






YOUR GUIDE TO Greenville

Greenville is located east of the Blue Ridge Mountains in the Upstate, SC, a lush, rolling midpoint between Atlanta, Georgia, and Charlotte, North Carolina. It is located



approximately 103 miles southwest of Charlotte, about 2 hours and 15 minute drive and 145 miles northeast of Atlanta, about 2 hours and 30 minute drive. It lies along Interstate 85, and its metropolitan area also includes Interstates 185 and 385.


Greenville County offers high quality schools including public, private, and homeschools.

The Greenville County School District is the largest school district in South Carolina with 14 high schools, 18 middle schools, and 50 elementary schools in the district.

The Greenville County School District is deeply committed to providing quality education. They have been awarded National Accreditation from the AdvancED Accreditation Commission, recognizing the school system as a high-quality school district and granting full accreditation to the school district and all of its schools.







There are 11 Magnet Academies in the district offering unique educational choices to the students of Greenville County. They offer a wide range of programs to meet every student's needs. The International Baccalaureate (IB) program in Greenville emphasizes foreign language fluency and fully developing the student. It has expanded to include schools across Greenville County and has an internationally recognized college preparatory curriculum. 





Research your options

If you already have found a job then you probably want to use the location of your future employer to decide where to live. 

Finding the right home

When searching for your home, having a list of all the things you want and need in your home is important. Note the must-haves, the deal-breakers, and your wish-list to help you target your search. This will save you a lot of time especially if you have a limited time to visit and check the area.

Making the offer and negotiating with the seller

Once you've found the home you'd like to buy, it's time to make an offer. An offer should specify price and all other terms and conditions of the purchase. Review every clause to make sure that they express your desired offer. Your buyer's agent can answer any questions you may have.

Negotiating is usually the most complex aspect of the home buying process. That's why it's important to have an experienced and knowledgeable buyer's agent who has successfully worked with relocating buyers.

Secure Financing

Once your offer has been approved and both sides have signed a purchase contract, it is time to begin the process of securing your mortgage. Your loan approval will be based on the information you provided to your lender during your initial application, so you should try to keep your financial life as stable as possible during the process any changes to that information could very easily affect your loan approval.



Closing

This is the last step in buying and financing a home. You can check with your buyers's agent about the details of your closing. He or she will be able to keep track of the transaction and communicate with your lender or title company to make sure everything is moving along in a timely manner.

The final walk-through is typically scheduled within the week leading up to the closing date. Your final walk-through is to ensure that any repairs have been completed if stated in your contract and that the home is ready to move into.

Moving

Moving out from your previous home also needs planning. As soon as you know a moving date, get price estimates and a list of services. Weeks before your moving date, you can start packing if you're doing the work yourself. If movers will do the packing, ask the moving company for advice on the best ways to prepare.
