Burgundy 2022 En Primeur: A Modern Masterpiece

It's a pleasure to present our 2022 Burgundy En Primeur review. As many of you will be aware, after the challenging and low-yielding 2021 vintage, vignerons are pleased to be back on track with a more generous harvest for 2022. Andrew and I were once again thrilled to return to the Côte d'Or (and the Mâconnais) to get to grips with the latest release; an experience we never take for granted. It is quite simply a moment in time where we are incredibly fortunate to be given the opportunity to taste direct from the barrel, discussing openly and at length with producers about all their hard work in both the vineyard and cellar, over the last 12 months.

There was a quiet, understated confidence emanating from producers during our tastings, and upon first impressions, it appears to be a modern masterpiece, where delightful wines in both white and red have been crafted. Comparing vintages is always tricky business as they truly are unique, nevertheless, Head Winemaker at Domaine Faiveley, Jérôme Flous, commented that 2022 was a "classic vintage... [it] was not too rich or concentrated", and during our extensive discussion said it reminded him of "2017 (for whites), but with more purity... and 2018 (for reds), yet with more finesse." Nicolas Rossignol from Domaine Rossignol-Trapet in Gevrey-Chambertin summarised the 2022 vintage succinctly as "having the climate of 2003, but the aromatic and flavour profile of 2020 and 2012, just with added spicy characteristics."

Interestingly having heard and read about the sporadic progression of the growing season, we were pleasantly surprised by what we found in the glass; vibrant, balanced, and charming wines brimming with energy and life. Although an improvement in yield was a welcome relief from the previous year, the 2022 vintage was not a bumper crop by any means with yields varying anywhere between 28 and 45 hectolitres. After the price increases of last year, we hope that they stabilise for this vintage (and with another good crop coming in the 2023 vintage), however, we are more discerning than ever in our buying policy. When tasting En Primeur we are looking for true expression; that of terroir, balance, structure, purity, and harmony. Above all, we search for wines we truly believe in, and feel represent value for money and stand out in the crowd.

Furthermore, as your independent wine merchant it is our job to continuously search for new and exciting Domaines. From smaller, up-and-coming appellations that we kindly refer to as 'petits villages', to more famous communes, and so we are delighted to welcome Claudie Jobard (Rully), and Joseph Pascal (Puligny-Montrachet) to our 2022 En Primeur offering. Although not a new producer for us as they have featured in our main portfolio for many years, it is the first time we have sold Saumaize-Michelin (Pouilly-Fuissé) En Primeur; their wines were simply stunning; and could easily hold their own against top Premier Cru Puligny-Montrachet.

Vintage and growing conditions

Winter 2021-22 was rather mild with slightly lower levels of rainfall but provided the water table with sufficient reserves. The risk of Spring frost was ever present in producers' minds; however, it did not occur as expected with a small bout through the nights of 10th-12th April where temperatures dropped to around -2°C. Although this wasn't any real cause for concern, some producers understandably still worked tirelessly during these nights to mitigate damage mainly with 'bougies' (candles) to put their minds at ease given track record of recent years.

As Spring arrived, so did the warmer weather and budburst ensued without any problems. The warm, dry conditions continued into May, allowing for almost perfect flowering mid-month, which resulted in high hopes for a much-needed abundant crop.

In June the hot weather continued until the second half of the month, when the course of the vintage changed due to storms and heavy rainfall on 21st-23rd June. Initially welcomed to replenish the already-depleted water table and alleviate possible hydric stress, feelings quickly turned to distress, with fears for vineyard damage (mainly erosion and mudslides) due to the extraordinary volume of water in such a short period of time. Nicolas Rossignol recalls that in Gevrey-Chambertin they had a "deluge of 170mm of rainfall in a week" and during one downpour "the rain was so heavy it was flowing down the street like a river; such was the power it even burst a few manhole covers as if it was nothing!". Down in Nuits-Saint-Georges at Domaine Faiveley, Jérôme Flous, commented that throughout May "unprecedented levels of rain had fallen (250mm), almost three times the 'norm' of 60mm."

Thankfully Mother Nature was kind to the vignerons and the remainder of the summer was one of the hottest, sunniest, and driest on records since the early 1990s with more than 40 days exceeding 30°C. When heatwaves came, they did so in manageable, short bursts rather than one long, grueling episode. The vines were therefore able to cope accordingly thanks to the rejuvenated water table, with little impact on quality of berries (even if some producers saw a slight reduction in yield). The risk of disease pressure was near to non-existent; another grand merci terre-mère! A small shower on August 19th nudged maturation over the finish line and harvest began in mid/late August for whites, and early September for reds. Overall, the grapes came into the wineries in very good health, balanced acidity, and moderate alcohol levels (12.5-13.5% ABV). Of course, the decision to pick is always dependent on vineyard management, house style, as well as winemaker preferences.

Whites: our vintage score 8.5 / 10

A good vintage that has created linear, pure, and precise wines with an emphasis on green, citrus, and white stone fruit (surprisingly less tropical and exotic fruit than you would expect from such a warm year). Again, we feel the best value is found at both Village and Premier Cru levels from Domaines Jean-Louis Chavy, Gérard Thomas, and Saumaize-Michelin, regardless of appellation. Irrespective of whether you prefer them youthful or with a bit of bottle age, these wines have good tension, energy and vivacity that won't disappoint.

Reds: our vintage score 9 / 10

A very good vintage that has produced attractive, vibrant, and juicy wines combining summer berry and bramble fruit with delicate floral overtones. We believe the best value to be found is Village and Premier Cru levels from Domaines AF Gros, Rossignol-Trapet, and Ambroise, regardless of appellation. These wines will provide great pleasure and drinkability in youth due to fantastic fruit purity and vivacity; yet also have the potential to age gracefully mid-term in the cellar.

After a devastating 2021 vintage that saw some appellations lose up to 80% of their yields, thankfully 2022 was less-challenging affair and saw a return to more generous (but not excessive) volumes. As already noted, it was one of the hottest, sunniest, and driest growing seasons on record in another so called "solar" year.

Charles Curtis MW (Decanter) remarked in his article **Burgundy 2022: What to expect** "Fortunately for wine lovers, the news from Burgundy this year is overwhelmingly positive. The quality of the 2022 vintage is very good, and the crop generally was abundant... While the wines may lack the sheer power of the 2019 vintage, or the titanic concentration of the 2018, it should generally provide the elegance of the 2017 vintage with more ripeness and fruit—a delightful prospect indeed."

Burgundy Guru, Jasper Morris (Inside Burgundy), concurs in his article **Burgundy 2022: Bountiful and Beautiful**, stating that "2022 is an amazingly consistent vintage. I tasted almost no poor wines. Everything was good to very good, with occasional touches of greatness... These are wines in both colours which will be appealing in their youth, are unlikely to close down, yet will last very well. Sounds good to me."

Our buying strategy

We continuously review our En Primeur buying strategy based on the performance of each vintage, with a focus on sourcing wines that we believe are the best from each appellation. We can therefore give you, the customer, a more personal and tailored service to suit your requirements and palate. We are very happy to talk you through the vintage and discuss what will best suit your cellar/palate.

Please be aware that as always, some Premier and Grand Cru wines are sold under allocation to those who have purchased them in previous years. However, if you are interested, please do let us know and we will do our very best to accommodate your request.

Our tasting notes are written from samples tried with producers direct from barrel at the Domaines, unless stated otherwise. As I am sure you will appreciate there is a lot of work that goes into producing this report, so a big thank you to my fellow Wine Buyer and En Primeur taster; Andrew Ray, who travelled to Burgundy in November with me, and has been instrumental in creating this report. We do hope you enjoy.

SÉGUINOT BORDET





Séguinot Bordet is the oldest producer in Chablis with records dating back to 1590. The estate is based in Maligny (8km from Chablis itself) and has 20-hectares under vine consisting of 2.5-hectares of Petit Chablis, 16-hectares of Chablis, and 1.5-hectares of Premier Cru Chablis with a small amount of Grand Cru Chablis. Jean-François Bordet places particular emphasis on obtaining the best fruit possible through careful pruning and de-budding, as well as harvesting at optimum ripeness. In the ultramodern cellar, cool fermentation in stainless steel tanks preserves freshness followed by 3-5 months on their lees adds textural richness to counterbalance the iconic vibrant acidity.

Jean-François has once again created pure, elegant, and refined wines in 2022 that won't disappoint. We have worked closely together for over 15 years now, and it's truly wonderful to see the estate (and wines) continue to go from strength to strength.

Petit Chablis 2022 (screw cap)

£130 IB (12x75cl)

Located at the top of the slope above Maligny where the combination of limestone and Kimmeridgian clay soils create bright, vibrant, and approachable wines.

"Enticing aromas of green apple, lemon citrus with a touch of verbena. Crisp and clean with vibrant, racy acidity on the mid-palate with a core of further citrus and green fruit with a dash of white pepper on the finish." Drink 2024-2027. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

Chablis 2022 (screw cap)

£140 IB (12x75cl)

Grapes come from south and southeastern facing plots near Maligny and have an average age of 25-40-years old. Again, the iconic Kimmeridgian clay produces wines with classic citrus fruit and underlying flinty characteristics.

"A fuller, more fruit-forward nose (than the Petit Chablis) of citrus and green fruit, which fuse with added ripe melon and acacia flowers. Juicy style with plenty of structure and poise where the white stone and citrus intermingle with the flinty, mineral acidity that leads into a saline, driven finish. Bravo." Drink 2024-2028. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

Chablis 1er Cru 'Fourchaume' 2022

£125 IB (6x75cl)

Situated in the north of the appellation along the right bank of the River Serein, nestled in between the Premier Cru vineyards of 'L'Homme Mort' and 'Vaulorent' where vines have an average age of 45-60-years old. Fourchaume is one of the best Premier Cru vineyards in Chablis.

"Attractive aromas of green apple and lemon citrus underpinned by a deft flinty edge. Impressive structure and power, yet refined and poised thanks to a streak of linear, taught acidity that cuts through the further citrus fruit dominant core and honeysuckle infused finish. A firm favourite." Drink 2024-2029. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

SAMUEL BILLAUD





Samuel Billaud is part of an esteemed Chablis family and was the former head winemaker at the iconic Chablis estate: Billaud-Simon. After a family feud, he left the family Domaine and decided to go it alone – a bold and masterful move. Samuel built a new winery in the heart of Chablis, and crafts excellent wines from Village to Grand Cru level using both his own vines (after reclaiming parcels of Les Clos and Vaudésir Grand Cru), as well buying in grapes from only the very best *climats* using his deep-rooted connections with vignerons in the village.

Samuel Billaud is without a doubt one of Chablis' rising stars with Neal Martin (Vinous), William Kelley (Wine Advocate), and most recently Jasper Morris MW (Jasper Morris: Inside Burgundy) having touted him as one of the region's top producers alongside François Raveneau and Vincent Dauvissat.

Petit Chablis 2022 £110 IB (6x75cl)

Grapes are sourced from vines located higher up the slope, just above the Grand Cru vineyards of 'Les Clos' and 'Vaudésir'.

"Bright aromas of lemon, peach, apricot, and a touch of orange blossom. So vibrant and pure on the palate with linear, zippy acidity that provides direction flowing into a further core of citrus and white stone fruit with a wonderful white pepper-infused finish. Frankly, it's not so 'petit'!" Drink 2024-2027. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

Chablis 'Les Grands Terroirs' 2022

RECOMMENDED

£130 IB (6x75cl)

Combination of 3 parcels adjoining several Premier Cru vineyards. The backbone comes from the 80-year-old plot of 'Les Cartes', whilst both 'Les Pargues' and 'Bas de Chapelots' provide precision and energy.

"Attractive aromas of lemon, peach, and apricot with a lifted chamomile note. Impressive purity and finesse on the palate with seamless balance between creamy complexity, and racy acidity... such fantastic tension, focus, and poise leads into a supercharged lemon citrus and crunchy green apple dominant core and a tingling mineral-infused finish. A fantastic Chablis." Drink 2024-2028. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

Chablis 1er Cru 'Montmains' 2022

£245 IB (6x75cl)

One of the best Premier Cru vineyards thanks to its long, narrow trajectory that catches the morning sun and creates wonderfully pure wines.

"Seductive nose of green apple, lemon, and white stone fruit intermingle. Intense and compact on the palate with a multi-layered core of further citrus and white stone fruit fused with a wonderful mineral bolt of acidity that provides structure and backbone to the wine. Vivid, vibrant, and powerful with seamless balance. Very impressive." Drink 2028-2038+. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

Chablis 1er Cru 'Butteaux' 2022

RECOMMENDED

£255 IB (6x75cl)

Located to the southwest of the village, the vineyard is known for its limestone-rich soils where the wines are taught, steely, and precise. 'Butteaux' is a climat located within the 'Montmains' vineyard and is considered as the pinnacle of Chablis Premier Cru.

"Striking aromas of green apple, peach, and apricot fuse with added grapefruit pith. Superb power, weight, and structure with a creamy, rounded texture balanced by linear, taught acidity that is so focused and defined. There's more ripe white stone fruits and white pepper spice on the long, lingering finish.

Fantastic." Drink 2028-2038+. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

Chablis 1er Cru 'Vaillons' 2022

£255 IB (6x75cl)

Situated on the left bank of the river Serein, grapes sourced from 60-year-old vines with a south-easterly exposure that captures all the morning sun. Matured in stainless steel only.

"...the 2022 Chablis Vaillons Vieilles Vignes 1er Cru is very backward on the nose with light iodine and oyster shell scents. The palate is well balanced, taut, and linear, very saline in the mouth, the marine-influence finish is calling for a huge turrine of fruits de mer. Don't say I didn't warn you! Excellent." Drink 2025-2042. 91-93/100 points. Neal Martin (Vinous)

Chablis 'Bougros' Grand Cru 2022

ON ALLOCATION

£550 IB (6x75cl)

Undeniably one of the best Chablis Grand Cru climats. Located on the right bank of the river Serein, it has a remarkable south-east exposure and is also the steepest slope of all Grand Cru helping to produce full-bodied, rich Chablis for the long haul.

"Partly vinified in stainless steel and partly in oak demi-muids, this is a fine and harmonious Bougros with beautiful, honeyed fruit complemented by crisp acidity and a mouthwatering aftertaste." Charles Taylor MW

Chablis 'Blanchots' Grand Cru 2022

ON ALLOCATION

£585 IB (6x75cl)

The most easterly of all Chablis Grand Cru vineyards, where the location on clay-limestone soils and extended sunshine hours creates a refined and sophisticated wine. The parcel is in the centre of the vineyard and vines have an average age of 35 to 40-years-old.

"Powerful and inviting nose of citrus and white stone fruit with an exotic twist. There's serious weight here and this is a wine that isn't afraid to flex its muscles and leads into a buttery, silky texture that coats the palate. Nevertheless, there's great tension balanced by an abundance of further lemon, peach, and apricot, all boosted by a vein of precise, mineral acidity and finely tuned oak on the marathon finish. A showstopper." Drink 2032-2042+. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

Chablis 'Vaudésir' Grand Cru 2022

ON ALLOCATION

£585 IB (6x75cl)

A blend of two parcels at opposite sides of the valley; one facing east, and the other facing west where the former brings freshness, and the latter maturity.

"Serious, captivating aromas of apple and lemon with a hint of verbena and vanilla spice. Complex and compact with wonderful tension thanks to the brimming oyster-shell infused acidity that reverberates throughout the core similar green and citrus fruit with white pepper spice. Very taught, precise, and well-balanced with serious focus and length. Très bon." Drink 2032-2042+. (JG/AR. Tasted at Moor Park in December 2023)

CLAUDIE JOBARD





Claudie Jobard boasts a proud viticultural and vinicultural heritage as her mother, Laurence, was the head winemaker at Joseph Drouhin for many years, and her father, Roger, founded one of the region's top vine nurseries. Roger developed the family Domaine in the 1970s through buying and planting land in Rully, which has now come to fruition as most of the vines are over 40 years-old and are producing some excellent wines. Claudie took charge of the estate in 2002, after graduating from her oenology degree, and changed the direction of the Domaine by stopping selling to négociants, and instead started a new venture by bottling wines under her own name.

After a miniscule crop in 2021 where Claudie only produce 7hl/ha, she is back with a bang with her 2022s and we are thrilled to add them to our En Primeur offering this year.

Rully Blanc 'Montagne La Folie' 2022

NEW/RECOMMENDED £120 IB (6x75cl)

2.5-hectares of vines with an average age of 47 years-old from a stony site near the village of Chagny, in the northeast of the appellation. 10-15% new oak.

"Vibrant aromas of lemon and white peach fused with more exotic undertones. So luscious and generous with a creamy, rounded texture that leads into a multilayered core of lemon, laced with white pepper spice all kept in check thanks to the racy, linear acidity. Superb." Drink 2024-2028. (JG/AR. Tasted at the Domaine with Claudie Jobard in November 2023)

Rully Blanc 1er Cru 'Les Cloux' 2022

NEW/RECOMMENDED £180 IB (6x75cl)

Certainly one of Rully's best Premier Cru vineyards. A minute parcel of 70-year-old vines from the south-facing, pebble-rich soil on steep slopes. 20% new oak.

"Focused nose of green apple and ripe pear with an added touch of honey. Lovely texture and density with impressive power and structure with an ample, creamy complexity balanced by a dash of mineral acidity providing tension, drive, and length. Gorgeous." Drink 2024-2030. (JG/AR. Tasted at the Domaine with Claudie Jobard in November 2023)

Bourgogne Cote d'Or 'Cuvée Miliane' 2022

NEW/RECOMMENDED £100 IB (6x75cl)

A single hectare of 80 to 100-year-old vines in Pommard on low-lying land below the Château. Crafted in homage to all the hardworking women at the Domaine, and aptly named after Claudie's maternal grandmother: Emily-Anne. 15% new oak.

"Wow, serious nose of red and black cherry, strawberry, and cranberry with added hedgerow fruit. Concentrated, and well-structured with juicy, silky tannins that wrap around a core of bright, vibrant summer berry and bramble fruit fused with black pepper spice on the lingering finish." Drink 2024-2028. (JG/AR. Tasted at the Domaine with Claudie Jobard in November 2023)

Rully Rouge 'La Chaume' 2022

NEW/RECOMMENDED £110 IB (6x75cl)

2.5-hectares of 45-year-old-vines planted just opposite Château de Rully, and Claudie's Rully 'En Villerange' plot to the south of the appellation. 100% destemmed fruit and 15% new oak.

"Bright, forward aromas of raspberry, cherry, and strawberry with a delicate fragrant lift. Juicy, plump, and generous on the mid-palate thanks to the ripe, rounded tannins with a little grip that adds structure yet is balanced by more savoury raspberry and cranberry fruit. GÉRARD THOMAS ET FILLES





Gérard Thomas has led this Saint-Aubin estate since 1982, however, his two daughters (Anne-Sophie and Isabelle) now run the day-to-day operation. Gérard has expanded organically by purchasing vines throughout the Côte de Beaune with acquisitions in Saint-Aubin, as well as Chassagne-Montrachet and Puligny-Montrachet, today owning a combined total of 12-hectares throughout all appellations. Several passes through the vineyards during harvest ensure optimum ripeness; everything is done by hand with careful treatment of complete bunches to avoid oxidation. All wines are barrel fermented with 25% new oak (renewed annually), followed by ten months ageing in barrels with regular lees stirring to add depth and complexity. They have recently changed supplier from Gillet to Montgillard, resulting in finer, more elegant wines with less toasted oak emphasis.

The continuous refinement and attention to detail Isabelle and Anne show year upon year is why they are considered one of Saint-Aubin's best producers, and offer some of the finest value wines in the Côte de Beaune.

Saint-Aubin 'Champ Tirant' 2022

RECOMMENDED

£120 IB (6x75cl)

Found to the west of the village where it borders the Premier Cru vineyard 'Les Castets'. The combined 1.63-hectares of vines on a gentle limestone slope produces one of the most consistent and best value White Burgundies in our portfolio.

"Bright, charming nose of green apple and pear fused with gentle smoky, toasted oak. A slightly creamy mouthfeel is reinforced by vibrant, zippy acidity that flows through into a further green apple, pear, and citrus fruit core and vanilla spice on the fine finish." Saint-Aubin 1er Cru 'Les Murgers des Dents de Chien' 2022 RECOMMENDED £160 IB (6x75cl)

1.82-hectares of vines planted between 1981 and 1999. It borders the Puligny-Montrachet Premier Cru vineyards 'Champs Gains' and 'La Garenne' to the east and located above 'Chevalier-Montrachet' Grand Cru.

"A more complex nose (compared to Champ Tirant) with an abundance of white stone verging exotic fruit fused with toasted oak spice. Excellent power, weight, and concentration on the mid-palate with its chiselled structure and backbone of linear, racy acidity that provides flow and tension. Puligny-Montrachet 'Le Trézin' 2022

0.52-hectares of vines planted in 1973 and 1978. A hidden gem at the top of the slope bordering the Premier Cru vineyards of 'La Garenne' and 'Sous Le Puits'.

The rich, rounded, and creamy texture is supported by a wonderful streak of mineral-infused acidity that adds energy and focus, leading into a core of more green and citrus fruit with a generous dash of white pepper spice." Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru 'La Garenne' 2022

A 0.57-hectare parcel where vines date back to 1983. This is the highest vineyard of all the Puligny-Montrachet Premier Cru vineyards and is situated at the top of the hill (on the Meursault side).

"Full, rich, and enticing nose of green apple, yellow plum, and honeysuckle integrated with delicate toasted oak spice. Luscious and seductive mouthfeel with a wonderful creamy consistency is supported by a streak of linear, vibrant acidity that wraps around a further green and white stone fruit core. Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru 'Les Chenevottes' 2022 RECOMMENDED £300 IB (6x75cl)

A small holding of just 0.32-hectares of vines planted in 1975, 1985 and some replanting in 2016, situated very close to 'Le Montrachet' Grand Cru.

"Forward, concentrated nose of green apple and white peach married with vanilla spice and gentle honeysuckle overtones. Multi-layered and complex on the palate that explodes into more exotic fruit that combines with the juicy, bright, and uplifting acidity that gives the wine a seamless balance and precision. More green and white stone fruit with added white pepper spice leading into a long-lasting finish. Once again, the star of the show." Drink 2024-2034+. (JG/AR. JOSEPH PASCAL





A true family affair as the Domaine started in the 1950s when Jean Pascal (who worked at Domaine Leflaive at the time) started buying up parcels of land with his wife Céline. Later in 1970s, their son Jean-Luc joined them and formed Domaine Jean Pascal et Fils, followed by their son, Jean-Luc, and his wife Alexandra in the early 2000s. Fast-forward to 2023 and the Pascal estate is now named after the next generation: Joseph Pascal. Their 15-hectares of vines makes them one of the larger properties in Puligny-Montrachet, however, there is no compromise on quality with the crop now being vinified and bottled at the Domaine. All wines are barrel fermented with the casks being supplied by four local tonnelleries; Berthomieu, Montgillet, Meyrieux, and Rousseau.

We were seriously impressed with the wines as well as the new, state-of-the-art tasting room at the Domaine. An exciting new estate and we're therefore delighted to include them in our En Primeur offering this year.

Bourgogne Côte d'Or Chardonnay 2022

NEW/RECOMMENDED £100 IB (6x75cl)

The majority of grapes are sourced from Puligny-Montrachet with the remainder coming from the neighbouring village of Corpeau. 80% barrel fermented, of which 10% is new.

"Charming aromas of lemon and green apple with a lifted chamomile edge. Bright, pure, and precise on the mid-palate with a touch of creaminess to balance the vibrant acidity and further green and citrus core. Very good." Drink 2024-2028. (JG/AR. "Attractive nose of green apple, pear, and white flowers. Wow, fantastic multi-layered core of further green apple and pear with added citrus and white pepper spice undertones balanced by a creamy, rounded texture that adds weight and structure. Ample, generous, and gourmand on the palate, yet so pure with plenty of energy, focus, and precision wrapping around more white stone and exotic fruit with well-integrated vanilla spice. JEAN-LOUIS CHAVY





Jean-Louis Chavy is based in the heart of Puligny-Montrachet where he has 7-hectares of vines (his share of the family estate: Domaine Gérard Chavy), which was divided between his younger brother, Alain, and himself. Production is split approximately 25% Bourgogne Blanc, 50% Village and 25% Premier Cru (including holdings of 'Le Champ Gain', 'Le Clavoillon', 'Les Perrières' and 'Les Folatières'). The wines represent such good value that there is a long waiting list of merchants desperate for an allocation; therefore, naturally we are delighted to receive ours once again.

Jean-Louis' son, Paul, is ever more prominent in all aspects at the Domaine and is seemingly a chip off the old block, carrying on the house style of crafting pure and precise wines allowing the superb fruit quality to shine through using old vines, as well as integrated use of oak.

Bourgogne Chardonnay 2022

RECOMMENDED

A combination of four parcels that total roughly 2-hectares from younger vines.

"Forward aromas of green apple and lemon citrus with a deft honeyed edge. Wonderful freshness and intensity with zingy, vivid acidity that emphasises the seamless tension, purity, and poise that if tasted blind, could easily be mistaken for a young Puligny-Montrachet. Two separate plots of 25 to 45-year-old vines totalling 1.3-hectares. The first is in the steepest stoniest part close to Blagny, which contributes excellent acidity and structure; the other is from lower down the slope where the soil is richer, in turn giving greater richness and concentration.

"Inviting nose of ripe green apple and lemon citrus with a delicate and elegant chamomile lift. Deceivingly rich and rounded on the mid-palate, yet retains elegance and grace thanks to the reverberating, mineral-infused acidity that provides sensational tension and drive. VINCENT LATOUR





The Latour-Labille family boast a long, rich history and have been making wine in Meursault since 1792. Vincent took over the family Domaine from his father Jean in 1998. He was then joined by his wife, Cécile, and changed the name from Domaine Jean Latour et Labille, to Domaine Latour from the 2010 vintage onwards. Since his arrival Vincent has implemented many changes (and in turn improvements), from the inclusion of whole cluster fermentation, adaptation of demi-muids and foudres, as well as longer élévage (12 months in old or large oak, followed by 4 to 6 months in stainless steel vats without any bâtonnage to avoid masking fruit).

Vincent is certainly one of Meursault's rising stars, and has gained local as well as international recognition in recent years. A new cellar and state-of-the-art tasting room have both been recently completed, taking this already impressive Domaine to the next level. The next generation is coming through too as Vincent's son, Thomas, has joined the family business (whilst also completing a stage in Chassagne-Montrachet with Domaine Jean-Marc Pillot).

Chassagne-Montrachet 'Les Benoites' 2022

NEW/RECOMMENDED £270 IB (6x75cl)

A small parcel of vines located underneath the Premier Cru vineyards of 'La Chapelle' and 'Guerchère' and flanked by 'Champs de Morjot' and 'Les Battaudes'.

"Intense and inviting nose of lemon citrus and crunchy green apple combined with fragrant verbena and honeysuckle overtones. Generous and abundant with a silky mouthfeel complemented by the pure, precise, and uplifting acidity that underpins a further citrus and white stone fruit core with a dash of white pepper spice that seals the deal." Rich, rounded, and ample on the mid-palate with great intensity, balance, and focus thanks to excellent purity of further citrus and exotic fruit core and taught, mineral acidity leading into long, linear finish." Meursault 'Les Narvaux' 2022

A minute 0.57-hectare plot planted in 1989 on limestone-clay soils. Without a doubt one of the most famous lieu-dit located next to the Premier Cru vineyards of 'Les Genevrières' and 'Les Poruzots'.

A wonderful buttery and rounded texture providing weight, structure, and concentration, yet is beautifully balanced by vivid, linear acidity that is just so pure and precise. The pure, silky, and seductive texture combines effortlessly with notable power and concentration on the multi-layered core of ripe exotic fruit with extremely well-integrated vanilla spice. Meursault 1er Cru 'Perrières' 2022

A miniscule 0.18-hectare parcel planted in 1964 and are the last vines before you reach Puligny-Montrachet. 'Les Perrières' is rightly credited as one of the top three Premier Cru vineyards in Meursault and is seemingly a combination of its peers: the minerality of 'Les Genevrières' and the roundness of 'Charmes', which creates the fullest, and most powerful Meursault Premier Cru.

"Beguiling aromas of grapefruit, mandarin, mango, and pineapple culminate in a honeysuckle twist. Impressive depth and concentration because of the rich, rounded, and generous mouthfeel that combines effortlessly with the linear, precise acidity and flows into more exotic fruit with added quince spice on the minute-long finish." Drink 2026-2036+. (AR/JG. Tasted at Domaine with Vincent Latour in November 2023)

SAUMAIZE-MICHELIN





Saumaize-Michelin was created in 1977, when Roger Saumaize received 4-hectares of vines in Vergisson (the heart of the Pouilly-Fuissé appellation). A year later in 1978, he fully took over his father's estate. Over the subsequent decades along with his wife Christine (whose maiden surname is Michelin, hence the winery name), they have naturally increased vineyard holdings throughout Mâcon, Saint-Véran, and Pouilly-Fuissé to its current holding of 9.5-hectares. The estate has been producing wines according to biodynamic principles since 2005, and as a result, the old vines (40 to 45-years-old) are naturally low-yielding and disease-resistant, resulting in wines with increased complexity.

As prices have continued to rise in the Côte de Beaune in recent years, regions such as the Mâconnais have become more popular and attractive. Even more so since the approval of Premier Cru status for Pouilly-Fuissé from the 2020 vintage, in addition to wine critics and writers such as Neal Martin (Vinous), William Kelley (Wine Advocate), and Allen Meadows (Bugrhound) confidently placing Saumaize-Michelin alongside the iconic producers of Jean-Marie Guffens-Heynen and Daniel Barraud.

We have been loyal supporters of Saumaize-Michelin for several years, however, we were simply blown away by the quality of the 2022s when tasted at the Domaine with Roger; it is definitely the best vintage yet. We are, of course, extremely excited to include them in our En Primeur offering this year.

Mâcon-Villages 2022 NEW £80 IB (6x75cl)

Grapes are sourced from a plot of old vines (50-years-old) called 'Les Sertaux' in the village of Bussières, just outside of the Pouilly-Fuissé appellation.

"Explosion of white stone fruits intertwine with mango, pineapple, and subtle spice. The impressive creamy, silky texture is underpinned by wonderful tension thanks to crisp, mineral-infused acidity that wraps around a core of grapefruit, orange, and mango with added toasted oak spice. JEAN-JACQUES GIRARD





Founded in 1529 by Jean Girard, the Domaine lays claim to be run by one of Savigny-Les-Beaune's oldest vigneron families. Spearheaded by Jean-Jacques Girard and his wife, Agnès, together they own a total of 18-hectares throughout the Côte D'Or; namely in Savigny-Les-Beaune as well as small parcels in Pernand-Vergelesses, Beaune, Pommard, Volnay and Aloxe-Corton. In certain circumstances Jean-Jacques purchases grapes from long-term, trusted contacts for wines where he has no plantings of his own (e.g. Meursault). There is no denying that Domaine Jean-Jacques Girard is one of our favourite producers that provide a great range for all occasions delivering consistent quality and superb value wines.

Over the last few years there has been a changing of the guard as Jean-Jacques' sons, Vincent, and François, have stepped forward to lead the estate, however, the spirit and ethos remain the same. Jean-Jacques is still on hand to guide and advise, and seemingly his son's carry his midas touch as once again they've crafted excellent wines in both colours with typical house trademark vibrancy and juiciness. Bravo les gars!

Bourgogne Aligoté 2022 NEW £50 IB (6x75cl)

Grapes sourced from throughout Burgundy crafting a bright, lively, and refreshing alternative to Chardonnay.

"Bright, forward aromas of lemon and white peach intertwine with a touch of pineapple. AMBROISE





Maison Ambroise's origins date back to the 18th century when only a few parcels had been planted around Nuits-Saint-Georges. However, it was not until Bertrand Ambroise took over the vineyard from his father-in-law in 1987, working extensively and gradually expanding the Domaine to its current size of 20-hectares. Bertrand built a reputation for full-bodied and opulent wines and now his children, François and Ludivine, run the winery under the new name Domaine Ambroise Frère et Soeur.

The siblings have introduced a more refined and elegant style too by moving ageing to 400L foudres, which maximises the purity of fruit to really come through in their wines. It's fantastic to see the next generation coming through at the estate and forging a new identity; François is certainly excelling having won the Côte de Nuits Young Winemaker of the Year 2022 award. Bravo, François!

Bourgogne Cuvée Vieilles Vignes 2022

FAIVELEY





The Faiveley family have lived and worked Nuits-Saint-Georges since 1825. From 2007, Domaine Faiveley has been in the capable hands of the seventh generation with siblings Erwan, and Eve Faiveley, working alongside head winemaker Jérôme Flous. The 115-hectare Domaine is split between a 78-hectare estate in Mercurey (Côte Chalonnaise), as well as a further 37-hectares throughout several leading appellations in the Côte d'Or including Nuits-Saint-Georges, Gevrey-Chambertin, and Chambolle-Musigny as well as lesser-known appellations such as Marsannay and Ladoix.

It is now one of the largest producers in Burgundy, though the vineyards are run with military precision where nothing is left to chance, as several teams keep a close eye on the viticultural programme. Their aim for elegance and finesse is now being rewarded with each wine possessing individual character and quality, a great reflection of the Domaine's terroir. Faiveley's impressive brand-new winery completed in 2017, as well as contributes to their steady rise in quality, profile, and demand for their wines around the world.

Mercurey 'La Framboisière' Rouge 2022

ROSSIGNOL-TRAPET





Archives show that the Rossignol family have run vineyards in the famous Côte de Nuits since the 16th century so brothers Nicolas and David Rossignol, have plenty of experience to draw upon when creating their wines. The Domaine has grown steadily over the last few decades thanks to a refinement in winemaking techniques, the construction of a new winery in Gevrey-Chambertin in the late 1990's, as well as the improvement and management of vineyard health.

Conscious that great wines are made first and foremost in the vineyard, the brothers started their change to biodynamic farming in 1997, beginning their Chapelle-Chambertin Grand Cru vineyard. They converted the whole Domaine in 2004 and were fully certified in 2005. They own a total of 13-hectares of vines throughout Gevrey-Chambertin as well as a few plots around Beaune, creating excellent quality wines with incredible elegance and sophistication.

We are great supporters of Rossignol-Trapet having bought their wines for almost 15 years. It is a real joy to have seen the development and progression of the estate in that time, which has seen them become one of the true superstars of Burgundy.

Bourgogne Rouge 2022

A miniscule 0.85-hectare plot planted in 1999 in 'En Grands Champs', which borders 'La Burie', 'Pressonnier' and 'Croix de Champs'.

In 1988, Anne-Françoise Gros established Domaine A.F. Gros, when her parents, Jean, and Janine Gros, decided to relieve a few parcels of the family Domaine. At the same time, Anne-Françoise acquired another Domaine in Flagey-Échezeaux, and later with her husband, François Parent, purchased a vineyard in Savigny-Les-Beaune.

The whole Domaine is now run by their children, Mathias (winemaker), and Caroline (commercial sales), who create some of the most elegant, sophisticated, and sought-after wines in Burgundy. They currently own 10-hectares of vines throughout Vosne-Romanée, Gevrey-Chambertin, Chambolle-Musigny in the Côte de Nuits, Pommard in the Côte de Beaune, as well as Moulin-À-Vent in Beaujolais. There is a négociant side to the business too where grapes are bought through long-term contracts with trusted growers, which are bottled under the label: Maison Parent-Gros.

It is incredible to see how far this Domaine has come in such a short space of time under Mathias and Caroline's guidance, and we are extremely excited to see their progression in the coming years. It is, without a doubt, one of the most fascinating estates in Burgundy and certainly one to watch (if not already on your radar!)

(Domaine) Pommard 1er Cru 'Les Pezerolles' 2022

A tiny 0.30-hectare plot of this Premier Cru vineyard situated near the Beaune border. Two-thirds of vines are 25 to 30-years-old (vibrancy and energy), and one-third are 70 to 75-years-old (depth and concentration).

Serious and grown-up palate due to the ripe, fine-grained tannins and plush, velvety core of similar hedgerow fruit and black forest gateau undertones.
