

Leath Na hOibre, (Community Quilt)
Free event - Saturday & Sunday - The Anglers Rest Hotel

During the Something In The Water festival in 2024, local textile artists Ester Kiely, with the help of the Headford Community, created an incredible community quilt. This beautiful work of art is testament to the community spirit of the town, and can be admired all weekend, but not during performances in the venue.

Sarah Martyn - 'Voices of the Land' Free Event - Saturday & Sunday - - St. Fursa's Parish Hall

The work of local visual artist, Sarah Martyn, captures the vibrant colours and intricate details of the natural world, through paintings of flowers and landscapes that invite views to engage intimately with nature. Her more abstract works, Paintings from Flooded Lands, consider the destructive and regenerative aspects of floods, as natural phenomena, which have their own beauty.



This exhibition also includes a collaboration with the community, where audiences will be invited to collaborate on the creation of communal artwork, by helping with the colouring of a print wallpaper of the artists drawings, thus reflecting the collective creativity and vision of the community.

From farm animals to their love of nature, their range of photos will be displayed during the festivities to show off the creativity and vision of young people today.











Brickeens, by Headford Lace Project -Free Event - Saturday & Sunday - St. Fursa's Parish Hall

This project was inspired by Headfords location as a gateway town to Connemara and the Joyce Country and Western Lakes Geopark. Headford is situated near the shores of Lough Corrib and famous for its trout-fishing. Breac is the Irish word for trout and a small trout is a bricín. Locals also refer to trout in English as Brickeens.

In July 2025 Australian Visual Artist, Mary Elizabeth Barron visited Headford Lace Project to deliver an artist talk, a bobbin lace community engagement workshop and a masterclass using recycled plastic as thread. Mary guided locals and visitors through some simple large-scale bobbin lacemaking techniques to create a series of speckled brickeens.

Plastic bread bags recycled by local businesses were used as our thread. Mary's work aims to highlight the plight of plastics in the world's oceans and waterways. Headford Lace Project will display these colourful brickeens made by members of the community at 'Something in the Water'.




