

AN INTERVIEW HE WORLD WE KNOW WITH PRIME CIRCLE

Prime Circle has been a cornerstone of the South African rock scene for over two decades. What inspired the band's formation, and how has your journey evolved since Hello Crazy World?



Marco Gomes: It started with a simple goal—being a unit, a circle of friends, musicians, and

brothers. That's what kept us going. We formed in Witbank in 2000, and the past 24 years have been a wild ride.

Our brand-new album, *The World We Know*, captures everything we've learned and where we're headed. Songs like *Calling on Angels* speak to real issues, making sure we stay relatable.

What were some of the biggest challenges you faced early on, and how did you overcome them?



Finding our sound was key—moving beyond comparisons to overseas bands. There was scepticism when bringing in a new lead vocalist, but even our biggest critics now love the new album and Gavin Edwards. We kept writing, touring, and

believing in what we do. Playing new songs live is always nerve-wracking, but that's part of the thrill. We are so blessed and do not take for granted that we are still performing to sold-out venues despite the big change in our line-up.

Are there any songs or albums that hold a special place in your hearts?



Marco Gomes:

Opening for +Live+ during their *Birds of Prey* tour was a game-

changer, and performing Hello at that show was a defining moment. Better Days marked a new chapter with Gavin, making it a standout for us at this stage of the band.



How has the South African music industry shaped your career, and where do you see the local rock scene heading?



Gavin Edwards:

South Africa has incredible talent.

Playing live is crucial—

you have to be road-tested to stand out. The 2000s saw an amazing scene with bands like Squeal, Just Jinger, and Springbok Nude Girls. Rock may have taken a backseat, but it's making a comeback. With major acts touring again, you can feel the hunger for great rock music.



How have your relationships as band members evolved, and what fuels your creative energy?



Songwriting is collaborative—everyone brings something to the table. The chemistry in the new line-up was so strong that what started as an EP turned into a full album. It's all about serving the song, not egos. You can have the perfect setting, but if the

energy isn't right, the music won't happen. It's about the hunger and the headspace, and we are all friends.

You've played internationally and gained global recognition. What's next for Prime Circle?



Gavin Edwards: We're focused on promoting *The World We Know*, with *Calling on Angels* as the next single—it's deeply personal, touching on struggles with addiction, anxiety, and finding strength. It's a song that is very, very close to us. It goes

into that place of despair where you feel all alone, and you have nowhere to run, no way to go. I—just in that time—realised that you can call on your angels for protection and to help you through; you can call on God. I was on my knees, praying, saying, "Please God, just take this alcohol addiction away from me." And that was the beginning of my sobriety.

And then we've got Dale, who has a journey of sobriety now, which is amazing. And I just know there are countless people out there suffering from all different things, all different addictions. You know, there's anxiety, there's depression—there's just so much. And we think we're alone. It feels like you're alone, but you're not. You know, you never are alone. If you ever feel like you are, you can always call out—call out to your angels, call out to God, call out to friends, call out to family.

We have just returned from a super successful tour in Germany, we played Portugal too, and will be doing more South African shows, and we have plans to break into the U.S. market. We're going in full throttle.



How has the rise of digital platforms changed your approach to reaching your audience?



Gavin: The downside?
The personal
connection is missing.
I miss opening a lyric

booklet, feeling the journey of an album. Streaming makes everything instant, but it's less immersive.



Marco: The upside? Our music is available worldwide at the push of a button. In the old

days, distributing albums was a logistical nightmare. Digital accessibility is great, but it also means more competition. Artists need to work harder to stand out.

What advice would you give to up-and-coming bands?



Practice. The more you rehearse, the more prepared you'll be for your big

moments. I've learned first-hand how important it is to be ready when opportunities arise. Writing together is also key—check your egos at the door and focus on what's best for the song. And stay sober.

The industry is full of distractions, but discipline, health, and a sharp mind will take you further than anything else.

How can young musicians stay authentic while navigating commercial pressures?



There's always a balance between authenticity and accessibility. John

Mayer once said you have to turn information into inspiration—understand what works for radio while staying true to yourself. Think of it like baking a cake: master the basics first, then put your own spin on it. Find that sweet spot, and you'll carve out a unique space in the industry.

An Interview With

ANTON BOTHA



Anton Botha: Thanks so much, great to be here! Things have been full steam ahead. I've been focusing a lot on corporate entertainment over the past few years, and it's become a very exciting part of what I do. We've been fortunate to create some unique productions that are tailor-made for each company's mission and vibe — everything from intimate events to large-scale shows with dancers, aerialists, and acrobats. But despite all that, live performances on stage will always be the ultimate. Give me a stage and I'll be there!



Proaudio MusicGear: That's amazing. You've been a household name for a while now, but many people might not know how early you started. Take us back a bit.

Anton Botha: I was lucky to have incredible opportunities even back in primary school. I shared the stage with legends like Coenie de Villiers, Anneli van Rooyen, and Randall Wicomb. Then in 2003, I was selected as one of the finalists for ATKV Crescendo, which opened a lot of doors. From there, everything just grew — a SAMA nomination in 2008, a Ghoema nomination in 2016, and golden awards for my work on "Country Kersfees" and "Country Konings." It's been a wild but beautiful journey.

Proaudio MusicGear: And it seems like songwriting has also played a big part in your success.

Anton Botha: Definitely. I love writing songs just as much as performing them. Over the years I've written for artists like Juanita du Plessis, Wynand Strydom, Thys die Bosveldklong, and Izak Davel — it's really special seeing your lyrics take on new life in someone else's voice.

Proaudio MusicGear:

What can fans look forward to musically? Any new projects or music coming soon? Anton Botha: I've been spending a lot of time in studio lately. I'm working on some amazing collaborations and also revisiting a few classic cover songs — but with a fresh take. I'm planning to release a few new tracks within the next two months.

There's a definite move towards more original material, which I'm really excited about. The goal is to capture where I'm at musically right now while still tipping the hat to the sounds that shaped me.



Proaudio MusicGear: And what about 2025? Any big plans you can share?

Anton Botha: Absolutely! We're planning a series of tours along the coast and across the country — really trying to take the music to all corners of South Africa. It's about reconnecting with audiences in a big way. There's also more in the pipeline with BluEyesRecords — we're pushing boundaries with what corporate entertainment can look and sound like.

Proaudio MusicGear: Let's talk gear — we know you're quite the tone purist. What are you playing right now?

Anton Botha: Ah, gear talk — my favourite! I'm all about tone and I really love chasing those iconic sounds I grew up with. Mark Knopfler from Dire Straits has always been a big influence, and for me, nothing quite gets that tone like a Gibson Les Paul. I've been deep-diving into the Les Paul Standard vs.

Traditional debate — it's a tough call!
Both have their strengths, but honestly,
I don't mind a heavier guitar if it inspires
me to make it sing.

That said, the Epiphone range has really impressed me too. It's got the look, feel, and sound that makes it ideal for beginners and working musicians alike. It's a killer option as a road guitar — reliable, versatile, and still delivers the goods.

Proaudio MusicGear: Sounds like you're always experimenting with your setup. Is there a specific tone or setup that's your go-to?

Anton Botha: Yes, definitely. I love the sound with the pickup selector in the middle position, and I roll the volume down just a little on the neck pickup — that gives me a sweet, balanced tone that's both vintage and modern. It works across genres and fits perfectly into my style.

Proaudio MusicGear: You've had your music reviewed in top magazines and featured on TV shows — from *Jukebox* to *Kwela*. How do you keep things fresh after so many years in the industry?

Anton Botha: I think it comes down to passion. Music has always been more than just a job for me — it's a calling. And the audience keeps me going. Every show is different, every crowd brings a new energy. I like to keep things spontaneous on stage — I'll take requests, improvise, even compose something on the spot. That keeps the fire burning.

Proaudio MusicGear: What can people expect from an Anton Botha performance?

Anton Botha: Entertainment for everyone. I want people to walk away feeling like they were part of something real — not just a gig, but a memory. I bring in a lot of 80s influences, especially from artists like Dire Straits, and blend it with Afrikaans pop, rock, and whatever the moment calls for. No two shows are the same — and that's the magic of it.

Proaudio MusicGear: Final question — what keeps you motivated after all these years?

Anton Botha: The love of music, plain and simple. And the fact that music has the power to connect people, to heal, to uplift. That's a responsibility I take seriously. As long as there are people to play for, I'll keep doing what I do.



1. Prep Your Work Area

Find a clean, flat surface with good lighting. Lay down a soft towel or guitar mat to protect your instrument.

2. Start with the Fretboard

Using the **Premium Fretboard Conditioner**, apply a small amount to one of the included polishing cloths. Rub gently into the wood (avoid applying on maple fretboards unless specified safe). Using the **Restorative Finish Cream**, apply a small amount to the second polishing cloth. Gently rub the cream onto the body in circular motions, following the grain of the wood. Buff lightly until the finish starts to shine, revealing a refreshed look that retains the instrument's aged personality.

5. Final Touch-Up

Use the dry cloth to wipe down the entire instrument, removing any leftover product or smudges.

Step back and admire your revitalized guitar.
