

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

Want to know where the locals go and what they do? Well, here's some of their favourite things to see and do, and not so secret haunts anymore. Great experiences await, but plan wisely, a couple of days may not be enough – food, wine, beer, gin, coast, nature, shopping and arts – enough said!

Things to do

ROUTE 31 Coastal Drive -

Meander along 31kilometers of pristine coastline, it's dotted with welcoming coastal villages and spectacular sandy beaches. Around every corner is another memorable moment to capture - crystal blue water, white sandy beach and breathtaking ochre-coloured cliffs. A fantastic way to experience the coast.



BIPLANE FLIGHTS — Aldinga

Take to the skies and enjoy one of the most remarkable views of McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast from the open cockpits, truly uplifting! Whether it's the nostalgic, elegant and sophisticated double seated Waco biplane or the thrill-seeking aerobatic flight aboard the Great Lakes biplane, adventure awaits. There's also a great little café overlooking the runway to take in all the action too.

SUP DOWN SOUTH — Port Willunga

One of the best ways to capture some of the most spectacular coastline the region has to offer is on a stand-up paddle board. SUP Down South has you covered with paddle board hire and lessons. For those a little more experienced, try SUP Yoga or a local water tour. The SUP team also offer photos to capture your experience, with the stunning Port Willunga beach as the backdrop.





WANDER HISTORIC VILLAGES ———

The region is home to some gorgeous historic villages, brimming with character and leafy streets, making them the perfect place to wander. A couple of local favourites include Clarendon and Willunga. Discover shopping gems, great food (including amazing bakeries) and award-winning wine, while falling in love with the charm of yesteryear.

FAIRWAYS AND GREENS CALLING

The Willunga Public Golf Course is set in a picturesque location amongst historic gum trees and a meandering creek with superb views of the vineyards and ranges. It's the perfect way to spend a morning or afternoon completing the 18 holes with its lush tree lined fairways and expansive grassed greens.

TASTE THE SEASONS

In a region where sensational local produce is abundant, it's no surprise that a range of restaurants like Coriole, Salopian Inn and The Current Shed (to name a few) have created their own kitchen gardens. Seasonal flavours and daily pickings inspire their menus, delivering an amazing dining experience every time. Booked yet?



PIZZATECA McLaren Vale

This has quickly become a pizza institution in the McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast region, with a cult following. Using techniques passed down from generations, dressed with sugo made with the family's hands and topped with South Australian produce, it's a must do! Book early, as this is always a sell out! Make sure you leave room for dessert – tiramisu, cannoli, gelato and don't forget to try the Limoncello, made with lemons from Nonna Anna's backyard – a crowd favourite! Take a little piece of the family with you and grab a bottle of their famous sugo and Limoncello Liquore to go.





VALE RESTAURANT AND BAR ———

McLaren Vale

Home to Vale Brewing, this amazing tap house commands one of the best views in the region. There is plenty of beer on tap to choose from, with beer flights the best way to sample the range, but there's also wine, gin, and whisky too. The restaurant is inspired by seasonal produce which is designed to be shared, and best enjoyed with one of their award-winning beers – of course. Hot tip – they also do weekend breakfast, a spectacular way to start the day.



WILLUNGA FARMERS MARKET – Willunga

When it comes to farmers markets, this is one of the best, as well as South Australia's first. Meet the grower and taste the region every Saturday showcasing over 70 local producers, but be early, as this is also a local favourite. To start, grab a delicious breakfast snack from one of the stallholders and wander the market, just as the locals do. Tip - don't forget to bring your reusable bags.



Great wine experiences

DANDELION VINEYARDS WONDER ROOM -

McLaren Vale

Spectacularly positioned atop the ancient ridge of Firehawk Farm, it provides amazing views of the vineyard valley, sea and ranges. The cellar door celebrates its former life as a tractor shed through architectural design, creating a beautiful space to relax and unwind whilst soaking up the view and deciding which tasting experience to enjoy. Wines are accompanied by a showcase of seasonal estate grown produce, curated by chef Chris Bone. An experience not to be missed.

Relax and unwind sitting on the deck overlooking vineyards with the sun streaming, making a decision between a wine or spirit flight – it's a tough life, but someone has to do it. Settle in and enjoy a grazing plate or two early in the week, or indulge in the seasonal vineyard menu complementing the wine and spirit collection to perfection later in the week. Weekends are busy, so book ahead.

MITOLO — McLaren Vale

Whether it's a wine tasting, sensational dining experience or kick your feet up and let your hair down feast, Mitolo has it all. From the cellar door to Little Woolf Osteria and Frankie Italo Dining and Disco Lounge, choose the experience that suits you. With a focus on house made, house grown and locally sourced produce, dining is a must. For something more casual, indulge in curated snacks with drinks from Frankie's.



CHALK HILL COLLECTIVE – McLaren Vale

When a wine maker, distiller and pizzeria come together, great things happen. Offering stunning views across the valley, The Collective features Chalk Hill Wines, Never Never Distilling Co and Cucina di Strata and it's the place to indulge in amazing wines, gin and Italian style street food. Whether outside on the long sweeping deck or inside enjoying a tasting experience, it's a great way to spend an afternoon and best to book.



BERESFORD ESTATE — McLaren Flat

The Beresford Tasting Pavilion features a stunning architecturally designed tasting room overlooking the estate, offering a range of guided wine tasting experiences. From classic to premium tastings (as well as fortified tasting too), a favourite is the Shiraz and Chocolate tasting experience – but best to book as this one is popular. There's also gin, beer and spirit tastings too, so a great all-rounder.





Keep your eye out for Paxton Summer Concert Series on Sunday afternoons featuring timeless rock amongst the vines. Experience live performances celebrating the greatest hits from legendary artists. Love grooving, then Day Dance is a must as you dance between stages at Paxton Wines and Simon Hackett Winery!

Lunch & lawn

When continuing to relax and unwind, what better than a tasting plate or pizza which highlights the regions rich bounty of fresh produce accompanied by an award-winning wine, gin or beer.

Pull up a rug or blanket on weekends at J&J Wines who offer delicious cheese and meat platters as well as wood oven pizzas. The expansive lawn area provides great vineyard views, as well as a giant chess board and play equipment for the kids.

Ivybook Farm is also another great location. Enjoy the picturesque grounds, with outdoor seating or bring along a picnic rug. They're famous for their platter Saturdays and pizza Sundays with a very loyal following. Best to book.

Embrace the nature and fun at Fox Creek Wines with their beautiful gardens, sprawling lawns and picturesque vineyard views. Enjoy a casual dining menu from Friday to Sunday, or fabulous regional produce platters and small bites anytime.

When spectacular views are in order, Main and Cherry Wines Cellar Door delivers. Enjoy great wine, local beer, shared platters and tapas style food on the large undercover deck or spacious lawns, all while soaking in the view.



Top pub eats

When looking for great pub eats, there are some notable watering holes celebrating classic pub fare.

There's good reason why the Willunga Hotel attracts a local crowd - the modern seasonal menu and pub classics. Featuring a restaurant as well as the beer garden, the dining room is the gem, showcasing original stonework and wooden fixtures. Enjoy live music on Friday nights too.

Mick O'Shea's in Hackham is a great pub with a contemporary twist. Another local favourite where old school hospitality meets a cracking seasonal menu, and an extensive tap selection. Keep an eye out for the ever-changing Chef's specials board featuring exciting new food! There's also live music on Saturdays and Sundays.

Festivals & events

The region is bursting with seasonal events attracting attention from across the globe.

One of the best ways is to explore the Heritage Trail. Venture through the gorgeous countryside and delight in beautiful buildings which have been hand crafted to last for centuries and lovingly restored. It's best to park the car and wander the historic streets of Clarendon, Reynella and Willunga uncovering their beauty, distinctive character, and quaint village charm.

Discover buildings like an 1860's jam and pickle factory, which is now home to Emprades Vintage and Design in Clarendon, as well as the Willunga Courthouse and Slate Museum which tells the story of the miners who worked in the quarries. Grab a coffee with breakfast and find a table where you'll likely get chatting to a local. A great way to spend a morning, sharing in the region's passion for produce. Willunga Farmers Market

OUR PLACE 'ANDY CLAPPIS BREAD' — Willunga

Andy is somewhat of a bread legend in the region, and you have not lived until you've shared a loaf of Andy's finest, handcrafted from a cross-culture of yeast and his own 30-year-old 'mother'. His bread, pizza bases and pita's feature at many magnificent wineries and restaurants around the region. So, where can you get your hands on Andy's bread? It's delivered hot out of the oven to the local Ampol service station in Willunga and the Willunga General Store on Wednesday and Saturday mornings, as well as the occasional pop-up stall at the Willunga Farmers Market. It doesn't last long – be quick!

THE ORGANIC STORE — McLaren Vale

A beautiful store embodying organic produce, sustainability, lifestyle, health and living with a happy heart. Specialising in organic fruit and vegetables, bulk foods as well as gluten free and vegan foods. Their peanut butter is ground fresh in store and have laid claim to the world's best organic tahini. There's also a naturopath in store who blends personalised herbal tonic on the spot.

A range of local gourmet supplies all in one spot. From dried fruit and nuts to sauces, chutneys, with dressings, balsamic, olive oil and honey being specialties. All picnic and pantry supplies are sorted. With local names like Matchetts Big Sissy Foods, Port Willunga Fine Foods and Thistle Be Good, every choice is a winner.





OZTALIA — McLaren Vale

Home grown and hands on, celebrating their Italian ancestors pioneering spirit. A few local panty staples found here, especially the thick handmade Sugo and extra virgin olive oil to dress and finish dishes or best enjoyed with crusty bread and a pinch of sea salt. But be quick these don't last long. The chilli oil and shiraz vinegar are also great panty additions, as well as the preserved eggplant or green tomatoes in olive oil (of course). Chilli honey is a favourite along with the limoncello liquore which starts with lemons from Nonna Anna's backvard. Browse the range at Pizzateca or Cucina di Strada in McLaren Vale.

CORIOLE – McLaren Vale

Whilst famous for their wine and restaurant, Coriole's olive oil and olives are a specialty. Featuring early harvest table oil and quality extra virgin oil to bring out the best in cooking and salads. The aged sweet vinegar spends a minimum of five years in old oak which is amazing in salad dressings and adds flavour, depth and sweetness to dishes. For something a little lighter, their verjuice is a great option too.

Harvests from kitchen gardens

Inspired by the variety of produce grown across the region, restaurants have also harnessed this energy and created their own kitchen gardens with Salopian Inn and Coriole leading the way.

CORIOLE

From Coriole's estate gardens and farm they are growing diverse, rare and heirloom organic vegetable varieties, found on their restaurant's menu throughout the seasons. Food miles are important to Coriole, as is producing their own compost and commitment to sustainability.

SALOPIAN INN -

Not far from the restaurant, their market garden spans an acre and inspires Salopian Inn's menu. In the height of summer, the garden can provide up to 70% of the restaurant's produce. Mustard greens and coriander are some of the best growers, with other herbs, edible flowers, chillies and perennials like artichokes growing well too. Their secret? Making their own compost, aided by the chickens as well as the restaurants food scraps.

Serafino 2022 Reserve Grenache

As accolades go, few rival Serafino's stunner. Among them are top gold, the trophy for Best Grenache of the Show, and winner of the 2023 James Halliday Grenache Challenge. It's a bona fide ripper.

Chalk Hill Wines 2022 Alpha Crucis Old Vine Grenache

This beauty was awarded 'Best Grenache' at the prestigious 2024 National Wine Show of Australia thanks to stunning handpicked fruit from (nearly) 90-year-old Blewitt Springs bush vines. It's fresh and floral with lashings of cherry and earthy, spicy goodness.

Yangarra Ovitelli Grenache

This acclaimed vineyard estate team, led by winemaker Pete Fraser, produces some of the finest Grenache in Australia. The 2022 Ovitelli Grenache is a must-try, made from a selection of Yangarra's best old vine (1946) fruit. It is fermented in a large ceramic egg. Take a bow, Pete.

Richard Hamilton 'Burton's Vineyard' Old Vine Grenache

Is named after Richard Hamilton's late father Burton Hamilton, a viticulturist in South Australia for his entire working life and a major part of McLaren Vale's history. The site, selection, and wine are an expression of McLaren Vale terroir and fitting tribute to Burton's pioneering spirit. It's beautifully fragrant and well balanced.

Samson Tall 2022 McLaren Vale Grenache

This small but beautiful brand honours McLaren Vale history and the precious patch of land on which they make wine. This smooth, loveable drop is something to be proud of and a dinner party winner.

Wirra Wirra Farmer's Heart Grenache

This iconic brand has plenty of Grenache to choose from, among them the Farmer's Heart which is homage to the late Greg Trott who fought long and hard for the protection of McLaren Vale as agricultural land. Or, go for the gorgeous Flower Vineyard Grenache which buzzes with energy.

Kay Brothers Griffon's Key Reserve Grenache

Another star on the Grenache landscape. The 2021 Griffon's Key Grenache boasts fruit from the Amery vineyard and oozes with rose petal, cherry, violet and dried herd aromas and a medley of rich red berries across the palate. Bravo.



Main & Cherry McLaren Vale Grenache

Winemaker Michael Sexton won gold in the James Halliday 2021 Grenache Challenge for his fresh, bright Grenache nous. The 2023 Grenache comprises early handpicked fruit from the ancient sandy soil at the iconic Brini vineyard in Blewitt Springs. It was partly fermented in locally made terracotta pots, basket pressed and matured in seasoned French oak.

Angove Warboys Vineyard Grenache

Angove's spectacular cellar door and function facility opened on the Warboys Vineyard in 2011. It is one of the family's beloved certified organic and biodynamic sites and the outstanding 2021 Warboys Vineyard Grenache exudes vibrance and joyful floral, dark cherry, wild thyme and red berry moments. It's oh so silky.

Hugo Wines 2023 Grenache

The Hugo Wines cellar door overlooks the bush vines planted by Will Hugo's grandparents Colin and Gwendoline in 1951. The handpicked grapes made their way into the fifth-generation family's 2023 Grenache. The result is a bright, perfumed drop with just the right amount of complexity.

Dig a little deeper and there's a world of fortified wine to discover here. Put simply, fortified wine is a wine to which a distilled spirit such as brandy has been added. There are many styles to sip, and here are some gems.

HORNDALE WINERY – Happy Valley

If only walls could talk. There's deep history to be found at Horndale. The winery has produced fortifieds since it was founded in 1896 and offers everything from Aged Tawny to Cream Apera, Whiskey Barrel Port, Apera, Frontignac, Muscat, and Choc Cherry Tawny, Choc Orange Tawny, and a Coffee Tawny. You can also buy Aged Tawny in bulk. Who doesn't want five litres of liquid gold?

KAY BROTHERS -

McLaren Vale

Prepare for a fortified immersion of the experiential kind. Kay Brothers' Fortified Tasting Experience traverses the iconic brand's Founders' Old Tawny, Grand Liqueur Muscat and Grand Liqueur Muscat. After such decadence, a moment of relaxation on the rolling lawns is necessary. Breathe deep and take in the vineyard views.

In exciting news, Yangarra Estate Vineyards released a 40 Year Old Tawny which was launched at the inaugural Neat Sips Festival held in McLaren Vale in August 2024. Fans of the iconic brand now have even more reason to seek out the new cellar door.





HASELGROVE -

There's no better place to sample Haselgrove's The Old Nut Fortified than its rooftop cellar door. The rare gem is has been made from a secret blend of McLaren Vale Shiraz and Grenache since 1981. Just 1000 bottles are produced each year. It's history in a bottle and captures a moment in time.

BERESFORD ESTATE —

McLaren Flat

Head to the Beresford Estate Grand Pavilion to try the Galway Pipe Bourbon Barrel Tawny 10-Year Old which was named Best Wine at the prestigious Frankfurt International Trophy 2024. The Galway Pipe Grand Tawny 12 Year Old turned heads too when it received the Grand Gold award. Try them with a side of storytelling during the one-hour flight of four Galway Pipe fortified wine.

HARDYS TINTARA ——

McLaren Vale

The Hardys Rare Fortified Tasting Experience allows visitors to taste four unique styles of fortified wines produced by the iconic wine brand for more than 100 years. The wines are paired with local Menz FruChocs chocolates. Definitely some flavours to savour here, and best to allow 45 minutes for the tasting experience.

FOGGO -

McLaren Vale

Imagine the scene; you've laid out a cheese platter and poured a nip of bright, fresh Foggo 'Young Gun' White Fortified to go with it. Or, for a refreshing twist, over the rocks with a dash of lime to sip as the sun goes down. The fortifiedloving Foggo crew also produce a rich 'Oblivion' Syrah Fortified made with Shiraz, 'The Gilded Goddess' Apera (yum), the Foggo Golden Muscat (Christmas pudding in a bottle) and a late harvest golden botrytis called Foggo's Little Sweetie. There's also 'The Quiet Achiever' Tawny made using apricots, peaches and juicy nectarines.

BEACH ROAD WINES ———

McLaren Vale

In addition to a dizzyingly exciting portfolio of wines, winemaker Briony Hoare also makes a small but stunning offering of fortifieds. A must try is the Beach Road Pedro Ximenez for thick, rich, scrumptious toffee, dried fig and quince flavours. Just 600 bottles are produced each year. Or, if broody dark chocolate and coffee flavours are more your thing, the Beach Road Grand Tawny is just the ticket. Pair it with a cheese platter.

PIRRAMIMMA -

McLaren Vale

The Pirramimma team respects tradition and more than 130 years of family winemaking when ageing their fortified wines through a solero barrel maturation system. There's plenty to choose from at the historic winery and cellar door. The Digby Rare Old Fortified, the Geoffrey 12 Year Old Liqueur (first released in 1957, the rich Aged Tawny, the Vintage Fortified Shiraz 2018, and complex Aged White Fortified.

Their approach is small batch and traditional, using botanicals such as juniper, lemon myrtle, rosemary, Tasmanian pepper berry and elderflower. Taste their range, which also includes a Ginny Pink Gin, a Spiced Fig Gin, and a Blueberry Gin, at the McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre. The gins are paired with garnish and tonic (or upgrade your gin flight by pairing it with local artisan cheeses), and best enjoyed on the deck overlooking lush lawns and rolling vineyards.

The contemporary Ginny Pig Meridian Gin makes a refreshing G&T or stellar martini.

SALOPIAN INN ———

McLaren Vale

This iconic restaurant is adored for many reasons, gin is one of them. The Salopian Inn currently stocks over 230 different gins from around the globe and Australia, with co-owner and gin enthusiast Alex Marchetti at the helm of a delightfully intoxicating drinks menu. Their experimental recipe batches and bottled products are available at Shifty Lizard, alongside laid-back vibes and an exciting menu (including fried chicken wings that regulars can't get enough of).



The Clover Club is a delicious mix of Soul Bird Gin, Chambord, lemon juice, and house-made raspberry syrup. Popular is an understatement.

The team at this boutique gin distillery and cellar door (part of Foggo Wines) takes inspiration from the landscape around it. Juicy lemons on the tree near near their cottage, mulberries from a nearby farm, a friend's Kangarilla vineyard, and grapefruit and blood oranges from a heritage orchard in McLaren Vale. The small batch gins boast botanicals that grow wild around the chook house. Herbs are picked fresh from their veggie patch and sourced from local suppliers. Embark on gin and vodka tastings (including the Neat Signature Gin and Neat Tangerine Dream Gin) and cocktails every weekend.






Events galore

The heart of the Vale

Dotted throughout McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast are over 200 public art pieces expressing and sharing the story of the region. Here's one that caught our eye.

Heart of Industry by Trevor Wren and Danica Gacesa-McLean

Celebrating McLaren Vale as the heart of the South Australian wine industry, an impressive public artwork is fittingly located in the heart of McLaren Vale's main street.

The intrinsic design features a suspended bunch of Shiraz like grapes, which is also similar in shape to the human heart. Whilst the supports have a role to play holding the suspended grapes, they also are integral to the design, symbolising and creating a wineglass, which appears at certain angles when moving around the artwork. The supports also represent the free spirited and organic growth of grapevines, as well as their roots tapping searching for water and nutrients.

The artwork has been elevated and stands five metres tall, encouraging people to wander in and around as well as under the sculpture. Find the best angle and share your pics #ValeandCoast.

A WALK IN THE PARK

A refreshing walk in nature is the perfect complement to indulging in the finest food and drink the region offers. McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast boasts several remarkable National and Conservation Parks, each offering an array of trails and paths for all levels of explorers. From leisurely strolls to challenging hikes, there's something for everyone.

Onkaparinga River National Park

Discover the stunning beauty of Onkaparinga River National Park, ideal for both casual strolls and more challenging hikes.

The Punchbowl Lookout Trail, a 2km return walk, offers breathtaking views of the gorge and valley, and is accessible to all, including those with prams or limited mobility. For seasoned hikers, the Gorge Hike provides a rewarding challenge over 6km, descending to the river and taking approximately four hours. Along the way, you might encounter native wildlife such as birds, koalas, kangaroos, possums, and occasionally, an echidna. The park also connects with the Willunga Basin Trail. The trail covers over 130kms and creates a loop taking in wine country, historic townships and coastal landscapes. Enjoy a half day section at a time or the full trail will take five to six days. Challenging but very rewarding.



Mount Bold Reservoir Reserve

It's claim to fame – it's the largest reservoir in South Australia and is easily accessible. Drive in and park and be treated to some spectacular natural landscapes and wildlife. There's more than 160 native animals calling Mount Bold home, including the Southern Brown Bandicoot.

For the explorers, there's 13kms of trails to wander, ranging from a short 1.4km return walk to the viewing platform or more challenging hikes that weave through a pine plantation and native vegetation, with sweeping views over the water.



Glenthorne **National Park**

Located on Majors Road in O'Halloran Hill, Glenthorne National Park offers a range of short hikes with panoramic views and opportunities to relax and listen to the sounds of nature.

Back at the visitor hub there's one of the biggest nature play spaces in South Australia with three large slides, Aboriginal carvings and totems, rope and log climbing and a 25m long flying fox. There's also barbecues and picnic areas, perfect for a family day out in nature.



Happy Valley Reservoir

With 20kms of trails taking you along the water's edge, through pine forests, native fauna and open grassy areas, exploring Happy Valley Reservoir is a great way to switch off for few hours.

Choose to take the longest of the trail the 11km Shoreline Loop or one of the shorter options. They all offer spectacular scenery. For the more adventurous, bring a fishing rod, kayak or mountain bike. Don't forget to pack a picnic, there's plenty of great spots to stop.

There are two main car parks, one on the western side of Berkeley Road and the other on the southern side, off the roundabout connecting Kenihans Road to Chandlers Hill Road.

Aldinga **Conservation Park**

Discover the natural beauty of Aldinga Conservation Park, an area of cultural significance to the Kaurna People and home to a diverse array of rare plant species.

There are four difference trails to choose from, ranging from 1.1km to 4.8km which are suitable for most ages and fitness levels.

As you wander, keep an ear out for the many animals and more than 166 different bird species that call the park home including mistletoe birds, rainbow bee-eaters, brown goshawks and golden whistlers.

Aldinga Conservation Park is located 46km south of Adelaide, a small car park is located on the corner of Fraser and Dover Streets

Kayak Bliss

Onkaparinga River is perfect to paddle out to where the river meets the sea at South Port. Paddlers can launch at either Wearing Street or further upstream at River Road Park.





On your bike

Discover the picturesque landscapes of McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast on an e-bike adventure. Feel the wind in your hair as you pedal at your own pace or let the e-bike do the work while enjoying the stunning scenery.

Willunga to Aldinga

Explore the newly built 6km trail from Willunga to Aldinga. The trail is mostly flat, making for an easy ride between the two charming towns. From Willunga, follow the trail out of the town heading toward Aldinga. You'll follow Aldinga Road to Flower Mill Road which will bring you to Main South Road, Aldinga. From here head to the Old Coach Road Precinct for a coffee or pastry and maybe a spot of shopping. For those eager to ride a little further, continue to the turquoise waters of Port Willunga Beach for a refreshing dip. Head back to Willunga and quench your thirst with a craft beer from Shifty Lizard.

McLaren Vale to McLaren Flat

If riding through vineyards, spotting a kangaroo or two and stopping for a glass of wine sounds like you, then the Flat to Vale trail is a must. Beginning at the McLaren Vale Sports Complex, this trail connects to the Shiraz Trail and onto the Coast to Vines Rail Trail.

The trail is mainly an off road shared used path, where there's plenty of spots to stop for a picnic or packed lunch along the trail, or head to Foggo Road (just a short detour off the trail) where you'll find Foggo Footsteps. What's Foggo Footsteps? It's a collective of small cellar doors and includes Foggo Wines and Neat Spirits, Haselgrove Wines, Hastwell & Lightfoot, Somos Wines and The Confessional. They are all in close proximity to one another and even quicker to get to by bike!

Shiraz Trail

The Shiraz Trail runs between McLaren Vale and Willunga, connecting with the Flat to Vale Trail, Willunga to Aldinga Trail and Coast to Vines Rail Trail. This is a relatively flat trail so you can soak in the scenery as you pass rows of vines, the odd kangaroo and some sheep grazing in the paddocks. With cellar doors located close by, there's lots of opportunities for a stop or two along the way.

Witton Bluff Base Trail (coming soon)

The Witton Bluff Base Trail connects Port Noarlunga and Christies Beach via an elevated boardwalk over the limestone shelf. The trail follows along the base of the cliffs between the two townships offering stunning views of the ocean. The best part, there's excellent cafés at both Christies Beach and Port Noarlunga for a post exercise latte. It's anticipated that the trail will be completed in 2025.

E-Bike hire

Hiring an e-bike is easy through SA eBikes, owned and operated by Willunga locals. Bikes can be picked up from the McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre, Oxenberry Farm, Gemtree Wines or delivered to your accommodation.

Keen for more two-wheel action?

The Coast to Vines Rail Trail is one of the most popular trails, as it offers a longer 35km ride, following the route of the original Rail Corridor from Marino to Willunga. Offering amazing clifftop views and picturesque countryside before reaching wine country. It's a great ride any time of year, as the seasons change across the spectacular landscape.



Four! Great golf courses

The region is spoilt for choice when it comes to golf. With four courses to choose from, the Willunga Golf Course is a great place to start and very popular amongst the golfing community.

Willunga Golf Course

The public golf course offers one of the most picturesque courses in the region, amongst historic gum trees and a meandering creek with superb views of the vines and Mount Lofty Ranges. The par 70 course delivers 18 challenging holes with lush tree lined fairways and expansive grass greens and has hosted the national Webex Players Series.

The onsite pro shop offers ball hire, clubs and motorised carts and equipment hire, as well as private golf lessons.

Prefer a little practice, no problems. The course has a driving range, large practice putting green and two practice nets. If you want to take a sneak peak of the course in advance, there is a hole-by-hole video on their website.


Enjoy the 19th hole with the newly renovated bistro offering light meals, sit inside or outside on the patio taking advantage of the stunning surrounds.

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COAST WITH THE MOST

McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast has 31km of white sand, turquoise water and golden cliffs to explore. The townships dotted along the coast all have a unique personality of their own which keeps visitors returning to the coast year after year.

CHRISTIES BEACH -

Complete with a unique beachside shopping precinct in a picture-perfect coastal setting...what could be better? A walk down Beach Road is a must. Indulge in a little retail therapy, explore the collection of funky cafes and there's a raft of treasures to find in quirky shops.

At the end of Beach Road, Rotary Park is a great place for a picnic while the kids burn off some energy at the playground. The park is opposite the glistening waters of Christies Beach. Take the boardwalk down to the sand and enjoy the spectacular cliffs as far as the eye can see.

Christies Beach is emerging as the coastal hotspot, with new small bars – Portal 58 and The LandBAR recently opening up. "Christies", as the locals call it, is eclectic, quirky and full of personality. Its vibe is laid-back beach holidays, urban grit, street fusion and coastal cool.

PORT NOARLUNGA -

Port Noarlunga is famous for its jetty, easily accessible reef, café culture, boutique shops and artsy vibe all while immersing yourself in the local delights. Enjoy looking through the boutiques and shops, enjoy a pastry, or a delicious lunch from one of the many cafes, including Mamma Carmela's where you can dig into a pizza and watch the sun set into the ocean.

Jubilee Park Adventure Playground is one of South Australia's best playgrounds – just ask the kids! Where imagination and little legs run wild, featuring a giant, multi-level wooden fortress, bridge, tunnel and all sorts of things to climb up, in, over and around.





ALDINGA AND SURROUNDS

Head to the Old Coach Road precinct where you can easily spend a lazy afternoon at Kickback Brewing or the Aldinga Hotel, drink in hand, or for some retail therapy Miss Gladys on Sea, known for its fabulous outfits. Aldinga Central Shopping Centre is also worth a stop to stock up on the holiday or picnic lunch essentials.

Aside from the beach being stunning (think clear water with a backdrop of rolling hills), Sellicks also has a cellar door that's not to be missed. Berg Herring Wines is in a converted heritage sandstone chapel. The lush, grassed area is complete with a sea view out the front, and the giant wine barrels that have been converted into private tasting pods are a must. Enjoy a glass of wine, tasting or pick up a bottle to take back to your accommodation.



ROUTE 31 COASTAL DRIVE

Who can't resist a drive along the coast, soaking up those beach vibes, not to mention the breathtaking scenery.

McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast is home to some of the most spectacular coastline in South Australia. But don't take our word for it! Explore the 31km (yes, that's where it gets its name from) and discover holiday favourites to hidden gems. This stunning stretch of coastline is a must do any time of year.

Stretching from O'Sullivan Beach to Sellicks Beach, this scenic drive winds through charming coastal towns, each offering unique experiences and stunning photo opportunities. Grab a map from the McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre or download a copy from the website, then follow the double blue Route 31 shield signs and let the adventure begin. Here's a few top spots not to miss, whilst enjoying the scenic coastal drive:

South Port

One of the most photographed beaches on the coast, South Port is simply stunning. It's where the Onkaparinga River meets the sea. You'll find this spot is popular with kayakers, swimmers and surfers depending on the tide and swell.

Port Willunga

You'll think you've been transported to the Mediterranean when arriving at Port Willunga. The limestone cliffs, beach caves, sheltered coves and clear water make Port Willunga arguably the best beach on the coast, perhaps South Australia.

Maslin Beach

Maslin's claims the title of Australia's first unclad beach. Clothing is optional at the southern end of the beach (look for the signs). It's renowned for its stunning cliffs, white sand and the clearest of clear water and the locals want to keep it a secret.

Make every day a beach day! Pack the sunscreen and get ready to explore one of the state's most stunning stretches of coastline.

Fun in the sun

The region is home to pristine beaches and coastal nodes, each with their own uniqueness and seaside charm. Whether you're a keen surfer, love snorkelling or scuba diving, or simply want to stroll along and soak up the sunset on the sand, you'll be spoilt for choice. Here's the quick guide.



ALDINGA BEACH

One of the region's drive-on beaches, Aldinga's expansive beach is ideal for families on the sand. Fish and chips, picnic rugs, sun shades and sand castles - this beach was made for family fun. When the tide is out, the rock pools at Aldinga are stacks of fun for little ones, too. You can spy starfish, crabs and sometimes even a little gummy shark in the shallows.



<table-cell-rows> CHRISTIES BEACH —

A popular surf beach, Christies is ideal for water activities, or a great seaside walk to Port Noarlunga. It's also a hit with snorkelers, the Witton Bluff reef a stunning example of the underwater diversity in the region. Make time for a stop-off at the Christies Beach Surf Life Saving Club, one of the most active in the area. If the doors are open, head in for a drink with the locals.

MOANA BEACH —

Moana is a great spot for kids and families with a nice beach break, with the local caravan park providing direct access to the beach. Known for its accessibility for beginner surfers, particularly if you're keen to get up and surf the breaks, as it is all sand bottomed and no rocks to worry about. With a superb cliff-top walkway leading down to the beach, the vistas here are stunning.

O'SULLIVAN BEACH ——

One of the best kept secrets, boasting some of the most stunning coastal views. It's also a boaties paradise, with excellent boat launching facilities (permit required) including a boat wash bay and trailer parking. It's also a popular beach for pets and people alike. O'Sullivan Beach is one of only a few beaches allowing dogs offleash, noting they must be under effective control.

MASLIN BEACH -

The state's iconic nudist beach, Maslin's is a great one for the bucket list. While the southern end of the beach is reserved for nudist swimmers, the remainder of the beach is dog-friendly and perfect for a dip, the rugged red cliffs a stunning contrast to the crisp blue waters. Maslin Beach is spectacular at sunset, with the sun's rays bringing a natural glow, further accentuating the gorgeous colours as far as the eye can see.

Port Noarlunga is an aquatic paradise. Drop a line off the jetty, or take a swim in the pristine waters, with the white sand just a hop from the town centre. Grab a bite for breakfast or lunch and head down for a day of family fun. The reef towards the end of the jetty is a perfect spot to catch a glimpse of local sea life, forming part of Encounter Marine Park.

Best swimming beaches

McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast is home to some of South Australia's most beautiful swimming beaches and many patrolled by lifesavers during the warmer months, keeping a watchful eye, adding that extra piece of mind when swimming.

Aldinga and Sellicks 🗧

A stunning long and expansive beach ideal for families. Swim in the shallows as this beach has a slow and steady depth incline. When the tide is out, the rock pools at Aldinga are great fun for little ones too.

Christies Beach 🗧

Looking for something a little quieter to find the coastal serenity? Christies Beach is it. The Witton Reef off the coast slows the sea down, sending smaller waves to the sandy beach.

Port Willunga

An aquatic paradise, where the Onkaparinga River meets the sea. It's also home to Port Noarlunga Reef, which acts as a natural breakwater, calming the waves to lap onto the beach. It's the ideal spot for a family swim, being calm and sheltered.

South Port 😑

The pristine blue water is perfect for safe swimming. In summer, the river current carries swimmers beneath the stunning sandstone cliffs until they are gently pushed back by the waves.

Port Noarlunga 🗧

An aquatic paradise, where the Onkaparinga River meets the sea. A natural breakwater, it's the ideal spot for a family swim, being calm and sheltered.

Moana Beach 🗧

The gentle waves are perfect for young kids first experiencing the water or new to boogie boarding with its sandy bottom.



PORT WILLUNGA -

One of the region's most photographed beaches, Port Willunga is known for its golden cliff faces, crystal clear waters and soft white sands. Stroll through the linear park and up the cliffs to continue along the Heysen Trail, or stick to the beach and check out the famous old jetty and fishermen's caves, carved into the cliffs. Because the beach almost forms a cove, the swell is safe for little swimmers, and ideal for paddle boarding and kayaking.

SEAFORD BEACH -

Known as one of the top surfing beaches in the area, it's a regular hot-spot for locals. Seaford is also popular with kiteboarders and wind-surfers too. On a sunny day, it's a beautiful spot to swim, and there's a number of cafes and restaurants in Seaford township nearby when you need to feed the sea air driven hunger.

🕈 SOUTH PORT BEACH —

Where the river meets the sea, this is one of the most photographed areas of the region. A culmination of red sandstone cliffs, the aqua-toned river, pristine blue ocean and the twinkling lights of the Esplanade homes. Sunrise and sunset here is a must at the lookout located at the top of the main staircase. Home to many aquatic activities - swimming, surf lessons, kayak or paddle board hire offering an opportunity to explore the Onkaparinga River.

SELLICKS BEACH -

Often called 'the funnel' by locals, Sellicks is ideal for wind-loving adrenalin junkies. Think kite-boarding, wind-surfing and paragliding - if you've got the gear, this is the place to do it. It's also a top spot for fishing and home to a popular beach launching boat ramp. Swimming and walking are also stunning, with the southern-most point of the region providing an epic coastline view stretching further down the Fleurieu coast.





Best dog beaches

Christies Beach 🗧

Christies Beach is ideal to take your best mate for a walk. Choose to wander along the golden sand, or if sandy paws aren't their thing, follow the footpath that runs along the Esplanade.

Aldinga Beach 🗧

Looking for a long stretch of golden sand that's easy to walk on? Head to Aldinga Beach. This beach is perfect for letting dogs run free, without the calf workout of deep sand beaches. Cars are permitted on part of the beach so keep an eye out.

O'Sullivan Beach

Seeking a less populated beach, but equally stunning, head to O'Sullivan Beach. There's usually plenty of room for your pooch to get sandy.

Surf's up

When living in a place like McLaren Vale and Fleurieu Coast, surfing is part of the lifestyle here and saltwater runs through the veins of the locals. So much so that the Mid Coast was named as a Surf Reserve in 2016, recognising the importance and value surfing has to the area.

Here's a few top surfing spots to try:

Christies Beach 🗧

Try Y Steps for a fun right-hander beach break that is fast and hollow at times.

South Port Beach 🗧

Great for learners due to the number of breaks and the sandy bottom and popular with the surf schools.

Seaford

One of the most well-known and popular breaks, The Bowl is a reef break that produces excellent waves, particularly when the southwest winds are up.

Moana 🗧

Moana Beach is great for those learning to surf, or for the more experienced when the surf's pumping. If you're keen to get a hang of surfing while visiting, you'll need to know the local lingo.

Triggs... is just south of the river mouth it's the next break around the bend. It's called Triggs because there's a trig point a large marine identification marker.

Y-steps... is at Christies Beach, taking its name from the steps descending to the beach.

The hump.... is reliably good for surfing, located at South Port. It's named the hump due to its shape, curving around the sandy coastline near the river mouth.

The bowl... is at Seaford and produces long right-hand waves with 3 sections. It has a bowly section on the inside and nicknamed 'The Bowl'.



SURFERS² CODE

DON'T "DROP IN" Give way to the surfer furthest inside (closest to the peak) or who has been waiting the longest

SURF WITHIN YOUR ABILITY If in doubt, don't paddle out paddle "wide" on the way out so you don't impede other surfers' rides.

STAY IN THE WHITEWATER If a breaking wave is approaching you as you paddle out, and there's a surfer on the wave.

NEVER THROW YOUR BOARD Where it might hit other surfers.

> COMMUNICATE WITH OTHER SURFERS When you're planning to take a wave.

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Best snorkelling

Life on the coast looks amazing already but put your head under water and there's a whole new world to discover.

Port Noarlunga Reef Sanctuary Zone

Port Noarlunga Reef is one of the most popular snorkelling spots in South Australia and for good reason. The reef is easily accessible from the jetty and is home to more than 200 species of marine plants and animals and more than 50 species of fish. There's also an underwater trail to follow with information about the reef. Port Noarlunga. Photo: Josh Coulter

Star of Greece Wreck, Port Willunga

The Star of Greece wrecked off Port Willunga in 1888, approximately 600m along the beach from the car park and around 120m from the shoreline. The wreck sits in roughly four metres of water and on low tide the top of the mast can be seen. On a calm and clear day snorkelers will be treated to an array of colourful fish and plant life.

Best stand-up paddle boarding

Sellicks Beach

Pack up your paddleboard and head to the crystal-clear turquoise water. Sellicks! Sellicks is a drive on beach meaning no carrying SUP's down to the beach.

Port Willunga 🧲

Typically, very well protected, Port Willunga, is ideal for paddle boarding. Don't have your own board? SUP Down South will sort you out with a hire board. During summer SUP Down South also offer SUP Yoga, keep an eye out on their socials for more details.

Port Noarlunga

A paddle around Port Noarlunga on a summer's day is pure bliss. Think crystal clear water, a reef to explore and an abundance of cafés close by for that post SUP coffee.





Enjoy the drive beachside

Don't want to carry your gear down to the beach? Go to one of four drive on beaches! This is a unique experience which also comes with responsibilities to ensure everyone can enjoy the beach safely.

Sellicks Beach

Stunning is the word that best describes Sellicks Beach. From the crystal-clear water, rolling hills and red cliffs, it's a beach not to be missed. This beach is perfect for the keen photographer, particularly just before sunset when the light changes, casting a glow on the hills and cliffs.

Silver Sands 🗧

The perfect beach for a long beach walk, a dip or a game of beach cricket. Silver Sands Beach Club located just off the sand is the place to go if you're hungry. During Summer keep and eye out for Pizzateca Beach with their pop-up pizzeria.

Aldinga Beach 🗧

Aldinga Beach is probably one of the most popular drive-on beaches. It's a great spot to drop a line and try for some fish or skip the fishing part and enjoy takeaway fish and chips while watching the sun set into the ocean.

Moana Beach 😑

Pack the boogie boards, beach umbrella and sunscreen and you'll be set for the day at Moana Beach. Usually there's some fun waves to catch and just off the beach you can grab a coffee or a delicious meal. The walk along the Esplanade from Moana to South Port is also stunning.

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


