VISA ESSENTIALS

Visa Eligibility

Visas are required for entry into Oman except for visitors from GCC countries.

Citizens from the 103 countries are allowed to enter Oman without securing a prior tourist visa and can stay for up to 14 days.

For other nationalities to apply for an e-Visa, applicants must hold a passport that's valid for 6 months from the date of entry. Keep in mind that a digital passport-size photo (on a white background) is required with the application. All visas must be applied for online at least 4 days before travelling to Oman.

Tourist Visa

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Tourist visa requirements for Oman differ from country to country. Securing an e-Visa before travelling is recommended. Keep in mind that e-Visas can take up to 4 days to be processed.

To apply for an e-Visa, contact Visit Oman's visa team.

The following documents are required for the e-Visa application:

- 1. Digital passport copy from an e-Visa eligible country valid for at least 6 months from the intended arrival date in Oman.
- 2. Digital photograph of traveller, passportstyle against a white background.

Visa Charges

Depending on the nation of origin and whether a single entry or multiple entry visit visa is required, visa fees can cost between OMR 10 and OMR 60.





Travel Tips

Navigating the Omani Riyal

The Omani Rial (OMR) ranks among the top 3 most valuable currencies in the world, even higher than the Euro! Divided into 1000 Baisa, comes in notes from OMR 1 to OMR 50, with 100 and 500 Baisa notes handy for smaller purchases. While coins exist in all sorts of denominations, keep in mind that 5 and 10 Baisa might not be universally accepted.

Cash is widely used in Oman, but do not worry – credit and debit cards are also widely accepted, especially Visa and Mastercard. Automatic Teller Machines (ATMs) are readily available in banks, airports, gas stations, convenience stores, and shopping malls, ensuring convenient access to cash.

Be sure to download a currency conversion app with offline capabilities for worry-free transactions before your trip, ensuring smooth navigation of your transactions.



Tax Savings: Practical Guide to VAT Refunds in Oman

Shoppers can claim a VAT refund on personal purchases provided the value of these goods is at least OMR 25 (not inclusive of VAT). Moreover, the goods should have been purchased not earlier than 3 months before the departure of the passenger and must be transported in their suitcases or carry-on luggage.

Items ineligible for a refund are cigarettes and other tobacco-related products, food and beverage items, and oil and gas products or their derivatives. Other items could be potentially added to the list of merchandise that is not eligible for a refund, according to the tax authorities.

The VAT regulations define tourists as individuals who do not have a permanent place of residence in Oman, or the wider GCC region. Furthermore, VAT refunds cannot be claimed by those staying in the country for more than 3 months at a stretch. Crew members of a flight, ship, road transport or ferry service are not eligible for a refund as well.

Visitors can claim VAT refunds at the dedicated counters at the airport, located at departure halls before security checks, in addition to land borders and ferry terminals. For eligible larger purchases exceeding OMR 500, head to the Oman Tax Authority website for a convenient online refund application.

Remember to collect tax receipts, pack purchases in your personal luggage, download the Oman Tax Refund App, check eligibility requirements, and allow enough time for processing before your departure.

Customs Declaration

Under Article 53, every traveller leaving the Sultanate of Oman must declare to the Customs Authority any cash, currencies, or negotiable financial instruments in their possession that exceed OMR 6,000 (approximately \$15,582 or equivalent in other currencies).

This declaration ensures compliance with Omani customs regulations and safeguards the integrity of financial transactions.

Weather & Climate

The best time to visit is during the winter months between October to March when the weather is pleasant and cool. April and May are pleasant, but warmer than the winter months. The summer months of June to September can be hot although the temperature remains pleasant in the mountain range.

Oman has a subtropical dry desert climate with a low annual rainfall. In the Al Hajar Mountain range and Dhofar region, the climate remains moderate throughout the year, a rarity in the Arabian Peninsula.



While Oman's average temperature in the summer reaches 35°C (95°F), the Sultanate enjoys cooler temperatures in certain parts of the country, offering a delightful escape that transports visitors into a different season; this includes the monsoon season down south with an average of 20°C – 28°C (68°F – 82°F), commonly known as Khareef Salalah as it is also peak season for frankincense harvesting, in addition to the Jabal Akhdar and Jabal Shams mountains where temperatures drop tremendously.

15 degrees cooler, visitors can trade cityscapes for stargazing skies up in the mountains, merely a 2-hour drive from the capital.

Alila Jabal Akhdar stands out as a truly unique luxury escape, with its fort-inspired architectural design seamlessly blending with surrounding cliffs, unparalleled views of the canyon, and cliffside dining under the stars. Visit Diana's Point at Anantara Resort, marking the spot where Princess Diana visited in 1986. With breathtaking panoramic views, it's a popular setting to enjoy the sunset, or a private dining experience within the resort.

Journey back in time and embrace Omani hospitality at Hanging Terraces. Nestled in the heart of Al Aqer, these lovingly restored 100-year-old houses offer a one-of-a-kind experience. Similarly, The Suwgra is a heritage inn, rooted in the cliff of the mountain, that aims to preserve the experience of ancient and traditional forms of living in Oman.

Once you enter the autumn season, temperatures gradually decrease, and this is considered one of the most pleasant times to visit the country, with average temperatures around 28°C (82°F). For adventurous travellers who enjoy snorkelling and diving, the whale shark season in Oman also falls between September and November as these gentle, majestic sea giants migrate south to the warmer waters of the southern hemisphere. The best spots to see whale sharks in Oman are at Ad Dimaniyat Islands off the coast of Muscat, and Musandam at the northern tip of the country.

With the Autumn Migration, it is also peak season for birdwatching, with popular spots including Batinah Coast, Dhofar Governorate, Jebel Akhdar, and Al Ansab Wetlands.

This is the coolest and driest time, with average temperatures in Muscat around 26°C (79°F). For camping enthusiasts, this is the best season to be outdoors. The days are warm and sunny, while the nights are comfortably cool. The weather allows visitors to enjoy outdoor activities from hiking, dining, and exploring what Oman offers.

The winter season offers lighter winds than summer, making it the ideal time for kite surfing, especially for beginners and intermediate riders as the wind can be more variable during this time. The best kite surfing spot in the country is Masirah Island, a kitesurfer's paradise with consistent wind year-round, followed by Mussanah and Al Sawadi Beach.



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With temperatures rising again, it is also the Spring Migration of the birdwatching season, where birds returning from Asia fill the skies; popular spots include Musandam Peninsula, Ras Al Hadd, Jebel Akhdar, and Masirah Island.
