The town of Virginia in the Free State took centre stage this week as the SOLA Group officially commissioned the 195 MW Springbok Solar Power Plant, a groundbreaking renewable energy facility that not only strengthens South Africa's energy transition but also promises lasting social and economic benefits for the Matihabeng region.

The event, attended by corporate leaders, government representatives, and media, celebrated Africa's first operational multi-buyer solar wheeling project, which allows multiple companies to source clean power from a single solar facility through the national grid. The project marks a historic milestone in South Africa's journey towards energy security and sustainability.

Delivered ahead of schedule, the Springbok Solar Power Project, valued at R3 billion, is now fully operational. The plant will generate over 430,000 MWh of clean electricity annually, enough to power approximately 150,000 homes and offset nearly 400,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions every year.

According to Katherine Persson, Managing Director of Assets at SOLA Group, the Springbok project represents the culmination of years of vision, collaboration, and community partnership.

"This project was first initiated four years ago, and today we stand proud to see it fully

operational," Persson said at the official opening. "It's a project of many firsts - the fastest we've ever delivered, completed ahead of schedule, and the first to bring so many partners together under one innovative energy model. We also take great pride in the relationships we've built through our community liaison projects and in achieving the highest number of women employed onsite, with 26% of our workforce being female. That's something truly worth celebrating.

Jonathan Skeen, Managing Director at SOLA Group, echoed his sentiment, describing the plant as "a blueprint for the future of largescale private energy in South Africa," showcasing how renewable energy can be delivered "reliably, flexibly, and at scale."

Beyond its contribution to the national grid, the project has already made a tangible difference in the Virginia community. To date, SOLA has invested over R375 million in local economic development and employment initiatives. More than 500 residents were employed during construction, with nearly half of them being youth and over a quarter

In partnership with the Matjhabeng Municipality, SOLA has rolled out several community upliftment programmes designed to leave a lasting legacy.

Through the Sports Against Crime initiative, local schools in Virginia and Welkom participate in youth tournaments that promote teamwork, health, and resilience while steering young people away from negative influences

Another standout success is the Sewing and Fashion Programme, which equipped 47 unemployed learners in 2024 with formal qualifications and their own sewing machines, enabling them to start small businesses or find employment in the textile industry.

Thabi Mohoboko, SOLA Group's Stakeholder Engagement Facilitator, said the company's approach to empowerment extended far beyond job creation.

"This project truly reached into the heart of our communities. We made sure young people from Wards 4 to 9 were given opportunities to work and gain experience. We also partnered with the nearby correctional facility to employ rehabilitated offenders, giving them a second chance to rebuild their lives with dignity.'

Local contractor and businesswoman Esther Mphore commended SOLA Group for its dedication to genuine community development.

"As someone who has worked closely with the project, I've seen the real difference it has made," she said. "From supporting small local businesses to training young people and women, SOLA didn't just build a power plant; they helped build a stronger community.

The Springbok Solar Power Plant is supported

by a robust lineup of corporate off-takers, including Amazon, Sibanye-Stillwater, Sasol, Vodacom, Old Mutual, Redefine, Afrimat, Rio Tinto, and BRM Brands. Together, they form the backbone of South Africa's new era of private renewable power.

The project was financed by leading South African banks, including RMB, Investec, ABSA, Revego, and Ubuzwe. Additionally, the project was constructed in partnership with WBHO.

Sibanye-Stillwater CEO Richard Stewart hailed the milestone as part of the company's broader 600 MW renewable energy strategy, saying it represents "another tangible step toward carbon neutrality by 2040."

Looking ahead, SOLA is preparing to expand its impact in the region with the upcoming Naos 1 and Nyala solar and storage projects, planned for Viljoenskroon and Welkom. Together, they will add 770 MW of solar power and more than 1.5 GWh of battery energy storage, solidifying the Free State's role at the heart of South Africa's renewable revolution.

With Virginia now home to the continent's first multi-buyer solar wheeling facility, the Free State has become a symbol of innovation and progress. The project serves as proof that renewable energy development can go hand in hand with local empowerment, lighting up homes, powering industries, and building a more sustainable future for generations to come.

SPOTTING FRAUD BEFORE IT'S TOO LATE



As we head into the last stretch of the year, many households are preparing for school holidays, family gatherings, travel plans, and the early stages of festive season shopping. In addition to an increase in day-to-day spending, this unfortunately also means more opportunities for fraudsters to target unsuspecting individuals.

"As we enter the final months of the year, it's important for individuals to remain alert to scams and fraudulent activity. Fraudsters know that this is a time when people are more relaxed, distracted, or busy with family plans, making them more vulnerable to scams. Protecting yourself comes down to awareness, caution, and using the secure tools your bank provides," says Dhashni Naidoo, Consumer Education Programme Manager at FNB.

Why this time of year matters

According to the South African Banking Risk Information Centre (SABRIC), digital banking fraud incidents more than doubled from 31,612 cases in 2023 to 64,000 in 2024, with financial losses exceeding R1.4 billion. While it isn't December yet, transaction volumes are already on the rise as families prepare for Black Friday, holidays, school breaks, and upcoming events. Fraudsters know this, and they use the increased pace of life and our moments of distraction to their advantage.

Naidoo also stresses that education and awareness are your best defences. "The more you understand how scams work, the less likely you are to be caught off guard. It's about building simple but consistent habits that make it harder for fraudsters to succeed. Small, everyday habits like always verifying text messages, links, or calls through your bank's official channels can go a long way in keeping your finances safe."

How scammers use social engineering to sneak in:

FNB's Head of Card Transact, Industry and Fraud Detection Chris Boxall says fraud has become more than just card skimming or stolen details. It's about criminals inserting themselves into your daily life, through social engineering, especially when you're already juggling bigger financial commitments.

Social engineering refers to the act of psychologically manipulating victims into performing actions or divulging confidential information. And, when scammers use this strategy, the trickery often begins with something that feels normal: a routine-looking SMS, a WhatsApp alert, or even a phone call from someone claiming to be from your bank.

Fraudsters use these otherwise ordinary platforms to manipulate unsuspecting members of the public into giving them unauthorised access to bank accounts, money, and other important assets. They often achieve this through tactics like:

•Phishing: emails disguised as communication from your bank or South African Revenue Service (SARS), often promising tax refunds

•Vishing: calls where imposters pose as

bank staff and pressure you for sensitive information

•Smishing also known as Messaging scams: on WhatsApp or SMS that push urgent links or payment requests

•Quishing: scams using QR codes that redirect to fake websites

More than 63% of cases reported by SABRIC involved the stealing of personal information through emails, fake websites, social media or text messages (phishing), or through phone calls or voice messages (vishing), or other related scams.

"Scammers are becoming increasingly sophisticated in the ways in which they execute social engineering. From phishing and vishing to fake WhatsApp messages and suspicious texts, they exploit our trust, our busy schedules, and even our sense of urgency or panic," adds Boxall.

Boxall warns that tax season adds another risk. "Fraudsters know many South Africans are expecting communication from the South African Revenue Service (SARS) about returns or funds. They use this to send out convincing emails or SMSes with fake links. Always double check using official SARS or bank channels."

Practical ways to protect yourself

FNB encourages consumers to combine vigilance, education and awareness, and smart banking habits with secure tools:

•Pause before you act: If a message or call

feels rushed or suspicious, stop and think about your next move.

•Verify directly: Contact FNB through the official number which is 087 575 9444 or the FNB Banking App instead of responding to unsolicited requests.

•Protect sensitive data: Never share PINs, passwords, or OTPs, no matter who asks. And remember that legitimate FNB staff will never, under any circumstances, ever ask you for this information.

•Bank with extra layers of safety: The FNB Virtual Card offers added protection for online purchases because it has a dynamic CVV, it's temporary, merchant-specific, and can be locked immediately after use.

•Stay informed in real-time: Turn on Smart Alerts in the FNB Banking App so you can receive instant updates on your transactions.

"Awareness is your first line of defence against fraud" says Boxall. "And, with a combination of vigilance and the right tools, you can keep yourself safe from fraudsters."

"The more informed you are about how scams work, the better equipped you are to stop them before they start. As a bank, we believe that helping our customers by empowering them with knowledge is just as important as providing secure banking tools. Yes, an FNB Virtual Card or our Smart Alerts can give you peace of mind. But the real difference comes when you make fraud awareness part of your everyday routine. LEGAL CORNER



A legal guide to comprehending property sales following the death of a seller

Introduction:

A legally enforceable contract is formed when a person signs an Offer to Purchase (OTP) to sell their property. When the seller dies after the OTP is signed but before the property transfer is recorded at the Deeds Office, it is a common cause for concern. The main legal rule guiding this situation is that a lawful contract is not always nullified by the death of a party. The estate of the deceased inherits the rights and responsibilities outlined in the OTP. The estate "steps into the shoes" of the deceased seller and is obligated to uphold the conditions of the sale agreement through the representation of a legally designated executor.

As long as the OTP was properly completed, this guarantees the protection of a buyer's rights and the fulfilment of the deceased's contractual obligations. However, the process is subject to the deceased estate's administration, which adds certain steps and possible delays.

The legal system: Functions and protocols

The primary function of the executor The Master of the High Court must be notified of the seller's estate upon their passing. Letters of Executorship, the formal instrument granting the executor authority, are then issued by the Master to designate an executor. Only this executor has the legal right to manage the estate's assets and liabilities and to act on its behalf. Only the executor, not the heirs, is recognised by the court as the estate's representative, according to case law. The executor's main responsibility is to manage the estate in accordance with the law, which includes upholding the deceased's

legitimate contracts.

Procedures for completing the transfer Authority and appointment: The official appointment of the executor is the first stage. No one is permitted to lawfully sign transfer documents on behalf of the deceased's estate in the absence of letters of execution.

Following the OTP: The executor must carry out the sale in accordance with the OTP's instructions. As the representative of the estate, they will sign the required transfer forms.

Administration of the Estate: All estate obligations must be paid off by the executor before the property can be transferred. This entails securing clearance certificates for rates and taxes from the nearby municipality and making certain that all other debts are settled.

The buyer has legal options if an executor wilfully delays or refuses to honour a legitimate OTP. The buyer may request a court order requiring the executor to fulfil their end of the bargain. When disagreements or needless delays impede the process, this kind of action is usually the last option.

Important lessons learnt:

A contract remains what it is: If the seller dies, a legitimate Offer to Purchase (OTP) remains valid. The seller's estate is nonetheless bound by the terms of the agreement. The executor needs to take action: The executor "steps into the shoes" of the seller and is required to honour the OTP and carry out the property transfer after being chosen by the Master of the High Court to oversee the deceased's estate. Anticipate delays: Compared to a typical

transaction, the transfer process is probably going to take longer. The property cannot be transferred to the buyer's name until the executor has been properly appointed and all estate debts have been paid.

Conclusion:


The sale of a property does not end if the seller passes away after signing an OTP. The agreement is still enforceable against the estate of the deceased. The designated executor is required by law to complete the

transfer, including signing paperwork and paying off estate debts. The buyer's right to take possession of the property is protected, even though the estate administration procedures may cause delays in the process.

For the procedure to go well and guarantee that the deceased's last intentions, as stated in the sale agreement, are honoured, there must be clear communication between the buyer, the executor, and the conveyancer.






