



Masjid Al-Ghufran was registered as Surau Balai Islam under supervision of the Federal Territory Islamic Religious Department (JAWI) on 6th April 1993. It was initially used for the local Islamic community meeting centre as well as the centre for religious classes besides acting as a prayer hall for congregation members around the Taman Tun Dr. Ismail. In line with the rapidly growing development, Surau Balai Islam was upgraded to mosque on 4th April 2000. The mosque is named Masjid Al-Ghufran in conjunction with the name given by Datuk Mohd Hashim B. Yahaya, the Federal Territory Mufti at that time which means 'Forgiveness'.



Masjid Jamek Sultan Abdul Samad, located at the confluence of the Gombak and Klang Rivers in Kuala Lumpur, is the city's oldest mosque, built in 1908 and officiated in 1909. Designed by British architect Arthur Benison Hubback, it showcases a unique blend of Mughal, Arab, and Moorish styles, with onion-shaped domes, twin minarets, and red-and-white brick arches inspired by North Indian Islamic architecture. The mosque features a spacious courtyard, marble columns, and colourful stained-glass windows. Set against the backdrop of the Sultan Abdul Samad Building, it stands as a symbol of historical heritage and Islamic architecture in the heart of Kuala Lumpur.






Masjid Saidina Abu Bakar As-Siddiq in Bangsar was established in response to community requests in 1976 and officially opened on 15 July 1982 by Sultan Ahmad Shah. Initially funded by RM700,000 in public donations and later supported by the government, it was completed under the 3rd Malaysia Plan. Designed for 3,500 worshippers, its capacity increased to 4,000 following an expansion in 2009–2010. Blending traditional Malay Islamic and modern architectural elements, it features a 43.3-metre minaret and open-concept layout. The mosque includes prayer halls, classrooms, offices, a library, and community spaces, serving as a vital centre for worship, education, and social activities.



Masjid Wilayah Persekutuan

Masjid Wilayah's construction began in 1996 and was completed in 2000, symbolising a new era for Malaysia. Initiated by Prime Minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, it is located near central Kuala Lumpur, close to the MATRADE building and Tuanku Abdul Halim Road. Officially opened in 2005 by the Yang di-Pertuan Agong, Tuanku Syed Sirajudin, its design was inspired by Istanbul's Blue Mosque. It features 22 lightweight domes made of glass fibre and epoxy resin. Positioned on a hill, the mosque includes a hypostyle layout, moat, cascading waterfalls, and mosaic floors that reflect light, creating the illusion of floating on water.






Masjid Putra in Putrajaya, built in 1996 and officially opened on 30 August 2000, was inspired by Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad and named after Malaysia's first Prime Minister, Tunku Abdul Rahman Putra Al-Haj. As a symbol of national independence and Islamic leadership, the mosque is set beside Putrajaya Lake and appears to float when viewed from Putra Bridge. Its architecture blends Safavid Persian influences with modern technology, featuring traditional elements like an octagonal transition from the square prayer hall to its grand central dome. At night, the mosque glows with dramatic lighting, making it one of Putrajaya's most iconic sights. Visitors can enjoy free mosque tours, WiFi, Braille Quran learning facilities, and even a children's play corner. With five main levels, including prayer areas, a media room, classrooms, and full facilities for those with special needs, it offers both spiritual and community experiences. Robes are provided for free – so come as you are and explore this architectural gem.

Masjid Al-Azhar, located at Kolej Universiti Islam Antarabangsa Selangor (KUIS) in Bandar Seri Putera, is classified as an "Institution Mosque" as it sits within an Islamic higher education institution under the Selangor Islamic Religious Council (MAIS). Constructed between 1998 and 2000, it was officiated by Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah on 25 May 2002. Positioned at the heart of KUIS, it has welcomed prominent scholars, both local and international. The mosque features a distinctive design, primarily Ottoman in style, with large domes, tall minarets, high ceilings, and spacious compounds, incorporating Moorish, Arabic, and modern Malay architectural elements.



Masjid Diraja Sultan Ala'eddin

Masjid Diraja Sultan Ala'eddin in Kampung Bandar, Kuala Langat, is a Royal Mosque of Selangor built in 1908 during the reign of Sultan Ala'eddin Suleiman Shah and officially inaugurated in 1926. Influenced by the Deli Sultanate's architecture, it stands near Istana Bandar and Bukit Jugra. Recognised for its historical importance, it was gazetted as an ancient monument in 1981 and declared a National Heritage Site in 2008. Today, it remains an active place of worship and a proud symbol of Islamic heritage for the local community.

Masjid Diraja Tengku Ampuan Jemaah in Bukit Jelutong was officially opened on 16 March 2013 by Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah. Named after the late Tengku Ampuan Jemaah, Malaysia's 9th Raja Permaisuri Agong, it was built between 2010 and 2013 and accommodates up to 4,000 worshippers. Funded through a RM25.5 million waqf from sources including the Selangor State Government and Sime Darby, its design was revised by Dato' Seri Nik Mohamed Mahmood to reflect Islamic spirituality, inspired by Al-Masjid Al-Haram. Featuring four minarets, a

central dome, marble mihrab, red carpets, and songket motifs, it blends Middle



Masjid Jamek Sultan Abdul Aziz in Petaling Jaya began in 1956 as a small wooden surau for 100-150 worshippers and was later rebuilt in the early 1960s with a concrete structure featuring an umbrella-shaped roof, increasing its capacity to 250-300. Officially inaugurated on 23 October 1964 by Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah and named in his honour, the mosque evolved alongside Petaling Jaya's growth. To accommodate the expanding population and modern needs, the mosque was later redeveloped with updated facilities by its management committee.



Masjid Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah

The Sultan Salahuddin Abdul Aziz Shah Mosque, Malaysia's largest and most prominent mosque, is located in Shah Alam beside Tasik Raja Lumu. Officially opened on 11 March 1988 by the Sultan of Selangor, it features a striking blue dome and blends Islamic and Malay architectural styles. Spanning 14.6 hectares, it can accommodate up to 24,000 worshippers and includes facilities such as lecture halls, seminar rooms, a library, religious classes, a wedding hall, and spacious ablution areas. With three levels, the mosque houses meeting and reception rooms on the ground floor and the main prayer hall on the first, serving as a powerful symbol of Islam's prominence and Selangor's pride.



Masjid Ar-Rahimah in Kuala Kubu Bharu was built following the 1883 flood that led to the relocation of residents. The original mosque, established in 1965, was replaced in 1999 as the population grew. The new mosque, opened by Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah in 2002, features a tall minaret outside the main building and architecture said to resemble classical English style. The mosque's light blue and white colour theme creates a calm atmosphere. Its spacious prayer hall is comfortably carpeted, offering a pleasant setting for worshippers. The flood-affected area was renamed Ampang Pechah in memory of the tragedy.



Masjid Al-Bukhary in Alor Setar is a legacy project by Tan Sri Syed Mokhtar Al-Bukhary, built near the old Alor Malai mosque once founded by his grandfather. Designed by architect Abdul Harris Othman, the mosque blends various Islamic architectural styles, inspired by the Silk Road and Middle East, to create a unique, integrated complex that includes facilities like a hospital, classrooms, and an orphanage. Set amid paddy fields, it features a cooling courtyard with gardens and fountains, a grand Safavid-inspired main dome, twin Mamluk-style minarets, and a façade adorned with Moroccan arches, embodying both tradition and modernity.

Masjid Zahir, built in 1912 in Alor Setar, Kedah, is a colonial-style mosque blending Mughal and Moorish architecture, reflecting Kedah's Islamic royal heritage. Located in the city centre within the historic Medan Bandar complex, it neighbours the Pelamin Palace and Balai Besar. Designed for the tropical climate, it features sun-protective overhangs and large ventilated openings. The mosque has two mihrabs—the outer added in 1959—and a royal dining hall used for official events. Renovations in 2003 expanded its structure, introducing an asymmetrical layout while preserving the majestic bulbous dome and diverse columns that enhance its cultural significance.



Masjid Al-Malik Khalid

Masjid al-Malik Khalid, located at Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM), was officially opened on 2nd September 1973 and named in honour of King Khalid of Saudi Arabia, in recognition of the financial support from the Saudi Government. Strategically built on the southwestern part of the USM campus near Sungai Dua, the mosque serves both the university and nearby urban communities. 

Masjid Negeri Pulau Pinang, the state mosque of Penang, was constructed starting in 1979 and officially opened on 29 August 1980. Designed by Filipino architect Efren Brindez Paz under the Penang Public Works Department, it can accommodate 7,000 worshippers, with a circular main prayer hall inspired by the hibiscus flower and a central chandelier. Tanjung Bungah

The Northeast District Mosque, also known as the Tanjung Bungah Floating Mosque, was built in 2003 to replace the old Masjid Jamek Tanjung Bungah. It cost RM15 million to build and spans 1,295 square metres, meeting the needs of the growing local population, especially with the nearby relocation of tsunami victims. The mosque can accommodate up to 1,500 worshippers at a time. It was officially opened by former Prime Minister Tun Abdullah Ahmad Badawi on 16 March 2007. On 10 December 2021, it was declared the Northeast District Mosque (Floating Mosque) by the Governor of Penang, Tun Ahmad Fuzi Abdul Razak. The mosque remained strong and undamaged during the tsunami that hit northern Peninsular Malaysia on 26 December 2004, even as many nearby houses were destroyed. It also acted as a natural barrier, helping to reduce the impact of the waves on the nearby village of Kampung Masjid.





Masjid Ubudiah, also known as the Ubudiah Royal Mosque, is a state mosque in Bukit Chandan, Kuala Kangsar, Perak, built in 1914 and celebrated as one of Malaysia's most beautiful mosques and a symbol of pride for Perak's Muslim community. Located about 3 kilometres from Kuala Kangsar's Royal Town, the mosque has remained largely unchanged except for its main and smaller domes, which were replaced with aluminium after damage to the originals. 





Masjid Al Azim, Malacca's State Mosque in Melaka Tengah, was built between 1984 and 1990 and officiated by Sultan Azlan Shah in July 1990. Its architecture blends Sino-Eclectic revivalism with Chinese influences, featuring a unique three-layered pyramidal roof topped by a small yellow dome. The roof ridges have sculptural designs resembling hand gestures symbolising Islamic prayers. The 57-metre pentagonal minaret represents Islam's five pillars. The square floor plan, inspired by the Prophet's Mosque in Madinah, includes six smaller blocks. The ground floor holds 9,700 worshippers; the first floor, for women, 700, with extra space for 1,300 more.

In 1922, a concrete building replaced the wooden mosque and was officially opened on Friday, 31 July 1931, when it was renamed Masjid Muhammadi after Sultan Muhammad's ancestor. Masjid D'Raja Long Yunus Langgar, originally known as Masjid Mukim Langgar, was believed to have been built between 1871 and 1874 during the reign of Sultan Muhammad II. 

Masjid Jamek Razaleigh is a beautifully designed mosque located in Gua Musang, Kelantan. Construction began in April 2016 on a 1.5-hectare site that formerly housed the old Gua Musang police station. Covering 99,000 square feet and built at a cost of over RM34 million, the mosque was inspired by the design of Masjidil Haram in Makkah. This vision was proposed by YBM Tengku Razaleigh Tengku Hamzah, the Member of Parliament for Gua Musang. The mosque features nine minarets standing 30 metres tall and eight domes styled after those in Makkah. High-quality materials, including premium tiles, were used in its construction. The mosque can accommodate up to 3,500 worshippers, including in its outdoor prayer areas. 



Blue and yellow stained glass windows, Islamic calligraphy, and Qur'anic verses adorn the interior and exterior, creating a serene, elegant atmosphere in the heart of Kuantan.



Initially built using chengal timber in a traditional Terengganu house style, it was later rebuilt with red bricks, added domes, and a three-storey tower. The mosque features a blend of Terengganu traditional, Islamic, and Colonial architectural influences. With a capacity for 2,500 worshippers, it serves as a significant religious and cultural centre in the region and is a popular tourist attraction.





Masjid Sultanah Nur Zahirah in Marang, Terengganu, was built to serve a growing population and increase in tourism. Construction started in October 2003 and finished in April 2005, costing RM8.3 million. The mosque accommodates 1,500 to 2,000 worshippers and features a large central dome with four tall minarets, fostering a serene atmosphere. Inside, it boasts a beautifully decorated mihrab and intricately carved wooden mimbar. Officially opened on 21 July 2006 by Sultan Mizan Zainal Abidin, the mosque honours Terengganu's Queen. Its original carpet design reflects Islam Hadhari, symbolising 99 points.

Masjid Seberang Takir, originally built in the 1960s during the tenure of Terengganu's 7th Menteri Besar, was rebuilt following a proposal under the 14th Menteri Besar, Dato' Seri Dr. Ahmad Razif Abdul Rahman. Construction of the new mosque, completed in 2020 at a cost of RM22 million, accommodates 2,500 worshippers and is located on the banks of the Terengganu River with Kuala Terengganu's skyline as a backdrop. The design showcases traditional Terengganu artistry, notably its distinctive Bumbung Limas dome, and includes the Galeri J.M. Aziz, honouring the local poet from Seberang Takir.

This mosque was built on 5 acres of reclaimed land in Teluk Ibai, Kuala Terengganu. It was inspired by the late Sultan Mahmud Al-Muktafi Billah Shah, who also named the mosque in honour of his late mother and personally contributed to its construction. Work began in September 1991 and was completed in mid-January 1994. The mosque was designed by Dato' Raja Kamarul Bahrin Shah Raja Ahmad and managed by the Public Works Department, with a total construction cost of RM6.997 million. Covering 1,372 square metres, the mosque features a 30-metre-high minaret and spans two floors. The main prayer areas for men and women are located on the ground floor, while a designated space for travelling worshippers is available on the upper level.



Masjid Al-Qadim

Masjid Al-Qadim in Sibu, Sarawak, built between the 1830s and 1860s by the Malay and Melanau Muslim communities, is one of the oldest mosques in the state. Its design resembles the Great Mosque of Demak, featuring the 'Tiang Empat' (Four Pillars) and a tiered limas-style roof. The teak wood main entrance is intricately carved to resemble the Prophet's Mosque door in Madinah. Constructed mainly from durable belian wood, the mosque is decorated with traditional motifs. Restored twice at a cost of RM2.2 million, it remains a vital place of worship and a symbol of Sibu's Islamic architectural heritage.
