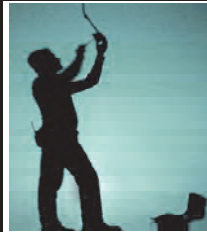

## Call for Entries

Fleurieu Film Festival is delighted to announce that the third annual Fleurieu Film Festival will be held on 9-11 February 2018 and the Call for Entries is now open.

Submissions for short films up to 8 mins in duration will close 5.00pm Friday 24th Nov 2017. The theme for next year's festival is **FIRE** and to be eligible filmmakers must include a reference to fire in their films.

A passion for short film and a desire to support filmmakers inspired the inaugural Fleurieu Film Festival and the response from filmmakers, patrons and sponsors has been brilliant. The first two festivals were sold out and last year 6 world premiere films were screened.

In recognition of a growing interest from younger audiences and tertiary institutions involved in screen production there will be a new award at this year's festival - the Young Filmmakers Award - for 18 to 24-

year-old filmmakers. Another new initiative will be a Film Makers Forum on Sunday 11 February. Presented in conjunction with industry partners it will further our aim to engage and support Australian filmmakers. The Awards Night screening on Friday 9 February 2018 will again be held by the lake in the stunning grounds of Serafino Winery at McLaren Vale, where festival patrons can enjoy the best of local produce and wines from Serafino or from food trucks on site. To celebrate this year's fire theme the night will finish with a spectacular fireworks display.

### **It's time to embrace Daylight Saving, with longer Summer days taking effect from Sunday 1 October 2017.**

With the shift in time comes a number of shifts in operations throughout the district. Of particular importance is the change in schedule for exercising dogs on some District beaches and reserves. Please note that the dog controls on our most popular beaches changed earlier this year and dogs are required to be on leash between certain times at particular locations. ## REINVIGORATING THE HEYSEN TRAIL – UPDATE

In August, 28 people attended a public meeting to hear more about a draft concept for reinvigorating the Heysen Trail. The concept featured elements including upgrades to walker-only infrastructure, improved access for passenger pick up/drop off and the creation of a gateway statement at the southern trailhead. In addition to feedback at the meeting, a further 118 online responses were received.

A key principle of the reinvigoration strategy is encouraging new demographics to the region. One in five people have disability: temporary or permanent, total or partial, lifelong or acquired. This group has been recognised by national and state tourism organisations as an overlooked, underserved and growing market segment.

Following feedback along with on-site visits, the Cape Jervis-Fishery Beach proposal has been modified to focus on the first 200-300 metres of

the Heysen Trail. For the extended Class 1 trail experience, an alternative site at Goondooloo Ridge has been identified. The Goondooloo Ridge Trail is entirely within the Deep Creek Conservation Park, with the terrain for most of the walk being open, grassed rolling hills, populated by eucalypts, yakkas and groups of 'relaxed' Western Grey kangaroos. Given the open terrain and topography this area lends itself to the promotion of night walks and it is suggested that night walks would be an attractive option for visitors to the region.

The intention is to seek State Government support for this project. DEWNR is currently developing a business case which it is hoping to present to the Minister of Environment, Sustainability and Natural Resources later this year.

# FIRE PREVENTION – ADVANCED NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

As the state dries off ahead of Summer, property owners are being advised to turn their attention to fire prevention. All property owners are required under law to undertake fire prevention measures. All vegetation\* (grass, pest plants and undergrowth) is to be reduced to a maximum height of a 100mm with the following considerations:

- Within 20 metres of any building
- Vacant blocks under half a hectare in area over the whole block
- Vacant blocks over half a hectare in area, require at least a 5 metre-wide strip fire break around the whole perimeter

All fire prevention measures must be in place by the start of the official 2017-18 Fire Danger Season (to be announced this month) and be maintained throughout the entirety of the

season. Council will be regularly patrolling to assess properties. Owners of vacant blocks within townships or investment properties in particular are reminded to remain vigilant about the conditions of their properties this season. For blocks/land posing a fire risk, Council's Fire Prevention Officer may issue a hazard reduction notice against the owner, and, if necessary, undertake the required maintenance at the owner's expense. For more information contact the Council's Fire Prevention Officer.

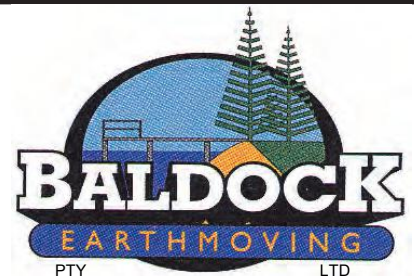

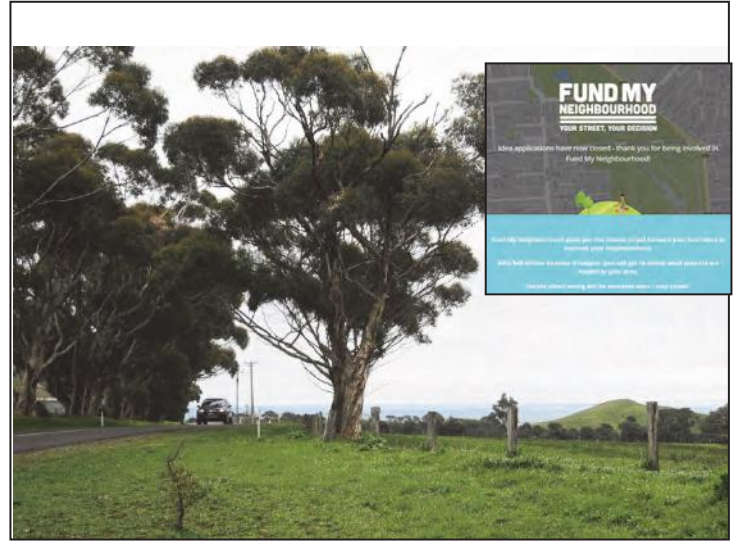



## Hooded Plovers Are Back

Our favourite little beach nesting bird, the Hooded Plover have arrived back to their nesting sites on our local beaches in the last month. Already the Normanville South pair have a nest with 3 eggs, this has been fenced and signs erected so please when you see the signs keep a good distance from the fence and put your dogs on the leash.

The signs and fences are a valuable tool for protecting the birds. Most beach goers do not mean harm to beach nesting birds and generally only need to be made aware of possible impacts they might have. BirdLife Australia research shows that when highly threatened nest sites are signed or fenced off, the Hoodies have a much greater chance of raising their young (the equivalent to Hoodies living on isolated beaches).

Last season 16 fledglings were reported on the Fleurieu, however most of these were on the South Coast. It would be great if we could help these venerable birds breed successfully on our local beaches this season.

The Yankalilla Council have changed some of their dog controls on local beaches. In daylight saving hours dogs have to be on the leash from 10am-6pm on all beaches with the exception of Shelly Beach and Lands' End which are dog free beaches. For more information contact the Yankalilla Council or the Resource centre.



## Weed of the Month from Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group

### Common Groundsel (*Senecio vulgaris*)

Senecios come in many forms... from the rare and unusual to the very common, and from trees through to small weedy herbs such as this one. This groundsel grows to about knee high, with clusters of flower heads at the end of the stems. The individual flowers are only about 1cm long, and don't seem to open properly, probably because of all those bracts surrounding the petals!

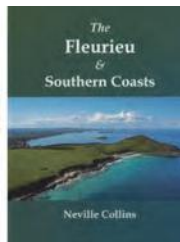
Only a millimetre or two of the yellow petals show at the top. There are 15 bracts or more, each tipped with black as can be seen in the photo. There are also lots of little bracts at the base of the flower head, again edged in black. Eventually the flower head produces a fluffy white ball, with the seed on the inside of the ball, waiting to be blown away like dandelion seed. Although this weed is found along our coastlines and in our national parks, it is more common in urban areas, or disturbed sites.

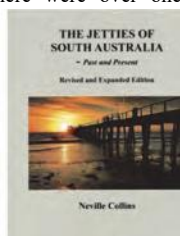

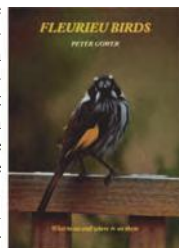

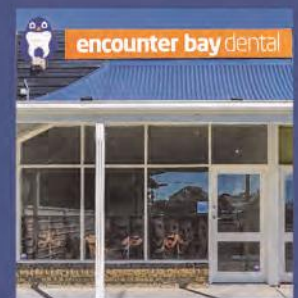

## The Demise - part 2a

For many years the oil/petrol companies have had the humble car owner under their control. They had a monopoly over the fuel that was required for automotive transport.

With electric cars the same scenario could take place with the electricity supply company's being in a good position to do the same. They already seem to have a long leash as far as price control goes.

Long distance driving will put EVs in the hands of them and we should take steps to avoid the monopoly situation happening again.

Fortunately there are some conditions available to EV motorist's to take charge of their own power supply close to home that were not readily available when petrol was required. Solar obviously is at the forefront [mentioned previously] but even with a battery storage back up we don't always have enough sunshine available to make the electricity required for our needs. We could have a generator on hand for emergencies [power failures at night and cloudy days]. Unfortunately you will also need fossil fuel to run it but it is only a short term requirement and I have a feeling there are other ways to take charge of these emergency's just around the corner. I like the idea of a pedal powered generator, exercise while you charge a battery. Every little bit helps. Tongue in cheek [maybe].

OK so a lot of panels required for a full charge of these EVs each day and if you need it all for your daily travel requirement the investment may look big. An average EV will do say 200k [it will get better, some claim 300 right now] on a full charge and if you look at the petrol required to travel the same distance you get an idea of the costs involved. 200 @ say 7 litres per 100 kilometres @ \$1.30 per litre [it will get worse] is in round figures, \$18. That's conservative as the 7 litre per 100k is a bit of a dream for most of us [big cars]. 365 days, less 10% for non use is around 328 x \$18 saving about \$5,900 a year. You will have to invest more than this which could take a few years to get back but things are changing fast and another crystal ball would be handy right now..

Solar panels on the car needs an approach that people are working on and will have a great affect if they can achieve the results they are targeting, every little bit counts [solar power collecting glass amongst other things?]. This will in turn have a dramatic effect on our solar energy gathering at home. Things will get better.

All these are possible ways of holding back the monopoly situation from happening again.

Autonomous is a word that comes to mind and the politicians should take heed of this and support their constituents in their quest to take a stab at cleaning up the part of the environment we have neglected over the years.

New ways of thinking are required and it would be great to see new viable approaches to give our world a chance to survive in a better condition for our grandchildren and their grandchildren.

## Re: Weekend Surgery Hours Funding going, going ...

I refer to the recent letter regarding the above matter. Following significant inquiries from patients at the Southern Fleurieu Family Practice it is appropriate I confirm the current position regarding this matter and impact on the after-hours service.

## Federal and State Funding withdrawn

I can confirm the Practice has had funding support:

- withdrawn by the State Government in December 2013 which was used to provide an overnight Doctor on call service to the region and the emergency services at the Practice usually without charge for any consumables

- modified by the Federal Government from July 2015. This funding was used to subsidise staff wage costs for the after-hours service Monday-Friday between 6pm-8pm, Saturday afternoons, and all day Sunday and public holidays.

## Impact on Patient Services

This funding withdrawal has affected our patient services as follows:

- The 24/7 medical service ceased in December 2014 when state funding was withdrawn. The Practice made multiple efforts to have this funding restored without success. It means patients with serious and life threatening conditions are now required to seek emergency treatment at the nearest public hospital, often requiring an ambulance transfer. To avoid the ambulance cost we have strongly supported residents taking out Ambulance insurance.

- The Practice now charges patients for consumables used in all treatments. Every effort was made to delay the level and imposition of this charge however to sustain the service to the community when funding was removed we needed to impose a charge on those patients using the service.

- After-hours medical appointments, particularly on Sundays and Public Holidays have been disrupted. Where there have been no or minimal bookings some services have been withdrawn as it is not sustainable to maintain the practice hours without support funding. Sunday and Public holiday services will remain under constant review and may be withdrawn without notice when little demand exists. This means patients who seek medical treatment at these times will need to postpone treatment and care or seek it at the nearest medical outlet. This again involves travel and cost and loses the continuity of care which we strongly support.

## What have we done

We have tirelessly for the past 2.5 years made approaches to recognise the unique circumstances which exist in the Fleurieu Peninsula which warrant ongoing funding to maintain and provide the medical services the community (and its many visitor's) deserve. I thank the Hon Rebekha Sharkie who has supported our efforts to restore reasonable funding support for this service. However, it is disappointing:

- The federal government Minister has hidden behind the Practice Incentive Program as an excuse to not restore after hours funding. While we receive a small incentive which covers no more than 10% of the true cost, the Minister and the Department have not accepted the PIP does not cover every situation across Australia. Minister Hunt says PIP is intended to be the 'main' funding. Perhaps he should allow the Department or his operational network the Country health PHN consider the merits of providing this community with a medical service.

- The Country SA PHN has elected not to support the

regional case. Sadly, they make representations to the Practice they are supportive yet advise the Department of Health something different. In fact, they warranted ongoing support for 2015/16 and then pulled it, allegedly due to Department of Health direction. Who can you believe?

- The State Government has failed to intervene and support this region. At the recent Community Cabinet event held at the Yankalilla Football Club a direct approach was made to Premier Weatherill and Minister Bignell who both claimed the region required important infrastructure and services with the growth of the tourism and wine industry. Despite a number of direct email communications to Minister Bignell's office there has been no reply.

## What is needed

This community deserves a 7 day a week medical service which can provide appointment services across the hours of 8am-8pm Monday to Friday and 9am-5pm every Saturday, Sunday and Public Holiday. Funding support to sustain wage costs and operating costs would facilitate this. We have consistently demonstrated the cost benefit analysis shows this service to be a much more effective use of taxpayers funds than the costs incurred through hospital transfer, Emergency Department attendance and overnight hospitalisation.

## What you can do

The Practice proposes to commence a formal petition for patients to sign. In the meantime, any concerned resident should also make their concerns known directly to:

**Premier Jay Weatherill** (GPO Box 2343, Adelaide SA 5001)

**Minister Peter Malinauskas** (GPO Box 668, Adelaide SA 5001)

**Minister Leon Bignell** (GPO Box 1671, Adelaide SA 5001)

Should you contact them directly feel free to mention the following points:

- SFFP is the only medical facility on the west coast of the Fleurieu Peninsula. The nearest public casualty area is at Victor Harbor or Noarlunga, and further afield Flinders Public. All take time, use hazardous roads and require personal transport (there is NO public transport) or travel in a costly ambulance ride.

- The Practice caters for a usual population of 4,500 which can increase to 16,000 in summer vacation and other holiday periods; that is the afterhours service periods.

- It was providing 24/7 access to medical services with the financial support from the State Government (for overnight and emergency care) and the Federal Government for after-hours services (6-8pm Mon to Fri; Sat afternoon and Sunday and Public Holidays).

- Overnight services ceased in Dec 2014 when the State Government withdrew finance support to pay doctors an on call fee. Patients now needing emergency care are required to travel to either of the above casualty facilities.

- After hours services have now been disrupted following the withdrawal of funding support

- Despite prior assurances Country SA PHN have withdrawn funding (allegedly due to the Department of Health) from 1/7/2016.

- The Practice delivered over 2000 services to patients during afterhours on Saturday afternoons and Sundays who will need to move to other regions for this treatment if the Practice is closed.

- The range of presentations during after-hours in the past 12 months has included acute child asthma, Anaphylaxis, Blocked airways, Cardiac/chest pain, Burns, Gallstones, Pain management, Dehydration, jellyfish stings and Mental health

- Funding to retain this service would be highly cost effective when compared with the health system costs of ambulance transfer, ED time and overnight hospitalisation

## What will we do

You can be assured this Practice will make every effort to sustain our current after-hours service.

As a reminder our normal opening hours (subject to bookings) are: Monday to Friday: 8am-8pm; Saturday: 9am-5pm; Sunday 10am-4pm. Please call 85580111 to make a booking.

## Keeping Fit: Side Planks

Have you been looking for another way to challenge your midsection? The Side plank, or as its also called 'the oblique lift', could be for you. Not only does it test your

core on a different plane, it also requires good shoulder stability.

1. Start by lying on your side, with the lower arm resting on its elbow. Make sure the elbow is directly

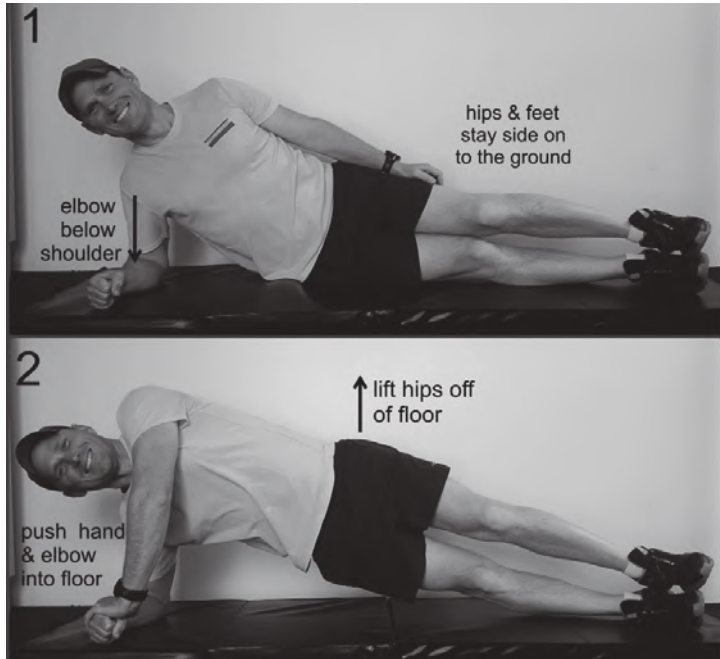
below the line of the shoulder, otherwise this joint will be put in a stressful position.

2. Have both feet and hips in a long straight line.

3. While staying square to the floor, use your elbow and top hand to place pressure into the floor so you can lift your top hip towards the ceiling. (it helps to think of a puppet string pulling you up from the hip)

4. Once the hip is lifted, lower it back down with control, rest, take a breath and repeat hopefully 10 times.

5. An advanced version of this is to only use the elbow to lift the body without the support of the top hand.

## Southern Fleurieu Family Practice

### Dr Lyn Gardiner – 42 Years Service to Rural South Australia

One of Yankalilla's most respected doctor's has decided to retire after 42 years as a rural General Practitioner. Dr Lyn Gardiner established the first medical practice in Yankalilla, and spent 30 years working in it as a solo GP, before expanding the practice.

The Southern Fleurieu Family Practice will miss him as will his many patients. Practice Manager, Sasha Godrich says Dr Gardiner is deeply respected.

"He is highly regarded by his colleagues but also by the community," she said.

Dr Gardiner graduated from Adelaide University in 1968, and completed his Resident Medical Officer year at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital before spending five years with the Royal Australian Airforce as a medical officer. "The last three of those years were spent in Western Australia and we returned to SA with two daughters," said Dr Gardiner.

"After some revision and upskilling in obstetrics and paediatrics we searched for a rural practice not too far from Adelaide."

Dr Gardiner developed a special interest in the ambulance service and its volunteers, after 12 road crash fatalities in his first 12 months at Yankalilla.

"My association with what was to become SAAS began as a support to our local volunteers, offering encouragement, assistance with training

and hands on help where and when required," said Dr Gardiner.

"The development of a centralised career staffed ambulance service, the introduction of paramedics with advanced life-saving skills, aeromedical rescue and retrieval, and improved volunteer training has led to many lives saved that otherwise would have been lost."

Dr Gardner was also involved with the establishment by Country Health South Australia of the Rural Emergency Responders Network, a group of specially trained rural GPs that attend out-of-hospital emergencies in partnership with SAAS and the MedSTAR retrieval service.

Ironically, Dr Gardiner required the assistance of these networks in January 2012 after he was paged to assist a crew at a tractor roll-over, two kilometres out of Yankalilla.

Dr Gardiner suffered a cardiac arrest at the scene. Fortunately, the medical retrieval service MedStar was already there.

"The good luck was being in the right place at the right time, with all the facilities already in train," he said.

"Having handed the patient over to the retrieval team, I stood up, turned around and did a face plant with a VF arrest. The CFS captain called in the event and began CPR. Defibrillation was successful.

"A second retrieval team had to be mobilised to manage the original casualty, during which interval I was

intubated and anaesthetised. Both helicopters flew us to Flinders Medical Centre in formation, which is definitely an uncommon sight.

"It was an unforgettable day and my deepest thanks go out to the members of our ambulance and emergency services who so capably adapted to the escalation of life threats on that day," said Dr Gardiner.

He returned to work four months later, and he worked up until 14 September 2017, when retirement beckoned and was answered.

Now 74 years old, Dr Gardiner says he's had a career full of highs and lows and that he has loved his time in Yankalilla.

"The community here is really strong and supportive of me and my practice. I've always been made welcome," said Dr Gardiner.

"We live in a 140 year old house which has been neglected. We'd like to correct that and of course we'll do some travel."

Dr Gardner says three of his four children live interstate, so there'll be plenty of trips.

"We have ten grandchildren; it will be lovely to spend some quality time with them."

He has been recognised by the Council of Ambulance Authorities and the Rural Emergency Responder Network and has received an RDWA service medal recognising his years of service.

## Ladies Probus Club

Our members gathered on August 23rd at the Community Hall Yankalilla and after announcements and minutes were read, three birthdays were celebrated and Clare McCann received her 20 year pin. This was followed by morning tea.

Our guest speaker Dr Maureen Roberts introduced herself as being a Doctor of the soul from the Greek "psyche-iatros". We found her talk very thought provoking. Her opening sentence stunned us as she asked if any of us suffered from depression, bi-polar disorder, social anxiety, and addiction to the internet? In fact any or all of us could have up to six disorders. Are we all insane? In fact being a human could well be described as a disorder if we examine what is happening in our society and the world.

Dr Roberts particularly addressed the prescription of psychotic drugs which seem to be on the increase not only in Australia but worldwide.

Radical reforms to our way of life are needed if we are to be protected from taking drugs. Without being aware of the dangers many people are prescribed drugs without thorough investigation or medical evidence of mental illness. Beginning in early childhood medications may be prescribed for inattention and hyperactivity. These may alter the way the brain functions resulting in more serious negative behaviours. Reasons for hyperactivity need to be fully explored.

Under the huge umbrella of Medicare and bringing wealth to pharmaceutical companies many people are being prescribed psychotic drugs for conditions described as a chemical imbalance or mental disorder. Sadly the long term outcome of taking such drugs can be devastating causing permanent damage to brain function and resulting in negative outcomes for the patient and other members of the community.

We have become used to hearing that a person who has committed an offence has been given a light sentence or none at all due to mental illness. We tend to be accepting of such outcomes but is it right for a lawyer to make such a decision? Where is the scientific evidence of mental illness? Psychiatrists are now being employed to provide support to offenders. Does the public question enough the outcome of such court proceedings?

Years ago we did not have the range of psychotic drugs which are currently used. Patients were described as having a mental breakdown or feeling sad and unhappy. Is it possible to return to a more simplistic way of helping people who are suffering such problems? By being 'human' and

relating to people in our community, supporting one another, providing help and listening to people. If we share life's hurdles and support one another reform can come from the community. Taking a tablet and making pharmaceutical companies rich is not the answer.

We need to guard against labelling people as mentally sick and recognise the normal ups and downs of life which we all experience.

If we seek help from a professional person there is a high probability that they will prescribe a drug. There are many deaths each year in addition to life threatening disorders, blood clots and brain damage from neuroleptic drugs. Each year the statistics reveal that there are more drugs issued and an increase in disorders. The need for drugs is on the increase and we are seeing the evidence of that with our medical costs and need for more funding.

More people need to question their treatment particularly if the medication being taken could make changes to brain function which cannot be treated. When told that you have an incurable illness most people accept the treatment which is prescribed, however some drugs can cause imbalances in the brain which cannot be corrected.

Medical Practitioners invited to a conference in 2002 declined to attend. The topic was 'Therapeutic Communities', the move to de-institutionalise people, surround them with a protective environment and treat with kindness.

Doctor Roberts reported the conference

findings were that anti-psychotic drugs have little effect on long term psychiatric patients. She suggested modern treatment should provide empathy for people and human right advocates state that we have a right to refuse drugs.

"The value of a society is how well we look after our most vulnerable".

Dr Roberts provided a most thought provoking talk and shared a lot of knowledge with us. Many thanks for her presentation, book references, pamphlets and DVD's which she shared.

Recommended reading; 'Take Control of your own health' by Elaine Hollingsworth. Our next meeting will be on 27th September and three ladies will demonstrate their skills, in painting, machine embroidery and miniatures.

## Grants to help launch your environmental ideas

Applications are now open for grants of up to \$5000 each for projects that protect and enhance our environment.

The Community Natural Resources Management (NRM) Action Grants are awarded annually by the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges NRM Board.

The grants are open to any community group, small business, non-government organisation or individual in the Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges region.

Andrew Raymond from Natural Resources Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges said the grants could be used to fund on-ground works or activities that build community capacity, such as training or knowledge sharing.

"Last year's grants helped with some great projects including restoring habitat for threatened species, producing a fungi field guide, trialling new ways to control weeds, and running cultural learning workshops," Mr Raymond said.

"It's great to see so many local groups making a real difference by working to safeguard and restore our local environment. The Community NRM Action Grants are helping support their efforts."

Grant recipients last year included the Adelaide Showground Farmers' Market, where sustainable living information sessions on topics such as worm farming and growing vegetables are just one example of how a group used a grant to educate the community and lead positive change.

A grant to the Friends of Black Hill and Morialta helped with the purchase of a remote camera which was used to confirm that southern brown bandicoots are living in Morialta Conservation Park. It was the first time the endangered marsupial had been seen in the park for a decade.

The Friends also employed contractors to tackle weeds that require specialised

control techniques, and to improve the biodiversity of popular rock climbing areas in Morialta.

Grant applications close midnight Friday 20 October.

## Little sailing ships... underpinning early settlement

The officers of the South Australian Company, who set up an establishment on Kangaroo Island from July and August 1836, arrived from England in nine sailing ships, ranging from the relatively small schooner *John Pirie* of 105 tons to the larger HMS *Buffalo* of 850 tons. Also, from the time of their first arrival, there was an urgent need of a smaller vessel, such as a cutter – a single-masted decked vessel, accommodating and easily managed by two or three men – and several early colonists brought with them frames, timbers, spars, sails, anchors, and chains, etc., for construction into small craft in the new

colony. A considerable number of men skilled in boat and shipbuilding, and handling small craft, were sent out with the 236-ton barque *South Australian*. Among them was experienced shipbuilder, Henry Mildred; Captain Joseph Wright, who had been a registered Channel pilot as superintendent of draught and seine fishery; John Germein as superintendent trawler and fisherman, his brothers Sam and Ben, aged 18 and 15 years respectively; Gilbert Hutchinson, harpooner; and Gregory Cummins, a ship's caulker.

Some small boats were brought out from England, others were sourced from Tasmania and some were built from local timber. However, the majority of small ships used came from Tasmania, as they were built by skilled tradesmen from quality timber, including the cutter *William* which arrived in the colony in September 1836.

Before any jetties were built, ships had to anchor offshore and passengers and goods transferred to shore by a cutter, longboat, hatchboat or gig.

Colonel William Light first made landfall on the mainland of the new colony at Rapid Bay, named after the brig *Rapid*, on 8 September 1836, having proceeded up Gulf St Vincent from Kangaroo Island. A week after landing Light went north to what is now Second Valley and walked overland to Yankalilla. He wrote, 'There is a beautiful stream of fresh water running into the sea.' This is near the mouth of the Yankalilla River. He was a prolific painter and recorded many events in paintings. Assistant surveyor on the *Rapid* with Colonel Light, William Pullen, wrote in his diary for this day:

*'Before leaving [Kangaroo Island] the Colonel engaged a man by the name of Cooper & his family, a sealer & had been about 7 years on the Island he was to act as Pilot his wives (two native women) and Kangaroo dogs were to supply us with fresh meat. When all ready started for Gulf St Vincent the distance across from Nepean Bay to Cape Jervis the East pt of the Gulf being about 25 miles we reached it that evening. Many & various were the opinions given on the near approach to the land, it was indeed beautiful presenting more the appearance of a park than land that had been for centuries trodden by uncultivated savages. How anxious were we to get on shore, no sooner was the anchor down & sails furled than off we started appearances had not indeed deceived us we were delighted & many castles built*

*and conjectures on prosperity likely to arise out of such a scene as was presented to us. Nothing but luxuriant foliage & oh! a thick sward of many and various flowers what was to expected from the act of man when such was the state of the place while in a Nature's garden. Cooper was sent off with his women to bring in the tribe of the place while we were busily employed getting tents & provisions on shore for the Colonel & surveying party it being the intention to remain here a few days. A garden was made & stocked with seeds we had brought with us The Bay and valley examined to satisfaction & named after the brig being the first vessel ever having anchored there.'*

Colonel Light's Journal recording his survey work along our coasts in the later months of 1836, and before the arrival of the *Buffalo*, wrote that the brig *Rapid*'s longboat and hatchboat were used for sending messages to the other ships and that Mr. Pullen sailed in over the bar at the entrance of the Port Creek in the hatchboat and proceeded a distance of nearly 15 miles; and also that men were sent from the *Rapid*, at Rapid Bay, in the hatchboat to the barque *Cygnat* at Holdfast Bay. Mr Pullen was the first to navigate the Port Creek, when he went in the hatchboat as far as its depth permitted and then continued in the ship's gig up to the Old Port. Colonel Light on the *Rapid* outside the river was most likely watching from the masthead the progress of the little ship, revealed by the occasional appearance of its sails over the mangroves beyond the sandhills of Lefevre's Peninsula.

It wasn't long before there were numerous small ships plying the coast between the port of Adelaide and the settlements becoming established along the coast of Gulf St Vincent at Aldinga, Rapid Bay, Yankalilla and Normanville, as well as to Kangaroo Island.

Dr John Woodforde at the surveyors' camp at Rapid Bay recorded in his diary on 4 December 1836: 'A sailing cutter anchored at the camp and disposed of 1-1/2 tons of potatoes and cheese and muttonbird eggs.'

But these trips in such small craft required courageous and resourceful mariners, and were not without difficulties. There were often mishaps, and many boats were wrecked along the coast in heavy seas and bad weather.

The first recorded wreck in South Australian waters was the cutter from HMS *Investigator*, commanded by Captain Matthew Flinders. Having

reached the entrance of what would later be called Spencer Gulf on 21 February 1802, the ship's cutter under command of the master John Thistle and with midshipman William Taylor and six sailors crossed to the nearby coast to search for water. The cutter was overturned and destroyed by a strong tide and all men were lost. Little wreckage and no bodies were found despite an extensive search. Flinders named adjacent islands after all of the men lost. The point of land nearest the disaster was called Cape Catastrophe.

Severe storms in Encounter Bay in December 1837 destroyed two ships. On 8 December, the South Australian Company's ship *South Australian*, anchored in Rosetta Harbour having been modified for whaling, was blown from her moorings and onto a reef. Crew and passengers escaped but the vessel was destroyed. *Solway* anchored near the site of the *South Australian* wreck later in December and was similarly destroyed in another storm, again with no loss of life. *John Pirie* was also driven onto the same reef, but was successfully re-floated.

On 29 March 1838, the wooden brig *Dart* grounded on Troubridge Shoal at the entrance of St Vincent Gulf, and became a total wreck, but there was no loss of life. The barque *Parsee* was also wrecked on Troubridge Shoal, on 17 November that year, but crew and passengers reached safety, although the ship and most of the cargo was lost. The cutter *William* was driven ashore in Yankalilla Bay in September that year and wrecked.

The brig *David Whitton* went ashore south of the entrance to the Onkaparinga River during a storm on 17 March 1839. The crew and some cargo were saved, but the ship was a total loss.

The cutter *Francis*, built at Encounter Bay by William Paterson, was sailed on a sealing trip by its owner in August 1840 and was wrecked on Neptune Island, where it is believed that the crew subsisted on penguins for 50 days. Despairing of ever being rescued two of the crew set out in the cutter's dinghy for Port Lincoln, 50 miles away, where they arrived safely, and a longboat then sent to rescue the remaining crew. Many others weren't so lucky.

## Yankalilla and the Historic Connection to Saint Mary of the Cross-MacKillop

### October 1867- The First Josephite Rural Convent and School Opened. 2017 - 150 Years

The Story of Mary Helen MacKillop and the teaching Institute of the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Cross that she co-founded with Father Julien Tension Woods in Adelaide in 1867 is well documented. However not well recognised is the historic significance of Yankalilla in her vision to provide educational opportunities to children of underprivileged circumstances. In October 1857, the first rural Josephite convent and school was opened in Yankalilla. This was the first experiment of opening a Josephite Catholic School in a remote district where the Catholics are scattered and the Priest resident at some distance. "So far, the trial has been a complete success. The people have come forward in a most generous way to assist the two school sisters who have taken charge of the district..." Fr.

The school operated between 1867 to 1874. The School House and Convent on Section 1181 at 48 Main Street Yankalilla was built by Thomas John O'Callaghan. It is probable that for

some of the time he rented the house at number 48 Main Street to the Josephite Nuns and that Mother Superior, Sister Mary MacKillop made a visit sometime in 1869, although no clear records have been found; however, the Josephine Nuns have always believed that she did pay a visit to Yankalilla. In 1874, the convent and the school closed. This was not in any way a sign of failure of the venture, but was a consequence of the events of the times, which saw a significant population movement away from the district. In 2010, a plaque was installed outside the house, (now privately owned), to commemorate the MacKillop School House and the two Nuns, Sister Clare
