

Bitter Crop

The Heartache and Triumph of Billie Holiday's Last Year

PAUL ALEXANDER

A revelatory look at the tumultuous life of a jazz legend and American cultural icon

Bitter Crop is an unconventional portrait of arguably America's most eminent jazz singer. Acclaimed biographer Paul Alexander shrewdly focuses on the last year of her life – with relevant flashbacks to provide context – to evoke and examine the persistent magnificence of Holiday's artistry when it was supposed to have declined, in the wake of her drug abuse, relationships with violent men, and run-ins with the law.

During her lifetime and after her death, Billie Holiday was often depicted as a down-on-her-luck junkie severely lacking in self-esteem. Relying on interviews with people who knew her and new material unearthed in private collections and institutional archives, *Bitter Crop* limns Holiday as a powerful, ambitious woman who overcame her flaws to triumph as a vital figure of American popular music.



Vanessa Kisuule is a writer and performer based in Bristol. She has won over ten poetry slam titles and her poem on the historic toppling of Edward Colston's statue 'Hollow' gained over 600,000 views on Twitter in three days. She has two poetry collections published by Burning Eye Books and has written for publications including the Guardian, NME and Lonely Planet. She the co-tutor for the Southbank New Poets Collective for 2021/2022 and was the Bristol City Poet for 2018-2020.

The pleasures and perils of fandom

VANESSA KISUULE

The debut work of non-fiction by slam poet Vanessa Kisuule, this is a love letter to the musicians we adore and an unflinching look at the costs of hero worship

My shame is a small fissure sitting to the left of my chest, and when I think of Michael it rattles. The shame is directly proportional to how deeply and sincerely I loved him.

Why do famous musicians mean so much to us? How does the pop culture industry both mirror and magnify the worst aspects of human nature? Why is it so hard to accept that the people we love, famous or not, can be capable of doing terrible things?

As conversations about abuse perpetrated by public figures become louder, this book examines the nuances of 'fandom': of celebrities as symbols and fantasies, of child stars and power imbalances. Neverland invites us to question the dangers of idolising and villainising individuals, it asks us to be unafraid of scrutinising the ugly and contradictory.


With verve and incisiveness, Kisuule explores her own experience of being a fan and the evergreen question of whether we can, or should, separate the art from the artist. With references to R. 

Her writing workshop, Letters That Will Never Be Sent, was featured in a BBC World Service documentary.





The first book to tell the stories of the army of underpaid and exploited workers powering artificial intelligence, *Feeding the Machine* tells the story of a global technology through the eyes of the people who produce it

Al promises to transform everything, from work to transport to war, and to solve our problems with total ease, just like magic. But hidden beneath the promise is a very human cost. Everything Al can do depends on armies of annotators, moderators and other data workers – people doing poorly paid, gruelling labour for the benefit of some of the richest companies in the world.

Based on hundreds of interviews and more than a decade of research, Feeding the Machine reveals the exploitation that makes Al look so effortless, talking to the people that build it and those it threatens to replace. It shows that all this new technology is founded on old, brutal systems of colonialism and capitalism, and details exactly what we need to do, individually and globally, if we are going to protect our future, and resist the harm that Al is already causing.




James Muldoon works and researches at the University of Essex, University of Oxford and Autonomy think tank. His research examines how modern technologies can create public value and serve the common good.

Joe Tucker's Uncle Eric was a beloved yet unconventional figure throughout Joe's life. 

Love is a gift, isn't it? From our early childhood years to growing up and pairing off, it's a feeling we chase knowing we're better off with it. But what if love is claustrophobic and conflicting? And what if at the same time we're chasing addictions to drugs, drink, sex and chaos?

Diagnosed twice with ADHD, Jordan Stephens found his teens and twenties a whirl of career success and nurturing friendships but also a brutal pattern of self-harm, hedonism, destructive coping mechanisms and heartbreak. When he tried to live up to his own damaged expectations and his world exploded, he stepped away from his previous existence completely and allowed himself to explore the pain he'd repressed his entire life.

Unsparingly digging into the fear, tenderness and trauma he carried in his body and mind, and the confusing assumptions of what a young man should be, Jordan Stephens discovers what it means to be a modern man, why we should all open ourselves up to life, and how the price we pay for love in all its forms is worth it.







What is home? Years ago Marchelle left Trinidad and now, uprooted once again, she heads to the peaceful English countryside – the only Black woman in her village. Drawn to her new garden, Marchelle begins to examine the complex and emotional question of home in the context of colonialism. *Uprooting* is a book about finding home where we least expect it.

Marchelle Farrell is a therapist, writer and amateur gardener. She spends much of her time getting to know her country garden in Somerset and writing about the things the garden teaches her about herself.







PETER GODWIN

The latest memoir from award-winning writer Peter Godwin, focusing on middle age and his changing relationships with the three women who shaped his life

Peter's mother is dying. Born in England, and having spent most of her adult life as a doctor in Zimbabwe, she now lies on a hospital bed in the partitioned living room of his sister's London house, her accent having overnight become posher than the Queen's.

Peter has spent his life missing his Zimbabwean childhood, a longing that does not diminish as he reflects on being a conscript in the Rhodesian army in the 1970s, writing about conflicts across the African continent and beyond or settling in New York with his English wife and transatlantic children. In his mother's final months, he must come to terms with everything his family was – and wasn't: the secrets they kept from one another, the stoicism that sometimes threatened to destroy them and the beauty of the wildly different places they called home.

In Exit Wounds, Peter Godwin considers the life of émigrés, exiles and refugees, and grieves the many losses that make life both magnificent and unbearable. With generations of history behind him, he brings us into the spaces which make us question, suffer and celebrate the lives we have among family and friends, and the healing of our own scars.

Peter Godwin was born and raised in Zimbabwe. He is an award-winning foreign correspondent, author, documentary-maker and screenwriter. He is the author of six non-fiction books amongst which are Mukiwa, which received the George Orwell Prize and the Esquire-Apple-Waterstones award, and When a Crocodile Eats the Sun: A Memoir of Africa, which won the Borders Original Voices Award. His book The Fear: Robert Mugabe and the Martyrdom of Zimbabwe, was selected by the New Yorker as a best book of the year. From 2012-15 he served as President of the PEN American Center. He is an Orwell fellow, a Guggenheim fellow, and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations.



James Lovelock is best known as the father of Gaia Theory, the idea that life on Earth is a self-sustaining system in which organisms interact with their environments to maintain a habitable ecosystem. At least until humans came along. But Lovelock was many other things: an environmentalist and inventor, an industrialist, NASA engineer and spy.

Lovelock's life was a chronicle of twentieth century science, and somehow he seemed to have a hand in much of it. During the Second World War he worked at the National Medical Research Institute, where his life-long interest in chemical tracing began. In the 1960s he worked at NASA on a planned Mars mission. He worked for MI5 and MI6 during the Cold War. He was a science advisor to the oil giant Shell, who he warned as early as 1966 that fossil fuels were causing serious harm to the environment. He invented the technology that found the hole in the Ozone layer. And all of this shaped Gaia Theory – a theory that could not have been developed without the collaboration of two important women in his life.


