The launch on Friday 13 October, at the Anglesea Art Space saw a judging panel select their top 12-works.

Fifty-five local artists entered the calendar competition across the four categories of Child, Youth, 2D and 3D.

Cr Gary Allen said DeeDee's mixed media piece, using sea salt and sponges to create texture, was a perfect choice for the cover. "The artwork is beautiful, and so colourful. For someone in grade three I have no doubt, there are many more artworks in DeeDee's future."

Know the drill this long weekend for campfires and off road vehicles

Victorians dusting off their camping gear and turning Melbourne Cup Day into a long weekend are being urged to take care if lighting campfires as weather conditions are creating higher bushfire risk than in recent years.

Forest Fire Management Victoria, the Conservation Regulator, and Parks Victoria are asking campers heading out to state parks and forests to brush up on their campfire safety rules before they leave home. Visitors wanting to use a campfire should prepare before lighting one by:

- learning how to build and maintain a safe campfire,
- · knowing the specific rules at their campsite,
- · checking weather conditions and Fire Danger Ratings
- having quick access to at least 10 litres of watee
- all rubbish must be collected and taken home; not dumped or burned.

Off-road drivers and riders must have a valid licence and vehicle registration and stick to formed roads, and check for road or track closures before they leave home: mapshare.vic. gov.au/mapsharevic/

Visitors can brush up on camping and campfire skills through Parks Victoria's step-by-step online guides: www.parks.vic. gov.au/where-to-stay/camping-for-beginners

Authorised Officers from all three agencies will be patrolling over the long weekend.





Could you be that teacher?

Victoria raising the profile of teaching careers

The national Be That Teacher campaign is a collaboration with the Federal Government which builds on Victorian initiatives that have grown the teaching workforce by 8,000 since 2020.

It features real life teachers who encourage senior school students and Victorians looking for a career change to consider the profound rewards of teaching.

The campaign complements Victoria's own 'Teach the Future' initiative, which encourages more to consider entering the teaching profession, especially senior secondary school-age students and people considering a career change.

Latest figures show that the state Government's teacher attraction and retention initiatives have had a significant impact on the workforce with 3,000 new teachers registering in the last year alone.

The campaign encourages individuals to consider a teaching career through an online gallery showcasing inspirational and personal stories about the lasting impact teachers have on their students.

'Be That Teacher' promotes pathways, available support and details the new scholarships available to encourage people to choose teaching as a career.

Support available for Victorian Disability Self - Help groups

Dedicated groups that improve the lives of people living with disability and their families are being supported by the Victorian Government to continue their critical work.

Applications are open for a new round of Disability Self-Help Grants, supporting groups to strengthen their work to provide social, emotional and practical support to people with disability and their families or carers.

A total of more than \$265,000 is available over two years, for grants of up to \$7000 per year for up to two years.

The grants can support groups to meet the costs of general expenses, running costs and minor works and equipment. The grants are also available for use in new ways, including providing activities that celebrate pride and recognition and paying for guest speakers at events for their members.

The grants are open to all Victorian-based disability self-help groups, with a focus in this round of funding on groups supporting First Nations people, young people, women and girls, people from multiculturally diverse backgrounds, autistic and neurodiverse people and people who identify as LGBTQIA+, as well as those providing support to regional and rural members.

Winchelsea is set to establish its own Social Bridge group with an 8 week Beginners Class starting in late January 2024 at the Senior Citizens Club in Harding Street.

"Contract Bridge is the most popular card game in the world with over 100 countries members of the World Bridge Federation," said Elaine Atkinson an avid but novice Bridge player who moved here in July this year to remarry.

"I have liaised with the Geelong Bridge Club and we are fortunate to have Arthur Robbins, one of the best Bridge Players in Geelong provide the weekly two hour sessions. Arthur has represented Victoria at National competitions and his background as a Maths teacher highlights his ability to impart knowledge," continues Elaine.

The estimated number of bridge players world-wide exceeds 60 million. You can enjoy Bridge anywhere in the world, even on cruise ships and while challenging, it is lots of fun.

"I remember my grandparents going off to their local Bridge club for over 30 years. They loved the game so much they even taught the younger grandchildren to play when visiting Nan & Pa. It was their love of the game that spurred me on to learn when I retired," continues Elaine. It is a card game that is mentally challenging, offers a great retirement hobby (and something you can share with your partner) while offering lots of social interaction with people of all ages and from all walks of life.

"For mature members of our community like me, Bridge is a great way to improve memory, logical thinking and concentration so why not give me a ring on 0458009616 or email me at rs.atkinsn@gmail.com to find out more and register. This beginners class I hope will lead to the establishment of a regular social Bridge competition in Winchelsea," says Elaine

"There will be a small fee for this class but the amount won't be known until we know final numbers. At this time the 2 hour weekly session will be held either Tuesday or Thursday, afternoon or evening depending on what suits most people. I look forward to hearing from anyone interested in learning this great card game," concludes Elaine.

Stunning Baroque exhibition comes to regional Victoria

Backed by the State Government, Hamilton Gallery will host an iconic exhibition of world-famous baroque masterpieces highlighting the region's unique cultural offering.

'Emerging From Darkness: Faith, Emotion and The Body in the Baroque' will run from 8 December 2023 to 14 April 2024, supported by the Regional Events Fund. It will feature European masters Artemisia Gentileschi, Lavinia Fontana, Sofonisba Anguissola, Peter Paul Rubens, Valentin de Boulogne, Guercino and Bartolomeo Manfredi.

The collection of works comes from partnerships and loans from the National Gallery of Victoria, the National Gallery of Australia and private Australian lenders.

Baroque is considered one of the most passionate and unapologetic art movements in history, and this marks the first exhibition of its kind to show in regional Australia.

The exhibition will be complemented by a symposium, a series of expert talks, accommodation and food and wine packages, and a collector's coffee table book.

Support from the Regional Events Fund will help drive art lovers to Hamilton and the surrounding area. Since 2016, the Victorian Government's Regional Events Fund has supported more than 350 events across the state.

Victoria's container deposit scheme now open

The state Government has today launched Victoria's Container Deposit Scheme – CDS Vic, which will reduce the state's litter by up to half while putting money back in the pockets of Victorians.

People can now return their eligible drink cans, bottles and cartons for a 10-cent refund at refund points across Victoria.

The scheme will generate more than 600 jobs statewide and turn used drink containers into new, recycled products.

Reverse vending machines, depots, over-the-counter sites, and pop-up refund points will be the four ways people can return their eligible containers – and depending on the type of refund point, people can choose whether they want to receive the refund in the form of cash, a retail voucher, or an electronic refund.

Victorians can also choose to donate their refund to a charity or community organisation registered with the scheme.

The network of refund points to recycle containers will continue to grow in 2024 – making the scheme even more accessible to Victorians.

VicReturn is the Scheme Coordinator, while Zone Operators Return-It, TOMRA Cleanaway, and Visy will establish and oversee the refund points and refunds to customers, as well as ensuring proper recycling of the containers.

The operators are each responsible for the refund point network in their allocated scheme zones: north, east and west.

Within nine months of the scheme starting, the Zone Operators will be required to have a minimum of one collection point per 14,500 people in metropolitan areas, at least one per town of 750 people in regional areas, and at least one per town of 350 people in remote areas.

CDS Vic is part of the state Government's \$515 million investment to transform the state's waste and recycling system. This includes the new standardised four-stream waste and recycling system, supporting our target of diverting 80 per cent of all material away from landfill by 2030.

Winch House Treasurer's Report 2022/3

Maddy Pearce, Treasurer

Winch House is a not-for-profit organisation whose mission is to engage and deliver support to the local community.

It is a common misconception that Neighbour Houses are fully funded by either State or Local Government. The House does receive partial funding through the Vic Government Department of Families, Fairness, and Housing and Surf Coast Shire; however, this combined funding still only covers approximately 42% of the House's over all running cost which leaves a large shortfall of 58%, that must be made up from other sources.

It is a continual struggle to generate enough funds, not just to cover the basic day to day expenses of the House, which includes wages, but also to continue to run programs that support the community. That is why it is so imperative that at least some of Winch House's programs run at a profit so we can continue to support programs that don't but are needed in the community such as our Occasional Child Care service.

This year the House has secured the weekly print run for the Winchelsea Star (our local paper), this new income stream will go a long way in reducing part of the financial stress. This year the House closed with a surplus of \$1,996.87 which is a remarkable achievement.

The Shire Hall: whilst Winch House has been appointed responsibility of overseeing operation of this venue, it is a Surf Coast funded initiative and as such is run as a separate entity.



Winch House Bookkeeper's Report 2022/3

During the last financial year, it has been very pleasant to be permanently back in the office and be able to catch up with the other staff members and the people who use the House.

As the bookkeeper, I process all the finances and the wages for both the House and the Shire Hall.

Since the Shire Hall opened last year, the processing of additional wages and invoices caused an increase in my working hours, which I appreciate was recognized and addressed by the Committee.

The audit for the financial year was a fairly smooth process, more information for a few items were required.

This last year has been a difficult time for me personally, due to ill health in the family. I would like to thank Wendy for all her concern, understanding and patience during this time and for all her general help always, with everything.

Winchelsea Community House and the Shire Hall are great assets to the community of Winchelsea and the surrounding areas and it is so heartening that they are now being used by many local groups.

I hope that they continue to flourish well into the future.

Cyber Defence placement opportunities for graduates in Cert.IV in Cyber Security

The development of Victoria's next generation of cyber security experts will be fast-tracked when they are drafted to the front line of the state's cyber defence operations in the coming months.

The launch of the Cyber Defence Centre Internship Program has been announced, which will help five graduates who have completed a Certificate IV in Cyber Security to kickstart their careers.

The Cyber Defence Centre is part of the Allan Labor Government's \$34.7 million investment in the Victorian Budget 2023/24 to boost cyber security protections - supporting the state to detect and block cyber threats in real time.

The state Government supports the Certificate IV in Cyber Security course as part of its landmark Free TAFE program, which is giving Victorians access to more than 80 Free TAFE qualifications and short courses.

With an estimated one in three Australian adults affected by a cyber attack each year - there's never been a more critical time to invest in strong cyber security defences.

Starting in January, the paid internship program will give graduates a unique entry pathway to build high-demand skills and gain experience, working with cyber security experts leading the state's response to cyber security risks.

Graduates will complete a five-month placement in one of three streams:

- 1. technology, digital forensics and incident response,
- 2. threat intelligence, and data analysis.
- Cyber security graduates are an important resource in the fight against cybercrime and graduates seeking a career opportunity with purpose are encouraged to apply for a position in the inaugural program.



Applications for grants are now open to help establish, expand, or improve Men's Sheds, as part of a \$1 million investment by the State Government. Grants of up to \$100,000 will support communities across the state.

Men's Sheds provide a place for men to come together and build friendships and support networks. They improve the health and wellbeing of members by reducing social isolation and promoting social inclusion. Shedders get to share their skills, learn new ones, and make new friends in their local area.

They also help to support local communities including schools, emergency services like the CFA, and through donations of handmade goods to local charities.

The last round of grants funded the construction of 8 new Sheds and the renovation of 21 others in Colac-Otway, Swan Hill, Baw Baw, the Mornington Peninsula and Echuca.

The grants program also helps successful applicants upgrade premises, and refurbish facilities, to make them more accessible and inclusive for people with disability.

There are currently more than 360 Men's Sheds across Victoria, each contributing great value to their local community and the people who attend them.

Doctors in Secondary Schools program delivers for students

Student health and wellbeing in Victorian schools is getting more support than ever with the Doctors in Secondary Schools program hitting a significant milestone. The initiative has delivered more than 72,000 consultations across Victoria to students since it began operating in 2017.

The state Government has provided \$113.5 million since 2016 to roll the program out across 100 government secondary schools in areas experiencing disadvantage and vulnerability.

The program makes primary health care more accessible to students, helping young people identify and address health problems early, also reducing the pressure of health care access and costs on families.

Adolescents have some of the lowest GP attendance rates nation-wide, with many missing out on vital healthcare due to difficulties in accessing services – especially those socially disadvantaged or living in regional areas.

Mental health has been identified as the primary reason for visits to the GP through the program, making up 47 per cent of consultations since 2017.

The delivery of primary health care to students through the Doctors in Secondary Schools program enables mental health care plans to be developed and referrals made to support services.


