DEAR COMMUNITY,

In 2016, a group of Palestinian and Syrian youth took the initiative to respond to the arrival of Syrian refugees to San Diego, and my family was among them. Together, we began coordinating services as well as recreational, educational, and social programs.

These efforts led to the official opening of the center in 2018 with a celebration, during which we recited poetry, danced our folkloric dance "dabka," and enjoyed authentic food. We gave an overview of the center's mission to offer various free services to families, immigrants and new refugees from Arab countries, particularly Syria, Palestine, and Iraq.

Five years later, we have made great stride in overcoming many of the difficulties we initially faced. The center's direct support and impact has gained the love and constant support of the people.

At the Majdal Center, we are dedicated to improving the socioeconomic, environmental, and health conditions of the community. Our mission is to have a voice in San Diego County so that we can achieve justice and dignity for our communities.

Your ongoing presence and support makes our efforts immensely fulfilling, and we are deeply grateful.

Our youth leadership council is a space for high-school and college-aged youth to develop leadership skills and build community.

The group leads monthly educational, social, and cultural events while participating in active campaigns.

In 2022, the group grew to 12 core members and planned 8 youth events with participation ranging from 20 to 100 youth and their family members!

YOUTH MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

We launched the second round of our mentorship program for newcomer youth in partnership with License to Freedom.

We offered one-to-one support to **10 young women** to further their personal, professional, and academic growth through college visits, resume-writing, and more.

Our goal is to support them with navigating the challenges of their new lives as resettled refugees.

BOYS SOCCER PROGRAM

We launched a new boys soccer program! Our program is led by Sulaiman who coordinates soccer practices on a weekly basis at a local park. We have 15 team members and growing, with ages ranging from 13 to 18.

DIRECT SERVICES





HEALTH ACCESS

We support community members navigate the healthcare system by helping them identify affordable and appropriate medical care, schedule appointments, and translation. Since the pandemic, we have supported access to COVID-19 information, testing, and vaccination.

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

The majority of new refugees in the U.S. rely on income from public assistance programs. We support with applications and case management for food stamp programs, MediCal, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS), unemployment (EDD), the Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI), and more.

HOUSING

We support community members access rental assistance, subsidized housing through Section 8, and low-income housing programs. We also advocate for tenants' rights through education and mediation.

OUR IMPACT IN NUMBERS





12 WORKSHOPS

In 2022, we co-hosted or attended **12 educational workshops** on topics including COVID-19, banking, tenants' rights, taxes, resumewriting, and student financial aid.

65 WOMEN

We supported an estimated **65 individual women** gain access to employment, domestic violence resources and legal support.

350+ HOUSEHOLDS

We served an average of **60** community members per week across over **350 households**. Our team members, Doaa and Mohammed, take appointments, phone calls, and walk-ins to deliver one-on-one support to community members.

5,100+ INDIVIDUALS

Our digital reach extends to over **5,100 individuals** through our communication channels including email lists, Facebook, Instagram, and WhatsApp.

CITIZENSHIP READINESS COURSE

In March 2022, we launched a Citizenship Readiness Course to support community members' preparation for their naturalization exams and interviews.

Our course instructor, Toma Gabriel, leads two classes per week in person at the center and virtually by Zoom.

With nearly **150 participants** registered, citizenship readiness is a key need among the community.

At least **30 participants** successfully passed their citizenship exam!





Citizenship provides the following safeguards for refugees:

- Protection from deportation
- ♦ Citizenship for children under 18
- Family Reunification
- ◆ Freedom to Travel
- ◆ Right to Vote
- Employment Opportunities

COMMUNITY FORUMS & NEEDS ASSESSMENT

We hosted a two-part community forum with **28 participants**. During the first meeting, community members shared their main challenges since arriving to San Diego as refugees.

During the second meeting, we generated community-driven solutions to these issues and identified potential leaders.

In addition, we conducted **110 needs-assessment surveys** by phone to shape our services, programs, and campaigns.

The community forums generated 5 key issue areas:

- Language barriers
- Lack of transportation
- Cultural & social integration
- Housing access
- Insufficient public services

HISTORY RESEARCH PROJECT

We partnered with a course on "Race and Oral History" at the University of California San Diego (UCSD). We paired students with 11 community leaders to conduct interviews about the history of Arab migration to El Cajon and the history of the Majdal Center.


