### Rely Yosimar Maradiaga the great

### Well-known presenter, media journalist.

riginally from Cecaguaca, Santa Barbara but raised in Siguate-peque with 34 years of age, married, father of a family, journalist and lecturer, founder of Luma productions talked exclusively with Roatan Today.

We know him as the storyteller of one of the most important sports programs in Honduras, with more than 20 years of experience in the national media.

He describes himself as a dreamer, a lifelong learner, an inspirer who can help others to fight for what they believe in. He is the son of Elba, a housewife, and Juan Ramón, a humble patrolman. The eldest of four siblings, the first of a home where luxuries were lacking, but love was in abundance.

But if he had to keep one last definition, he considers himself a son of God, which for him is the most important thing.

He was born in Ceguaca, Santa Barbara. Where his maternal family is from, while his father is from Ilama, Santa Barbara. I am a pate pluma by birth.

The communicator Maradiaga said that he has lived his whole life in Siguatepeque. And he expressed the following "I always say that I have a house to spare because I consider myself from both places. I love both Ceguaca and Siguatepeque equally".

His passion for the media was born when he was an 11-year-old boy. His father always encouraged him to become a journalist because he was the first to identify that Maradiaga had a talent, a fluency in public speaking.

At that time his father gave him a book called "Mil y una historias de Radio Venceremos", which was a Salvadoran radio station. That book marked his life in a way that is difficult to explain.

In addition to that, when he was in sixth grade he visited the local radio station in Siguatepeque. Between the book and that magical visit, seeing the announcers in action, he knew that he wanted to dedicate his whole life to communications

It is a blessing to live for what you love. During the interview, he told us that he founded his own video production company, called Luma, which has allowed him to meet clients, companies and brands that have given him a world beyond soccer.

And now he is experiencing a new facet, the one he has been doing for 6 years for free and working more. And this new stage fills his heart.

Home of the need to have a more direct contact with people. Television is magic, but it has the barrier of the screen.

He grew up admiring great speakers and for a long time I prepared myself to try to fill the hearts of an audience for an hour and that this would be useful for their lives.



The following authorities were present at the event.



# The international law firm Villela Villela shares with you the requirements to register Hondurans born abroad

As a legal firm we want to present to you the requirements to register your children born abroad to a Honduran father and mother or only one of the parents born in the country.

any Hondurans when residing in other countries worry about their immigration status or are unaware that their children can be registered in their country of origin, in this case, we are referring to Honduras.

As a law firm, we want to present you with the requirements to register your

children born abroad of a Honduran father and mother or only one of the parents born in the country. Attorney Skarleth Castellanos of the international law firm Villela tells us what the requirements must be presented for Hondurans born abroad.

#### Birth Registration of Hondurans Born Abroad

To register a Honduran born abroad

the legal professional will make a written request to the general secretary of the National Registry of Persons in Tegucigalpa, which must be accompanied by the following documents: Power of Attorney

Birth Certificate of the Honduran father or mother.

Photocopy of the passport if one of the parents is a foreigner.

Foreign birth certificate of the Honduran citizen born abroad, duly apostilled by the country of origin and certified by the Secretary of Foreign Affairs in Tegucigalpa.

If the foreign birth certificate is in another language it must be translated into Spanish.

Once the application is admitted, the process takes from 3 to 4 months, and in certain occasions this term can be extended up to 6 months. When the administrative resolution is obtained, it is sent ex officio to the Civil Registry of the municipality that was established at the time of the request, who upon receiving it will proceed with the registration of the petitioner, thus concluding the process.

Another important information that we want to share with you are the requirements that you must present at the moment of making a death registration out of the established time.

### Registration of Death outside the time established by the RNP

As established by the Law of the National Registry of Persons in article 68, the term to register a death is 6 months from the date of death, after this term the registration must be done by means of a replacement for omission through a request made by a legal professional, which must be presented before the civil officer of the National Registry of Persons of the corresponding municipality.

### The application must be accompanied by the following documents:

Proof that the death is not registered; Proof of the administrator or person in charge of the cemetery where the deceased was buried.

Proof issued by the hospital where the death occurred or the report issued by the Public Prosecutor's Office.

# Karla Arzu, the Garifuna who empowers her traditional entrepreneurship

Karla Arzu is a multifaceted woman of Garifuna origin with experience in teaching and traditional entrepreneur with the artisan bakery Doña Bella.

he defines herself as a blessed, empowered and resilient woman. Because she has had to face many situations in life. Since she was a little girl, at the age of 7 years old, she accompanied her mother to sell coconut bread, we walked from the Rivera point to the municipal warehouse of San Pedro Sula.

By the age of 10, she was not only walking, but also carrying coconut bread with her mother.

In 2004 at the Jose Trinidad Reyes Institute while she was studying her first career in hospitality and tourism, I carried a basket of coconut breads and at recess time I sold them, this happened until 2006 which was the year I graduated.

In 2012 at the National Pedagogical University Francisco Morazán I took breads to sell, but only by order.

During the pandemic I implemented to sell coconut breads by order and then make the delivery in the colony that is in the Jucutuma Corridor.

I created a Facebook page called Panes de coco "DoñaBella" which allowed me not only to reach the Sampedrana population but also to reach different cities in the country and outside of Honduras. Now I sell the breads online, they ask me and at the time of delivery we do it in a place of mutual agreement.

Currently the bakery is still standing and has a team that consists of her mo-



ther, brother, sister-in-law and herself. The breads they offer to the general public are the traditional coconut bread, pineapple empanadas, coconut tablet empanadas, and poleada de leche empanadas.

One of the things Karla Arzú enjoys

sharing with her family is reading the bible. She sees herself as a successful person, and likes to be a support for others and I would love to continue preaching the word of God.

My message to entrepreneurs is to keep fighting to create new opportunities.

In 2008, the University Board of Directors, within the framework of the Fourth University Reform, restructured the University Center for General Studies (CUEG) to form the Faculty of Social Sciences where the School of Communication Sciences to which it belongs is currently developed. the career of journalism.

"It is no longer climate change, it is


"It is no longer climate change, it is a climate emergency that we are experiencing", was the reflection of the Chilean speaker, Jorge Moller. During the event, authorities from the

It is important to mention that CITE has rooms for coworking and business meetings, where young people will have access to 3D printers, computers with smart monitors, interactive screens, virtual reality glasses, and tablets, among others.
