Vestiaire Dorcas

I just want to share with you some of the activities that have been happening at the Bouchtouche Seventh-day Adventist Company. We started a little community center that is called the Vestiaire Dorcas. We meet every Thursday from 10am-2pm and sometimes even later. We have a drop box in front of the church and people in our community bring clothing, household items and once in a while they even donated furniture. Then, we ask around searching if there is anyone who has a need for such items. It is all by word of mouth and people come and they are very happy.

We have our regulars that come every week for their hugs and love, some of them share with us their concerns and their joy. We are blessed that the Lord provided this place for us. Vestiaire Dorcas operates from the basement level of our church. We also give out our books and bibles. God is truly blessing this place. We get to listen to people who come to us and we pray with those who are hurting, and God is blessing this ministry. They are very happy to have such a place as this. They are happy to leave with someone saying to them, "Don't

forget Jesus loves you, and we do too," or, "God bless your day" or, "God is good, all the time!"

During the holidays, we had gathered about 17 boxes of food for families that were in need. They were happy and felt that we really cared for and loved them. There is no charge for the clothes and everything else that we give out. Word is spreading around about us in the communities all around Bouctouche. We have many newcomers that come to us also...anybody who is in need.

A miracle happened on January 22, 2024. The building next door to us caught on fire. There was a Dixie Lee restaurant and a flower shop, and everything burned down to the ground. We had many firemen from all around, even coming from Moncton. Our building was just a driveway away from the building that was on fire, and it was spared. We were fortunate because the wind had shifted the other way, and the smoke went the other way. We were able to have bible study in our building the next day, which was Tuesday. The tenants of the building that was burnt down were all saved, but they all lost their belongings. However,



God is good because He spared their lives. The restaurant on the other side is still closed due to the smell of the smoke, but our community center was not affected at all.

In total we are four volunteers, Rose Marie Cormier, Denise Desjardin, Lynn and Lucille. We work very well together in unity and love. Starting January 31, 2024, Denise will be doing a four week cooking class. We will meet every 2 weeks. We are inviting people from the Vestiaire Dorcas to come. Katherine Walsh had come in the Fall of 2023 to do some presentations on health, and we had 15 people present.

To sum things up, at the Vestiaire Dorcas people get free clothing, household items, free prayer and they get to share their experience. The receive strength and hope, free books and bibles, free hugs of course (hugs not drugs). Hugs and the love of Jesus is medicine to the heart. Most of all people receive free blessings from the Lord...thank you Jesus!

ADRA Project-Free Pantry

Yarmouth Seventh-day Adventist Church

This spring the Yarmouth Church requested funds from ADRA to build a the pantries. Free Pantry for the town. Acts of Kindness had already had one built in the south end of town and we thought it would be good to add another one. The idea of the pantries is that anyone who wants to can donate food to the pantries and anyone who needs food can take what they need from them. These two pantries both have a refrigerator in them so that they can be stocked with perishable food items.

Jerry Muise built the pantry for us and did a very professional job. Nathan Hamilton and other church members moved the large pantry to the spot that Acts of Kindness had arranged for it. The Acadia First *Nations* gave permission to put it on the reserve property where they allowed it to be hooked up to their electricity source. It is on a main road and anyone who wants to can "take what you NEED, leave what you CAN". We are pleased to be able to work with the band and AoK to benefit the people in the town who need help.

Since it was put on site, we have used ADRA funds to keep putting in healthy food items and others have been donating to it as well. The food does not stay there long because many people are in need. We anticipate that in the fall many people will donate fresh produce from their gardens.

Acts of Kindness is instrumental in getting many other smaller pantries built (without a refrigerator and a quarter of the size) throughout the county. The last number that I heard was 12 with plans to have at least 6 more! Some of these are in front of churches who help to maintain

I would suggest that other churches consider making use of ADRA funds to build such a pantry in their community. It doesn't have to be large and could be a big help to those who need food. The ADRA logo is on one end and the Yarmouth Seventh-day Adventist Church logo is on the other side. This lets the community know that we care enough to help.
