2 SHADOW CHARADES

Get ready for the magical world of light and shadow! All You need is a flashlight and hands to create an extraordinary spectacle. This activity sparks imagination, improves coordination, and brings endless joy.

You will need:

- A flashlight

How to play?

Preparation:

- Choose a dark room and position the flashlight so it shines on a wall
- One person uses their hands to create a shadow shape – the others guess what animal it is!

Creating shadows:

- Use your hands to form animal shapes – try making a dog, rabbit, bird, or elephant!
- Experiment with movement – flutter butterfly wings or open and close a crocodile's jaws to bring your shadow to life.

Add sound effects!

- Make it more fun by adding animal sounds.
- Everyone can try their hand as a "shadow actor".
- You can also act out night scenes – like a safari or jungle sounds.

Playing with light and shadows together brings lots of joy, laughter, and **helps overcome fear of the dark!**

1 SHADOW THEATER

With the flashlight, you can tell stories and create magical characters that appear and disappear in the dark. This activity sparks imagination and allows children to discover the art of shadow puppetry.

You will need:

- A flashlight
- A piece of wall or a scene
- Paper characters and sticks
- A script an idea for the show

How to play?

Preparation:

- Cut out characters from dark paper and attach them to sticks for easier movement.
- Light up a blank part of the wall with a flashlight – and you're ready!
- You can create a stage by cutting a hole in a box and covering it with white parchment paper.

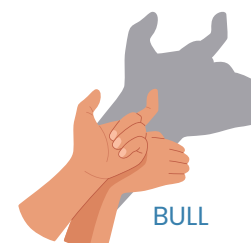

3 TREASURE HUNT

When it gets dark, it's time to search for treasure! A flashlight and a map will help little explorers on their quest.

You will need:

- A flashlight
- A map
- A treasure



How to play?

Hide the treasure in the garden, yard, or inside the house. It can be buried in a sandbox, hidden under a tree, or tucked under a bed.

Draw a simple map and mark clues to help the children find the treasure.

At sunset, give the kids flashlights and maps, then send them off on a treasure hunt!

With their flashlights, they will explore every corner, following the clues on the map step by step.

Once the treasure is found, they can open the chest together and share the reward!



More advanced version

Treasure clues can be simple puzzles or riddles.

5 SHADOW ART

Shadows can be the foundation for amazing works of art! All you need is a flashlight, a sheet of paper, and a bit of imagination to create your own light-inspired masterpiece.

You will need:

- A flashlight
- A sheet of A4 paper or larger
- A pencil or crayons
- Various objects to cast shadows

More advanced version

You can try to trace moving shadows – “shadow portraits.”

How to play?

- Preparing the space – in a darkened room, stick a large sheet of paper to the wall.
- Creating shadows – position the flashlight so that it shines on an object in front of the paper. Its shadow will appear on the sheet!
- Tracing shapes – the child traces the shadow with a pencil or crayons.
- Creative play – You can draw in the details and create Your own story! Maybe the shadow of a teddy bear will turn into a superhero?
- Experimenting – try changing the angle of the light and observe how the shapes change.



4 ONCE UPON A TIME...

A great idea for a simple storytelling game that engages children and boosts their imagination and creativity.

You will need:

- A flashlight

How to play?

Set the mood – turn off the lights to create a mysterious and cozy atmosphere. You can sit in a circle on the floor or on a bed so everyone sees the flashlight.

Start the story – the first person points the flashlight upward and begins with: “Once upon a time...”

Then, after a few sentences, they pass the flashlight to the next person, who continues the story.

The story ends when the flashlight returns to the first person, and everyone agrees it's the perfect ending!

It's a great way to stimulate imagination and create fantastic stories together!
