Which Shore Excursions Are Right for You?

Choose the tours that interest you by using the icons as a general guide to the level of activity involved, and select the tours best suited to your physical capabilities. These icons will help you to interpret this brochure.



Moderate Activity: Requires intermittent effort throughout, including walking medium distances over uneven surfaces and/or steps.

Strenuous Activity: Requires active participation, walking long distances over uneven and steep terrain or on steps. In certain instances, paddling or other non-walking activity is required and guests must be able to participate without discomfort or difficulty breathing.

Panoramic Tours: Specially designed for guests who enjoy a slower pace, these tourss offer sightseeing mainly from the transportation vehicle, with few or no stops, and no mandatory disembarkation from the vehicle during the tour. As vehicles outside the United States are rarely lift-equipped and ramps are seldom available, a very small amount of walking will be necessary. The pace is gentle and taking your time is encouraged.

Limited Capacity: The number of people able to participate in this tour is strictly limited. Reasons for limiting capacity may include the number of transportation seats available, or the need to maintain a safe ratio of guides for hikes, fishing and water activities. Tours require a minimum number of participants in order to operate.

Snack: This tour includes a small snack or tasting of local specialties. The snack is not a meal.

Meal: This tour includes a meal—lunch on daytime tours, dinner on evening tours.

Frequently Asked Questions

What should I wear?

Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for all shore excursions. When you visit places of worship, we recommend dressing conservatively (no shorts or sleeveless tops), but casual clothing is perfectly acceptable. Dress in layers and have a jacket along. Bring an umbrella or raincoat, a hat and sunscreen.

What about meals?

Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. In-room dining is available on board.

How will I know what time each tour departs?

The on-board Shore Excurions Order Form in your stateroom will show departure times. This information will also be printed on your shore excursions tickets, which you will receive on board. Approximate tour departure times are posted on our website at hollandamerica.com.

I am traveling with friends. Can we be accommodated on the same motorcoach?

The departure location for each tour is printed on

your shore excursions tickets. If you wish to travel with friends, please arrive at the designated meeting place together. This will enable the staff to allocate space for you on the same vehicle.

To allow our Shore Excursions Managers flexibility to coordinate your time in port with meals and activities on the ship, exact departure times are published in the Shore Excursions Order Form on board. I have a disability. How do I know which tours will best suit me?


The tours are graded according to the relative level of activity they entail. The activity icons that appear at the beginning of each tour description provide a general idea of the level of activity to expect. Please see page 1 for specific information or speak to a Shore Excursions specialist (1.888.425.9376). It is important to keep in mind that tour operators are subject to the laws of their own country with respect to accommodating the needs of guests with disabilities. In most foreign countries, the laws are not as stringent as those in the United States.

Will I encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship when it's in port?

Please see the on-board Shore Excursions staff to help determine whether you can expect to encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship in a particular port of call. The decision whether or not to carry or provide other mobility assistance to a guest and their device (wheelchair, walker, etc.) up or down a ship's gangway, or on or off a tender boat, is at the sole discretion of the Captain, made based on his evaluation of guest and crew safety. We encourage you to bring a collapsible wheelchair as space limitations may restrict the ability of some tour operators to accommodate motorized mobility aid devices.

Isafjordur, **Iceland - Sunday**, **June 15**, 2025: This busy fishing port runs to sizable shipyards as well as shrimp and fish factories—all ready to handle the catch of the day from the icy waters of the Denmark Strait. Perfect jumping-off place for hiking, biking and kayaking.

Arctic Foxes & Avalanches



Departs: 9:00 AM, 12:30 PM Approximately 3 Hours Adult \$189.95; Child \$129.95

Learn about the Arctic fox while visiting the charming and quaint village of **Súðavík** (pronounced Soothaveek). The drive from the pier in Ísafjörður to Súðavík village is a scenic one, with majestic snow-white and graystriped mountains set against the sky and the ever-changing ocean below.

Súðavík, founded in the 19th century, has only 200 inhabitants.

Visit the **Arctic Fox Center** -- a non-profit research center and museum dedicated to the only native terrestrial mammal in Iceland. The museum focuses on the biology and natural history of the Arctic fox as well as the social history of Iceland in relation to it. Enjoy **coffee and refreshments** in the lovely café.

Listen to a traditional **Icelandic music program** at the local **church**. The church was originally built in Hesteyri -- a village that was later abandoned. Several decades later, the church was moved to its current location despite vehement protests from the former villagers of Hesteyri.

Continue your drive to the **Langeyri Peninsula**. Two whaling stations that used to be located here provided work for more than

a hundred people. Little remains of this industry today except for a few old whalebones dotted along the coast.

Before heading back to Ísafjörður and the ship, you'll stop briefly on the shores of the fjord to visit the **avalanche memorial**, honoring those killed when the Old Town was hit by a massive avalanche (1995).

Notes: Dress warmly in layers with a windproof and waterproof outer layer; bring a warm hat, gloves and a scarf. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. Due to Ísafjörður's remoteness and the scarcity of professional guides, all guiding is handled by locals; some are not professional, but all have great experience in guiding and extensive knowledge of the area. Parents traveling with children under the age of 3 must rent a child's car seat from the tour operator; please see the Shore Excursions team on board. You cannot use your child's car seat from home in Iceland.

Dynjandi Waterfall: A Taste of the Westfjords



Departs: 9:30 AM Approximately 5 Hours Adult \$369.95; Child \$239.95

In a land blessed with thousands of waterfalls, it is indeed a privilege to visit the one that many Icelanders claim is the most beautiful of all. **Dynjandi Falls** is your destination today.

From Ísafjorður, you'll set out on a panoramic drive through the breathtaking scenery of the Westfjords area. The route takes you across an unforgiving landscape of jagged mountain ridges and narrow passes. The coast is lined with steep slopes and deep fjords, where farms and villages huddle together on narrow strips of land that reluctantly yield a living for the hardy souls that tend them. Take advantage of a number of scenic photo opportunities along the way.

The Dynjandi Waterfall itself features a tall upper cascade and tiered terraces, ending with a free-fall into the pool below. Your guide will lead you on a **walk** up to the falls for a closer view.

Next, acquaint yourself with beautiful **Suðureyri village** -- a destination that feels like you have it all to yourself. In Suðureyri, it's all about fish. This is your chance to hear about life on the cusp of the Arctic Circle and to see for yourself how this thriving community processes Iceland's ocean bounty. Enjoy a taste of fresh fish while listening to local stories. Learn how Iceland's first-class export produce can be on your dinner plate in North America just 36 hours after leaving the icy-cold Atlantic Ocean. It might also surprise you to hear that sustainability is king here -- this small, forward-thinking village has an eye on the future at all times.

Notes:

Due to Ísafjörður's remoteness and the scarcity of professional guides, all guiding is handled by locals; some are not professional, but all have great experience in guiding and extensive knowledge of the area. Approximate distance covered on foot is one mile. Terrain includes paved flat surfaces with some inclines and a few steps, as well as a few gravel paths and uneven surfaces. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair or for those with mobility limitations. Dress warmly in layers with a windproof and waterproof outer layer; bring a warm hat, gloves and a scarf. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. Parents traveling with children under the age of 3 must rent a child's car seat from the tour operator; please see the Shore Excursions team on board. You cannot use your child's car seat from home in Iceland.

Fjords & Flowers



Departs: 11:30 AM Approximately 3 Hours Adult \$189.95: Child \$169.95

Driving among the mountains of Ísafjördur affords an excellent view of the harsh local landscape, where narrow passes cross sharp mountain ridges, deep fjords shelter farms and villages clinging to narrow strips of land.

Visit **Skrúður**, the first Icelandic botanic garden, founded in 1909. This small garden is

the brainchild of the former minister and principal of Núpur, the cultivation pioneer of Iceland. He grew plants and vegetables that nobody ever dreamed could germinate so far north or in such a rugged landscape and harsh climate.

You'll drive to **Flateyri** village, formed around the shark-fishing industry in the mid-19th century. Leave the transportation and step inside a charming small church, quite typical of Iceland. Listen to an Icelandic music program; then, stroll with your guide down the small main street of Flateyri. Pause for a **coffee break** with homemade refreshments.

Visit the old **bookstore** and the merchant's home, where an exhibit explains Flateyri's history.

Notes:

Due to Ísafjörður's remoteness and the scarcity of professional guides, all guiding is handled by locals; some are not professional, but all have great experience in guiding and extensive knowledge of the area. Flowers may not be in full bloom in May or September. Dress warmly in layers with a windproof and waterproof outer layer; bring a warm hat, gloves and a scarf. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. Terrain includes gravel paths and uneven surfaces. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair. Suitable for guests with mobility limitations with a companion to assist. Parents traveling with children under the age of 3 must rent a child's car seat from the tour operator; please see the Shore Excursions team on board. You cannot use your child's car seat from home in Iceland.

Hesteyri & Glacier Fjord Cruise

Departs: 8:30 AM Approximately 4½ Hours Adult \$239.95; Child \$169.95

Visit the **abandoned village of Hesteyri**, reached only by a 70-minute **boat ride**.

The landscape in **Jökulfirdir Fjord** is very beautiful, with impressive, steep, snow-flecked mountains and quiet, secluded coves. In the late 1940s, all 80 inhabitants of Hesteyri village decided to move away. At the time, they were living without telephones, electricity or roads. By 1952, the village was completely abandoned.

Stroll through the village with your guide, enjoying **traditional Icelandic refreshments** at the old doctor's house. You will feel the distinctly eerie atmosphere of this unusual place where time has stood still.

Renowned Icelandic crime and thriller author Yrsa Sigurðardóttir wrote a fantastic ghost story, *Ég Man Þig* (I Remember You), whose plot takes place on Hesteyri Island. The story was recently made into a movie filmed on location here during the winter.

Notes:

Due to Ísafjörður's remoteness and the scarcity of professional guides, all guiding is handled by locals; some are not professional, but all have great experience in guiding and extensive knowledge of the area. Dress warmly in layers with a windproof and waterproof outer layer; bring a warm hat,

gloves and a scarf. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. Walking is required on gravel paths and uneven surfaces. You will transfer from the boat to a smaller inflatable boat to land at Hesteyri. Participants must be physically fit. There is a 200-yard walk from the ship to where the tour boat is docked. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair. The boat is not wheelchair accessible. Suitable for guests with mobility limitations with a companion to assist. The boat does not have restrooms. The boat portion of the tour is unguided.

Isafjardardjup Bay

Departs: 9:00 AM Approximately 4 Hours Price \$449.95

Embark on a **scenic panoramic drive** from Ísafjörður to uncover the natural wonders of Ísafjarðardjúp Bay -- a remote corner of Iceland with towering mountains and thriving wildlife.

From the **Kambsnes Viewpoint**, spectacular panoramas of the bay and Vigur Island dominate the foreground, with the snow-covered Snæfjallaströnd Peninsula lurking in the distance.

Keep an eye out for Möngufoss Waterfall, a hidden gem nestled amid uninhabited wilderness.

Cape Hvítanes is home to a colony of charming harbor seals. Watch as these playful creatures frolic along the rocky beach, providing a delightful spectacle for wildlife enthusiasts.

Further along the coast, quaint **Litlibær Farm** is like a time capsule. Step inside the tiny **turf-roofed house** built in 1895 and inhabited until 1969 -- a slice of Icelandic rural life. Indulge in typical **Icelandic waffles**, renowned as some of the best in the country, as you relish the rustic charm of this historic homestead.

Back in Ísafjörður, visit the **Arctic Fox Center** to delve into the world of Iceland's only native land mammal and meet these captivating creatures up close.

Notes: Wildlife sightings are likely but not guaranteed. Minimum age is 6 years.

It's A Viking Thing



Departs: 8:30 AM, Noon Approximately 3 Hours Adult \$319.95; Child \$179.95

This blast from the past is your invitation to step back in time and learn about Viking ways and how the hardy Norse people lived off the land.

Your journey begins with a panoramic drive from Isafjordur to the old **Viking village of Thingeyri**. Walk through a recreated Viking area, learning about what is fact and what is fiction in the many stories you've heard about the famous Vikings. A short hike brings you to the old ruins of the Viking meeting place called a *Thing* -- the closest translation in English is 'parliament.'

Step inside the **interactive Viking Museum** for a chance to dress up in authentic hand-sewn Viking clothing, take photographs, bake your

own Viking bread, and explore the museum - all part of learning more about Viking ways.

After your Viking experience, head back to Isafjörður.

Notes:

Terrain includes mainly paved flat surfaces, with some inclines and a few steps, along with a few gravel paths and uneven surfaces. Tour requires walking approximately one mile. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair or for those with mobility limitations. Dress warmly in layers with a windproof and waterproof outer layer; bring a warm hat, gloves and a scarf. Wear sturdy, closed-toe, non-skid walking shoes. Due to Ísafjörður's remoteness and the scarcity of professional guides, all guiding is handled by locals; some are not professional, but all have great experience in guiding and extensive knowledge of the area. Parents traveling with children under the age of 3 must rent a child's car seat from the tour operator; please see the tour staff on board.

Life & Culture of Isafjordur



From Isafjörður harbor, you will head through the town center with a stop at the Osvör **19th-century fisherman's hut**, restored in 1988.

Drive through Bolungarvík village and back to Isafjörður with views of the magnificent

mountains and Westfjord -- a beautiful but sometimes harsh landscape.

You will also see the Buná Tunguá River and the waterfall in Tunguskogur and taste fresh mountain water that flows down the stream. What could be more clear or more refreshing?

Finally, see the Maritime Museum of Isafjörður, housed in one of the town's oldest buildings (1780). At the museum, you'll have the opportunity to sample dry fish and shark to complete your Westfjords experience.

Notes:

Approximately 50 steps must be negotiated at the Osvör Museum. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. Due to Ísafjörður's remoteness and the scarcity of professional guides, all guiding is handled by locals; some are not professional, but all have great experience in guiding and extensive knowledge of the area. Parents traveling with children under the age of 3 must rent a child's car seat from the tour operator; please see the Shore Excursions team on board. You cannot use your child's car seat from home in Iceland.

Off the Beaten Track: Cruise to Vigur Bird Island



Departs: 12:30 PM Approximately 3 Hours Adult \$269.95; Child \$179.95

Cruise by boat to **Djupfjord**, where **Vigur** Island offers a wealth of **magnificent bird life**, including puffins, eider ducks and Arctic terns. The only windmill in the country, almost 160 years old, is still maintained on the island. The farmers here live off the land and by harvesting the down of eider ducks.

Vigur village is a time warp. Its ten friendly inhabitants welcome you in their relaxed, easy manner. A leisurely walk around the island allows you to see an abundance of birds in their natural habitat during the high season.

The tour ends conveniently at the **Vigur Café** and post office shop for **home-baked refreshments** before free time to enjoy the historical and wildlife exhibits.

Notes:

Dress warmly in layers with a windproof and waterproof outer layer; bring a warm hat, gloves and a scarf. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. About an hour of walking is required for this tour on gravel paths and uneven surfaces. There is also a 200-yard walk from the ship to where the tour boat is docked. The boat is not wheelchair accessible. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair or for those with mobility limitations. Participants must be able to step onto the boat and up to the island from the dock. Most bird species start migrating away from Vigur

around August 10. Wildlife sightings are likely but are not guaranteed. The boat ride is unguided. There is no restroom on the boat. Due to Ísafjörður's remoteness and the scarcity of professional guides, all guiding is handled by locals; some are not professional, but all have great experience in guiding and extensive knowledge of the area.

Sudureyri: A Taste of the Westfjords



Departs: 8:30 AM, Noon Approximately 3 Hours Adult \$159.95; Child \$99.95

Visit the beautiful village of **Suðureyri**, where it's all about fish all the time. This is your chance to hear about life at the edge of the Arctic Circle and to see for yourself how this thriving community processes Iceland's ocean bounty.

Enjoy a **taste of fresh seafood** as you listen to local stories. Learn how Iceland's first-class export produce can be on your dinner plate in North America just 36 hours after leaving the icy-cold Atlantic Ocean. It might also surprise you to hear that sustainability is king here -- this small, forward-thinking village has an eye on the future at all times.

Notes:

Wear comfortable walking shoes. Terrain includes mainly paved flat surfaces but with some inclines and a few steps, as well as a few gravel paths and uneven surfaces. Tour requires a walk of approximately one mile. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair or for those with mobility limitations. Dress

warmly in layers with a windproof and waterproof outer layer; bring a warm hat, gloves and a scarf. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. The fish-processing plant may or may not be operating during your visit. Due to Ísafjörður's remoteness and the scarcity of professional guides, all guiding is handled by locals; some are not professional, but all have great experience in guiding and extensive knowledge of the area. Parents traveling with children under the age of 3 must rent a child's car seat from the tour operator; please see the Shore Excursions team on board. You cannot use your child's car seat from home in Iceland.

Surf & Turf in Isafjordur



Departs: 8:30 AM, Noon 3½ Hours Adult \$249.95: Child \$179.95

A glorious **panoramic drive** takes you along Isafjörður -- the largest fjord in Iceland -- for fantastic views of the stunning Westfjords

region and some great photo opportunities. In this coastal setting, you may be lucky enough to spot some friendly seals lollygagging about in their natural habitat.

You're headed to the small Litlibær turf farm -- an opportunity to learn how Icelandic farmers lived in the early 1900s -- often a struggle in this harsh environment. Look inside the preserved farm buildings, churn fresh cream into butter, and then taste it on traditional Icelandic flatbread. Explore the farm and enjoy refreshments of coffee with an Icelandic waffle and homemade jam.

On your way back to Ísafjörður, stop by the

Hvítanes seal-watching platform. You'll also find ruins of the old fishermen's huts dating back to the 19th and early 20th centuries.

Pause at Kambnes Viewpoint for a 360° view of the mountains in Isafjörður -- the longest fjord in Iceland.

The Back Streets of Isafjordur

On your walk, you may encounter the barber playing his accordion, the baker training for a marathon, or the goldsmith paddling his kayak offshore. Many famous and unusual people have made their homes here.

Snap a photo of some of the local landmarks - including the fishermen's monument -- and peer into the windows of the local shops.

Step inside the Maritime Museum (at your own expense) to form an impression of how different life was in Iceland just a century ago.

You can also try some well-known Icelandic delicacies, such as dried fish and Brennivín.

Walk back to the ship on your own, or guests wishing to stay in town to shop or explore independently are welcome to do so but must make their own way back to the ship.

Continuing with the descent, you will pass through the ski area in Tungudalur, after which transportation will be waiting to return you to Ísafjörður.

Cruise along the beautiful Snaefjallaströnd (Snow Mountain Coast), watching for whales in the icy water. Seals and dolphins often pop their heads up to say hello, too. Isafjardardjup is known for its rich bird life. Chances are high that you will spot puffins on the water.

Walk back to the ship afterward.

A three-hour cruise on a **traditional wooden fishing boat** introduces you to the magnificent nature and wildlife of **Skjálfandi Bay** -- a chance to observe whales and dolphins, puffins and other seabirds in their natural habitat. You will **circle Lundey Island (Puffin Island)** - home to about 100,000 puffins during their breeding season. Watch for massive flocks of these and other birds nesting on the shore. The puffins arrive in mid-April every year and stay until the end of August. Around 60% of the world's puffins breed in Iceland -- you're in the right place to see these comical characters.

Husavík is one of the best places in the world to see the **minke whale**. Normally quite timid creatures, here, they've been known to approach boats and surface right alongside, often appearing to take as much interest in people as we do in them. Boisterous white-beaked dolphins and harbor porpoises frequent these waters, and sometimes humpback and other large whales are spotted also.

During Operation Archery, Allied forces attacked the German unit at Måløy on Christmas day of 1941. The Måløy Raid Museum depicts the story of Operation Archery, using a combination of interpretive materials and audio guidance to ensure visitors have the best experience of the museum and its exhibits. Located in the center of Måløy, the facility is comprised of three floors, including a bunker built by the Germans. Original pictures from the raid and original film footage tell a vivid story that will intrigue and inform history buffs.

The Moster Amphitheatre in Bømlo is a historical jewel, marking the site where Christianity first took root in Norway during the Viking era. Step back in time about a thousand years back when you explore the permanent exhibit here entitled From Paganism to Christianity, simply called "the Viking Exhibition" by many.

The site is anchored by the **Moster Old Church** -- one of Norway's earliest churches.
It features a detailed museum that chronicles the region's history from the Dark Ages to the medieval period, showcasing artifacts and exhibits that narrate a storied tradition of faith.

Embrace the adventure as the RIB boat speeds across the fjord. Keep your camera ready for scenic views and potential wildlife encounters.

Ride will be bumpy; guests who are pregnant and those with a back or neck condition are not allowed to participate. Minimum age is 12 years. Maximum weight is 265 lbs. Lifejackets and floatation suits are provided and must be worn.

Stord Mountains Hike & the Sherpa Steps



Departs: 9:15 AM, 11:45 AM Approximately 3½ Hours Adult \$149.95; Child \$119.95

On a scenic minibus drive from Leirvik to Heio, relax and take in the beautiful landscapes. At the trailhead, start your ascent and, as you climb, you'll experience a range of landscapes -- from dense forest to open moorland. The views of the fjords, valleys, and mountains are awe-inspiring and perfect for photo stops along the way.

One of the most thrilling parts of this hike is the **Sherpa Steps** -- a series of well-built stone steps that guide you safely through a steeper section of the trail. Take your time and enjoy the craftsmanship and the spectacular vantage points as you climb. At the top, take in panoramic views of the Sunnhordland region, the North Sea, and the surrounding peaks of the Stord Mountains. On clear days, the views stretch endlessly, making the effort worthwhile.

Notes:

Terrain includes even and uneven surfaces. stones, steep inclines, gravel, many steps, and an elevation gain of 1640 feet (500 m). Please realistically assess your physical fitness and ability prior to booking; best suited for those with a good level of fitness and some previous hiking experience. Stord's Industrial Heritage & Mining Museum

Explore the industrial past of Stord at the Mining Museum at Litlabø. This museum serves as a vivid tribute to the miners' lives and labor, offering an up-close view of Norway's industrial heritage.

Watch a **short film** from 1960, when the mine

was in production, depicting the life of the mine workers and how the mine operated. Then, step back in time with a **train ride** about 200 yards into the depths of the old mine and a further **walk** of about 250 yards to explore the challenging conditions the miners faced. See the spectacular **pyrites mine** and learn how it was run.

The **Visitor Center** explains the geological setting and helps you to understand the community shaped by the miners' toil. It is a journey into the legacy of the hardworking people who helped build the nation.

Wander about the mine area afterward -- it is pretty and inviting.

Notes:

Tour requires around one hour of walking. Terrain includes even and uneven surfaces, inclines, gravel, grass, and steps. A safety jacket and helmet are provided for the mine tunnel visit and must be worn.

The Hulder Boulder & Rocking Beer Tasting

Head to **Port Steingard** for an important mission -- beer tasting at the PS Brygge Café, located next to the ELØ microbrewery.

Your **beer-tasting session** includes five types of beer from ELØ, along with a glass of the incredibly pure drinking water of Fitjar. Non-alcoholic tasting can be provided.

Leirvik, Norway - Thursday, June 19, 2025

A light **lunch** is served -- a selection of seafood specialties prepared using traditional methods and served with focaccia and whole wheat bread.

Hear the **myth of the Hulder** -- a female creature in Norwegian folklore whose gorgeous good looks are marred, sadly, by the cow's tail sticking out from beneath her skirt. Questions? Ask your guide, who has all of the indisputably factual answers.

Shop for products from the Fitjar Islands and a soap producer based in Kråko. Check out the Hulder Boulder, the stunning surroundings, and the pretty architecture before returning to Leirvik by coach.

Notes:

Non-alcoholic beverages are available as an alternative. Gluten-free bread available upon prior request. Other menu substitutions are not available.

Valleys, Coastline & Brandasund Fishing Hamlet



Departs: 8:45 AM, 11:15 AM, 1:45 PM Approximately 2½ Hours Adult \$99.95; Child \$79.95

Travel by coach to the **fishing hamlet of Brandasund**, showcasing western Norway's outstanding landscapes.

Journey through living postcards as the route winds through the island scenery of Bømlo's northwest side, with highlights including crossing multiple bridges that offer

panoramic views of the varied terrain.

In Brandasund, the scene transforms from lush valleys to the rugged beauty of Norway's coastline. Explore this charming village that reflects the region's maritime heritage. Wander along the quay and visit the local store. Breathe in fresh sea air on this soulenriching scenic odyssey.

Notes:

Tour requires a short uphill walk from the bus parking area to reach the local store. Tour consists mainly of sightseeing from the transportation.

Rotterdam, The Netherlands - Saturday, June 21, 2025: Often called the gateway to Europe, the port city of Rotterdam is full of old-world charm. The harbor offers amazing views and a maze of wharves and canals, along with towering spires make for a beautiful sight. Take a stroll and duck into one of the pubs or eateries along the way.

Only three pre World War II buildings in the city center have survived and are worth a look - city hall, St. Laurence church and the White House. Explore the Museum Boymans van Beuningen, which houses a unique collection dating from the 14th century, or the Museum Voor Volkenkunde - home to ethnological exhibits. Exquisite architecture can be seen in many areas of Rotterdam, most notably in the Delfshaven quarter of the city - where 18th century houses are on display. For a laugh, check out Kijk-Kubus, an upside-down house.

Amsterdam Highlights & Canal Boat with Airport Transfer

Amazing **Amsterdam** has always had strong ties to the water. Spread out over 70 islands, this cosmopolitan city and capital of the Netherlands boasts 60 miles of canals and 1,000 bridges. As early as the 13th century, tiny ships sailed from this port into the challenging Zuider Sea.

Amsterdam was the birthplace of the Hanseatic League and gained renown in the 15th century when it became a major trading center, steadily assuming commercial leadership and thus controlling the country's finances. This trend remains to this day. Future-oriented and steeped in history, Amsterdam is most famous for its narrow, gabled houses lining the canals.

After a transfer by coach to the city center of Amsterdam, you will board a glass-topped

canal boat and enjoy a one-hour cruise through Amsterdam's canals.

Finally, your coach will take you to Schiphol Airport in time for your flight.

Notes:

This tour is available only to guests whose cruise ends in Rotterdam, with flights departing after 3pm. Tour does not operate on holidays. If you have already purchased an airport transfer with your cruise booking, a refund for the transfer will be processed on board the ship, as this excursion automatically includes a transfer.

Easy Rotterdam with Airport transfer

Board a motorcoach for a panoramic drive past Rotterdam's creative and modern architectural highlights. Watch for the brilliant white Weena office/apartment block in the business sector and for the Café Rotterdam, Schouwburgplein and Kop van Zuid.

You'll see Coolsingel -- the main street of the central area of Rotterdam on the right bank of the River Maas. At the near end of this wide street stands the Town Hall (Stadhuis), built between 1914 and 1920 in Dutch-Renaissance style. Catch a good view of the 607-foot-tall Euromast tower as you travel.

The city center also boasts pre-war architecture, such as the Van Nelle Factory -- one of the most important historic industrial buildings in the Netherlands -- and the Huis

Sonneveld.

The innovative and adventurous period of building after World War II is expressed in such structures as the Groothandelsgebouw -- one of the first major buildings built after the bombing of Rotterdam. See the Kunsthal, the Luxor Theater and the Erasmus Bridge -- the latter is an almost-abstract combination of steel and concrete.

Take advantage of a photo stop at the Cube Houses, designed by Piet Blom in the '70s as a post-modern village. The complex is a visual treat that challenges architectural norms and makes you tilt your head!

Set out on a brief **walk** through **Delfshaven** -- a borough of Rotterdam on the right bank of River Nieuwe Maas. Delfshaven has officially only been part of Rotterdam for a little over 100 years, yet it was from here that the Pilgrim Fathers set out on their epic journey to America in 1620. It's also the birthplace of Piet Hein -- naval commander and folk hero, mathematician, scientist, inventor and poet.

Rotterdam, The Netherlands - Saturday, June 21, 2025


Passing Euromast and Westerkade, you will stop at **Veerhaven** for a great view of the Hotel New York. As the centerpiece of the city's renovated docklands, this trendy hotel is housed in the Art Deco-style former headquarters of Holland America Line.

End your tour with a **transfer to Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport** in time for your flight.

Notes:

This option is available only to guests whose cruise ends in Rotterdam, with flights departing after 4pm. Windmills of Kinderdijk with Airport Transfer



The windmills of Kinderdijk, built in the 1700s, are collectively a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The 19 windmills that remain intact today are lined up along the riverfront and were used to pump rising water to the canal and thus keep the village dry. Incidentally, the name of this charming village comes from the time of the St Elisabeth flood in 1421, when the villagers found a baby (kind) on the dike (dijk).

Walk past the windmills and look inside one of them for an up-close appreciation of how

these simple machines harness the power of the wind to work -- it is quite ingenious.

You'll have time for plenty of photos of the windmills and the countryside. **Transfer to Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport** in time for your flight.

Notes:

This tour is available only to guests whose cruise ends in Rotterdam, with flights departing Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport after 4pm. Tour does not operate on holidays.

If notice of cancellation is received after the booking deadline/cancellation date, a refund can be assured only if the ticket is resold. Guests are encouraged to pre-purchase tours. We recommend speaking with the Shore Excursions Manager on board if you have any questions about your physical ability to take part in any tour. Should you opt not to take the tour following this discussion, full reimbursement will be made provided the cancellation is made within 24 hours of boarding the ship. For Overland Adventures and Overnights, due to the in-depth nature of the adventures, most areas are not accessible to wheelchairs and require a considerable amount of activity.
