

Calendula Marigold

Calendula Marigold (also known as pot marigold) is different from the regular Marigold flowers that typically grow in a garden. For one thing, these annual flowers differ vastly in appearance. Marigolds have shorter, compact petals and thinner leaves. Calendula flowers feature longer petals and rounder, wider leaves. Although both plants are part of the daisy family, calendulas look more like daisies.

The bible is loaded with "recipes" for healing. God personally instructed how to make anointing oil, right down to the core ingredients and portions. I'm certain that the Holy Spirit had inspired many a physician in coming up with the types of herbs and preparations to treat many kinds of sickness in those days as well. It's no different today. The Native American Indians and the ancient Chinese have been using natural remedies to treat and even cure many kinds of ailments for thousands of years.

Needless to say, in today's world of prescription medicine (which at times may be necessary,) we have lost our original contact with the natural remedies that God has given us. Let's just start with calendula:

- It's packed with anti-oxidants. Antioxidants are beneficial compounds that neutralize the harmful effects of oxidative stress in your body. Calendula extract possesses several potent antioxidants, including triterpenes, flavonoids, polyphenols, and carotenoids.
- 2. Treats wound and skin ulcer healing. In a 12-week study in 57 people, 72% of those treated with calendula extract experienced complete healing of venous leg ulcers, compared with 32% in the control group.
- 3. Combats certain cancer cells. Calendula's antioxidant content may provide anti-tumor effects. Test-tube studies suggest that calendula's flavonoid and triterpene antioxidants may fight leukemia, melanoma, colon, and pancreatic cancer cells. Research indicates that the extract activates proteins that kill cancer cells while simultaneously blocking other proteins that would otherwise interfere with cell death.
- 4. Anti-fungal and Anti-microbial. Calendula extract is known for its antifungal and antimicrobial properties. Notably, in one test-tube study, oil from calendula flowers proved effective against 23 strains of Candida yeast a common fungus that can cause oral, vaginal, and skin infections.
- 5. Improves skin health. Calendula extract is widely utilized in cosmetics, including creams and ointments. Both test-tube and human studies show that calendula extract may enhance skin hydration and stimulate its firmness and elasticity, which may delay signs of aging. These effects are likely due to its antioxidant content, which may reduce skin damage caused by oxidative stress.

I am currently growing calendula and will make infused oils and salves when the plants have reached maturity.

Where We Stand

I wanted to give a deeper explanation of where the church currently stands in the balance as God is weighing all things within His Courts (you can find more in the February monthly Newsletter). We each know that God has given us positions within His Kingdom to occupy. It is through our positions within God's Kingdom and Courtroom that the enemy will be thoroughly and utterly defeated. However, at this moment, there is a greater Court case going on that goes beyond our ability to officiate within the Court room. Instead, we are in a place where we must rely heavily on Jesus our Mediator while we walk this last phase of proving out.

The hallmark Courtroom scripture of Zechariah 3 depicts a court case that was centered around Israel's high priest of the hour, Joshua. As you read it you, will see that Joshua said nothing during the case. Instead, the Lord Himself spoke and used those around him to minister to him, including Zechariah the prophet.

We are in a similar place right now where it is not our officiating within the Courts that is going to advance us personally, but it is the decisions we make in our daily lives that are going to qualify us in the eyes of God's Courts. Many things within the courts have been whittled down to the point of us needing to "prove it", much like the proving of Job and the sifting of Peter.

Job 1:9-11, BSB Satan answered the LORD, "Does Job fear God for nothing? 10Have You not placed a hedge on every side around him and his household and all that he owns? You have blessed the work of his hands, and his possessions have increased in the land. 11Butstretch out Your hand and strike all that he has, and he will surely curse You to Your face."

Luke 22:31, BSB Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift each of you like wheat

The word sift here means to prove by trial. So, each of us are in a "prove it" stage in certain parts of our walk. God has been working to throw out the enemy's cases, but God can only do this as we prove our faithfulness to God. Behind the scenes, this is working to build a powerful testimony. When we couple the story of our faithfulness to God with His overwhelming faithfulness to us, we have an ironclad testimony that is the basis for proving our right to officiate weightier matters within the Courts. Remember that all of your testing and trials are proving you so that you may be propelled to higher heights within the Kingdom.

Revelation 12: 10 -11, ESV For the accuser of our brothers has been thrown down—he who accuses them day and night before our God. 11 They have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony. And they did not love their lives so as to shy away from death.



The Strength of Humility: Knowing Where You Are At... Part 2

As we continue on learning about the Strength of Humility, today we will look at "knowing where you are at" in Christ.

Let us Look at Adam & Eve.

"And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool [afternoon breeze] of the day, so the man and his wife hid and kept themselves hidden from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. But the Lord God called to Adam, and said to him, "Where are you?" He said, "I heard the sound of You [walking] in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid myself."" Genesis 3: 8 –10 {AMP}

Knowing where you are at is key to understanding your relationship with God. Our eyes should always be on God and not ourselves. This is difficult to achieve but not impossible. As you mature in Christ, this should become a part of your daily maintenance to do list. One should consistently evaluate where you are at in relationship to God. Are you close to His heart or are you starting to drift away from His heart? We can be easily distracted with life. You must never assume that you are close to God. This is dangerous and can open the doorway for complacency to make you take your relationship with God for granted.

We see in verse 10 that Adams focus was shifted away from his relationship with God and changed to Adam looking at himself. Adam's view had shifted from looking for God to Adam looking at his own condition. This can be tricky. We need to know our condition, but we cannot let that knowledge of our condition keep us from looking for God. A lack of humility will cause you to misjudge your relationship with God. A lack of humility will cause you to put yourself in a place or position in God that you have not been given. The key to humility is acknowledging where you are at for the purpose of not walking in self-deception.

We can be deceived by other people, and we can deceive ourselves into thinking that we are something that we are not. People do not want to embrace this possibility, but this is truth. God asked Adam where he was at for the purpose of teaching Adam to realize that something was wrong with their relationship in this moment. We need to understand that there are going to be moments in our relationship with God that things will be wrong. When this occurs, we need to be open for God to teach us and show us what that is so we can continue on in our relationship with Him by fixing the problem. This knowledge about us being wrong shouldn't pull us away from God. It should create within us a greater sense and need to be closer to God.

In my recent studies pertaining to the Fear of the Lord, the word "understanding" appeared several times. For instance, Proverbs 2:1-6 reads, "My son, if you receive my words and treasure up my commandments with you, making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding; yes, if you call out for insight and raise your voice for understanding, if you seek it like silver and search for it as for hidden treasures, then you will understand the fear of the Lordand find the knowledge of God." Proverbs 111:10 reads, "The fear of the Lordis the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding. His praise endures forever!"

I think we underestimate the blessings behind gaining understanding. The definition for understanding means: the ability to understand something; comprehension. One word sticks out more than the other in this definition. Your first thought could be the word "comprehension" as it were for me. When reading once more, I found the word "ability" to stand out even more! The word ability is similar to a skill or a talent that one may carry. Another word for ability is "mastery". Mastery is comprehensive knowledge or skill in a subject or accomplishment.

If you think of this from a perspective of everyone not carrying this skill or talent, you will come to understand why scriptures would suggest for us to cry out for it, to seek after it.

Proverbs 18:2-A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only

in expressing his opinion.

knowledge and understanding;


Truth... God desires to give us everything we need to farewell in this life. Understanding plays a role. Jesus came to give us understanding and why?

Happiness in Humility (Part 19)

2nd Corinthians 12:9-10 tells us, "Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. Therefore, I take pleasure in infirmities: for when I am weak then am I strong."

When God called Paul, He had given him some really great revelations and it would have been easy for him to think that he was extra special or needed to be acknowledged as special, but God had thought ahead and had given him a thorn in the flesh to keep him humble. Paul's first desire was to have the thorn removed, he even asked to have it removed from him 3 times. The answer that came to him was that the trial was a blessing; that in the weakness and humiliation it brought, the grace and the strength of the Lord could be better manifested. This gave Paul a new insight to his trial, instead of simply enduring it, he glorified in it, and he did it with gladness.

Instead of asking to be delivered from it, he took pleasure in it. Paul had learned that the place of humiliation is the place of blessing, of power and of joy. Pretty every Christian being passes through these two stages in his pursuit of humility.

First of all, they will fear and flee and seek deliverance from all that God sends to humble them. That is because they have not learned to seek humility at any cost. They may accept the command to be humble and seek to obey it, but utterly fails. Even when we want to be humbled, in the secret parts of our heart we want to be kept from the things that will make him humble.

In his pursuit of it, there is still a sense of burden and bondage. He has not yet become the spontaneous expression of a life and a nature that is essentially humble. It has not yet become his joy and only pleasure. He has not yet reached the point where he says, "Most gladly do I glory in weakness; I take pleasure in whatever humbles me." We should hope for the day that this is the case. We should choose humility as our highest blessings.

Paul faced the very real possibility of exalting himself, he didn't understand perfectly what it was to be nothing, to die, that Christ alone might live in him and to take pleasure in all that brought him low. We must fully conform to the Lord in that self-emptying where he glorified in weakness so that God might be all. We need to realize that the highest holiness is the deepest humility.

Ask yourself, "Do I take pleasure as Paul did, in trials, in necessities and in distresses?" or are you so free from self that whatever is said about you or done to you, is lost and swallowed up in the thought that Jesus is all. This is where He wants us to be. Let us trust Him who took charge of Paul to take charge of us too. For He watches over us with a jealous, loving care, "lest we exalt ourselves."

OVER-THE-COUNTER MEDICATIONS TO USE WITH A COLD

Home sick with a cold, sore throat or cough? There is no cure but there are plenty of OTC remedies that pledge to help you feel better. Since they are over-the-counter, you don't need a prescription. Use this guide to find the right one for the symptoms you have.

STUFFY NOSE AND SNEEZING

- * Antihistamines blocks a chemical that makes your nose fill up and run. May work better when combined with a decongestant. Some antihistamines can make you drowsier than others, so be aware of the side effects. You might not get tired at all but you will be even more sedated if you drink alcohol with this medicine. Take precautions and be safe about driving or operating machinery.
- *<u>Decongestants</u> shrinks swollen blood vessels in the nose to relieve congestion. They come in pill form or nasal spray. They have the opposite side effect of antihistamines they can make you jittery. Avoid taking them within a few hours before bed or you might have trouble falling asleep. If you have high blood pressure, ask your doctor if it's okay to use a decongestant. Also, don't use a decongestant spray for more than 3 days in a row. Doing so can make your stuffed nose come back.

COUGH

- * Antitussives a/k/a cough suppressants block the cough reflex by decreasing activity in part of the brain that causes coughing. Brand names are Robitussin Cough and Triaminic Cold and Cough.
- *Expectorants works to thin mucus, which can in turn help your cough move mucus out, clearing your airway. Brand names are Mucinex and Robitussin Chest Congestion

ACHES AND FEVER

* Acetaminophen – relieves headaches and may also help open a stuffy nose. It's in many cough and cold products as well as in other medicines. Read all the labels and be sure to follow the dosing instructions carefully so you don't accidentally take too much.

Aspirin and Ibuprofen - good for aches and pains. If you take a blood-thinning drug, check with your doctor before you take aspirin. **DO NOT** give aspirin to children. It can raise their risk for a rare but serious disease called Reye syndrome.

SORE THROAT

- * <u>Ibuprofen</u>, <u>acetaminophen</u> and <u>aspirin</u> can ease the pain of a sore throat.
- * <u>Lozenges</u> by sucking on a lozenge, your saliva helps release the active ingredients, helping to soothe and lubricate the throat.
- * Throat sprays offers instant relief by numbing the throat with such ingredients as benzocaine, menthol or eucalyptus.

The Courtroom – Your Blood- Part 2 – Blood Speaks of Generational and Ancestral – Blessings and Curses

(Proverbs 14:22) (More on this to come)

So, as we first started, I grabbed my pen and paper and began to write little outlines and notes on different things that God has been showing through His Word, from others, and from His revelation on what some things we can do and allow a complete cleansing work to begin. This went on for a few months and continues.

As my blood was put on the witness stand, things that were revealed were put to trial and dealt with right there. Sometimes, things happen so fast that you can't keep up. The main thing is that you can use the voice of your blood to confess things wrong with your body, your family line, curses, and blessings you could be walking under. You can use everything from test results to Prophetic Words and personal agreements and commitments you have made with God. The important thing is to ALWAYS have the Holy Spirit to lead you.

Let's begin with the first things on the outline of things that I was to have my blood testify and be a witness to:

- 1. Speak of Generational and Ancestral blessings and curses
- o To use against all generational attachments including sickness, sin, punishments, curses, etc... 1 Peter 1:18-19-18 For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your ancestors, 19 but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect.
- o You can also use this later to claim the blessings of your ancestors and generation through this courtroom session. Genesis 9:12, Genesis 17:7, Exodus 3:15, 2 Kings 10:30, Psalm 22:30; Psalm 49:11 Continue next week.
