# HOCKEY **SKILLS** DEVELOPMENT

Led by renowned coach Nancy Wilson, the UNISUS Hockey Skills Program is designed to develop well-rounded, high-performance athletes through elite training, technical skill development, and a comprehensive off-ice program.

Our curriculum focuses on the key fundamentals of the game—skating, puck handling, passing, shooting, and tactical play—while integrating advanced techniques to enhance game intelligence, competitiveness, and mental resilience.

## **On-Ice Training Focus Areas:**

- **Skating** Acceleration, speed, mobility, agility, balance, quick feet, stride efficiency, controlled skating, and change of pace.
- **Passing** Precision passing, receiving, backhand control, puck protection, and touch passing.
- **Puckhandling** Smooth, controlled movements, handling in small spaces, traffic navigation, and puck protection.
- **Shooting** Power, accuracy, quick release, in-motion shooting, goal-scoring techniques, shot variety.
- Checking & Defensive Skills Body positioning, angling, gap control, finishing checks, and playing both offensive and defensive blue lines.
- **Game IQ & Thinking Skills** Anticipation, playmaking, positioning, supporting teammates, and system awareness.
- 1 vs. 1 Play Offensive deception, defensive angling, determination, and net-front battles.
- Face-Offs Strategy, tie-up techniques, winning draws, and knowing positional responsibilities.
- **Mental Toughness** Resilience, confidence, bouncing back from setbacks, and staying positive under pressure.



## **Off-Ice Development Program:**

- **Strength & Conditioning** Hockey-specific training focused on agility, speed, power, endurance, and flexibility.
- Functional Movement & Injury Prevention Enhancing athleticism while reducing the risk of injuries through targeted training techniques.
- Mental & Strategic Development Building focus, discipline, and decision-making skills to enhance in-game performance.
- **Recovery & Performance Optimization** Proper cool-down techniques, stretching, and injury prevention strategies.

# **PATHWAYS** TO COLLEGIATE ENTRANCE

## **Academic Pathways**

UNISUS integrates exceptional academics with a focused hockey skills development, ensuring student-athletes maximize their potential both on and off the ice. A strong academic foundation is critical for collegiate and university sports entrance, as hockey ability alone is not enough—only 0.02% of junior players make it as sustainable professional athletes. Our program is designed to position students for long-term success, providing the skills, education, and strategic guidance needed.

We enable students through the entire pathway to collegiate sports, including mentorship, scholarship applications, coach connections, and online profile development as they near collegiate entrance. Our program helps athletes explore career pathways beyond playing, such as team management, coaching, sports media, and health sciences. Through our guest speaker series and specialized electives, students gain exposure to industry professionals while preparing academically for their chosen future.

We offer flexible academic accelerator options, allowing them to balance rigorous training with top-tier academics all during the school day. Students can choose between earning a B.C. Dogwood Diploma or pursuing the challenging International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP).

At UNISUS, we provide a complete roadmap to academic and athletic success, ensuring every student has the tools to thrive in university and beyond.

## **Competition Pathways**

# HOCKEY PROGRAM 2025/2026 SCHEDULE



These prices reflect the 2025-2026 program costs.


