#### Branching Out - trees for today and tomorrow **Surf Coast Shire**

Council is partnering with local community groups in the first phase of a multi-year effort to increase the number of trees in Surf Coast Shire towns.

As part of an initiative called 'Branching Out,' Council will help deliver major street tree planting projects in Winchelsea and Deans Marsh this year.

The Winchelsea project, developed in partnership with Growing Winchelsea in line with its Winchelsea Arboretum Trail Concept Plan, will see more than 80 trees planted in priority areas in town.

A further 80 trees will be planted along key streets in Deans Marsh, in a project initiated by the Deans Marsh Streetscaping Group.

Both projects are fully funded through Council's 2024-25 budget, with planting to begin soon.



Councillor Tony Phelps recently met with members of Growing Winchelsea's Arboretum Trail sub-committee. "This is an important investment by the Council, aimed at putting more trees in the ground to help our local towns become greener, cooler, more appealing places to live and visit," Cr Phelps said. "Along with many environmental benefits, Branching Out will boost local economies and contribute to a happier and healthier community."

As well as tree planting projects, Branching Out will also deliver:

- a preferred species list for each town to ensure the right trees are planted in the right places; and
- a canopy cover and heat map assessment to help determine future priority planting areas.

Branching Out is being planned as a six-year initiative, subject to future funding, that would ultimately see around 1200 new trees planted across the shire. Funding of \$160,000 has been included in Council's draft 2025-26 budget for year two.

Cr Phelps said the environmental benefits of trees in urban environments are significant. "Planting more trees will help adapt our townships to withstand the changing climate. Trees are proven to reduce urban heat, air pollution and noise, while supporting biodiversity and improving stormwater filtration. It's a very exciting project and we can't wait to see it unfold."

#### What is an Arboretum? An arboretum is "a garden

where many different types of trees are grown for people to look at or for scientific study"1.

#### Where is the Arboretum Trail located?

The Arboretum Trail is designed to be an integral part of the Winchelsea environs, within a 2.5km of the town centre. Residents and visitors will be able to enjoy and experience the benefits of trees and nature everywhere they go. The trail will connect a number of mini arboreta, significant trees, and sites throughout

the town. Parts of the trail already exist, and other parts are yet to be constructed. Proposed pathways are subject to further investigation and approvals by Council and other relevant authorities and owners.

In Winchelsea, the trees will not be confined to one large area but spread across the town in smaller reserves to create mini arboreta and treed avenues and streets. Residents and visitors will be able to walk, run, ride or drive to visit these areas. A good example of the positive impact of strategic tree planting can be seen in towns such as Camperdown, Bright and Beechworth to name a few.

#### The Winchelsea Arboretum Trail A 5 Pillars Project:

#### People, Place, Planet, Prosperity, Participation

In February 2020, a group of Winchelsea residents registered a community led project proposal with the Surf Coast Shire to develop an Arboretum Trail throughout the Winchelsea township area.

On 23rd June 2021, this proposal was referred to an investigation phase, with Council resources being provided to support the community to explore the proposal's feasibility.

A sub-committee of Growing Winchelsea was established, and work has begun.

#### **AXE THE TAX: PROTESTING THE ESVF**

On Saturday 31st of May, hundreds of CFA volunteers and supporters from surrounding communities joined together outside of Winchelsea Shire Hall to protest the State Government's Emergency Services & Volunteer Fund levy (ESVF).

The main road was lined with fire-trucks and the front of the Shire Hall a sea of yellow CFA jackets as protesters descended on the Shire Hall to stand against the ESVF levy. At 10:40AM a coordinated chorus of sirens rang out across the town, a poignant and clear response to the proposed tax.

The State Governments proposed ESVF levy (which will replace the existing Fire Services Property Levy that is collected by council through rates charges) is due to come into effect on July 1st 2025 and looks to increase the variable charge to residential and commercial properties by 100% and to farmers by 150% (the latter now postponed until 2026).

As you might have read in last week's copy of The Winchelsea Star, the Winchelsea Fire Brigade is firm on their position against the charge. "This is a charge we believe is unfair and places an additional burden on already struggling communities. We proudly stand shoulder to shoulder with the farming community who will wear the biggest 'levy' (tax) increases and are the backbone of brigades around the State."

It's a sentiment shared by the many protestors on Saturday, with a handout stating "a significant proportion of emergency service volunteers in rural Victoria are farmers. They are now being asked to pay a higher levy than anyone else for the very services they are volunteering their time to."



## Winchelsea hosts fire levy protest

Saturday morning saw around 60 emergency services vehicles converge on Winchelsea town centre, for a protest demonstration against the State government's Emergency Services & Volunteers Fund (EVSF) levy. A crowd of roughly 300 listened to several speakers voicing community opposition to this property-based tax. The Winchelsea Lions Club were flat out providing egg-and-bacon rolls and sausage sizzle to so many.

Organised by Rod Taylor of Winchelsea Brigade, there were fire-trucks and other fire vehicles from all around the region - Geelong to Colac, Bannockburn to Wurdale, between and beyond. Farmers, volunteer firefighters, business owners, home-owners all came along to support an amazingly strong statement against a revised fire levy that not only greatly increases what every single ratepayer will be asked to pay, but also unfairly targets the farming community in the middle of one of the worst droughts on record.

Speakers included State Senator for Western Victoria Bev McArthur, State MP for Polwarth Richard Riordan, Volunteer Firefighter Brigades Victoria (volunteer's union) Tony Winsall, John Callahan AFSM from Barwon Downs CFA, Surf Coast Mayor Mike Bodsworth and myself as Councillor Tony Phelps. Councillors Adrian Schonfelder and Joel Grist were present too, with Leon Walker unable to attend but sending his support. Winchelsea Group Officer Mark Brown emphasised that mental health support is available - from friends, neighbours, over the phone, and online.

The common thread of course was opposition to this EVSF legislation which will increase the fire services levy for commercial properties by 66%, residential properties by 100%, and farm properties by a whopping 150%. Only a fraction of those funds come back to rural and regional Victoria, with the VFBV calculating just 7 cents in the dollar going to CFA. Most funds go to metropolitan institutions such as the State Control Centre in Melbourne. The loud message is that this revised levy needs to be scrapped.

The State government has temporarily backed down by freezing the farming levy for 12 months. This still threatens a huge rise in future, and still puts significant financial burden on all other ratepayers across the state. The levy is required to be collected as part of council rates, which puts a burden on councils too to amend systems and deal with collection with short notice and no choice.

Congratulations to the Winchelsea Group for putting this stirring and very visual event together - when all the fire vehicles drove a couple of laps of Winchelsea centre with lights & sirens on, it was an awesome spectacle that shows this is an issue that the community feels very strongly about. More such demonstrations are expected to continue around the state.

# A cynical political tactic to defuse public outrage against the tax?

The 'pause' is a welcome admission of failure from the Government, but the fact remains this unjust tax should never have been forced through in the first place.

It should not have taken the incredible protest and public pressure from CFA brigades, farmers, councillors, professional firefighters and regional communities for Labor to realise how offensive this tax was.

Volunteers who have protected their communities for generations were targeted by a government out of touch with regional Victoria.

The fact that 200 CFA brigades felt forced to take themselves offline shows just how deep the anger and sense of betrayal ran.

It is unacceptable that this climbdown only includes farmers in limited LGA areas, worst affected by drought. Support for areas suffering is welcome, but the inherent unfairness of this tax affects farmers across Victoria. It should be cancelled for all LGA areas, and permanently.

This pause has to be the beginning of a permanent reversal of this attack on volunteers and farmers — not a cynical political tactic to defuse public outrage. One year's pause is nothing - we cannot return to the same situation in twelve months.

Taxing CFA volunteers, who are often farmers, more just to keep the government afloat is not only backward — it's insulting.

Let's be clear: this wasn't a tax for volunteers. It is a tax on volunteers.


It punishes the very people who are the backbone of our CFA brigades — farmers and landholders already doing it tough during the worst drought in living memory.

The Premier now needs to rule it out for good.

Regional Victoria deserves respect, not ignorant, offensive tax grabs and piecemeal 'support' packages from inside the tram tracks of Melbourne.

I will continue to stand with farmers, firefighters, Councils and rural and regional Victoria until this tax is gone for good.

## New plantings to discourage Corellas on the Barwon River at Winchelsea

#### **Growing Winchelsea**

Friday 23 May 2025 GenU planting teams were on site to bring two planting areas to life!

They planted approximately 2,000 native and indigenous plants, all grown from seed especially for the Corella Management Plan – what an incredible contribution. The teams had plenty of help on the day.

Recently, Landscape Architect Pete Wilson visited Winchelsea to meet with representatives of the Project Steering Group to gain input into the Landscape Concept Plan for CWA Park and the highway avenue, where a mix of trees will eventually replace the existing Elms. The elms are diseased and damaged and at the end of their life. Corellas like open space so this plan seeks to increase plantings while maintaining the space as a community park.

Pete has been carefully researching tree and shrub species that are well-suited to Winchelsea and less attractive to Corellas, that is, minimal seed or bark appeal. Pete's early findings suggest that ornamental native species will be the best fit for the highway and parts of the park.

Corella management is a complex issue, and Surf Coast Shire is trialling a long-term strategy to discourage the birds from establishing a permanent roost site during the summer months. Changing the local environment, to reduce open spaces and increase lower-level planting of trees and shrubs that provide a

visual barrier from danger, makes the birds uncomfortable and unwilling to stay.

"We will continue to keep you posted. Keep an eye on the nesting box perched high on a pine tree on Barwon Terrace to see if a pair of nesting peregrine falcons have set up house," concludes John Tebbutt, President of Growing Winchelsea.

Parents for Climate put utilities on notice after landmark win against "state sponsored greenwashing" from Renew Economy, Anne Delaney May 30, 2025

The landmark legal settlement secured by the small non-profit group, Parents for Climate, has put Australia's biggest energy companies and corporate brands on notice – and thrown a spotlight on the government-backed certification scheme that enabled years of misleading green claims.

Last week, EnergyAustralia admitted that the pollution caused by burning coal and gas cannot be undone by buying carbon offsets – a core feature of its now-abandoned 'Go Neutral' product, certified under the federal government's Climate Active program.

EnergyAustralia's Go Neutral product was an electricity and gas offering, available since 2016, and marketed as a product that would "cancel out" the climate impact of burning fossil fuels through the purchase of carbon offsets.

"They used words like carbon neutral... and even claimed the product had a positive impact on the environment" said Parents for Climate CEO Nic Seton

## Get ready for several years of killer heat, top weather forecasters warn

There's an 80% chance the world will break another annual temperature record in the next five years, and it's even more probable that the world will again exceed the international temperature threshold set 10 years ago, according to a five-year forecast released Wednesday by the World Meteorological Organization and the U.K. Meteorological Office.

With every tenth of a degree the world warms from human-caused climate change "we will experience higher frequency and more extreme events (particularly heat waves but also droughts, floods, fires and human-reinforced hurricanes/typhoons)," said Johan Rockstrom, director of the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research in Germany.

Ice in the Arctic — which will continue to warm 3.5 times faster than the rest of the world — will melt and seas will rise faster. Lately, after each jump from an El Nino, which adds warming to the globe, the planet doesn't go back down much, if at all. "Record temperatures immediately become the new normal," said Stanford University climate scientist Rob Jackson.

## **Spinal Health Week**

Alarming new data on impact of technology use Insight Communications

The Australian Chiropractors Association (ACA) has released new national data revealing that Tech Neck - known as Tension Neck Syndrome - is now a serious public health concern.

Women and young people are the most affected, with 68% of women and 60% of men reporting symptoms linked to screen time, poor posture, and non-ergonomic device use.

#### **Key Findings**

- 85% of women who don't take tech breaks experience neck pain (vs 61% who do break)
- 80% of smartphone users who rarely take breaks whilst using their device suffer neck pain compared to 60% of users who took regular breaks.
- 78% of respondents take over the counter pain relief and 47% prescription medication to treat neck pain.
- 73% of women aged 31–40 report neck pain the most affected group
- 70% of neck pain sufferers reported neck pain impeded their movement or daily activities.
- 64% of Aussies experienced neck pain 68% of women and 60% of men
- 71% of full-time students reported neck pain with female students 63% more likely to experience neck pain than male students (81.8% v 50%).
- Sedentary female workers experienced the highest rate of neck pain and were 22% more likely to experience neck pain than men (71.7% v 59%).
- Male gamers who had regular breaks reported 33% less neck pain than gamers who never took breaks.
- Female laptop users who stretched/took a break every 2 hours were 24% less likely to experience neck pain than women who only stretched or took a break when they were in physical pain (69.6% vs 86.1

## Victorian schools embracing phonics

Victorian State Government

Victorian schools are embracing a shift to phonics with a recent snapshot showing nine out of 10 government primary schools already using this approach to teach reading, well ahead of the requirement to implement it in classrooms by 2027.

Deputy Premier and Minister for Education Ben Carroll said Victorian schools had jumped at the chance to introduce the system into schools early, supporting students to achieve stronger reading outcomes.

The Victorian approach to reading, which includes daily systematic synthetic phonics instruction as part of their reading program, is due to fully mandated in Victorian government schools by the start of 2027.

A Department of Education survey shows that 93 per cent of government primary schools have adopted a focus on delivering daily phonics instruction.

There is strong teacher and school engagement with Phonics Plus program. Out of the sampled schools 88 per cent report they have engaged with Phonics Plus and 37 per cent are using the Phonics Plus resources.

## history of winchelsea

## The Hopkins Family and Wormbete Station

Written and Researched by Dr. Paul Michael F Donovan, Federation University, of Winchelsea

The Western District is known for its fertile land, which is essential for successful agriculture and food production. Major Thomas Mitchell described the plains of the area as 'covered with excellent grass; and in many places detached groups of trees... resembling a nobleman's park on a gigantic scale'. For many years, the town of Winchelsea was known as 'The Gateway to the Western District'.

As European settlement stretched out beyond the shores of Port Phillip Bay in the late 1830s, large squatting runs were taken up, often along the region's watercourses. One of the earliest runs selected along the Barwon River and its tributaries, including Wormbete Station which was first established as a sheep run by Henry Hopkins. It is believed the name originates from a local Indigenous term meaning "lake with a black fellow's mound". This name etymology may imply the existence of a burial site or a midden from camping and/or historical inhabitation. Wormbete Station is located on the East side of Barwon River, on the lands of the Wadawurrung People.

Henry Hopkins is remembered for his business acumen in the wool industry in Tasmania, and for his philanthropy. He was born in Deptford, Kent, England in 1787. Hopkins migrated to Tasmania in 1822 with his wife (also his first cousin) Sarah Rout. Henry and Sarah Hopkins were the first pastoralists to export from Tasmania. They traveled to the Port Phillip District from Tasmania in 1836 and returned to Tasmania to buy Merino sheep to stock Wormbete Station. The Hopkins family left Tasmania for England in 1840 and returned to Tasmania in 1842. Hopkins' business ventures were so successful that he was able to retire By 1845, aged 55. In August, 1851 Henry formally transferred Wormbete Station to his son John Rout Hopkins, at which point it was estimated at 31,000 acres and capable of carrying 3,000 head of sheep.

The bluestone homestead which still stands today had been erected in the 1840s, with other outbuildings added in the two decades following. Wormbete Homestead is significant for its association with the early development of Victoria's pastoral industry, and is one of the very few surviving pastoral properties in Victoria to contain a principal building dating from the 1840s. The remaining buildings also are early (1850s and 1860s). Additionally, the buildings are laid out formally in a farm court, a practice which is most unusual in Victoria and which has strong links with the earlier Tasmanian and New South Wales farms built before the settlement of Victoria and derived directly from English tradition. The Victorian Heritage Database remarks that the way the large drawing and dining rooms are reached from the glazed front verandah is most unusual, as is, for a nineteenth century residence, the north-facing aspect of the house.

John was a pillar of his local community. An active sportsman and supporter of the Winchelsea Anglican church. He spent many years as a councillor with the Winchelsea Shire (and its predecessor the Winchelsea Roads Board), serving several terms as shire president as well as becoming the first shire president of Barrabool Shire. In addition to local politics, John was also a member of the Victorian parliament, holding the seat of South Grant in the legislative assembly (lower house) from 1864-1867 and then again from 1871-1877. In 1892 he was elected to the lower house seat of Geelong, also taking up the position of mayor of the town in the same year.

John married three times during his life but his first - and longest marriage - was to Eliza Ann Armytage, the daughter of his squatting neighbour George Armytage from Ingleby Estate to the south west of Wormbete. The couple were married in 1850 and before Eliza's death in 1885 raised a family of seven daughters and six sons at Wormbete.

#### Grants for all abilities sport

Victorians living with a disability can look forward to more opportunities to be involved in the sports they love, with the Government announcing the recipients of grants supporting even more people to participate on and off the field.

Minister for Community Sport, Ros Spence today announced 88 grants worth more than \$1.5 million from the Regional All Abilities Participation Grants program for grassroots sport and active recreation clubs, and not-for-profit organisations.

With grants of up to \$25,000, the program aims to increase access, inclusion and options for people living with a disability to reap the benefits of sport and active recreation in regional

Shepparton Netball Association will receive \$15,000 for a yearround All Abilities Netball Program co-designed by people living with a disability. The Program will include summer and winter seasons and a Walking Netball program.

Cycling Without Age Gippsland has scored more than \$22,000, to support people living with a physical and cognitive disability to get involved in cycling in their local community.

Murray Human Services will be using its \$20,000 grant to install MultiBall in Echuca, an interactive, all ability sport wall to support adults living with a disability including those with sensory or behavioural needs who are unable to participate in traditional sports.

Disabled Wintersport Australia received more than \$21,000 towards accessible equipment including sit skis, headsets for vision impairment, and outrigger skis to make skiing in Victoria's alpine regions more accessible.

The program is part of the Government's \$40 million All Abilities Sport Fund that is removing barriers for people with disability to get involved in sport and recreation across regional Victoria.

#### Seasonal road closures help keep motorists safe

Visitors to Victoria's parks and forests are being reminded that temporary road and track closures will come into effect on Tuesday 10 June, following the King's Birthday long weekend.

The annual closures make it safer for motorists and reduce damage to remote roads impacted by heavy rain and snow.

Forest Fire Management Victoria, Parks Victoria, and the Conservation Regulator enforce seasonal closures between June and November annually.

Authorised officers will be educating visitors about the upcoming changes in busy parks and forests during the King's Birthday long weekend, followed by increased patrols and surveillance over the 2025 closure period.

Last year, there were more than 307 gate breaches, and over 700 instances of illegal vehicle use across Victoria's parks and In 2024, 140 infringement notices under the Conservation (Vehicle Control) Regulations were issued, including for driving cars or riding trail bikes illegally off-road or in restricted areas.

Offenders caught driving or riding on a closed road in Victoria's parks and forests face a maximum penalty of up to \$3846 if prosecuted in court.

Visitors are advised to check local road and track closures and weather conditions before heading into the great outdoors.



## Safeguard against growing trend of push-start car theft

Thieves are increasingly using electronic devices to access vehicles via their on-board diagnostics (OBD) ports, enabling them to start and steal cars without the owner's key. Victoria Police data has shown that 20 per cent of car thefts in 2024 were stolen using this method.

RACV General Manager Motoring Products Jeff Ames explained how offenders were targeting modern vehicles. "By connecting unauthorised devices to a vehicle's OBD port, a thief can communicate directly with the car's engine control unit, allowing them to program a new key or even start the engine without the original key."

In addition to OBD port-related theft, RACV is also warning motorists of 'relay theft' – where thieves use a device to amplify a signal from your car key, tricking a car to unlock and even start. "As vehicle technology advances, so do the methods employed by criminals, so it's crucial for motorists to be aware of these tactics and take appropriate steps to protect their vehicles."

RACV recommends the installation of OBD port locks to prevent push-start car theft. An OBD lock works by physically securing the OBD port, preventing unauthorised access. "An OBD lock is a simple, yet effective tool that can significantly reduce the risk of theft by blocking access to the port," Mr. Ames added.

#### How to install an OBD lock

In general, OBD port locks are easy to install yourself. OBD port locks are cheap and readily available from auto shops and vehicle anti-theft websites.

You will need an OBD lock kit, a screwdriver, and possibly a socket set, depending on your vehicle model. Follow this step-by-step guide to ensure a successful installation:

- Turn your vehicle off and remove any keys
- Locate the OBD port in your car, usually found under the dashboard near the driver's seat
- Gently remove any panels or coverings over the OBD port
- Secure the lock in place over the OBD port, following the instructions provided with your OBD lock kit
- Reattach any panels or coverings you removed earlier.

You can test the installation by attempting to connect to the OBD port with a diagnostic tool. The lock should prevent access, confirming that your installation was successful. In addition to installing OBD port locks, RACV recommends the following precautions:

- Secure your keys: Always keep your vehicle keys in a safe place, away from doors and windows, to prevent relay attacks. Ensure you also keep your valuables out of sight.
- Install physical deterrents: Use steering wheel locks or wheel clamps as visible deterrents to potential thieves.
- Stay informed: Regularly update your vehicle's software with a registered mechanic and be aware of any manufacturer recalls or security updates.

"By staying vigilant and implementing these security measures, vehicle owners can significantly reduce the risk of theft," Mr. Ames concluded.





RSPCA's Rebecca Cook said "We know animals make our lives better, and we also know Victorians love their cats, but the reality is, allowing them to roam takes years off their lives. From being hit by cars, getting into fights, or catching diseases, the risks are so much greater than people expect."

"The majority of councils have or intend to introduce cat containment rules or curfews, but we know keeping your cat safe isn't simply about locking them indoors; it's about creating a fun, enriching environment where they can live a longer, healthier life and we want to support people doing this."



RSPCA Victoria's Rethink Roaming online tool gives cat owners a simple, interactive way to:

- Learn about the dangers their cat faces when roaming in their own neighbourhood
- Get practical tips to transition cats to a contained lifestyle
- Explore enrichment ideas to keep indoor cats stimulated and satisfied

"In addition to the risks pet cats face, freeroaming felines are also a major threat to our native wildlife," Ms Cook said.


