





Understanding Blackstar's ISF Technology and how to Shape Your Sound





Gibson Les Paul Recording

Released in the late 1970s for studio use, this model featured low-impedance pickups, a built-in preamp, and versatile tonal controls, allowing players to record directly with exceptional clarity.

Gibson Flying V2

Introduced in 1981, the Flying V2 was a radical redesign of the classic Flying V with an angular body, multiple pickups, and bold finishes like blackburst and candy apple red, making it a favourite for avant-garde collectors.

Gibson Nighthawk

Released in the late 1990s, the Nighthawk blended Gibson tradition with Fender-style versatility. Its unique pickups, adjustable bridge, and contoured body made it stand out in Gibson's lineup.

Gibson Les Paul Axcess

Debuted in the late 1980s, the Axcess offered modern playability with a contoured body, beveled neck joint for upper fret access, and optional tremolo, combining classic Les Paul tone with progressive design.

Gibson Explorer Retro

A reimagined version of the 1958 Explorer, this guitar featured sharp body angles, bold finishes, and unique pickup setups, making it a collectible for players seeking extreme designs.







Mango Groove is celebrating an incredible 40 years this year. When you look back on the band's journey - from those early gigs in the 1980s to becoming one of South Africa's most iconic acts - how does it feel to reach this milestone?



Slightly surreal, actually! Perhaps above all we feel very fortunate, because we

have had so much support from all South Africans through the years, and – to our surprise – have also somehow managed to reach new generations of listeners. They say you grow up on the music your parents listened to, but we've somehow managed to reach and touch the grandparents too, lol.

The Kirstenbosch Gardens show in January set the tone for these celebrations. How will the upcoming Johannesburg concert at Walter Sisulu Gardens capture that magic while offering something unique to Jozi fans?



We were blown away by the support we got at the Walter Sisulu show, and were so

delighted that the show sold out.

Joburg is not an easy gig, to be honest, as it often overflows with competing events, and given that it is essentially our home base, we had some trepidation about it, and really wanted it to be extra special. We were ecstatic with the show and the support, though, it was a very special and moving event for us.

Your sound - that distinctive blend of Marabi, Kwela, and pop - has always been instantly recognisable. How did that penny-whistle sound in "Special Star" originally come about, and how has the band kept the sound fresh over the years?



Well, thank you for the compliment, as ''distinctive'' can be double edged in

relation to music. We've always relished eclecticism in music, art and culture, and actually the Mango sound has many influences, including pop, marabi, swing, and even early Punk and New Wave. The specific Kwela (penny whistle) influence came about from John Leyden's early love affair as a child with the original penny whistle greats such as Spokes Mashiane and Lemmy Special, along with various '50s and '60s urban styles celebrated by Miriam Makeba and others.





Songs like "Another Country" became soundtracks for South Africa's journey to democracy. How do you reflect on Mango Groove's role in the country's social and cultural history?



Well, thank you again for the very kind words. We have never been overtly

sloganeering or obviously political in our career – we're a pop band, at the end of the day - but in the context of our history, and like many artists, we always invariably drew on our emotions experiences and in that way, I guess, reflected what we were grappling with as South Africans, and the very complicated journey we were on, and in a sense are still on. If anything, we simply feel grateful and humbled to have been even a tiny part of the far greater processes, forces and personalities that fed into our country's transition and ultimately made it possible.

Alongside the concerts, you've announced exciting new projects - a documentary (Special Stars), a docu-drama (The Groove), and even a stage musical (Gladlands). What inspired you to tell Mango Groove's story through these new mediums?



Interestingly enough, the global music market is thoroughly dominated by

catalogue songs over new music, so it made sense to explore the ways we could celebrate our catalogue and give it new life and expression.

The Groove and Gladlands, and in fact a movie documentary we are pre-producing are huge projects, and are very ambitious, so a lot of work lies ahead, but they are terribly important to us, including some new material, so we push ahead!





The music industry has changed dramatically since the 1980s, with digital platforms and social media reshaping how music is shared. How has this evolution influenced Mango Groove's approach to recording and connecting with fans?



I guess new recording technologies and social media have empowered

artists to connect more directly with their listeners, but at the end of the day, whatever the technology or medium, it's still about connecting emotionally with people, and that has always been the case with art.

In this age or AI, moreover, originality and human content, and the ability to move people, have become more important than ever: a key component, maybe of why live concerts are so central to this business.

After the Johannesburg concert and the 40th anniversary celebrations, what's next for Mango Groove? Are there new projects, collaborations, or dreams still waiting to be explored?



"We've only just begun...", lol. Was that a Carpenters song? Well, as long as the

love and support is there, we will explore as many projects as possible, and I hope reach new generations and new ears.





As **Mango Groove** looks ahead, one thing remains clear: **their story is far from over.**

With landmark concerts, ambitious new projects across film, theatre, and music, and a commitment to connecting with new generations, they continue to remind us of the power of music to bridge divides, celebrate culture, and inspire hope.

Forty years may be a milestone, but for Mango Groove, it feels like the opening bars of a melody still being written—one that will echo long into the future.



From the first note, it's clear this isn't just a toy. The Fly 3 Bass features Blackstar's signature toneshaping EQ and a sub-control that adds real depth to the sound.

Whether you're practising quietly at home or jamming with friends, it handles dynamics beautifully — smooth, rich, and responsive. The overdrive circuit gives you that extra growl when you dig in, while the MP3/line input lets you play along with your favourite tracks.

What makes it special is the way it reacts to your playing. Roll back your guitar's volume and it cleans up beautifully; dig in and it growls with authority. The ISF control is the secret weapon — twist it one way for tight, modern American tones, or the other for that thick, mid-rich British punch. Understanding Blackstar's ISF Technology and How to Shape Your Sound

Blackstar amps are known for their versatility and ability to deliver authentic tones for players of every style. One feature that truly sets them apart is **ISF** — **Infinite Shape Feature** — a unique control that lets you sculpt your amp's overall character and discover a sound that's entirely your own.





What is ISF?

ISF stands for **Infinite Shape Feature**, and it's Blackstar's proprietary tone-shaping control. Unlike standard EQ knobs that adjust bass, middle, and treble independently, ISF adjusts the overall personality of your amp's tone.

With the ISF knob, you can fine-tune the tonal response of your amp along a spectrum:

- BRITISH-LEANING ISF: Produces a tighter, more focused tone with pronounced mids and a sharper edge. It's ideal for punchy rhythm playing and aggressive lead tones.
- AMERICAN-LEANING ISF: Offers a more open, airy sound with smoother mids and softer highs. This is perfect for clean tones, dynamic playing, and versatile studio applications.

Sliding the ISF knob along this continuum allows you to explore a virtually infinite range of sounds, all from a single Blackstar amp.

Blackstar amps that include ISF include popular models like the Debut Series (Debut 10E, 15E, 100R) and the ID:Core Series (ID:Core 10, 20, 40, 100), among others. These amps demonstrate the versatility of ISF across entry-level, practice, and performance amps.



Why ISF is a Game-Changer

Traditional amps often lock you into a fixed tonal character. Blackstar's ISF technology breaks that limitation by letting you customize the overall voice of your amp. Whether you need a tight, focused sound for high-gain riffs, or a spacious, smooth tone for clean playing, ISF gives you the flexibility to get there without changing amps or relying heavily on pedals.





How to Use ISF to Shape Your Sound

- 1. **START NEUTRAL:** Begin with your EQ set to the middle positions and gain low. This creates a neutral starting point.
- 2. ADJUST THE ISF: Slowly turn the ISF knob and listen to how the tonal response changes. Notice how the mids, highs, and overall clarity shift as you move along the spectrum.
- 3. **REFINE WITH EQ:** Once you've selected a general ISF position, use your EQ to fine-tune your tone. Small tweaks to bass, middle, or treble can help you achieve exactly the sound you want.
- 4. **EXPERIMENT WITH GAIN AND EFFECTS:** ISF interacts with the amp's gain and any pedals you may use. Higher gain settings on the Britishleaning side will feel more aggressive and cutting, while the American-leaning side will remain smoother and more responsive.
- 5. SAVE YOUR SETTINGS: If your Blackstar amp allows presets (like the ID:Core Series), save your favorite ISF settings for easy recall in future sessions.

A coil-splitting feature adds even more flexibility, allowing players to switch between humbucker thickness and single-coil sparkle at the flick of a switch. 



Who is your favourite artist?


I listen to a wide variety of genres and artists but I enjoy Radiohead, Current Joys, and Billie Eilish.
