Meet Amna Akhtar and her 4th graders



In a small fishing village of Ibrahim Hyderi, Karachi, stands a government school that had not seen a parent walk through its doors since 1989. It was within this often-overlooked school that Amna began her Fellowship journey.

Amna, a business & finance graduate from IBA Karachi, faced a big decision in 2012. Should she follow a traditional career in finance, or should she join the Teach For Pakistan Fellowship? Despite the political instability and uncertainty in Karachi, Amna chose to teach a group of 4th graders in a community facing many challenges that made education hard to access.

Amna's time in the classroom showed her students' struggles, both with their learning and with challenging realities outside of school. Many faced significant barriers to learning, including limited foundational skills and inadequate access to educational resources. Yet, within each child, Amna saw potential waiting to be realized.

The challenges Amna's students faced reflected broader systemic issues affecting countless children across Pakistan.

In a country where 25 million children are out of school, and 95% of those who are in school receive sub-par education, the question arises:

How do we come together as one to build an equitable Pakistan, for all our children and all our people?

Teach For Pakistan harnesses the energy of the best young minds in Pakistan - mind like yours - to do just that.

Fellowship Facts

The Fellowship is a full-time, paid professional commitment for two years



In Islamabad, Teach For Pakistan partners with the **Federal Directorate of Education** (FDE), which places Fellows in government schools in keeping with their needs. In Karachi, Fellows will be placed in public schools according to **School Education & Literacy Department, Sindh's** needs.



Fellows will be assigned a combination of grades and subjects as per the schools' needs. In Islamabad & Karachi, primary and middle school placements will be for **English, Math, Science**, and **Social Studies**; Fellows will also teach **Urdu** in Karachi.



Each Fellow has an assigned Coach who works closely with them and provides **mentoring and coaching.**



At least **two Fellows** are placed in each school, working together to strengthen school culture and support students in their learning journey.

Eligibility Requirements

We encourage individuals from all academic and professional backgrounds to apply

- At least a Bachelors degree from an accredited university, completed by June 2025 (minimum 16 years of education)
- Pakistani citizenship or a valid National Identity Card for Overseas Pakistanis (NICOP) or Pakistan Origin Card (POC)
- Fluency in English and Urdu
- Successful completion of the pre-placement
 Training Institute in July and August 2025
- Two-year commitment to the Fellowship with placement in Islamabad or Karachi.

STEP 1 - Online Application

Short-listed applicants will be invited to an assessment center comprising a sample teaching lesson, group activities, and problem solving exercises

STEP 3 - Final Interview

Applicants who clear the assessment center will be invited for a final interview with a member of Teach

STEP 4 - The Offer

Candidates who meet our rigorous selection criteria will be offered a spot in the 2025-2027 cohort

STEP 5 - Summer Training Institute

(July- August 2025)

Incoming Fellows attend, and successfully complete a full-time six-week training prior to school placement in mid-August 2025.

Students and Fellows: Together on a path to lead change

Samreena and her 3rd graders: Journey toward academic excellence



"When I began teaching my Grade 3 students in 2022, I quickly realized that they struggled to understand even basic English sentences — a challenge shared by many students across classrooms in Pakistan. Driven to address this, I developed a four-stage language acquisition plan: starting with letter recognition, moving to sounds, then forming words, and finally building sentences. Alongside this structured approach, I focused on showing my students why learning English mattered for their futures. Through after-school remedial classes, storytelling, and exposure to storybooks, the students slowly began to see English not as a foreign task but as a way to express themselves and work toward their dreams. This shift from rote learning to purpose-driven learning sparked motivation and confidence across the class.

A significant turning point came when the students began setting their own goals, tracking their progress, and even teaching younger children in the community. Collaborations with organizations like Teach For Nigeria and Student Voice Accelerator opened doors for them to connect globally, and some students even advocated for girls' education and empowerment. By the end of the year, the impact of their hard work and self-belief became evident in their board results—the class average rose from 24% to 75%, with every student achieving a GPA of 3.75. This journey showed the powerful transformation that happens when learning is rooted in purpose and belief."

Ashas and Mehboob: Collective Leadership for Student Success



"When I began teaching Math and Science to Grade 4 at a public school in Chatha Bakhtawar, I was struck by the classroom's state: students frequently fought over small differences and showed little interest in academics. My co-fellow Mehboob and I realized we couldn't create change alone; we needed the whole school community. Together, we introduced classroom rules, set visions, and built a management system. Students started engaging with lessons, and we involved parents through WhatsApp updates. Students even led goal-setting sessions with other teachers, igniting a collaborative spirit. Our efforts paid off; Math and Science mastery rose from 6% to 62%, and students began aspiring for brighter futures as doctors, artists, and scientists.

In April 2023, we worked with teachers across grades to implement a school-wide Classroom Management System. Our principal strengthened parent relationships by regularly updating them on student progress, increasing engagement. We celebrated students' achievements with 80% attendance of parents on result day. Teachers shared best practices, collaborating on classroom visions and goals; a movement took hold. This journey showed us that lasting change in education is possible when the whole village - teachers, students, and parents - works together."

Meet Amna, a few years on



Amna's Fellowship not only altered the trajectory of her students but also transformed her future. After two years of unwavering dedication and perseverance, her students achieved remarkable academic milestones, demonstrating that success is attainable even in the face of adversity.

Through the Fellowship experience, Amna recognized that to drive systemic change in education, we need to address the interconnected challenges faced by our communities. After the Fellowship, Amna engaged in various roles to create meaningful and sustainable change. She played a key role in the Government of Sindh's legislative efforts, advocating for the Rights and Recognition of Women Agricultural Workers Bill, which passed in 2019. This experience deepened her understanding of community complexities and fueled her passion to continue working to uplift marginalized communities.

To further her impact, Amna pursued a Master's in Public Administration at Columbia University on a Fulbright scholarship, equipping her with critical skills to continue the important work. Upon returning to Pakistan, she worked to confront broader issues and engaged with communities, facilitating conversations that empowered individuals and amplified their voices in education and social equity discussions.

Currently, Amna works as the Monitoring, Evaluation, Reporting, and Learning Manager at UNDP Pakistan. In this role, she focuses on systemic transformation in the merged districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, applying insights gained from her Fellowship and beyond.

Amna's story shows how determination can challenge the status-quo and inspire a brighter future for our people and communities.
