

Water tower art puts Cressy on the map

Barwon Water

The first "silo artwork" in the Colac Otway Shire has been completed on the Cressy water tower, thanks to a partnership between Barwon Water and the Cressy & District History Group.

The project was the initiative of the Cressy & District History Group, with the intent of showcase the local history of the area at the same time as creating a tourist attraction.

The works were completed by renowned silo artist Tim Bowtell who is responsible for many silo artworks across Victoria and New South Wales, including the six silos at Colbinabbin, Victoria, which are critically acclaimed and popular with visitors.

Cressy & District History Group President and Project Coordinator Robyn Alexander said Tim had done a fantastic job on the four murals on the Cressy Water Tower, which depict significant aspects of the region's local history.

"On one column facing Colac Ballarat Road, there is the Woady Yallock River where Cressy was founded, on the rear column there is a steam train representing our vibrant railway history, on each side of the barrel are two vintage aircraft representing the Cressy RAAF Base which operated during World War II, so you will see a Hawker Demon on one side and a Spitfire on the other side."

Ms Alexander said the completion of the project marked the end of a 12-year journey from when the idea was first seeded, and five years of planning since 2019.

"Thanks to Barwon Water for the use of the tower and funding partners Berrybank Wind Farms through the Corangamite





Shire and the Golden Plains Shire, Colac Otway Shire, Mt Gellibrand Wind Farm, and Golden Plains Wind Farm."

Tim Bowtell said the mural was one of the more challenging he a had worked on given the shape and height of the 60-foot tower and the 365-degree nature of the work.

"It is the highest work I've completed and I'm really pleased with how it's turned out.

"It's great to be able to work on projects like this, that tell a bit about the local history and have a really positive local impact."

Barwon Water General Manager Customers, Community and Strategy Laura Kendall said the organisation was happy to support the project, which will promote an identity for Cressy, fostering growth and development for their community.

"We're glad to be able to provide in-kind support of the use of the Cressy water tower as a base for the mural.

"It's a project that will positively impact economically, culturally and socially, in turn invigorating community life and promoting community pride."

The Cressy water tower, built in the early 1960s, is located on New Station Street and is a landmark for those approaching the township.

As well as now artistically representing some of the region's history and extending the Silo Arts Trail along the Hamilton Highway, from which it is visible, the tower marks the northern most point of Barwon Water's Colac region supply system.

It remains a crucial part of Cressy's water supply infrastructure by gravity feeding water into the town's drinking water network.

Oh those scammers - "Business Registration"

I check my Spam folder every now and then, to make sure it hasn't sidelined a legitimate email and also to keep tabs on what the scammers & spammers are up to. I thought I'd write about one example and assess what it's about and the type of scam that it is. Wouldn't it be great if nobody in our area fell for these tricks?

This week - "Business Registration For Winch Websites". Steven Hoffman was kind enough to write to me (more than once) and no doubt several thousand other small businesses around Australia;

"Hope this email finds you well,

Winch Websites has been selected and approved for the AUSBRB Best Businesses in Australia 2024.

This offer is presented only to businesses that have maintained a 4+ star google review rating or equivalent proof of customer satisfaction.

Representing the Best Businesses in Australia, the AUSBRB Australia Business Review Board Inc. has found that your business meets strong consumer satisfaction standards, and we look forward to recommending your services.

Membership in the AUSBRB Best Businesses In Australia 2024 includes listing in the exclusive.... blah blah blah...

To accept your AUSBRB Best Businesses In Australia Membership & Verification please reply to receive information on how to proceed."

No doubt there is a fee for being 'listed' - do a Google search for the organisation and you find very little other than their website & socials, a couple of obviously fake positive reviews, and a stream of small businesses that have fallen for the scam and are effectively promoting it. There's a nice-looking certificate and badge which can be put into websites and social media pages etc, which may make the business owner feel good (after all, s/he is the best in Australia!) but these



promotional items also link back to AUSBRB. Their 'directory' simply lists a photo, name, website address that can't be clicked, and phone number - very little benefit to the business owner. And guess what? AUSBRB is not listed in ASIC as an Australian business!

So if you see a nice shiny badge like this on a website you're visiting, do them a favour and let them know they've been scammed and to remove the badge. It might look good and sound good, but it's unworthy bling.

This is a good example of a scam which isn't illegal, but very shady. You do get a badge, and of course they 'review' the hundreds and hundreds of businesses in their directory (with an automated bot), and yes, they do actually have a directory. Similar scams include those that target the annual renewal of a business name - for an extortionate price - with a letter that looks remarkably like an invoice but which will switch away from direct registration with the government to a private organisation that does it for you at a considerable profit.

Be alert people. Your country needs lerts.



Authorities sick and tyred of cleaning up

Environmental authorities are urging Victorian households and businesses to spare the environment and dispose of their used tyres legally and responsibly after more than 2700 car and truck tyres were found dumped on public land last year.

The Conservation Regulator and Parks Victoria recorded at least 60 separate illegal dumping incidents involving personal or commercial quantities of tyres across Victorian public land in 2023, with the State's Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) estimating that thousands more have been dumped, burned, or stockpiled.

Dumped car tyres can have serious impacts on human and environmental health. Old tyres also contain harmful chemicals that leach into the environment and groundwater as they break down, potentially poisoning plants and animals.

Discarded tyres also present a serious fire risk, as tyre fires are harder to control or extinguish than regular fires. As rubber burns hotter and more easily, tyres dumped in forests can fuel bushfires with devastating effects.

Legal disposal of old tyres reduces these environmental and safety risks, and recycled tyres can often be turned into other products, including roads and artificial playground turf.

Individual or small quantities of tyres can be responsibly disposed of at recycling centres, such as local council transfer



stations, for a small fee. Most tyre outlets will also accept old tyres as part of government recycling schemes, either for free if people have purchased new tyres from their shop, or for a small fee if brought from elsewhere.

When disposing tyres through one of the above options, people should check with their local council, recycling facility, or individual tyre seller to see if they accept them.

Victorian businesses also have legal obligations for safely storing and transporting large amounts of waste tyres. EPA Victoria produces guidance on managing these responsibilities, which can be found at: www.epa.vic.gov.au/ for-business/find-a-topic/manage-industrial-waste/waste-tyres

In Victoria, it is an offence to dump litter or waste under the Environment Protection Act 2017, with maximum penalties ranging between \$3,846 and \$230,772.

Housing options for seniors

Housing affordability continues to be a burning issue. A shortage of housing for seniors looking to downsize, but not ready for supported living, was identified in southwest Victoria.

Corangamite Financial Services Ltd (CFS), which operates the Community Bank branches at Winchelsea, Anglesea and Lorne brainstormed possible solutions to this issue. The result is an impressive project – ten independent living units (ILU) for seniors and people with disabilities will be built to address the problem. These units will be built on land obtained from the Surf Coast Shire and are architecturally designed to be age and disadvantage friendly.

Those most likely to take up these units are farmers and other locals looking to downsize but still capable of independent living. They're typically seeking quality accommodation that sits between a conventional family home and supported living.

CFS has contributed \$500,000 from their Community Enterprise Foundation (CEF) account as seed capital for architectural planning, a heritage survey, permits and the initial groundwork on the site. CFS has committed a further \$1 million to the construction cost. Also assisting with the development of the ILU's are:

- Surf Coast Shire provision of 3,100m² of land for the nominal fee of \$1
- Hesse Rural Health Services provision of support packages for residents
- Winchelsea Lions Club possible financial support and identification of tenants
- Growing Winchelsea Inc identification of tenants
- · Bendigo Bank Ioan funding.

The CEF have been instrumental to the success of the project and have facilitated workshops to fine tune the concept and provide guidance on the most appropriate structure.

CFS Director, Gerard Kelly, said a lot of thought and research had gone into the structure to ensure the best outcome for all parties.

"This is about how a Community Bank company can leverage funds accumulated in the CEF to work in partnership with local councils and other parties to build permanent, much needed community capital in their regions. Realistically, this is what the Community Bank companies were set up for! The power of the Community Bank model is to provide both the impetus for the development and also the seed capital via the Foundation," said director Gerard Kelly.

Taking a closer look at the barriers for women in sport

Victoria State Government

Teams of top researchers at Victorian universities will embark on research projects to help break down barriers for women and girls in sport.

The program also supports the development of early career researchers with an interest in gender equality and emerging issues impacting women and girls in sport and recreation.

Deakin University has two grants and will lead research aimed at increasing women's visibility and look at the impacts of menstruation on participation in sport and active recreation

RMIT University will examine active outdoor recreation experiences for Culturally and Linguistically Diverse women through the Social, Accessible, Fun and Equitable project.

This round will bring the total value of research grants awarded through the Change Our Game Research Grants Program initiative to more than \$460,000 - with 21 research projects being supported since 2018.

Funded through an earlier round, La Trobe University's Enhancing Participation Pathways for Women Coaches in Community research explores key barriers experienced by women coaches in community sport and was released today. It outlines eight steps that sporting organisations and clubs can adopt to recruit, induct, support, train and retain women as coaches. Investing in community sport to change the game

The Victorian Government is backing more women and girls from all backgrounds to get involved in the sport they love, right across the state.

Minister for Community Sport Ros Spence today opened applications for the 2023-24 Change Our Game Community Activation Grants program.

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to support community sport and recreation clubs or organisations to increase participation, build capability, promote gender equity and support the professional development of women and girls playing, volunteering and working in community sport.

In this round of the program there's also a strong focus on supporting club or organisation initiatives that encourage the equitable inclusion of women and girls from all backgrounds and experiences.

The program is part of the Government's Change Our Game initiative, working to make sport more accessible, increasing local participation and providing opportunities for all Victorians to be leaders in their local sporting community.

Now in its seventh year, the Change Our Game Community Activation Grants program has provided more than \$2.2 million towards 461 grants that have benefitted community sport and active recreation clubs and organisations across the state.

One such initiative was with the Benalla Golf Club that saw 75 women and girls participate in a 'Fun on the Fairways – Girls in Golf' program. The 9-week program to learn golf skills, game play and course etiquette provided a safe and supportive environment and resulted in a 20 percent increase in competition rounds played by women.

Together with the Fair Access Policy, launched by the Labor Government in August 2022, Change Our Game Community Activation Grants provides a great opportunity for clubs and organisations to extend equitable access to, and use of, community sports infrastructure, and build participants' skills and knowledge.

These grants are part of the Government's \$18.8 million investment in the Office for Women in Sport and Recreation and the Change Our Game initiative since 2016.

The fund objectives include addressing gaps in community infrastructure, building community pride, enhancing living, working, socialising and recreation, supporting economic activity, increasing participation in community life and strengthening social cohesion.

Eligible community associations are required to contribute 20% of the project budget but 50% of the contribution can be in-kind.



Victoria's inspiring Rural Women's Award finalists

Four trail-blazing Victorian women are in the running for the 2024 Agrifutures Rural Women's Award.

The Award celebrates Australia's rural women leaders from across a range of industries, including Victoria's \$20.2 billion agriculture sector, who use their skills to benefit their communities and rural Australia, and inspire others.

The Victorian winner will be announced in April and will receive \$15,000 towards their project.

They will also go on to represent Victoria at the National Award, a Gala event at Parliament House in September.

The national winner will receive a further \$20,000 towards their project, and the national runner-up \$15,000.

In 2023, Victoria's Glenmore-based co-founder of Grown Not Flown, Nikki Davis, took out the national prize.

She said the award felt like recognition for the challenges she has faced as a female founder working across both the agriculture and technology sectors.

'I am not a natural farmer, I don't know how to fix a fence, and I would prefer to stay indoors when it is windy outside,' Ms Davis said.

'What I am good at is problem solving, working with technology and data, and believing that we can change the world with our ideas.'

This year's finalists are:

 Georgina Morrison, from Hamilton, formed the Creative Toolkit to help position rural Australia as a hub for competitive creatives. The online academy aims to empower rural creatives to expand their profitable skillsets.

- Grace Larson, from Kyneton, formed The Sisterhood Project to mitigate the barriers of distance and affordability for parents and carers in rural areas. The Project aims to deliver free access to essential paediatric first aid training for vulnerable groups, to help curb higher child mortality rates in rural Australia.
- Reeanjou Ram, based in Melbourne but raised in Fiji, founded iTrazo Tracetech to help bridge the gap between Australia's rural producers and their metropolitan consumers. iTrazo offers digital traceability services to mitigate transport risks for producers and better inform customers.
- Sarah Holmes, from Mildura, founded EnviroEDU to promote environment, conservation and sustainability awareness in rural and regional communities. EnviroEDU aims to educate children at the grassroots level to help contribute to conserving our natural ecosystems.

In addition to the Victorian AgriFutures Rural Women's Award, the Victorian Government is supporting women in agriculture and rural communities more broadly with a suite of programs that provide leadership skills and support resilience and connection for women across rural Victoria.

The risk of mosquito-borne diseases is highest in October to late April in Victoria, as mosquito numbers peak.

Mosquito-borne diseases include Japanese encephalitis, a rare but potentially serious infection of the brain caused by a virus that can spread to humans through mosquito bites.

The best way to prevent mosquito-borne diseases is to avoid mosquito bites.

- Cover up wear long, loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing as mosquitoes can bite through tight clothing.
- Use mosquito repellents containing picaridin or DEET on all exposed skin. Apply on top of sunscreen and reapply after swimming or sweating.
- Limit outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are about.
- Remove stagnant water where mosquitoes can breed around your home or campsite.
- On holidays make sure your accommodation is fitted with mosquito netting or screens.
- Don't forget the kids always check the insect repellent label. On babies, spray or rub repellent on their clothes instead of their skin.
- Avoid applying repellent to the hands of babies or young children.
- Use 'knockdown' fly sprays and plug-in repellent devices indoors.
- Consider a mosquito net treated with a residual insecticide if sleeping outdoors, including a tent or cabin.
- Mosquito coils can be effective in small outdoor areas where you gather to sit or eat.
- Vaccination. Be prepared JE is a rare but serious infection. Vaccination can protect you.

JE vaccine is free for eligible Victorians, visit your GP or local immunisation provider.

You are eligible for free JE vaccination if you:

- live in high-risk areas of Victoria and meet additional criteria
- · live or work at properties with pigs
- are going to high-risk areas for seasonal work.


