THE SCENT OF GRACE

We sit in my apartment and assemble our plates. The scent of warm sesame oil wafts in from the kitchen. We oscillate between comfortable silence and soft chatter until the last grains of rice are scraped from our bowls. Our conversation lingers long into the night.



In the haze of clean-up, my friend stops me. She asks if I know why Lunar New Year, which I celebrate with these Chinese friends, is so important to her. I admit that I know a little bit about the dumpling's symbolism for good fortune, urging her to tell me more. She smiles, and affirms, yes, the dumplings are indeed an important tradition for the holiday. Then she reaches out, pressing her fingers into my hand.

She says, "We celebrate today because it means our family is together." The quiver in her voice disappears, replaced with something steadier. Something weighty. "For me, those are people who live far away," she says, "but I still feel welcome here."

She pauses. The clatter of metal pots in the kitchen is muffled, her gaze fixed on my face. She wants me to remember what she says. "It is special for us because this is time we have for just us and nothing else."

In a moment, I have become the guest, the host receiving hospitality, the stranger elevated to the status of family. I catch the scent of what my friend has given and am reminded of grace. It is a scent that lingers, clinging to those who stand close by, urging us to return to its source. Indeed, Jesus Christ is hospitality in its holiest form given to us. When received, gratitude becomes the aroma of our lives.
