or Jordanian-Palestinian Basma Abdulhadi, becoming a bag designer was never part of the plan. Born and raised in Amman, Basma had completed a degree in criminology at the University of Boston and was taking a well-earned holiday at her family's home in Göcek, Türkiye, when she happened upon women working on wooden looms in a neighbouring seaside village.

"It felt like I was witnessing something from hundreds of years ago," says Basma, who was fascinated by the skeletal looms. "They were taking offcuts of cotton or silk trucked in from Istanbul, spinning them into yarn and then weaving them into these beautiful new materials." Called dokuma – meaning 'handwoven' in Turkish – the fabrics were the very definition of sustainable materials, salvaged from scraps otherwise destined for the bin. Depending on the style of the dokuma, it could take anywhere between two and 20 days to make a metre, taking the term 'slow fashion' to a new level. Impulsively, Basma bought some fabric. "I kept going back and buying more, with no real purpose – it was just beautiful. But eventually. I knew I had to make something with it."

Despite not having any experience in fashion design. Basma instinctively knew where to start. "I've never been a flashy dresser - I prefer jeans, casual dresses and flat shoes." But, she explains, there was one item she had a vision for. "If you're going to go crazy with one item in your closet, it has to be your beach bag. I don't get it when you see plain black baskets on the beach. You're on the beach - that's the one time where you have to be bold!" With that in mind, she began working with local craftswomen to create vibrant, colourful beach bags from dokuma. adding a woven macramé handle fashioned from raw rope. Working on one at a time from her mum's basement, she named the brand Nosouj (meaning handwoven in Arabic), set up an Instagram account, and that's how the business ran for several years.

By her own admission, while Basma was passionate about the sustainable and cultural principles of the accessories, she was not sure where to go next. That changed in 2023 when she bumped into Sharif Hajjar, an old classmate from Amman, who had just sold his farming business and was looking for a project to invest in. They decided to work together and moved the business back to Amman, importing the dokuma fabrics from Türkiye and India but keeping everything else Jordanian. "We were excited by the idea of being one of the pioneers in Jordan's fashion scene, which is not as advanced as other Middle Eastern countries like Egypt and Lebanon," explains Basma.

#### "I want the business to fulfil our promise of being made in Jordan"

In their new workshop in Jabal Amman, a creative area dotted with artisanal shops in the city's Old Town, Basma began thinking of ways to bring more Jordanian skills – and women – into the business. "I wanted to create opportunities for local craftswomen as we had in Türkiye," she says. The solution she found was adding crocheted pompoms and characters on the bags, handmade by local women who "don't have the luxury of going to a workplace. Crochet is a skill that they've been taught by their mothers, and it's something they can do while their husbands go to work," says Basma. "It creates a way they can have their own money and a little independence."

The company now numbers six full-time staff making the bags by hand and another 15-20 women crafting the crochet mascots to adorn them. As for the designs, they are still Basma's handiwork, but in her typical freestyle approach – deciding on colour combinations as they go. They also began working with an Italian agency to help them grow the business. Part of that work saw a rebrand, choosing Basma's name for the company. "Coincidentally, Basma means smile in Arabic – and that's what people do when they see our bags," she says, grinning.

While the nature of dokuma and the techniques they employ means business growth is gradual, Basma is now seeing an increase in requests for partnerships and collaborations as its reputation grows. They recently began a partnership with the Ritz-Carlton in Amman to create a series of beach bags to be sold from the hotel, with profits going to The Badwa Center for Special Education. A non-profit organisation dedicated to providing support services for children with special needs, it's a cause close to Basma's heart. "I want the business to fulfil our promise of being 'Made in Jordan' and that means investing in the wider community. Alongside our work with local women, this is another way we can do that."

As for what comes next, Basma's hope is that the brand can build its reputation overseas. "I'd love to see our bags in the beautiful beach resorts in Dubai, Saudi and Egypt. And, on a personal level, I'd feel a little bit of pride – you know, here's another good brand from Jordan." **basmacollection.com**





In Istanbul's Sultanahmet neighbourhood, one couple is teaching the ancient art of Ebru - paper marbling - to a new generation

reen pigment flies onto the surface of the water, one careful flick of the horse-hair brush at a time. Next, I pick up a biz – a small tool a bit like a small screwdriver with no head. I dip it into the paint pot, picking up a thin coat that I then dot onto the surface, watching it bleed into a bigger circle. I add a red pool to the series of green and black puddles already floating nearby, and with a few careful swooshes of

the biz, the previously abstract shapes form a picture. A piece of paper is delicately placed on the surface of the water, and then pulled out slowly against the edge of the tray. The painted design disappears from the water and transfers onto the sheet. "It's like magic, isn't it?" says my teacher, Betül Şengüler, grinning as I hold up my first Ebru attempt: the iconic red tulip of Türkiye. Her husband, Ali – also an artist and co-owner of Turkish Arts – comes to take a look. "Ah, you see, I told you: the next Picasso!"

My trip to Istanbul was not originally about art at all. But while browsing the website of the Shangri-La Bosphorus, the decadent five-star hotel where I'm staying, I came across an Ebru lesson – a classical form of Central Asian art, which is believed to date back as far as the 9th century – as part of their guest experience menu. "Ebru is a combination of the Arabic words *ebri* – meaning 'cloudy' – and *abru*, meaning 'water surface'," explains Betül, who studied



traditional Turkish arts at Istanbul's Mimar Sinan Fine Arts University. Painting on water sounds impossible – surely it's not as straight-forward as popping a paintbrush in a bowl? "We mix the water with carrageenan, a seaweed extract, to thicken it to the consistency of a liquid soap, and allow it to settle for several hours before we pour it into the tray," says Ali.

Next, the naturally-derived paint pigments are mixed with water and ox gall – bile taken from a cow's naturally occurring gallstones – which makes the paints water surfactant (meaning they sit on the surface and stick to the paper once it is applied). Line up your brushes, a number of differently-sized biz and combs – wooden rulers with evenly-spaced metal teeth to draw through the water – and you're set.

"Ebru was traditionally used in book binding, but vou can transfer onto different surfaces including leather and ceramics," says Betül as she shows me the next technique - the peacock effect. It's created by flicking four different colours on the surface of the water before drawing the biz through in a grid formation, then using different combs to make the swirling pattern even more intricate. The only real rule to remember is that the last colour you add will be the most dominant - for me, that's a bold blue. As I draw the combs through the colours, it becomes clear why UNESCO inscribed Ebru onto its Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity in 2014 - there is a magic, methodical quality to the art that comes from its longevity. It's a calming, meditative process, watching the colours and shapes shift, I say. "Not always," Betül laughs in reply.

Keen to learn more, before my class I also speak with the artist responsible for bringing Ebru to a global stage right now: Garip Ay. Another graduate of Mimar Sinan, Garip has travelled the world showcasing Ebru, creating live performances of his creations at galleries (even for a TED talk) and most famously recreating iconic artworks in Ebru, including Van Gogh's *The Starry Night*.

"Many traditional Ebru artists see painting Ebru like meditation – calming and soothing. And it can be like that to watch," he says. "But it's not like that for me! It's stressful and hard to control. As an artist, you have to be open to things changing... art evolves." Watching videos of his work is fascinating: more performance art than painting, Garip has to anticipate and react to the water's movement. "For me, the process is as crucial as the result."

Back at Turkish Arts, we pause for a tea break, accompanied by delicious homemade pistachio cookies. Their HQ is a narrow townhouse, spread across four floors including a spectacular roof terrace with views of the Bosphorus as well as the Topkapı Palace walls opposite. "I love creating my own art, but there's something extra special about sharing it with others," says Betül. I tell them it's unlike any other art form I've tried, and in many ways more forgiving – my red tulip looks far more skilful than I could create with traditional paint on paper. I want to do more. Betül smiles. "Ebru is a dying art, but thanks to the magic of the process and the beautiful results, we're keeping it alive." turkisharts.com

#### The online star

sk most Italians and they'll tell you - with good reason - that their national cuisine is the best in the world. But not all of them illustrate it with quite the same passion and creative delivery as Angelo Coassin. Better known as @cookingwithbello, this ballet dancer turned social media star's highenergy, tongue-in-cheek viral recipes have seen him accrue more than 3m followers. "It's the best in the world," says Angelo, speaking from his hometown of San Daniele del Friuli, north-east of Venice. "Food is central to our culture. When we have lunch, our main discussion is what we're having for dinner!"

Known for his light-hearted presentation skills and flamboyant catchphrases ("super sexy" and "mamma mia!" feature in most videos), Angelo's passion for cooking began as it does for most Italians – helping his mother and nonna in the kitchen. "I would be doing my homework at the table as they made dinner, and I would take breaks to help them chop and stir. I just loved cooking – when I got to high school I would invite my friends around every weekend and cook for them. And I obsessively watched every TV cookery

show I could, taking notes so I could recreate the recipes," he explains. "Cooking is like therapy for me – even as a teenager, I dreamt of having my own cookery show."

Alongside his passion for ballet, which he began learning at just three years old, Angelo's enthusiasm for cooking only grew as he became an adult. He moved to London to pursue dancing, performing at Sadler's Wells and the Royal Albert Hall, and subsidised his living with a job at a café. "Then, in 2020, lockdown hit and I found myself in a flat-share with no work and nothing to do," says Angelo. "I'm not the kind of person who can just sit and watch hours of Netflix. I had been thinking about starting a cooking account on Instagram for ages. One day, I just decided to buy the ingredients for my dad's lasagne and make a video of it."

It wasn't entirely straightforward. Angelo had no equipment and no idea how to film, but he borrowed a ring light from his flatmate and went in search of other props. "I found an old ironing board outside my flat and decided it would be the perfect height to film from, so that became my tripod," he laughs. Some of his early videos, he admits, were far from perfect. "They were horrible. I shot them horizontally, and sometimes the recipes took three tries to get right. Once, I made caramel wrong so many times I had to throw out two pans."

Gradually, his skills in filming and editing social videos grew, as did his following. Realising TikTok was for more than just dance videos, he made his own channel, responding to viewer requests for different



# Bello's parmesan biscotti

Serves 4-6
Prep Time 15 minutes
Cook Time 10-12 minutes

These savoury cheese biscotti are perfect for an easy appetiser or party snack... mamma mia!

- 125g (4 oz/1 cup) plain (all-purpose) flour, plus extra for dusting
- 100g (3 ½ oz) Parmesan cheese, grated (shredded)
- 90g (3 ¼ oz) chilled unsalted butter, cubed
- small bunch of thyme, finely chopped
- pinch of salt
- pinch of freshly ground black pepper
- Preheat the oven to 180°C fan (350°F) and line a baking tray with baking parchment.
- In a large bowl, combine all the ingredients and knead with your hands for a few minutes until a smooth dough forms.
- On a lightly floured surface, use a rolling pin to roll out your dough to a thickness of about 4mm (¼ in).
- Cut the dough into rounds using a biscuit (cookie) cutter, re-rolling to use up the off-cuts, then place on the prepared baking tray.
- 5. Bake for 10–12 minutes, or until ... super sexy!

recipes ("almost always pasta!") and happening upon what would become his catchphrases: "Cooking is not an exact science – one oven might take longer than another – and just saying 'cook for 30 minutes' is so boring," says Angelo. "So, rather than giving an exact timing I wanted to express that you should cook it until it's looking amazing – or, as I put it, super sexy."

Likewise, when it comes to quantities of ingredients, Angelo says the Italian way is "the more the better". For instance, "when you are grating cheese – there is no such thing as too much! In Italian we have the phrase *come se non ci fosse un domani* ('like there is no tomorrow'), and that's my approach. It means: go for it, don't hold back."

Eventually, Angelo was approached to create a cookbook – something he says is a dream come true. "I wanted to write a book for ages, but it takes a lot to make the stars align for this kind of project. And I

wanted it to be true to me: fun, not too serious – just me in my white vest, being silly and making delicious food." The result, Cook like a Real Italian: Super Sexy and Simple Recipes from Cooking with Bello (Hardie Grant, £24), is a tribute to Angelo's favourite Italian flavours and dishes including easy arancini, fried gnocco and moreish parmesan biscotti (see p31).

Now Angelo is focusing full-time on his cookery and splits his time between London and Italy. "Unfortunately, you can't dance ballet professionally at 90 years old, but I'll still take my ballet classes then," he laughs. As for the future, after the book is published, Angelo has his sights set on another lifetime ambition: his own TV cookery show. "I hope it will happen – who knows!" he says, flashing his instantly recognisable grin. Given his success so far, we wouldn't bet against it.





t's 7.30am on a Tuesday morning at Széchenyi Baths, a primrose-yellow, Neo-Baroque construction that dates back to 1913. Set on the outer limits of Budapest's City Park, it houses 21 pools, indoor and outdoor, each with varying temperatures. Elderly ladies, their hair covered by ornate swimming caps, cling to the side of the pool and chatter animatedly, the mischief in their eyes hinting at the nature of their conversation. Nearby, a group of similarly aged men relax under the spraying plumes at the centre of the pool. Others wade in to join them, greeting the ladies, as they pass, with easy familiarity.

"Everybody knows each other," says 60-year-old János, who wakes daily at 5.30am to go for a run before coming to Széchenyi. "For me, this is the same as beer at the bar after work." He pauses and thinks for a moment. "Except before work," he adds. "And without beer." He is, he tells me, a "very young man. Others, the old ones, maybe they stay here more hours." He puffs out his chest proudly. "I am businessman, I leave here and go for work."

Certainly, many of the bodies in the pools show signs of lives long lived. By the thermal pool in which, if you're lucky, you'll sometimes see old men playing chess in the water, a man moves slowly to the water's






edge, leaning on his cane. His withered frame is bent like a question mark, but the habits of a lifetime are obviously more important than his frailty.

Budapest's spas are somewhere that brings together generations - families where the children are learning to swim, young people unwinding after a busy day working. And visitors to the city have a number of options available to them when it comes to experiencing the many bathing complexes.

But the best way to experience Budapest's thermal baths is to follow the locals - preferably early in the morning - in celebrating what the baths are to the city: a place to meet, gossip, relax, socialise and to benefit from the curative powers of their waters. Thanks to unique geological features, the waters that burble under Budapest come to the surface with the addition of health-giving minerals, such as magnesium, chloride and calcium. The Romans were typically savvy about such things, and their enjoyment is evidenced in ruins scattered around the city.

"We have clients who have been coming every day for 40, 50 years," says Dora Ferenczi, duty manager at Lukács Baths, located in the northwest of the city. "We open at 7am, but many are often outside, waiting, at 6.30am. They tend to spend

around one to two hours here: it's as much a part of their routine as a morning coffee."

The medicinal qualities of Budapest's thermal waters are complemented at most complexes by wellness services, such as massages and sauna, as well as medical treatments for prevention and rehabilitation. Many house on-site medical staff.

And this, too, is an aspect of bathing culture in Budapest that demonstrates how it is so much more than a tourist tick box. It is so woven into the lives of locals that doctors prescribe time at the baths in the way that another might dole out painkillers. Further proof of its importance lies in the fact that such visits are subsidised by the national health system.

# Time is a healer: A history of Budapest spa culture


100AD - The ancient Romans popularised relaxing in healing waters, creating the first 'spas' in Buda. 16th century – The Ottomans construct beautiful Turkish baths, some of which are still around. 1878 – Engineer Vilmos Zsigmondy drills a hole under Heroes' Square, which acts as the source of water for Széchenyi.

1913 - Széchenyi Baths opens. Named after Count István Széchenyi, it costs 3.9m Gold Crowns to build. 1934 - Budapest is named 'City of Spas' and recognised across the world for its healing thermal waters. It was exactly such a medical directive that led to the creation of luxury resort wear brand PELSO. Having injured his arm after a fall, founder Attila Bálint was advised by his doctor to bathe at Széchenyi at least 10 times. "I was sitting in the water, moving my injured arm back and forth to restore its mobility," he recalls. "And I was looking at the Széchenyi building and thinking that something so beautiful really deserved to have its visitors using beautiful towels, rather than the odd assortment that I could see around me." He laughs: "Széchenyi fixed my arm and inspired my business."

The collection, which is available at various points within Széchenyi, as well as online, has since grown to include sumptuously printed swimsuits, kaftans and loungewear, largely inspired by the colours, flora and fauna of Lake Balaton (also known as Lake Pelso) located about 131 km from Budapest. Describing itself as 'Lakeside Luxury,' the label has recently graced the pages of British *Voque*.

The therapeutic nature of Budapest's thermal waters are even more apparent at Lukács, where the outer walls are studded with stone 'gratitude' plaques: gifts from people who have been healed by treatment here. The clientele is, Dora tells me, around 80% elderly locals who come for their health, and there is certainly a more subdued ambience here than at Széchenyi. The young people here tend to be visitors, as this is the city's only bathing complex where entry is free with the tourist-friendly Budapest Card.



# Sitting in the water with a fröccs (wine spritzer) in hand, the sky turns pink



Despite the gender segregation on certain weekdays in the stunning 16th-century
Turkish section of the complex – a practice that most of Budapest's other bath houses have done away with – it's at Rudas that younger locals tend to congregate, not least because it opens at 6am and forms a hub for post-nightlife relaxation. There's also its panoramic rooftop pool with on-site bar and views over the Danube. Backed by sheer cliff faces, tufted with greenery, the pool stays open until 3am on Friday and Saturday. As we sit in its waters, fröccs

(wine spritzer) in hand, the sunset turns the sky over Elizabeth Bridge, in the foreground, and the historic Széchenyi Chain Bridge, behind, a dreamy shade of pink.


"If I want to take glamorous pictures, Rudas is my favourite," says 28-year-old Krisztina Mehes, a tour guide with GetYourGuide's Hungária Group. But equally, she acknowledges that bathing life is transgenerational and deeply enmeshed in local culture. "My grandmother had a knee problem, and my brother had eczema, so the three of us went to the baths every day for a week," she says. "It was so much fun and the eczema and knee pain both healed. Baths bring us together."

When it comes to glamour, it's hard to beat Budapest's five-star Mystery Hotel, which opened in 2019 in a former Freemasons' lodge, a building with eclectic flourishes at every turn.

Naturally, in keeping with the city's bathing heritage, the hotel houses a splendid spa, The Secret Garden, where guests can relax in a courtyard setting that combines Baroque details with towering palm trees. There's also a rooftop pool, with views over Buda Castle.

Glamour also abounds at Gellért Spa, a stunning Art Nouveau building where intricate mosaics characterise the entrance hall, harking back to its Ottoman-era beginnings. It has soaring columns, glass ceilings and turquoise tiles, which make the water preternaturally blue, and it wears its gorgeousness as unashamedly as the clients wear their own skin, caps and swimsuits. It's also one of the most decadent spas when it comes to relaxing remedies, with unusual offerings such as the 'frizzante cocktail body treatment' featuring a detox body wrap, a pampering massage and a cocktail to enjoy at the end.

By one of the outside pools at Gellért, a man sits with his closed eyes protected from the sun by a tilted cap, and his hands held out to the sides, fingers twisted into a complex mudra. Behind him, another man approaches, his round belly cheerfully bulging over the top of his swim shorts, and stops, watching his seated counterpart with an amused smile. When the meditator finally opens his eyes, they both laugh uproariously, exchanging easy banter before the newcomer launches himself into the water to join a group of men by the steps of the pool.

We didn't catch the chess players on our visit, and perhaps that's a blessing. "My friend, with a degree in Physics from Cambridge, challenged one of those guys to a game," says PELSO's Attila. He chuckles, and glances towards the pool where players gather. "He lost in under three minutes."

wood carvings, a Zsolnay porcelain fountain and an illuminated Aszú wall displaying 240 bottles of 2000 vintage Oremus 5-Puttonyos Aszú.

Another distinctive feature of Aszú restaurant is the plates created from melting Tokaj wine bottles gathered for reuse and art. The inspiration came from rock samples collected from Tokaj mountains, which can also be seen at the restaurant's entrance.

Since opening in 2013, Aszú restaurant provides customers with a unique gourmet experience in addition to wonderful food and drinks. It is open daily from 5pm, except on Tuesdays.

It is an experience not to be missed when visiting Budapest. It is absolutely worth stopping by this restaurant where world-famous stars eat.

hafts of early-morning light pierce the tree canopy, waking up the forest, and us, with a golden glow. It's only 6am, but sisters Dixie and Sofie - three-year-old Border Collies - are already hard at work. Whilst my nostrils are being tickled by the scent of pine, this conscientious canine unit is sniffing out poisoned bait: the nemesis of Cyprus's most threatened bird of prey. "As scavengers, griffon vultures are at the top of the food chain. They clean the countryside and play a really important ecological role," says the Game and Fauna Service's Nikos Kassinis as we head deeper into the woods.

Nature's natural-born cleaners, vultures dine exclusively on the carcasses of medium to large animals, and in doing so, curb the spread of deadly diseases like anthrax and rabies. A once common sight across Cyprus, the sun-drenched Mediterranean island now has Europe's smallest breeding population; whittled down to just 10 individuals in 2012. In June, their numbers crept closer to 40 when 14 rehabilitated griffon vultures – transplanted from Spain's remote Extremadura region – were geotagged and released as part of an ambitious project to rewild Cypriot skies with these remarkable raptors.

Launched in 2019, the LIFE with Vultures project is led by BirdLife Cyprus: a non-profit whose conservation approach fires on all cylinders. One of their first jobs was to custom-build an aviary – complete with rain-harvesting roof – where the birds acclimatise for six months. Perched on an exposed



strip of land overlooking Kouris Dam - about 16km from the seafront city of Limassol - it's perfect for a first flight, since much like a plane, griffon vultures rely on a runway to take off, says Nikos. It's also home to one of Cyprus's four 'vulture restaurants'. where safe-to-consume animal remains are left out weekly.

Carcasses are illegally used as poisoned bait by some farmers wanting to protect their livestock from predators like foxes and feral dogs, explains BirdLife Cyprus's Melpo Apostolidou. The poison is also intended for hunting dogs. laid down by some of the island's 40.000 hare and partridge hunters to defend their territory.

"Poison can cause mass losses because they feed in groups," Melpo says of griffons; the most social of Europe's four vulture species. A poisoning incident in 2022 halved Cyprus's griffon population - including chicks - in the space of 48 hours. The recovery of this emblematic species is made more difficult by their painfully slow reproduction



rate. Griffons take five years to reach sexual maturity, bearing just one chick every two years. "We lost the last breeding pair [on Cyprus] last summer to a poisoned dog," says Melpo.

Dixie and Sofie have sniffed out an impressive 70kg of poisoned bait and 81 dead animals in their two years of preventive patrols, "which have taken them everywhere from the seaside to the tip of the mountain!" BirdLife Cyprus's Conservation Projects Officer Martha Petrou tells me. They may be working dogs, but it doesn't stop these canines being man's best friend too.

"We communicate without even having to say words," says Andreas Christoforou, a Game and Fauna Service warden who has become a dog handler, of Sofie, who he describes as active and sensitive. Handler Andreas Koumbaris – who's grown up around dogs – tells me: "You're with the dog 24/7: at work and at home, so it's a growing bond that gets stronger."

Noses to the ground, Dixie and Sofie continue snaking along a dirt road in the Troodos Mountains foothills, stopping only to be rewarded with an occasional tasty treat scooped out of their handlers'

climbing-style chalk bags. "Poisoning doesn't just affect vultures. It affects hundreds of species on the island from a fly to a Bonelli's eagle," says Martha as we seek out shade beneath a walnut tree. She's tasked with getting the 266 registered livestock breeders – based in and around the vultures 1,300km² home range – onside with conserving, rather than cursing Cyprus's misunderstood raptors.

One such farmer is 63-year-old Hungarian-moustached Aristos Stylianou. We find him rounding up his 400 sheep and goats on horseback through gnarled olive and ancient carob trees. Emerging from a cloud of dust,

Aristos shakes down edible carob pods from a branch using his shepherd's crook so we can snack on nature's candy. It's not long before we get to eat the literal fruits of his flocks' labour when we lunch on goat-sheep halloumi cheese around the family dining table, where he recalls his boyhood memories of griffons.

"[In the 1950s] there might have been over 100 vultures at a single donkey carcass," he says. Before tractors, these sure-footed animals were put to work in the island's vertiginous vineyards. Aristos reveals that the outer



feathers of a griffon - usually shed during a frenzied feed - had a cultural connection in the mid-19th century. "The [feathers] shaft were used to pluck the strings of a laouto [a type of lute], which my father played at weddings." These days the traditional Cypriot instrument is plucked with a synthetic plectrum.

About 10km away is another wind-whipped smallholding though this one comes with sea views - where our conversation is soon drowned out by the bleating of 2,000 goats. They belong to Panagiotis Tsestos: a former mechanic wearing a T-shirt emblazoned with a vulture - gifted from BirdLife Cyprus - and a dayold kid goat draped around his neck. A proud griffon ambassador, the farmer tells me how the raptors have helped him identify where some of his livestock - bred for milk and meat - have died, by circling overhead.

"I used to see more vultures before the electricity wires went up," he says as we scan pylons on the horizon. Unfortunately, collisions with Cypriot power lines are griffons' second biggest

menace. "We've lost four birds in four months to electrocution," says Melpo.

Back on the (bumpy) road again, we find ourselves on a hairy adventure tracking the elusive birds of prey on the edge of eastern Cyprus's Paphos Forest. With the help of solar-powered GPS transmitters - tagged to 95% of Cyprus's griffon population we locate 32 of the raptors resting on the roof of the Department of Forests' aviary. Always one flap ahead of us, no sooner have we eved them through binoculars, and they prepare for lift off, forcing us to make a hasty retreat back uphill. Minutes later, five griffons catch us off guard and hover directly above our 4x4. Engine silenced and necks craned, we marvel at their V-shaped forms until the birds soar so high, they're nothing more than blackish specks.

Ungainly on land, graceful in the air, these high flyers of the avian world can reach heights of up to 3,500 metres. "You find vultures around mountain summits like Troodos because they're using the thermal

updrafts," explains Kassinis. It's a finding made thanks to their GPS tags, which have also confirmed communal roosting sites like bridal-white Episkopi Cliffs. Hugging a crescent-shaped bay on the island's southernmost tip, it's a nesting site for griffons as well as loggerhead sea turtles, which burrow in the powder-soft sands below.

Chasing the last light of the day, we follow the path of a favourite vulture flyway, where these raptors run the gauntlet of high-voltage power lines.

Strung along a two-kilometre stretch are fireflies – small but life-saving anti-collision markers. Installed by LIFE with Vultures, they're one more way the team is working to guide Cyprus's masters of the skies safely home to roost.

# Give & take

To reinforce its status as one of the world's most sustainable cities, a new programme in Copenhagen is set to transform green actions into a currency for cultural experiences



















hen it comes to cities that emanate progressive cool, Copenhagen takes the crown. Not only has the Danish capital scored consistently highly on the annual Happy City Index and been named the best bike city in the world, this summer a trial of a new city-wide campaign, CopenPay, encouraged locals and visitors to take eco-actions in return for discounts and cultural experiences. Ahead of its wider roll-out in 2025, we went to discover how it works.



# Paddle power

Tobias Weber-Andersen launched GreenKayak Tours in 2017 with one simple concept: you can take out one of the company's kayaks for free in exchange for collecting litter from the city's waterways as you paddle. Since then, these goodwill powered kayaks have become a fixture for locals, who often shout words of encouragement as the green boats float by.

I join Tobias on a beautiful Copenhagen morning and we've barely paddled out of the harbour before a woman in a small boat calls out "keep up the good work," with a thumbs up. It feels nice to be helping out, and seeing the city from the water gives it a completely different perspective.

Tobias was keen to get involved with CopenPay, since the scheme matches his own concept so neatly. "You can really get back to nature by using the kayaks on our canals," he says, fishing a beer can out of the water with his litter picker. "It's such a positive thing for the environment and it encourages people to move around the city in a greener way."

The kayaks come with a round bin. "Most of the trash is blown into the canals by the wind," Tobias says. We make our way along three canals and collect 4.3kg of rubbish, adding to the 120 tonnes GreenKayak Tours has collected since it started.

Demand is so high, explains Tobias, that people inquire about their availability before they've even booked their flights. "We won't solve the problem of water pollution alone, but it makes me so proud to see how we inspire people to do better." **greenkayak.org**

# **Running the town**


"Running is super sustainable, and sustainability is a big part of our DNA," Lena Andersson tells me outside City Hall at 7am on a sunny Saturday. Having founded Go! Running Tours in Copenhagen (the concept has since expanded to more than 70 countries), Lena's all for inspiring visitors to make conscious green choices. Consequently, taking part in CopenPay was a "no brainer" and she devised an adapted 5km green running tour with 75% off the usual price. In this instance, the eco payoff is touring the city on foot, therefore lowering your carbon footprint.

We start our jog towards the waterfront in time to see a man dive in one of the harbour baths near the new BLOX building. "Typically Danish," Lena says. She talks passionately as I pant. "We want to help attract people who are curious about how the city works and explore it in a different way," she says. "Not just ticking off tourist sights like the Little Mermaid, but integrating and contributing. Plus, Copenhagen is a flat city, perfect for running."

The tour takes in many of the city's sustainable wins along the way, from mobility solutions (car-free bridges and 546km of bike lanes) to architecture (buildings topped with solar panels and rainwater collection systems). It's not all virtuous though – eventually we stop for fuel: in our case, a coffee at a branch of Hart Bageri. "By increasing the awareness of sustainable activities people will behave more consciously in the city," says Lena. It also serves as the perfect excuse for that Danish pastry. gorunningtours.com

# **Natural choice**

For those with green fingers – or if you just like to mingle with locals and enjoy money-can't-buy experiences – another fun eco-activity can be found at the Øens Have organic farm at Refshaleøen. It sits on a plot of land that formerly housed the B&W shipping company's canteen, and is now lively with wild birds, honeybees and clucking chickens. The Volunteer Tuesdays scheme began at their sister farm, ØsterGro, 10 years ago, and extended to Øens Have in 2021. So when CopenPay was announced, their partnership seemed, well, natural.

The volunteer sessions are free to join between 10am-5pm every Tuesday, and visitors can stay for anything from an hour to the whole day, getting stuck in with tasks including sowing, planting, watering, weeding and harvesting. No gardening experience is needed – just a willingness to get your hands dirty and mix with new people from the city and further afield.

Your reward arrives at 1pm sharp, when everyone sits down to enjoy a delicious family-style vegetarian lunch prepared by a chef at the farm restaurant. It's a popular draw: there's up to 100 people on the waiting list most weeks and a 40-person limit.

"Tourists get to be out in nature, talking to locals about the city: where to go, what to see or eat, and leave full of ideas – you don't often get that interaction," says Jeanette Koustrup, who works at the farm. "I don't think it's even the free part that appeals. It's a beautiful community experience that you won't get anywhere else. We just love volunteer days." **oenshave.dk**

# Saddle up

The Copenhagen state of mind is "cool, curious and adventurous," according to Christian Hougaard, founder of Cycling Copenhagen. Their free CopenPay trail takes in alternative sights including the new Circle Bridge, Islands Brygge with its public outdoor pool and Kalvebod Brygge, home to 'The Wave', a waterfront hotspot. Here, your mere presence on the tour is your contribution to the city's sustainability quota – so the only cost is the bike hire. While CopenPay is on ice for now, Cycling Copenhagen still offer similiar trails like The Must See Tour and The Urban Tour.

As we weave our way around the city my guide, Oliver, shares stories I'd never find in guidebooks: from the forest ants that were sprinkled on desserts in Noma to the fact it takes 25 seconds to ski down the CopenHill power station. He also points out the best spots to engage in "Denmark's national sport of sharing a six pack [of beer]".

"We believe in the benefits of getting around the city by bike," explains Christian. "To us, Copenhagen has a similar way of life to the smooth ride in a bicycle lane – we go with the flow. It's by far the best way to get around and experience the (green) city of cyclists." cycling-copenhagen.dk

Soft-launched this summer ahead of a wider roll-out in 2025, CopenPay is an initiative where people are invited to 'pay' for cool things to do, eat and see with climate-friendly actions. # Getting your hands dirty

Once I have my bike legs, a 23km cycle north of the city along a stunning stretch of the coastline brings me to the Karen Blixen Museum in Rungsted, and another brilliant eco-opportunity. I'm met by guide Sofia at the outdoor café that edges beautiful flower-dotted gardens and woodland in the grounds of the the childhood home of Blixen, the Danish author, who published her world-famous book *Out of Africa* in 1937.

As part of CopenPay, visitors were invited to join a community of volunteers who help keep the gardens tidy - and in return receive free entry into the museum, whose property dates back to the Middle Ages. "The house and its gardens are preserved as they were back when Karen lived here. and you can see the clothes she wore and her writing desk," says Sofia. "She loved the house's history and was passionate about preserving the biodiversity in the garden." Sofia adds. "So our community of volunteers are very much in Karen Blixen's spirit". Guests can grab a pair of gardening gloves and, guided by a professional, help turn the soil and keep part of Copenhagen's history thriving. And for those who don't want to cycle the distance, Rungsted train station is just 10 minutes from the museum, blixen.dk

Tuck into the new wave of socially conscious restaurants and cafés taking over Prague

t first glance, the recently opened Stará Škola in Prague's Smíchov district seems like any other hipster coffee shop: house plants, latte art, kitsch crockery and eclectic framed photographs lining the walls. But look closer and you'll quickly realise this is a café with a difference. Everyone, from the cook whipping up raspberry crumb cake in the kitchen to the barista fashioning a heart out of milk on the top of your coffee, is a

"We exclusively hire older people here," explains Iveta Čížová, who heads up the project launched by senior-focused non-profit Elpida. "This section of society is often made to feel pushed aside, as though they no longer have value. By giving them a role and teaching them new skills, we can revive their sense of worth."

senior citizen.

While the staff are all in their sixties and above, many of the customers at Stará Škola ('Old School', in English) are much younger. The coffee shop acts as a welcoming

meeting place between generations that might not usually interact. "There's a certain view that young people here have of their elders: that they're grumpy and rude. When they come to the café, they realise it's not true," says Iveta.

"And it's the same the other way round too," laughs Marie Poledníková, a 70-year-old retiree who works five-hour shifts twice per week. "I've been so surprised how pleasant and polite young people are." Marie was stuck in a liminal space between retiring from her role as the right-hand to the CEO of a private company and finding her new place in society. Since she started working at Stará Škola, she's received barista training and mastered tasks she'd never even tried before. Watching her at work, it's evident that Elpida's concept is successful. "It's changed my life – this last period of it, anyway!" she says.

This coffee shop is the latest opening among numerous social enterprise eateries in the Czech capital, each focusing its efforts on uplifting a different subsection of society. Mlsná Kavka café in Karlín, for instance, gives professional experience to people with mental illnesses, while Mezi Rádky is a chain of cafés, a bakery and a coffee roastery that's dispelling prejudice and providing opportunities by giving jobs to people with disabilities. You can't visit without trying one of their homemade cakes or some artisanal bread (with pesto inside, if they have it).

These cafés are a simple way in which socially conscious travellers can make a

Over the past few years, people have started to move away from mass tourism and mainstream experiences, instead wanting to make the effort to truly interact with local culture and people.

"These social enterprise eateries are not non-profit organisations – they aim to get orders and make money, which is used to pay their beneficiaries and, in some cases, fed back into the project," says Veronika Vávrová from the Czech Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs. The senior citizens at Stará Škola, for example, get an hourly salary but any profit is funneled back into the café or into Elpida's other projects, such as its senior centres. "So, visitors going there for their coffee or a bite to eat is genuinely helping."

At Kuchařky bez domova ('Cooks Without Homes'), a vegan catering company that does pop-ups and events around Prague, the money is used to support homeless women and trans people - some of the most vulnerable members of the homeless population. Due to the rising cost of living, the knock-on effects of Covid-19 and an ever-increasing demand for accommodation, the city's homeless population is growing. Recognising that one of the biggest barriers to their reintegration is lack of employment, the social enterprise overseen by Olga Pek from charity Jako doma hires them as cooks/servers. This provides immediate aid in the form of a salary, and in the long term through the teaching of professional skills that will help them get follow-on employment elsewhere.

"Kuchařky bez domova has given me more chances than I would have got in a normal job, while also setting clear boundaries. It's helped me realise that work is work and not something I can start and stop. I wouldn't have been given the opportunity to learn that elsewhere," 44-year-old Jana tells me. She's been living on and off the street since she was discharged from a children's home in 1998. Working with Kuchařky bez domova has given her enough structure and money to partially integrate back into what she calls "normal life". "It's hard to get back on your

feet when you're living on benefits so this salary means I don't have to rely on that anymore. I still have one foot on the street and one in a shelter so my next goal is to get a permanent roof over my head."

The social enterprise concept isn't new to Czechia. Its first, Café Therapy, was established almost two decades ago, when founder Jiří Richter was inspired by similar initiatives he saw in the UK and Germany. He began employing some of the former prisoners and drug addicts using the services of his already well-established NGO, Sananim, in a café in New Town, with the hope it would be a significant step towards resocialisation. Considering almost 150 people have undergone transit employment through Café Therapy, it has proved a good model. So much so, in fact, that since Jakub Janyška and Samuel Bachmann took over in 2016 they have established five further locations: new cafés in the Komedie Theatre and ABC Theatre. a bistro in the Charles University, Faculty of Education and, just last year, the campsite and café Staré Časy in Chřenovice.

"Originally the idea was to employ people for half a year, but we wanted to make it a more permanent job for those that wanted it; to give them a salary, stability and the opportunity to progress," explains Jakub. One employee, for example, started from the lowest position in the kitchen and now leads a team of 20 across both theatre cafés.



This evident investment in its staff's progression is not only significant for the beneficiaries of Café Therapy, making them feel trusted and believed in and thus more confident; it also has a positive impact on a business level. A good example is Café Therapy's collaboration with Tomáš Levý. The haute cuisine chef was called in to teach employees complex culinary techniques such as fermentation, breadmaking and salmon smoking. They even learned how to make cheese from fresh milk, which they then fry and serve inside one of their artisanal buns. Little wonder it has become the signature dish.

With upskilled employees, Café Therapy's outposts are able to offer more refined food – important in the fight to stay relevant within Prague's thriving restaurant scene. It proves all the more vital when one considers this particular social enterprise principally relies on customers to keep it running. "It's harder for us to get external funding than


other social enterprises because there's still this stigma that drug addiction isn't an illness but something people have done to themselves," says Jakub.

Overall, though, a big reason so many workers stick around is a sense of community. They can meet people with similar experiences who are also in a state of rehabilitation and mentor those who are newer to it. What's more, some 30% of the staff come from a more 'typical' background. Working together as equals allows for a compassionate exchange of life views and experiences.

One of the longest serving employees is Daniella, who left behind 11 years of crime and drug addiction and has worked at Café Therapy for almost a decade. "Whenever I'm in trouble, not just at work but in my personal life, the first people I get in touch with or ask for help are those from Café Therapy," she says.



### **Moldova's UNESCO-listed treasures**

Not only is Moldova blessed with stunning natural beauty and warm welcoming people, it also has some rich traditions that are on UNESCO's Intangible Cultural Heritage list

#### In full voice

If you are spending Christmas
Eve in a Moldovan village, expect
a few knocks on the door. A
wonderful type of carolling, the
ritual of Colindat sees groups
of young men go from house to
house performing festive songs.
As a reward, the hosts offer
singers ritual gifts and money. The
songs are adapted to each host's
individual circumstances and are
sometimes performed in costume,
with instrumental accompaniment
and choreography for a truly
unforgettable experience.

### Weaving some magic

While Moldova's woven wall carpets are these days mainly appreciated as works of art and exhibited at city festivals and ceremonies, these intricate pieces have a far more practical past. At one time they were used for insulation and also as part of a bride's dowry. Whatever their function, the carpets are never less than striking, with weavers using a variety of techniques to produce impressive motifs that reflect the part of the country they hail from.

### Perfect fit

Called altiţă, a traditional blouse with embroidery on the shoulder is an essential part of Moldovan folk dress for men and women. It blends a simple cut with colourful ornamentations stitched using intricate sewing techniques passed on within families. The white

blouses are made of natural fibres (flax, cotton, hemp or floss silk), with stitches combining horizontal, vertical and diagonal seams that result in a very specific (and absolutely beautiful) pattern.

#### Spring is in the air

In Moldova, the beginning of spring is a red (and white) letter day. Mărţişor (or 'Little March') is a tradition that, from 1 March, sees the making, offering and wearing of red and white thread, which is then untied when the first blossom tree, swallow or stork is seen. The token is part of larger spring celebration and provides symbolic protection against bad weather, so you can have safe passage from winter to spring.

### Friðheimar

### near Reykjavik

Have you ever eaten in a greenhouse? The answer is probably no – nor is it likely you'll have seen one on the scale of Iceland's Friðheimar. Located in Selfoss, about an hour from Reykjavik on the famous Golden Circle tour route, Friðheimar is a tomato farm run by Knútur Rafn Ármann (an agronomist) and his wife Helena Hermundardóttir (a horticulturalist). As such, you can expect scientific rigor and some of the best tomatoes you've ever tasted, despite being grown in the

land of ice. Sample them at the Friðheimar Bistro – a sleek space in the heart of the greenhouses, where chef Jón K.B. Sigfússon has crafted a menu in which almost everything contains tomatoes.

That extends to desserts (green tomato and apple pie; tomato ice cream or cheesecake topped with green tomato jam) and a drinks menu including Friðheimar tomato beer and even tomatoschnapps – an Icelandic birch schnapps served (yep, you guessed it) in a hollow tomato, **fridheimar.is** 



### Hiša Franko

near Ljubljana

Ana Roš is not short of accolades, having been named The World's Best Female Chef in 2017 and being the subject of an episode of Netflix's Chef's Table. Her restaurant, Hiša Franko, is no different, boasting three Michelin Stars and coming in at 48 on the 50 Best Restaurants list for 2024. Located in Kobarid, in the Slovenian countryside, it serves a precise, ambitious tasting menu inspired by hyper-local ingredients. hisafranko.com



### Figlmüller Wollzeile

<u>Vienna</u>

There aren't many dishes synonymous not just with a country but a specific city. The Wiener schnitzel is just that – a cultural icon in edible form – and in the Austrian capital, Figlmüller Wollzeile, around the corner from St Stephen's Cathedral, has been serving them since 1905. Measuring a whopping 30cm, their delicious pork schnitzel is traditionally served with either potato salad or mixed greens, and is best paired with a glass of Grüner Veltliner. **figlmueller.at** 



Championing Baltic ingredients paired with Nordic flare, Uoksas is a fine-dining restaurant that is making waves in the Lithuanian city of Kaunas.

The eatery is the brainchild of head chef Artūras Naidenko whose menus are 'micro-seasonal' - meaning they constantly shift to accommodate the local produce available, resulting in a delicious, surprising meal. Expect ambitious culinary dishes like ponzu-pickled mackerel with sunflower seeds, lacto-fermented cucumber and

celery root terrine, or rib eye steak cured in koji spores with tomato and leek, potato puree and a bone marrow and sake jus. To get a good overview, order the tasting menu in advance. Located in the heart of the city, and with a drinks list packed with Lithuanian wines, there is good reason why Uoksas is now celebrating its 10th year in business with an inclusion in Lithuania's brand-new Michelin Guide. uoksas.eu

# "This is a symbol of our commitment to sustainability in the skies"

Wizz Air's 20th anniversary livery design was selected in a customer competition to celebrate its sustainability achievements. We speak to the team involved to find out more ext time you see a WIZZ plane at the airport or in the air, take a closer look. If you're lucky, you may just spot our brand-new livery featuring a nature motif, designed to celebrate Wizz Air's 20th anniversary, as well as the recognition WIZZ has received as the most environmentally sustainable airline from CAPA in 2022 and 2023. But, there's more to the story.

Having been celebrated for our efforts to lower carbon emissions and commitment to sustainable technology. Wizz Air decided to mark the accolade in a unique way. "We wanted to engage our community and celebrate our environmental milestones by inviting creative designs for a new livery that reflected our dedication to sustainability," says Yvonne Moynihan, Wizz Air's Corporate and ESG Officer. "So, in January 2023, we launched a social media competition inviting customers to design a sustainability-themed livery for one of our new Airbus

A321neo aircraft. The challenge was to raise awareness of our sustainability efforts and mark our commitment to further reducing our CO<sub>2</sub> emissions intensity by 25% by 2030."

The team was thrilled by the response from the Wizz Air community, receiving more than 550 entries. They whittled those down to four shortlisted designs, before eventually choosing a winner: Éva Kerényi from Slovakia, whose design incorporates leaf motifs curling around the aircraft.

"Éva's design stood out for its unique ability to maintain the core WIZZ branding while seamlessly integrating natural elements like leaves and vines," says Yvonne. "This clever incorporation not only preserved the brand's identity but also added a fresh, nature-inspired dimension that resonates strongly with our sustainability mission."

Éva was thrilled when she discovered her design had been selected. "When I received the email I had to re-read it as I couldn't believe my design was chosen," she says. "I wanted the design to be subtle, graceful and elegant, something that suits both the Wizz Air brand and my own style. It was a once-in-a-lifetime, almost unimaginable experience to see my design on a huge plane at the unveiling." Éva was also awarded €2,000 in WIZZ vouchers.

Next came the challenge of transferring the design onto the Airbus A321neo - chosen because it achieves the lowest CO2 emissions per passenger in the industry. "We shared the design with Airbus, who then created a 3D CAP document, capturing the design from all angles to guide the painting process," explains Gréta Dobránszki. Wizz Air's Fleet Acquisition Manager. "We then selected the specific green colour code for the design, while the pink, blue and white remained consistent with our basic livery."

The big reveal took place this year during a delivery ceremony at the Airbus factory in Hamburg, with Éva in attendance. "What made the event so special was that it brought together all the relevant players in the aviation ecosystem: the airline, the manufacturer and the customer," says Yvonne. "It was symbolic of the collaborative sustainability approach that is essential on the road to net zero. We're immensely proud to see this symbol of our commitment to sustainability in the skies."

Wizz Air's sustainability efforts don't stop there, either. On World Nature Conservation Day, 28 July, we announced the second voluntary WIZZ Sustainability Ambassador programme, which sees employees participate in local sustainability projects. promoting eco-friendly practices and sharing valuable insights with colleagues. "The new term kicks off this autumn, so stay tuned for updates from our new Ambassadors who will raise awareness of environmental and social sustainability issues across Wizz Air's network." savs Yvonne. ### Your onboard safety

Please show consideration for your fellow passengers and pay attention to the following information. Remember that by purchasing your Wizz Air ticket, you have accepted the Wizz Air General Conditions of Carriage (available in full at wizzair.com)



#### Safe handling of hand luggage

Ensure hand luggage remains safely stowed in the locker or under the seat in front of you for takeoff, landing and at any time as instructed by the crew. Passengers seated in the emergency rows and first row must store their cabin bags in the overhead lockers. Take care when opening lockers, as falling items may injure fellow passengers.

In case of evacuation, all baggage must be left on board, and the instructions of the cabin crew must be strictly followed.



#### Safety equipment

It is an offence to tamper with or remove safety equipment, including adult and infant life vests, infant safety belts or extension belts. You are not allowed to remove or damage any onboard informative placards.



#### Sharp items

To dispose of any sharp items (e.g. hypodermic needles), please contact a cabin crew member. Do not leave your needle or syringe behind.



### **Turbulence management**

Turbulence can occur unexpectedly. Whenever seatbelt signs are switched on, remain seated, keep seatbelts fastened, and stow away large electronic devices.



#### Safety of infants on board

Wizz Air has a clear procedure for infant (a child under two) restraint systems. You can only use the single hook infant seatbelt – vests/slings cannot be used with the infant seatbelt. Wizz Air only accepts aft-facing car seats when an extra seat is purchased. However, during take-off and landing, and whenever the seatbelt sign is switched on, infants should sit on an adult's lap with the seatbelt fastened. Life vests for oinfants are available and are provided whenever flying over water. All lavatories are equipped with a changing table. Do not leave children unattended in the cabin.



#### **Lithium batteries**

Portable electronic devices (PED) such as phones, laptops and tablets can contain lithium batteries. When damaged, faulty or overheated, these batteries can catch fire and explode. If you recognise any issues with your device, inform the cabin crew immediately.

Charging electronic devices on board using a portable battery charger is forbidden.



#### **Flectronic devices**

Some electronic devices can be used during the flight with WLAN/Wi-Fi/Bluetooth turned off.

Larger electronic devices that cannot be held comfortably in one hand, exceed ca. 1kg in weight and do not qualify as handheld devices (e.g. laptops, notebooks etc.) must be stowed in the overhead stowage compartments for takeoff, landing and whenever required by the cabin crew.

If in doubt, please ask your cabin crew.



Read these tips on how to stay fit when travelling.



#### Before your air travel

Consult your doctor before travelling if you have any medical concerns. Pregnant women and those with heart or respiratory problems, blood diseases or ear, nose and sinus infections should seek medical advice before flying. Crew members are entitled to call for medical assistance pre-flight if they deem it necessary and are in doubt about your fitness for the flight.



### **Medical supplies on board**

Keep any medication you may need in your hand luggage and in its original packaging. Inform cabin crew of allergies or illnesses. If you are seriously ill or travelling post-surgery, you will need a medical certificate confirming that you are fit to fly. If you have limited mobility, are hearing- or sight-impaired, pregnant, or unable to understand/react to safety instructions, you will be unable to sit in the emergency exit rows or the front row. If you start to feel unwell during the flight, do not hesitate to talk to the cabin crew.



#### Nut allergy

During our WIZZ Café service we offer peanuts and some snacks containing peanuts/nuts traces. If you have any allergies we strongly encourage you to take all necessary medical precautions before flying, and to inform the cabin crew during boarding about your allergy.



### Why smoking is banned on flights

Airlines started banning smoking in the late 1980s and by 2000 it was made illegal across the world. Here are the reasons why

Secondhand smoke: Secondhand smoke contains over 7.000 chemicals, including at least 70 known carcinogens. Breathing these harmful chemicals in the confined space of an aircraft poses serious health risks.

### It impacts air quality:

Cigarette smoke can circulate in the confined air and lead to unpleasant odours. It impairs the air quality and jeopardises how the cabin pressure system functions. which can result in a lack of oxygen at high altitude.

It's a fire hazard: A lit cigarette can ignite flammable materials, potentially leading to a catastrophic fire in the cabin. Extinguishing fires mid-flight is challenging.

### **Electronic cigarettes/vapes/IQOS** can cause concern: Therefore

they are also not allowed on in the cabin. While e-cigarettes produce vapour rather than smoke, the visible vapour can be mistaken for traditional cigarette smoke, causing confusion and potential alarm among passengers.

Dry air conditions: The dry air in the aircraft cabin can make fuel more flammable

Smoke detectors: The smoke detector in the toilets is linked to a warning system. When triggered,



the smoke detector notifies cabin crew through a control panel in the cockpit and triggers an audible alarm throughout the aircraft cabin. This system helps cabin crew swiftly address emergency situations related to smoke onboard.

Overheating batteries: Vaping, IQOS and e-cigarettes work with lithium-ion batteries that are more likely to overheat or explode while being used.

### **SMOKING ON A PLANE COULD LEAD TO:**

- Fines of up to €3,000
- A ban from flying with that airline for life
- As per the applicable law, smokers on board may face prosecution.

Remember, lighting up during a flight is not only illegal but also jeopardises the wellbeing and safety of everyone onboard. 




