process is MANDATORY because VITAS will expire 30 days after you arrive. If you still do not have an ITAS 30 days after you arrive, your stay will be considered illegal (overstay).
- At OIA, you must complete a number of required documents with the assistance of OIA staff. After completing all of these documents, OIA will help you deliver your documents to the local Immigration Office in Yogyakarta and notify you once your ITAS is ready.

Overstay

If your stay in Indonesia exceeds the validity of your visa or stay permit, you overstay your visa/ITAS.

Examples:

- You enter Indonesia on the 1st of September using a visa on arrival which is valid for 30 days. It means that your visa is valid through 30th of September and each day after this date will count as overstaying.
- You enter Indonesia on 1st of September using VITAS that is valid for 30 days. Until the 30th day of your stay, you have not started processing the conversion of your VITAS to ITAS. As long as you do not process your ITAS, each day after your VITAS is expired will count as overstaying.
- If you overstay for 60 days or less, you will have to pay a fine. Based on the 2016 regulation, the fine is IDR1,000,000 per day. However, if you overstay for more than 60 days, there is the possibility for further investigation from the immigration, deportation, blacklisting (banned from reentering in certain time periods), or other unfavorable consequences will follow. <u>WARNING</u>: Failure to fulfil the above administrative process and all of its consequences due to overstaying are your own responsibility. Please consult with UGM's OIA should you have any inquiries regarding the visa and immigration matters.

1. UGM Residence

Applying for UGM Residence

- 1. Accepted students who do not yet have a student number or a UGM email should apply through this website: mitra.simaster.ugm.ac.id.
- 2. Students who already have a student number or a UGM email may apply through simaster.ugm.ac.id.
- 3. Read and agree to the applicable terms and conditions.
- 4. Choose the payment scheme.
- 5. Choose menu "bayar" (pay) and pay according to the pay code within 2x24 hours. If during the specified time the payment has not been made, the applicant's data will automatically be deleted.
- 6. Payment can be made through BNI teller using this format: name of dorm_floor_student's name as in Baciro_2_Alex. Students can also make a payment using mobile banking and send the payment proof to the administration staff of the units.

Taman Melati Yogyakarta Apartment



2. Kost

Kost is a typical accommodation among students in Yogyakarta and other cities in Indonesia. In general, a kost is a room with basic facilities, such as a bed, desk, chair, and closet. Nowadays, you can find a type of kost according to your financial capability and needs, such as kost with an ensuite that costs a bit more, kost with an air conditioner, and many more. To find one, you can visit the kost or through the internet. Although finding a kost through the internet seems convenient and more efficient, you have to be aware of the possibility of scams and other forms of cybercrimes. For this reason, you are recommended to use the kost finder application or websites that are relatively trusted. In Indonesia, one of the most well-known and used applications among students is Mamikos (https://mamikos.com/).



IRANSPORTATION

In Yogyakarta, finding ways to get around is easy. Yogyakarta is small, so taking a tour around this city is easy and affordable. You can walk to some public facilities and tourist attractions or pick one of the options below.

• Motorcycle and car

UGM's campus is located near the city center and can easily be reached by motorcycle or car. You can rent either of these from a travel agency that is quite easy to find since Yogyakarta is a tourist city.

• Online-based transportation

If you are not confident in riding or driving by yourself or need efficient transportation to go to the campus, you can choose one of the available online-based transportation such as Gojek, Grab, or Maxim. They provide both cars and motorcycles. This type of transportation is the most frequently used in Yogyakarta. It is considered more convenient and cheaper. Gojek and Grab also provide delivery services for goods, foods, and beverages.

• Local buses

Local buses are one of the best options for traveling either within the city or to the connecting areas. In Yogyakarta, there are two main terminals; *Jombor* (northwest of UGM) and *Giwangan*, to the south of UGM. There are two types of buses that connect areas in the Special Region of Yogyakarta; local buses and buses connecting Yogyakarta to other cities (intercity buses).

1. Intracity buses

These buses connect the City of Yogyakarta with the regencies in the Special Region of Yogyakarta. Among these buses are Kopata and Kobutri (connecting UGM with the City of Yogyakarta), Pemuda (connecting UGM with Sleman Regency), and Abadi (connecting the city with Bantul Regency and Kulon Progo Regency). However, these buses do not have good scheduling. Taking them is quite time-consuming because these buses often stop at a certain area for some time. Passengers pay the fare to the bus conductor.

2. Intercity bus

The other type of bus you can find is the bus connecting Yogyakarta with other cities in Indonesia. These buses are well scheduled, and you can pay the fare at a counter or terminal. You can find most of these buses in big terminals. There are many operators with different destinations, such as Suharno (to Solo), Puspa Jaya (to Lampung), ALS (to many cities on Sumatera Island), and et cetera.

• Trans Jogja

Another option to reach UGM is taking Trans Jogja buses. They are well scheduled, serve many routes around the city, and have their own shelter (bus stops). There are three types of tickets for Trans Jogja – single trip (IDR3,500), regular (can be topped-up, IDR2,000 per trip), and regular tickets for students (IDR1,800 per trip, which can only be obtained from educational institutions). These buses are in service from 5.30 AM to 9.00 PM.

• Becak(Trishaw)

Among travelers, becak is well-known as traditional transportation in Yogyakarta. This mode of transportation is mostly found in tourist attractions or public places such as traditional markets. If you wish to feel a more local atmosphere, you can take a becak to get around the campus or city, but it is better for you to bargain before hopping on it. In addition, you also need to have a plan as to where you want to go. Some becak drivers may take you to certain shops whose owners have some form of cooperation with the drivers.

• Sepeda kampus (Campus Bicycle)

Committed to developing educopolis areas, Universitas Gadjah Mada has taken several ways to embody this commitment by creating a zero carbon emission campus by 2050. In line with this goal, UGM launched its campus bicycles. This in-campus transportation facility is arranged with several considerations comprising safety, comfort, clean air, and connectivity between areas in UGM. Sepeda Kampus can be found and borrowed from several shelters that are located around the campus. One of the closest shelters to the Faculty of Psychology is Shelter Lembah, located in the northeastern of the faculty building. This shelter is also close to a food court, ATM, and parking lot. Students only need to show their student cards and write down their ID and destination before they can use the bicycle. Source:

• Trans Gadjah Mada Bus

UGM has two electric buses. Their service started on April 1st, 2022, with an inauguration ceremony led by UGM's Rector, Prof. Ir. Panut Mulyono, M.Eng., D.Eng. These buses operate on campus and stop at 35 stops connecting pedestrians, bicycle stations, parking areas, and Trans Jogja shelters. There are two stops near the Faculty of Psychology; one shelter is located in front of Building A, and the other is located in the northeastern of the faculty, close to the round-about and Faculty of Philosophy.

Health Facilities

1. Gadjah Mada Medical Centre (GMC)

GMC is a non-profit health center and a primary health care center located in SEKIP Block L3, Sendowo, Sinduadi, Mlati, Sleman, or to the south of the Faculty of Dentistry. At GMC, we can see a general practitioner or a dentist. We can also have laboratory examinations and buy or fill prescription drugs at the pharmacy. 
