CRITICAL SUPPLIES SAVE LIVES TROOPS DIRECT

The young American men and women who comprise our military forces serving in Afghanistan fight tirelessly to protect our security, here at home, on a daily basis. Most of us cannot fathom existing as they do, in 120-degree heat, with 70 lbs of gear strapped to their backs, for days on end. TroopsDirect.org addresses the large-scale need to support these heroes with essential supplies and resources. We attribute our success in large part to support from The Julia Burke Foundation. Like our brave service members on the frontlines, The Julia Burke Foundation has been selfless in its mission to support our efforts.

In partnership with The Foundation, TroopsDirect.org acquires critical supplies for our troops, responding at times to uncommon, unexpected, and even surprising requests: medical gear ranging from stretchers to stethoscopes, portable showers, and even tools used to identify roadside bombs. Furthermore, support from The Julia Burke Foundation enables



us to double our response to requests for shipments when times are darkest for our soldiers and Marines. To quote a Marine Corps Colonel, "Troops Direct is single-handedly changing the manner in which our military can operate on the frontlines."

However, the greatest facet of our relationship with The Julia Burke Foundation is their recognition that the work we do, every day, for our Americans on the frontlines, makes a genuine and unparalleled difference in the lives of these service members. I can state with

A SHARED VISION FOR THE ENVIRONMENT INTERFAITH CENTER FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

As Julia's former debate partner and friend, I am very moved by the support of The Julia Burke Foundation in promoting a message of coexistence, tolerance, and sustainability from the Holy Land.

I was inspired to witness the cooperation of religious teachers of different faiths (that many times are associated with conflict). Through coverage in 15 media outlets in five languages, including the internationally syndicated AFP, the event reached millions of people around the world with this message.

With critical support from The Julia Burke Foundation, the Interfaith Center for Sustainable Development achieved two goals this year: securing the endorsement of a joint Declaration on Climate Change by the Council of Religious Institutions of the Holy Land, and putting on the Interfaith Eco Forum in Jerusalem in July, 2011. The Forum

brought together Christian, Jewish, and Muslim religious leaders to speak about their shared vision for environmental sustainability in the Holy Land.

At the event, Bishop William Shomali of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem said, "The earth is like our home, and those who live in the same home should know how to live together. The main religions should study ecological issues together because we have a common destiny."

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LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



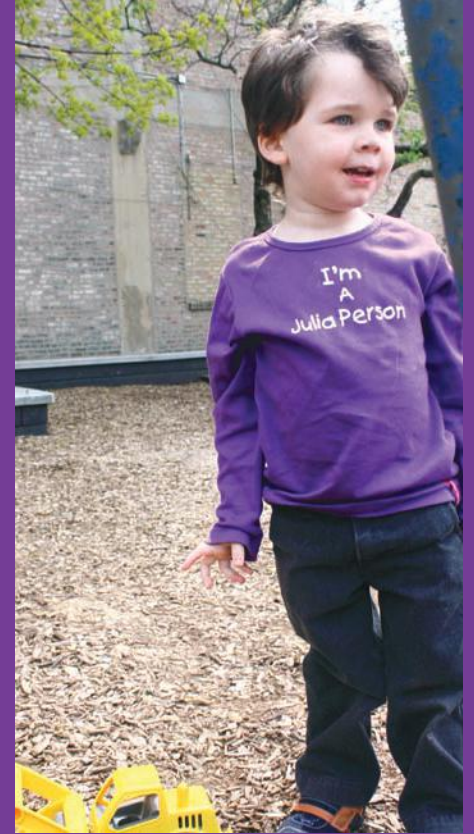

MAKING SMART COOL BAUDL

The support of the Julia Burke Foundation has made a real difference for Bay Area youth and families over the past three years. Thanks to this support, we have brought the transformative voice-centered pedagogy of debate to more than 700 students in 14 schools in San Francisco, Oakland, and now Emeryville. These students — and the coaches and volunteers who give so much of their time to open debate opportunities for them — are indebted to the Foundation for this chance to follow in the footsteps of their more privileged peers.

According to our students, there are two things that our organization most clearly does better than any other program. First, we inspire students whose voices are ignored or silenced in traditional classrooms not only to take stands on issues (plenty of programs do this) but to **take stands backed by rigorous evidence**. Second, we use a fun, competitive community to raise expectations and enable young people to **pursue excellence unlimited by contexts of underachievement**.

As support from our schools and districts grows, we are closing in on the transformative goal of **making smart cool** developing a cadre of eloquent debaters on each campus that help their peers find the benefits of intelligence and change those contexts of underachievement over time.

The Summer Institute, the Travel Scholarships, and the League Championships that The Julia Burke Foundation make possible are crucial pillars for the work we do. As we grow in our capacity to serve more students, to send our varsity debaters out to debate on the national circuit, and even to contribute to their research skills and their commitment to solving the problems of the communities around them, BAUDL and The Julia Burke Foundation keep these pillars standing. A LIFE OF POSSIBILITIES STUDENTS RISING ABOVE

Students Rising Above (SRA) is proud of its 90% (and rising!) college graduation rate, but that's only part of the story. In addition to fulfilling the dream of a college degree, we ensure that by the time our students graduate, they have strong resumes filled with meaningful professional experiences that have given them the skills, confidence and connections to be competitive as they transition from college to career. How do we find these opportunities, especially in today's challenging economy, where this kind of experience is more crucial than ever? The answer is hard work combined with the generosity of The Julia Burke Foundation.

A portion of the funds from The Julia Burke Foundation grant supports our growing career guidance and summer internship programs. Just as the number of students in SRA has been growing every year, we have also increased the number of internship placements each summer. This year we placed 52 students in rewarding internships, up from 39 in the summer of 2010.

Dalvin Butler, a junior at Georgetown University, interned for the San Francisco District Attorney's office this summer. "It's a great honor and pleasure to serve as an intern in the DA's

office. As a future attorney and politician, this was a once in a lifetime experience." Dalvin's supervisor was equally enthused, "Dalvin exhibits the hallmarks of an exemplary and faithful student of SRA, namely a profound sense of self, commitment to and respect for others, and burgeoning leadership skills."

Support from The Julia Burke Foundation helped make this opportunity possible for Dalvin and 51 other SRA students. "Their support gives hard working students the opportunity to participate in life-changing experiences," commented Lynne Martin, Executive Director. Additionally this year, the organization was proud to appoint Jerry Burke to the SRA Board of Directors.

A POWERFUL PARTNERSHIP HALO

Board members Jon Cowperthwait and Robbie Murphy represented The Julia Burke Foundation at a luncheon hosted by Cindy McCain, a board member of HALO USA and wife of Senator John McCain, in San Francisco on May 21, 2011. The Foundation has sponsored landmine removal and weapons destruction through The HALO Trust in several war-torn countries. This event provided an opportunity for these two board members to discuss, with other potential donors to HALO USA, how effective the partnership is between the Julia Burke Foundation and The HALO Trust.

By January 2011, twenty-two years after its founding, HALO has reached some important milestones that include:

- over 1.3 million landmines destroyed
- over twelve million items of larger caliber ordnance destroyed
- over fifty million bullets destroyed
- over 2,800 heavy weapon systems immobilized
- over 129,000 assault rifles destroyed
- over 7,400 minefields cleared
- 27,367 hectares (67,625 acres) made safe from landmines
- 128,785 hectares (318,235 acres) made safe from unexploded and abandoned ordnance
- 12,409 kilometers (7,710 miles) of roads cleared

These statistics, which may appear bland, are a testament to the dedication of HALO staff conducting one of the most inherently dangerous jobs on earth, and the generosity of donors, including The Julia Burke Foundation, who understand that our work directly saves lives, and allows a return to normal rural livelihoods in some of the poorest countries in the world.

After learning to put on a mindful body—a technique for increasing focus and awareness—a 2nd grader raised his hand and said, “I feel like \$1,000 dollars.” And after a minute of focusing on her breath, a 5th grader said, “I feel relaxed and I don’t feel mean.”

The weeklong Lafayette Summer Music Workshop serves 195 students of Jazz—of all ages—and supports a 40-member faculty comprised of world-class professional musicians, recording artists and music educators. The Julia Burke Foundation provided 50 students with full or partial scholarships to attend the camp, based on both need and merit, which ran in August 2011. In so doing, the Foundation continues to support the workshop goals, including: improving musicianship with a pathway from entry level to the professional level; the development of life skills such as listening, collaborating, responsibility, respect, competency and confidence; and providing students the opportunity to work directly with music professionals from across the country and with other music students with similar passions.

The camp benefited greatly from the participation of these scholarship recipients, none of whom could have attended the workshop without financial support. One student, in particular, auditioned and was placed in the highest combo, and her performance brought down the house. She plans to study music in college. She said, “I want to thank you so much for giving me the chance to attend and experience Lafayette Jazz Workshop. I appreciate you for providing for me. I’ve been having a lot of fun and learning a bunch from these amazing musicians. This has been one of the best camps I’ve attended. I cannot thank you enough. You’re the best!!!”

THE DEBATE GROWS ROUND ROBIN

Each February, the College Preparatory School hosts The California Round Robin, the premier policy debate round robin competition on the West Coast, just before the California Invitational at the University of California at Berkeley. In 2011, with support from the Julia Burke Foundation, College Prep expanded the scope of the competition by adding Lincoln Douglas and Public Forum debate. Twelve of the top Policy Teams, Lincoln Douglas debaters, and Public Forum teams came to the Bay Area for the event, including debaters from as far away as Washington, D.C., Florida, and Maryland. A total of sixty debaters from ten states competed in the round robin. This competition is unique in the world of high school debate because experts on the topics being debated evaluate the final round debates. These debaters are also matriculating into top universities across the country. Students testify that their debate programs, and the opportunity to challenge themselves against top competitors nationwide, have positively influenced their academic success and ability to perform well on college entrance exams, and at interviews. These students are also afforded a visibility to college coaches that is simply not available to local debaters.

Of course, the amazing and increased success of our team of debaters is also not to be missed!
