

OPENING & WELCOME



How they got started

In 1989, the Governor's Commission on Sports & Physical Fitness passed an endorsement that Virginia Amateur Sports (VAS) would serve as the state organization to hold the State Games of Virginia. In 1992, the Games were officially named the Commonwealth Games of Virginia. In 1990, the initial Games drew 4,400 athletes competing in 29 sports. More than 290,000 athletes, their families plus spectators have participated during the past 34 years.

Credentials

VAS is a member of the National Congress of State Games (NCSG) and is sanctioned and recognized by the NCSG, the Virginia High School League (VHSL), the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), and by the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee as a member of their USOPC multi-sport organizational council.

Funding

In 1990, when the Games started, VAS had secured a \$175,000 grant from the state to launch the Games. By 2001, VAS lost all state funding. Despite the loss of state funding, VAS perservered and expanded its staff and programs. With zero funding from the state, local governments increased their financial support in addition to providing fields and facilities. VAS tries to keep the cost to participate in the Games minimal, with the majority of funding coming from sponsors. The Games have had four title sponsors in their history - Cor-East, Southern Health/Coventry, Subway and now Liberty University.

Support

With its dedication to a tradition of excellence & with a staff of four, VAS relies heavily on outside support. That support includes over 1,000 volunteers, 60+ volunteer sport coordinators, a volunteer local organizing committee made up of individuals from supporting localities, other business professionals, volunteers from the medical profession field, security and police departments, and the VAS board of directors.

The Virginia Commonwealth Games at Liberty University

Going into its 35th year, the Virginia Commonwealth Games at Liberty University, this annual event is held in July (for most sports) and is open to all ages and skill levels. From baseball to wrestling, this event offers sports competition venues for 30+ different Olympic, Pan American, and recreational sports.

The Games represent the true spirit of amateur athletics. For some, this celebration of sport is a stepping stone for following the dream of representing the United States in the Olympic Games. For others, the Games are a place to compete in a favorite pastime. Regardless of the age or skill of the athlete, the Games provide the pure pleasure of competing for the love of sport.

The Virginia Commonwealth Games at Liberty University are more than sports events; they go much deeper. The Games teach values such as teamwork and good sportsmanship, which are important components of everyday life. The Games encourage athletes to develop and improve their physical talent and competitive abilities. Lastly, the ideals of the Games promote physical fitness and encourage Virginians to adopt a healthy lifestyle.



ClaraLee Ripley has competed in 30 of the VA Commonwealth Games

Athlete Spotlight

Competitors in a certain age group in July's VA Commonwealth Games will have a youngster to compete with this year. "Youngster" being a relative term, of course.

ClaraLee Ripley will turn 85 before the Games kick off, so she is now in the 85-89 age bracket.

"I've been promoted to the next age group so I'm the youngster now," ClaraLee said.

Not that she needs any advantages to do well in the Games, Ripley has amassed quite a haul of medals in the 30 years she has been a regular competitor in the Commonwealth Games and the Virginia Senior Games.

"I've won a total of 225 medals in the Commonwealth Games and Senior Games in the 50-, 100-, and 200-meter dashes, the long jump, triple jump, shot put and discus," she said.

Those are the events she will compete in again this year, but they are just a sample of her athletic prowess. Ripley competed in 18 different sports along the way, starting with ping pong in 1995 where she won her first bronze medal.

A physical education teacher and coach, during her 32-year career, she was at G.W.H.S. in Danville for 29 years and before that, 3 years at E.C. Glass in Lynchburg. Following that, she founded the G.W.H.S. girls' Tennis team.

While in the 6th grade, she won the Triple Jump for the whole school at the big year end Field Day Event.

The Triple Jump was then called, the "Hop, Step, and Jump." Ironically, 49 years later in 1999 at the Inaugural State Games of America in St. Louis. At age 60, she won the Triple Jump for the whole nation taking first in her age group. At that event she also took home Gold in the 100m and 200m, then earning silver by a tiny margin in the long jump.

In 2008 ClaraLee was honored, along with two outstanding male athletes to be inducted into the Danville Register and Bee, Sports Hall of Fame. It is one of her most cherished athletic awards.

Like most of the competitors at the Games, the competition is secondary. Fellowship and camaraderie are the primary motivations for returning year after year.


"I enjoy seeing the same people year to year," she said.

There is also a benefit to maintaining wellness with a goal of competing in mind.

"The Commonwealth Games keep me motivated to keep my muscles in shape," Ripley said.

Staying in shape is important. She goes to the gym regularly and plays pickleball weekly to stay active. Additionally, ClaraLee has been a leader in Bible Study Fellowship International for 30 years.

ClaraLee Ripley is not unique. She knows when she sees friends each July that others also look forward to getting out on the track for competition and friendship. The Virginia Commonwealth Games Masters Track & Field events will take place July 21st at Liberty University's Matthes-Hopkins Complex. Consider coming out to cheer them on; or better yet, consider registering to compete.

Virginian to represent the Commonwealth and Team USA in Paris

Coach Spotlight

From the halls of a small Virginia high school to the bright lights of Paris, Coach Delethea Quarles has traveled an amazing route. Her journey hits its pinnacle in early August when she will be one of the coaches for Team USA track and field at the Olympics in Paris.

Quarles, known universally as Coach Dee, will coach the women's jumping events and the heptathlon.

Quarles, now the director of track and field at James Madison University, this is her first chance to be on the Team USA coaching staff at the Olympics, although she has coached the United States' team in other international events, including serving as head women's coach in IAAF World Championships in Beijing in 2015.

Earning a spot as a coach for TeamUSA is a highpressure, performance based selection akin to making the team as an athlete. It starts with application to be a coach for junior events and lower-tier international meets. In those roles, Coach Dee has traveled to Russia, Qatar, South Korea, Canada and Brazil. Along the way, she made the grade that allowed her to apply to remain on the international staff.

"You're graded on performance," she said. "You have to get a certain grade to be able to apply again. It's a great time but a high-pressure time."

Because most athletes being their personal coaches, the team coach is less an instructor and more of a logistics expert. In addition to meetings, events, schedules and a thousand other items to coordinate for the athletes, Coach Dee has to be knowledgeable about an event to be an instructional coach if a situation arises where a personal coach is not available. More important, she has to be closely watching the competition in case a protest needs filed on behalf of an American athlete.

"My eyes are to be on my events in case there's a protest," she says. "We have to communicate if we need to go to protest table; you only have a certain amount of time. A lot of technical things related to fairness are things we look out for especially. Plus we are there to promote team unity. The men and women operate as one team. We do everything we can for our athletes to get on the podium."

In 2016, Coach Dee went to the Olympics in Rio de Janeiro as the personal coach for high jumper Jeannelle Scheper, a national champion at South Carolina who represented St. Lucia at the Rio Games.

For Quarles, coaching the heptathlon is a natural. She excelled in the event in her days as a college athlete, earning all-American status three times, including as a freshman at Campbell University, then twice at Liberty University.

A Virginia native who grew up in Covington, Quarles was a multi-event athlete for Alleghany







High School, but high school meets did not have a heptathlon. Brant Tolsma, a coach at Campbell University, recognized that Quarles had the ability in multiple events to be a strong heptathlete.

"My college coach recruited me with a hand-written letter, where he told me what the heptathlon was and said I had done a lot of those events in high school and I'd be good at it," Coach Dee says. "He said I could be all-American as a freshman. I went there and a lot of what he predicted came true."

Tolsma, left Campbell for Liberty when the women's program was getting started under head coach Ron Hopkins. Quarles followed Tolsma to Liberty, grateful for the chance to compete closer to her hometown. She was so successful that she was inducted into the Liberty University Athletics Hall of Fame.

"It's a whole different place from my time. It's humbling to walk on campus," Quarles says.

Coming home is special to Coach Dee. After graduating from LU, she spent eight years on its coaching staff, she went to work on the staff at the University of South Carolina where she spent 25 successful years coaching 50 all-Americans and two national champions in jumps, including Scheper, and multisport events.

In 2022, she got the call to come home again, returning to Virginia as the track and field director at JMU.

"It's special to come home," Coach Dee says. "You're home and people know you. They've known you since you were young. They are all invested in your success."

And now the entire country is invested. Her jacket isn't about a state or a university. It says "USA."
