All for His glory!



### **Giving Thanks**

"Rejoice in the LORD always! And, again, I say Rejoice!"

This phrase is found in Philippians Chapter 4. It is right before the often quoted verses of "Don't worry about anything, but in everything, through prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."These verses remind us to be thankful and think about our attitudes – something we as Americans tend to do at this time of year. But, there is a verse in between those we quote, and it says to "Let your graciousness be known to everyone. (Verse 5). That word, "graciousness", is translated many ways in the different versions of the Bible. The King James calls it "moderation". The English Standard uses "reasonableness." 






How did Black Sheep wind up with the Hawko's? Is there a story behind that? Everyone has one. As for us, God's ways are certainly surprising—and far better than ours! It shows in the way we came to be part of the super fantastic Black Sheep Motorcycle Ministry.

To begin, our efforts to find a home church after we settled in Maine (from Guam) put us in a predicament. Our goal to find a place to serve God was not working out, or so we thought. We tried and tried. Meanwhile, we had four high school and college-age children to handle and rode our motorcycles only casually. Ken had back issues that caused a severe hardship as well; it was a rough patch for sure. Think speed bumps and potholes. We definitely didn't have biker missionaries on our game card!





Around that time, Ken prepared for retirement from active duty with the purchase of a sweet new 2014 Road King. I followed suit and got a 2007 Sportster 1200C. We heard of the HOG Chapter and walked into a meeting one night. The first person we met was Phil Andrukaitus, a Black Sheep Chaplain and Pastor at a Bible-centered church a couple of towns over. Meeting him turned out to have unexpected and pleasant consequences, including finding a church! Pastor Phil, a former Marine, even gave the benediction at Ken's USCG retirement ceremony in 2015, which was truly an honor.

Needless to say, we joined HOG and began mentorship for Black Sheep in 2017. Another surprise—Marty Edwards, aka Slow Dog, patched us in! At a regional gathering in Pennsylvania, we met him and many others, most of whom we consider blessed to know as friends today. We've been active in the Southern Maine Chapter ever since.

So what have we gotten ourselves into? Given that we have hearts for God (that joy of salvation thing) and a passion for riding constantly at play in our lives, we felt God was calling us to join His people on mission to the biker community. We prayed about the fit for us, the impact it would have on our lives, how family/friends would react, etc. Finally, Ken convincingly said, "How else do we live apart from bringing these two things together?! Do all things to His glory!" ("So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." 1 Cor. 10:31). Yes! We love the Lord, give Him all thanks, honor, and glory, and with our innate passion for riding, its freedom, the spring it brings to our souls, and the community around it—the "Do" made sense. Naturally, God put the pieces together, fitting us out for this amazing biker ministry with amazing Christian brothers and sisters.

Best of all, we have a solid foundation and platform in Black Sheep to "be about our Father's business"! Knowing of the deep spiritual needs around us and our mission to proclaim the Gospel gives us motivation and joy in the body of Christ to serve Him. As Paul writes in 2 Cor. 5:18, "All this is from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation." The places He has taken us and the people we have met are beautiful, eye-opening, and sometimes heart-wrenching, but still, we knew that with God, life in the Black Sheep ministry would be a ride with surprises like no other!

### My 2012 Harley Davidson Heritage Softail: A Tool for Ministry

I was inspired to purchase my 2012 Harley Davidson Heritage Softail after seeing how my brother in Christ, Whiskey, had customized his Deluxe. Witnessing firsthand how a motorcycle could attract people and spark conversations about Jesus had a profound impact on me. On several occasions, when we were out riding, people would approach Whiskey, asking about the details of his bike, especially the scriptures and images he had thoughtfully placed on it. The ease and natural flow of these conversations inspired me to begin my own project.



It reminded me of when we ride with our cuts, which signify our purpose and ministry. People notice, and sometimes they ask questions about why we do what we do. The Holy Spirit often opens these moments for us to share what Jesus' presence has done in our lives, and I've found these opportunities incredibly rewarding.

I found this Heritage Softail in May, with fewer than 4,600 miles on it, still in its original condition, including the white-wall tires. I praise God that I made it home safely after my brother Dubb discovered the tires were in poor shape, with a screw lodged in the rear one. For me, it was another reminder of God's protection, even when we don't immediately recognize it.

After that close call, I prayed for direction on how to move forward with this bike. What has remained constant in my heart throughout this journey is the truth that Christ's Blood covers a multitude of sins.





My vision for the bike is to paint it a deep blood red, adorned with gold leaf scriptures and images. My hope is that this design will continue to open doors for conversations about our Lord, Jesus Christ, just as it has already begun to do within our ministry and with strangers in the community.

This project has brought me closer to my brothers and sisters in Christ, whether through conversations in Big Chris' garage, over breakfast with Preacher and Daryl, at an event with Whiskey or Silverback, or even in phone calls with Dubb from North Carolina. I am deeply blessed by the people God has placed in my life who have guided me along this journey.

Isn't it an incredible feeling to be encouraged by the body of Christ? I aim to complete this project by late spring, but honestly, I sometimes wonder if we are ever truly finished with our bikes. However, regardless of the timeline, I praise God for the blessing this project has been, as it continues to shine a light on His goodness, the people He has placed around me, and our shared purpose in this ministry.

# Compelled: Eyes and Ears for the Father's Heart

Being deeply involved with the BlackSheep mentorship program over the past couple of years has given me the opportunity to dive into what it means to be compelled to join God in His purposes. Our BSHDFC pledge begins with the question: "Are you compelled by the Spirit of God...?" The term \*compel\* comes from the Latin word \*compellere\*, which translates to "driven together." In other words, has the Spirit of God provided me with a clear sense that I am driven together to unite with the Black Sheep: Harley-Davidsons for Christ? It's an important question for all of us when it comes to something we feel may become a life passion.

In my 20 years of walking with the Lord, there have been only a few times that I felt truly compelled by the Spirit of God. One of those times was when I felt driven together with my beautiful wife, Alicia, as God would use us to carry out His purposes together. Another was joining BSHDFC and sharing the good news of Jesus with the motorcycling community.

But before either of those, my first calling was to serve orphans who were helpless and harassed like sheep without a shepherd. Nineteen years ago, my pastor shared that God had called him to dedicate the rest of his life to taking care of orphans in Africa. It was a shocking declaration. This man had faithfully shepherded a growing fellowship for 27 years, with plans to construct a new church campus to support the growth. However, after attending a Promise Keepers conference, he received a prophetic word, compelling him to pivot to this new mission. He wrestled with the




call—he had made an inner vow to never return to Africa after nearly dying from malaria in Nigeria 20 years earlier. But in the end, he knew the Holy Spirit was leading him.

He shared the plight of orphans in Lusaka, Zambia, with the fellowship back in 2004: millions of children orphaned due to HIV/AIDS and malaria. The life expectancy in Zambia was 35 years, and 85% of the population was under the age of 15. The situation was dire. He then asked if anyone else felt compelled to join him in this mission. What happened next is difficult to explain—I felt as though something lifted me to my feet. I was standing, unsure of why. I didn't know much about orphans or Africa. Even my girlfriend (now my wife) was shocked, as she certainly had no interest. A few others stood as well, but it wasn't a popular decision; many in the congregation felt abandoned by the pastor, and several left the church. It weighed heavily on his heart, but he knew he had to follow God's call.

After Alicia and I got engaged, she joined me on the first trip to Zambia. We weren't prepared for what we witnessed: children in tattered clothes, burning scraps of cardboard at night to stay warm, and huffing gasoline to numb their hunger and cold. Many had suffered abuse. It was heartbreaking. When we returned, I went to my pastor, frustrated. I told him that instead of spending money to travel there, I could have just given the money so the children could eat. I also questioned how we could possibly build a village on the barren land we had seen.

As a good and loving pastor should, he corrected me. He explained that my calling wasn't to solve everything, but to be the eyes and ears for the Father's heart, showing others the needs of these orphans. At the time, I didn't understand what he meant.

Fast forward 19 years, after nearly 25 trips back to Zambia, sharing this mission with many in our circles, and bringing teams of





people with us, I now understand. The fruit produced has been undeniable. We have seen orphans we took in at young ages grow up to become social workers, lawyers advocating for better policies, engineers improving infrastructure, and pastors shepherding others. The transformation is not just in Zambia—it's back home as well. People who have joined us on these trips have had their lives radically changed, compelled by God to alter the very trajectory of their purpose.

The ministry is called Breath of Heaven, and it truly lives up to its name. Like a fresh breath, it is a glimpse of what I believe heaven will be—paradise. Psalm 68:5 says, "A father of the fatherless and a judge and protector of the widows is God in His holy habitation." This experience has been a taste of that habitation, better than a thousand days elsewhere.

Breath of Heaven Children's Ministries (http://www.bofheaven.org) is an international humanitarian organization which is committed to bringing hope and a future to orphans and vulnerable children. Our current vision is to build a Children's Village complex in Lusaka, Zambia, which will provide residential care for up to 168 children in a family-like environment catering to their physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual needs. When built out, the complex will consist of 14 individual family homes, a community church, school facilities serving students through grade 12, a Vocational Training Center, and a fully equipped medical clinic. After opening our doors in January, 2010, we now have 10 homes completed with 96 children in residence. In addition, the church, school, and medical clinic are all in operation. These facilities allow us to serve the spiritual, educational, and health needs of the surrounding community as well as the children in our care.

We believe every child has a right to a family home where they are loved, secure, protected and free to be a child knowing their tomorrows are full of hope and that dreams can become a reality. This is our commitment, challenge and promise to the orphans of Zambia. These are the children we are called to rescue.

### 2024 "Bikers With Boxes" Ride & Event **RECAP**



Benefiting Samaritan's Purse "Operation Christmas Child"

Organized by Black Sheep Harley-Davidsons For Christ – Hickory NC Chapter

Sponsored by Blue Ridge H-D, Freedom Biker Church, Hickory Bible Church, Mountain Grove Church, Gloryland Baptist Church & Pisgah Methodist Church.

Shoeboxes were distributed to the local participating Black Sheep member's churches the month prior and a display table was established at Blue Ridge H-D. Donated Shoeboxes were collected and as of the morning of the Ride & Event a Total of 458 had been locally received!

The Lord provided a perfectly sunny 80 degree day on Saturday, October 5th, 2024, for which 42 motorcycles accommodated 4 decorated trucks outfitted with event banners along the escorted route down the hour long ride to The Billy Graham Library in Charlotte, NC to deliver the gift shoeboxes! The motorcycle pack stretched over ¼ mile long as it paraded down 3 major freeways. By the end of the day BGL reported that nearly 800 Bikers had dropped off shoeboxes! Bikers were given a 2024 "Bikers With Boxes" Tee Shirt along with complimentary lunch by Chick-fil-a and the opportunity to tour the Billy Graham Library and Grounds. Everyone enjoyed amazing Spirit filled fellowship and making new friends!

By the end of the day a Total of over 8,550 Shoeboxes had been received from all the Bikers!

Since 1993 through 2022 Samaritan's Purse "Operation Christmas Child" has distributed 199,256,994 shoebox gifts with the message of The Gospel sent to 175 countries & territories!

This is the 8th year in a row that the Black Sheep HDFC - Hickory Chapter had participated.

### from the President's Desk

I remember meeting a man in Arkansas during the Bikes, Blues, & BBQ rally a few months back. We started chatting, and since it's an election year, the topic of politics naturally came up. He told me that the Bible was quite clear on who we should vote for, and then he asked if I knew what Ecclesiastes 10:2 said. I admitted that I couldn't remember, and he encouraged me to look it up when I had the chance.

After our conversation ended, I pulled up the verse on the Bible app. It read, "The mind of the wise tends toward the right, but the mind of the fool toward the left." I chuckled at first. It was clear the man had a sense of humor.
