

Dear UJCBR Family,

August 15, 2023

These High Holidays are a journey when we come together as a community. At this time we reflect on the past year, welcome the New Year and all the future has in store for us. Some have been part of our community for most of their lives and we also meet people coming to the community for the first time. We feel a spirit of connection as we join together in song, prayer, and learning. We hear the blast of the Shofar together as Jews have for thousands of years. We live in a time when it is easy to feel disconnected from the people around us. We can feel isolated in our jobs and daily routines. The High Holidays provide us, as does much of Jewish life, with an opportunity to plug into something greater than ourselves and to reach out to the other people in our community. Ron Wolfson says "...the task of Judaism is to build a relationship between individuals and the Jewish experience. ...the approach needs to focus on how Jewish practice can be a path to meaning and purpose, belonging and blessing. Jewish life cycle and holiday rituals, liturgy, and study are all means to a goal—to self-discovery, celebrating relationships, and fulfilling communal obligations."

This past year has been a year of growth and evolution for the UJCBR. Rabbi Smiley has helped us develop meaningful prayer, worship and study that reflect the deeply Jewish values and diverse backgrounds of our congregants. Julie Tepper, our religious school director, continues to work tirelessly to provide quality Jewish and Hebrew education to our children. Latonia Douglas directs the Rayner Center, maintaining it as a first in class early childhood center. Our office staff are dedicated to the smooth operation of our synagogue. Numerous volunteers have devoted many hours to projects and activities from cleaning sidewalks to making sandwiches to building the Sukkah to guiding our finances. A special group of volunteers, led by Marc Sager and Greg LaCour, have zealously worked on the plans, design and construction of our new campus.

So as we enter 5784 and strive for the UJCBR to be a place of Keruv, closeness to God, I pray we will continue to be a center of:

Tikkun Olam – The commitment to repair God's world though the pursuit of justice; Tikkun Nefesh – Personal and spiritual growth as a Jew and as a human being; Talmud Torah – Life-long study of Torah and of Jewish history and tradition; Mishpacha – A sense of extended family through a warm and supportive atmosphere; Reform Judaism – Its principles and values.

I can think of three ways to help accomplish these goals.

First – Volunteer.

Second – Spread the word and bring a friend.

Third – <u>Donate</u> to UJCBR. Yes, you knew that was coming.

All we have and want to accomplish comes with a cost. We depend on our High Holiday Appeal to supplement the annual commitment you make in the form of "dues." Our goal for this year's appeal is \$36,000. Whether its \$36 or \$3,600, we as ask that you give what feels meaningful to you. We all want to continue to build upon our tremendous accomplishments since the founding of our congregation in January 2022.
