### Children and Smartphones

The five schools in the Moira and Magheralin area have grouped together to start a discussion on children's use of smartphones. We believe this is a very important topic, particularly given recent items in the news on the potential dangers children can face online despite the best efforts of parents to keep them safe.

We are keen to understand parents' views on the use of smartphones and will be circulating a short parent survey across the five schools in the coming weeks. This is to help determine what information and support we can provide, with a view to potentially holding an information session for parents.

In the meantime we wanted to share an initiative and some media on the topic that has been highlighted to the schools by some parents. Please note that some of the media linked below does contain some difficult and sensitive themes.



**Smartphone Free Childhood** is a grassroots movement of parents who believe childhood is too short to be spent on a smartphone. The aim is to bring parents together, empower parents to wait to give their children a smartphone and demonstrate that parents are demanding change. <https://smartphonefreechildhood.co.uk/>

Five schools in the area (Rowandale Integrated PS, Moira PS, Maralin Village PS, St Patrick's PS Maralin and Meadowbridge PS) held an informative and successful information evening discussing children and smartphones on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> May.

We had great talks from Rosalind McClean of Smartphone Free Childhood Northern Ireland, Professor Peter Cosgrove (Paediatrician), the Police Service of Northern Ireland and Michelle Guy MLA.

On the night we heard the latest research on children's mental health, developments happening at Stormont regarding online safety and the serious, very real, and increasingly common issues the PSNI are dealing with in relation to children online in the Lagan Valley area. We also heard how Smartphone Free Childhood are bringing parents together and the work they are doing with government bodies to bring about change in schools and the wider community.

Following the evening there has been increased support for Smartphone Free Childhood in the area, through signing of their pact and an increase in their Moira area WhatsApp group for parents. Signing the pact adds weight to their movement and we would encourage parents to sign up.

With thanks to Mairead and John McManus for starting the conversation many months ago and instigating the movement in the Moira area, to the Rev Joanne Megarrell and the Parish of St John's for the use of the parish centre on the night of the event, to all the speakers for your time and commitment and to the parents, carers and grandparents who came on the night to show support for this very important issue.

Last month, Mrs McCarragher travelled to Lasell University in Boston with LANTEC Digital. Mrs McCarragher has been part of the 2nd cohort of teachers from Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland to study Universal Design for Learning through Lasell University.



The course has been completed online throughout this academic year and ended last week in Boston with delivering final presentations and graduating from the Universal Design for Learning Graduate Certificate Program. As a school, we are excited to begin our journey with UDL and look forward to learning from Mrs McCarragher and seeing UDL in action in our classrooms.

## Update

### The Arts

Developing a skills approach in the teaching of Art, Music and Drama

Staff availed of 2 sessions of training with Lorna Gardiner, Thinking Matters Consultant.

### Thinking Matters

Staff explored the use of Thinking Frames to encourage a transfer of thinking skills and provide a visual record of thinking.

# metacognition

### Play

Clare Devlin, Educational Play Consultant has been working with the school to support the development of the new Nursery and Foundation Stage Play provision.

### Adaptive Practice

Foundation Staff have been creating resources to increase the power of choice as to which resources the children select to support their learning in Literacy and Numeracy.

### Restorative Practice

Teachers have been implementing Restorative Circles to the weekly schedule to build stronger relationships, develop social-emotional skills and enhance conflict resolution.

Staff are also revising planning for Physical Education, improving pupil performance in the area of 'Fluency of Facts and Procedures' in Numeracy and developing strategies to improve word meaning in KS1 and KS2 in Literacy.
