Your Pathways After School.



Vocational

If you're aged between 16-18 years old you will have a study programme specifically tailored to meet your educational needs and career aspirations. It consists of your main chosen course as well as further development of maths, English and employability skills.

A Levels

If you're looking to study A Levels, our Ludlow Sixth Form College provides an excellent choice of A Level subjects. Students often progress on to higher education and secure places at Russell Group universities.

Apprenticeships

We currently offer a variety of different apprenticeship subjects and routes ranging from Level 2 qualifications right up to Degree Level. This route allows you to combine work and study through on-the-job training with classroom learning.

T Levels

These courses offer you a mixture of classroom learning with workplace experience. During the course you will put your skills and knowledge into practice during an industry placement of 315 hours.

GCSE's

This is a one-year GCSE course designed for students wishing to develop their maths and/or English skills and improve their grades. Students will require a grade 4 (grade C) in both subjects to progress to any A Level course or Level 3 Vocational course.

The course will help you to improve on the areas you find the most difficult, building your confidence as well as your understanding and skills. For students who do need to re-sit either (or both) GCSE maths or English, it will be accommodated into your programme of study, as day and evening classes are available.



Getting to College.

Herefordshire College is located in the east of the city and only a short walk to the heart of the city centre.

Travelling by train? Hereford train station (opposite Morrisons) is located less than a mile away from Herefordshire College with links to Ledbury, Malvern, Worcester, Leominster, Ludlow, Abergavenny etc.

Travelling by bus? There are a variety of routes into college from Herefordshire and our neighbouring counties, dropping off at the nearby train station and bus station.

Travelling by car? Herefordshire College operates a free parking permit system for students and staff. Students can use the large car park at the rear of the main building (Car Park A). This can be accessed off Whittern Way. To use the car park you must apply for a parking permit, which is then displayed on your windscreen.

We also have plenty of bike racks available so you can securly lock your bike during the day.


Herefordshire Council support the college by allocating travel passes to students who live over 3 miles from the college.






Course Entry Requirements

The information below outlines the minimum entry requirements for the different types of courses we offer.

Entry/Level 1 Course

No formal entry requirements. Applicants will be considered on aptitude and commitment, following initial advice and guidance.

Level 2 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3, including English and maths or successful completion of a relevant Level 1 qualification. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

All full-time courses can lead to employment as well as the routes shown.



This course provides interactive lessons and opportunities for real-life scenario roleplays. You will work in small and supportive groups and get the chance to visit the local community.

What you could do next

Progression routes may include Entry Level 3 or Level 1 Foundation course.

The purpose of this qualification is to develop the skills, attitudes and behaviours needed for learners to progress to further study and ultimately into employment. Through learning the basics of carpentry, bricklaying, plumbing, electrical installation and property maintenance, accompanied by skills in planning, time management and working with others, students develop personally and as tradespeople. The course is designed to be delivered in an applied way, delivering a good balance of practical, technical and life skills.

Why choose us

Students taking this qualification will learn practical skills in various construction trades and the life skills necessary in Further Education and working life. The combination of practical work and theory will help develop confidence and social skills. Teaching is highly individualised, finding best ways for the development of a learner. Most of the learning is provided in the workshops with a less formal and more relaxed atmosphere.

What you could do next

Continued learning at a higher level in construction or another sector. Further qualification in brickwork, carpentry, building maintenance, plumbing or eletrics are the most common choices of current students.







Level 2 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3, including English and maths or successful completion of a relevant qualification.
Applicants without suitable practical experience may be advised to commence study at Level 1. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

Level 3 Course

Successful completion of a relevant Level 2 qualification at merit grade and GCSEs at grade 3 in English and maths. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.



There is an option to study additional certificates to the Level 2 qualification, such as make-up and skincare workshops, and also to be involved in the College's Hair and Beauty Show. The thorough and professional understanding developed through your studies will prepare you for a career in beauty therapy offering many exciting opportunities, such as managing and running your own salon, travelling the world working on a luxury liner, working in a prestigious health farm or spa, or teaching your skills to others at a college or private centre.

What you could do next

The information below outlines the minimum entry requirements for the different types of courses we offer.

Level 2 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3, including English and maths or successful completion of a relevant qualification. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

Level 3 Course

A minimum of five GCSEs at grade 4, including English and/or maths or successful completion of a relevant Level 2 qualification at merit grade. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

Level 4 Course/HNC

A Levels or a relevant Level 3 qualification totalling 32 UCAS points. We will consider applications from experienced and mature practitioners who do not have the above qualifications. These applicants will be invited to complete an essay, which will demonstrate the ability to study at this level.

Level 3 Course

A minimum of five GCSEs at grade 4, including English and/or maths or successful completion of a relevant Level 2 qualification at merit grade. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams

Foundation Degree/HTQ

A minimum of 32 UCAS points from A Levels or Level 3 qualification. Four GCSEs at grade 4 or above. We will consider applications from experienced and/or mature practitioners who do not have the above qualifications. These applicants will be invited to complete an essay, which will demonstrate an ability to study at this level.

All full-time courses can lead to employment as well as the routes shown.


No formal entry requirements. Applicants will be considered on aptitude and commitment, following initial advice and guidance.

Level 1 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 2, including English and maths or successful completion of a Foundation or Entry Level 3 qualification.

Level 2 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3, including English and maths or successful completion of a relevant Level 1 qualification. Applicants without suitable practical experience may be advised to commence study at Level 1. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.





This course is designed to provide students with comprehensive knowledge and provide a foundation for practical skills required within plumbing, electrical installation, and the wider building service trades. Due to the scope of the associated content and the nature of the construction industry, this course is delivered using a blend of workshop-based practical sessions as well as class-based theoretical sessions. Students on this course will develop the core knowledge required to potentially progress onto associated Level 2 programmes.



Entry Level 3 Course

No formal entry requirements. Applicants will be considered on aptitude and commitment, following initial advice and guidance.

Level 1 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 2, including English and maths or successful completion of a Foundation or Entry Level 3 qualification and good progress with English and maths.

Level 2 Course

A minimum of four GCSEs at grade 3, including English and maths or successful completion of a relevant Level 1 qualification. Applicants without suitable practical experience may be advised to commence study at Level 1. Students without grades 9-4 in GCSE English and maths must demostrate good attendance to English and maths lessons and must attend all GCSE exams.

All full-time courses can lead to employment as well as the routes shown.



Under 19?

No tuition fees! If you enrol on a further education full-time course before your 19th birthday or are continuing to attend a course before turning 19, there are no tuition or examination fees.

However, some courses may charge additional course costs to cover equipment, specialist clothing, etc.

Over 19?

Tuition fees will vary. But you may be eligable for free tuition. As everyone has individual circumstances the best way to work out the fees relevant to you is to call and speak to us.

Looking to study Level 3, 4, 5 or 6?

Advanced Learner Loans from the UK Government can cover your course fees providing your course qualifies.

Transport

If you are aged between 16 and 18 you may be eligible to purchase a travel pass through the local council. If you live outside the county, contact your local county council for more information.

How can it help me?


At the core of the Centre is the Student Services Manager who facilitates a range of talks, lectures and activities aimed at involving the community at the College.


