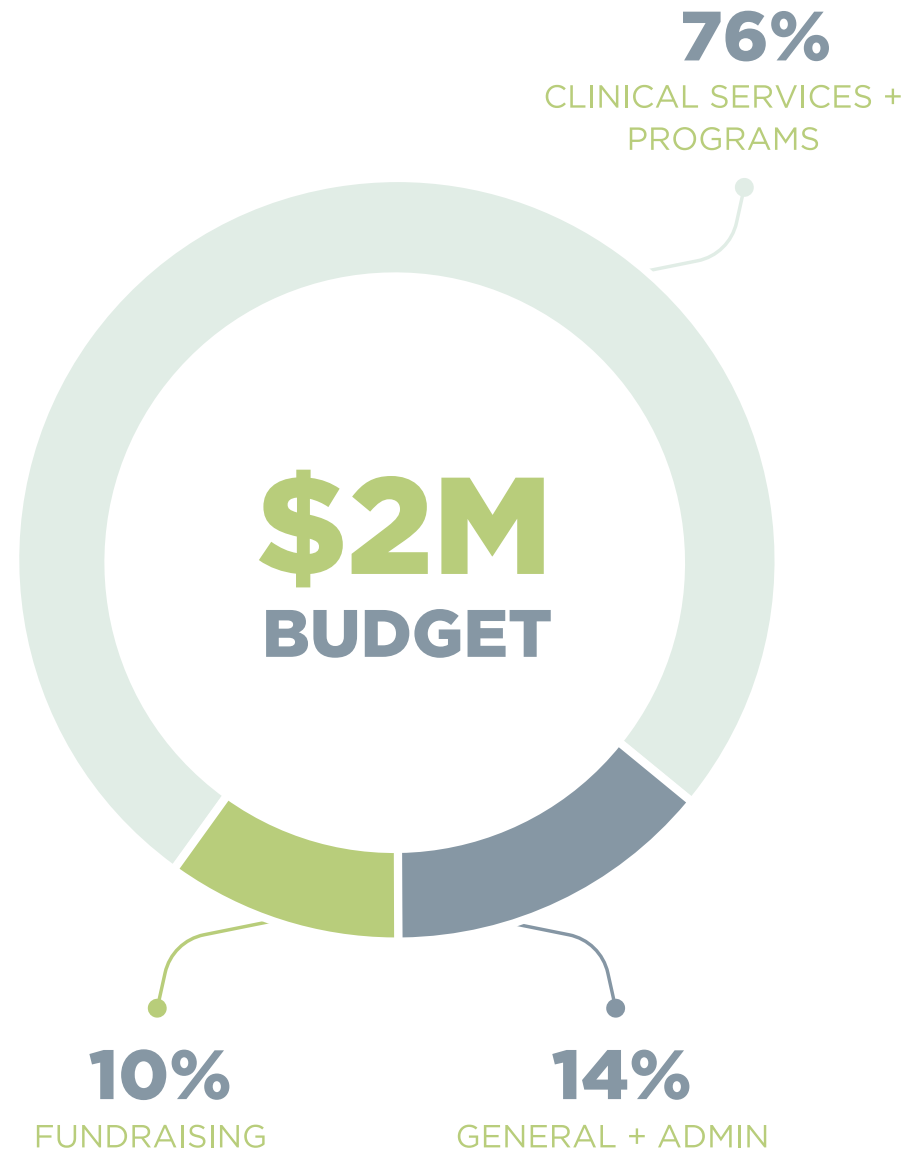

FAMILY PROGRAMMING



GRIEF THERAPY SERVICES

AHF hosted a grief camp in July 2022, in addition to holding multiple grief group sessions throughout the year for both children and adults. The comprehensive grief program is under the direction of AHF's LMFT Susan Latta- who has over 35+ years of grief counseling experience.

STEAM CLUB

Another part of Diversionary Therapy done at AHF, STEAM activities are provided for affected patients and their siblings as a part of their visit to the Foundation. Activities follow a theme and records are kept to ensure that children are following a curriculum and achieving mastery of standards. We also do quarterly STEAM Clubs, all with a different theme, such as geology or engineering.



HONORING THE JOURNEY

This special evening in September 2022 honored those who have walked the journey of childhood cancer and those who have passed away. Families were able to come together with others who have experienced the loss of a child or young adult to pediatric cancer. The evening consisted of a candle lighting ceremony, live music, a special presentation, dinner, desserts and a butterfly release.

CAMPS

Whether it's a one day camp, parents night out, or a week-long camp, AHF plans multiple camps throughout the year for kids to come hang out with others who share a similar journey as they do, and for parents to have a bit of a break. All camps have a unique theme, and are led by our clinically trained staff for a fun day at the Education Advancement Center.



TEEN & YOUNG ADULT NIGHTS

AHF Teen Nights (12-18 year olds) and Young Adult Nights (18-26) are unique, diversionary therapy nights where those affected by cancer in a similar age range can bond over shared experiences while all participating in a fun activity together- like cooking! AHF provides a safe and supportive space for these incredible young people to connect and have fun.

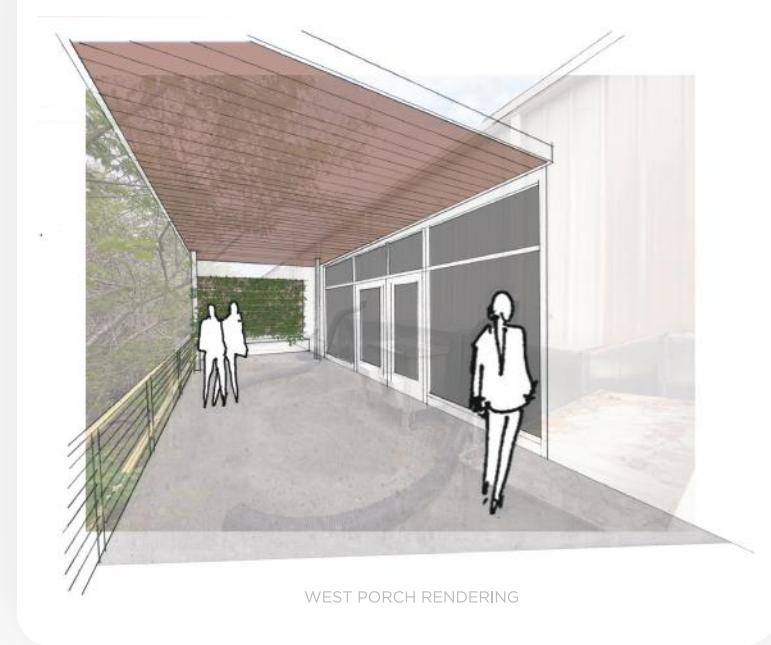
ROAD ATLANTA

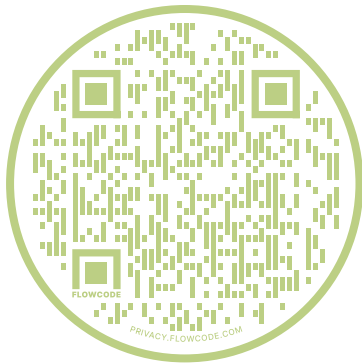
