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God promises that if you come to him, you will find rest no matter the circumstances you're in. What an amazing feeling of comfort he can provide us with through a simple passage!

As we venture into the last quarter of 2024, practicing the pause is a good time for some personal and quiet reflection.

A time to evaluate our behaviour, action towards others and how God features in our lives.

It is a time to ponder how we can use these pauses to improve moving forward.

It is a good time to take advantage of the pauses and use them to change the way we handle doubt, anger, stress and everything else that life throws at us.... especially before the busyness and chaos of the Christmas season is upon us!

My dear parishioners of SIC,

Through the Rosary, we can not only find peace but also strengthen the bonds of love and faith within our homes.

Let this be the month you begin a new tradition of daily prayer, uniting your family and seeking God's help in all things.

Our CDD founder, Cardinal Celso Costantini emphasized that "The presence of the Lord" is found in The Blessed Sacrament, The Pope, and the Holy See.

On September 19, 2024, leaders came together for a briefing with Anthony Sta Maria and team to learn the ropes.

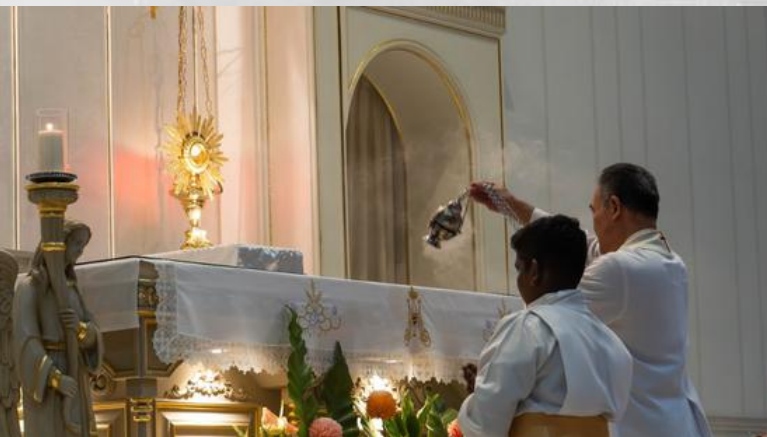
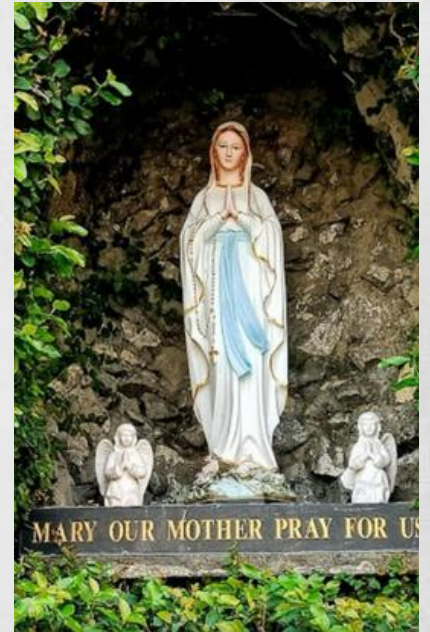
The maiden animation of this sacred hour with the Lord commenced on Thursday, 17th of October 2024.

The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary was established to celebrate Mary's role in the Christian triumph over the Turks at Lepanto on October 7, 1571.

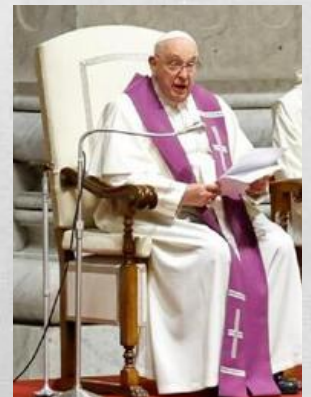

OKR 圣保禄基信团2024年劳勿、文冬及文德甲朝圣恩宠之旅

一如往年，趁着大马日连续假期，OKR圣保禄基信团，在现任主席Thomas李任芳弟兄领导、联络事工Frankie黄裕祥弟兄精心部署之下，于2024年9月14至15日，组织起两天一夜的朝圣共融之旅。



周六早晨，一行人接受本堂主任司铎黄大华神父（Fr. Lawrence Ng）的降福之后，于八点发车。全员44人，其中包括团员们不同宗教背景、不同年龄段的亲朋好友，乘坐旅巴开往东方，跨入彭亨州土地，来一趟共融、祈祷、归依、生活体验之行。

恩宠满被的新团员Agnes林淑恩姐妹主持破冰环节之后，大家随即颂唸玫瑰经，把这趟“以朝圣共融为主、休闲娱乐为辅”的行程，藉圣母的有力转祷，完全交托在天主手中。

碰上二合一连假，加叻大道交通显得特别繁忙，行程必须有所调整，旅巴导游先生一再报告更新的安排。在将近五个小时之后，一行人终于安全抵达劳勿，先用午饭填饱辘辘饥肠，再继续下面的活动行程。

劳勿圣母领报堂 Raub Church of the Annunciation

首站，一行人来到座落于劳勿Jalan Cheroh Lama的圣母领报堂，参加本堂林进发神父（Fr. Clement Lim）主持的光荣十字圣架庆典弥撒，并特别降福了当天庆祝结婚35周年的朝圣者Nicholas林顺隆夫妇。林神父在弥撒后还特别介绍嵌在祭台上的圣髑，并且让大家围绕在祭台周围，一边近距离亲睹圣髑、一边聆听他的讲解。惟距离1965年该堂火灾后重建、1967年新堂落成的年代久远，圣髑出处已不可考。

圣髑（relics）就是圣人的物品或遗体遗骨，在敬奉（veneration）之气氛下被作为实体的纪念物小心保存。一级圣髑是圣人的身体或部份遗体，例如骨块或肉体。二级圣髑是圣人自己用过的物品，例如衣服或书籍（或这些物品碎片）。三级圣髑则是圣人曾接触过的物品，或者那些曾接触过一级圣髑的物品。（参考资料：

下一站，团员在霏霏细雨中来到一座饲养着各种飞禽与小动物的休闲农场（The Bentong Farm）。天主施恩，在办完团票入场以后，雨水竟然暂停，让大夥在习习凉风中走完占地27英亩的整座农场，重拾童趣，大发未泯之童心，身心灵皆得到充份的放松。

傍晚入住文冬市镇上的旅馆后，大家享有一段自由活动时间，各自步行到附近夜市逛逛，饱享当地美味小吃，也欣赏入夜后的小镇风貌。

翌晨，大家起床享用早餐后，于7时30分集合驱车往文冬公教中学毗连的圣心堂，参加八点正、同样由林进发神父主祭的常年期第廿四主日弥撒。弥撒以巫、中、英三语进行，服务当地多元背景的信众。

弥撒结束时，林神父给朝圣者特别介绍四名圣人的圣髑，即：圣类思·公撒格 (St. Aloysius Gonzaga)、里斯本的圣安多尼 (St. Anthony Padua)、圣则济利亚 (St. Cecelia) 和圣玛利亚·葛莱蒂 (St. Maria Goretti)。

当一众团员列队往前瞻仰保存在四个小型圣髑光 (Reliquaries) 内的圣髑时，不期然地遇上特殊的信仰经验。其中一人在热切渴望向圣髑祈祷的过程中，由于在内里经历属灵的争战而有了外显的异样。众团员虽然略显紧张，却都毫不畏惧地伸出援手，齐声颂唸圣母经。见过类似事件的弟兄姐妹，更是热心协助林神父让当事人从恶势力中得到释放，逐渐恢复平静，得到内心的治愈。

大家在回程中回顾并分享这次际遇时，都纷纷表达了因深觉天主的光荣与权威、圣母转祷的救赎以及圣神的力量，加上见到团体内自动自发的合一表现，内心无不被深深地触动。

We also pray for Rev Fr Thomas Koo CDD as he takes up this new appointment.

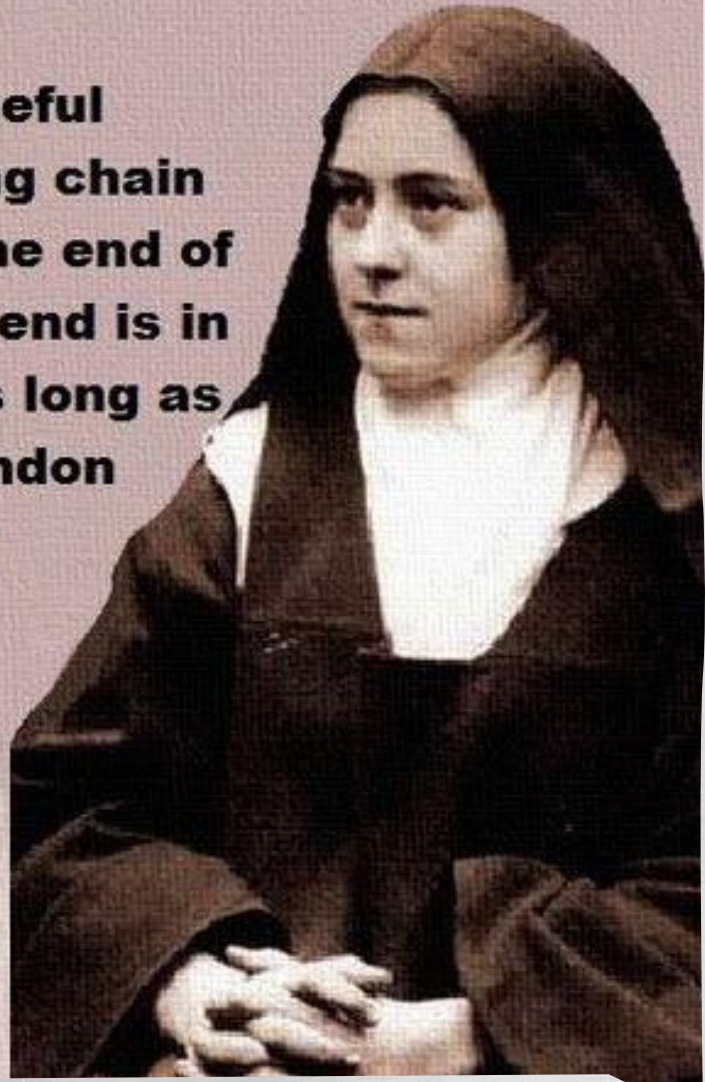
