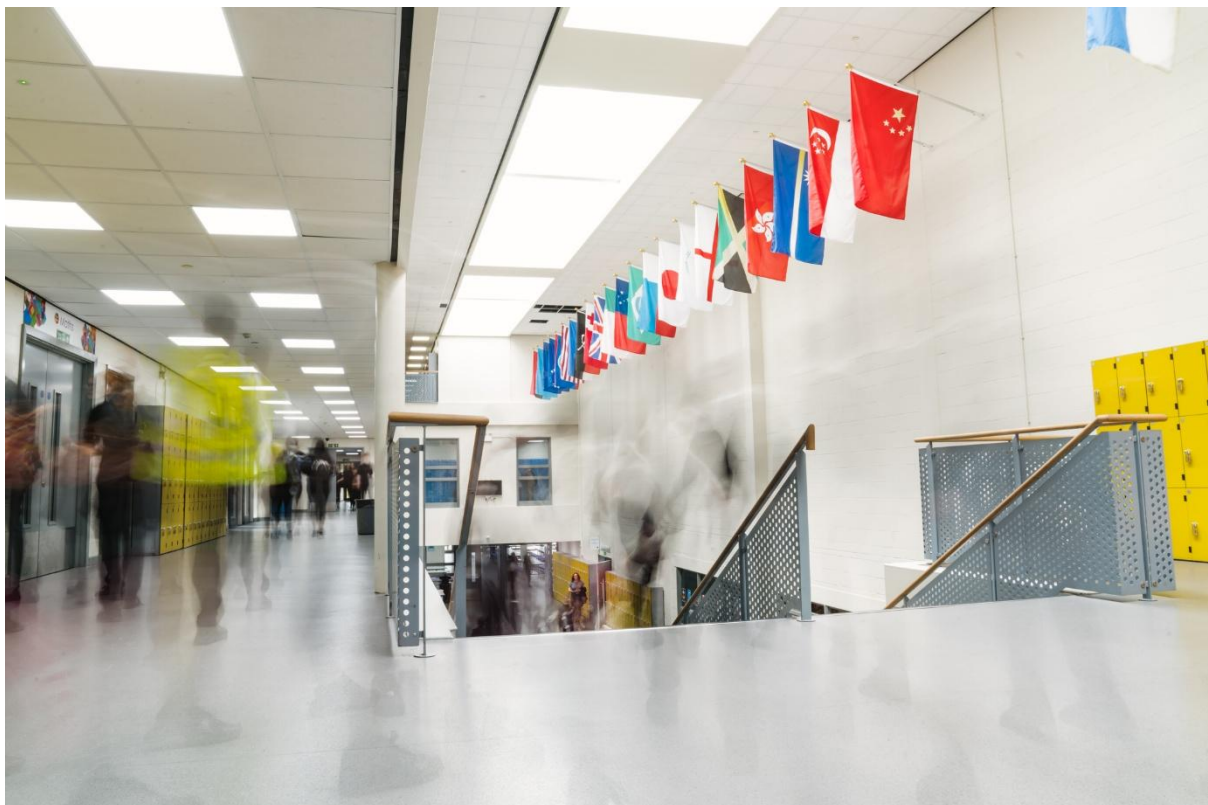

Primary school visits

The Year 7 transition team will visit you in your primary school to help you to get 'Westfield Ready'. They will also discuss your needs with your primary teachers, so we can be ready for your arrival at Westfield.

SEND induction events

If you have a special educational need or disability our Learning Support Team will work with you, your family and your primary school to help you get ready for your move to Westfield School.

Our Learning Support Team will communicate directly with your child's school to offer additional support.

Transition Days

Wednesday 8 July, 8.30am – 2.50pm

You will be invited to spend two days at Westfield, during which you will meet your classmates and some of your teachers. You will take part in activities designed to help you to settle into Westfield and find your way around your new school.

We ask that you:

- Bring a pen, pencil and ruler.
- Wear your primary school uniform.
- Wear footwear that is suitable for PE.
- Bring a packed lunch (if you are entitled to free school meals, you will receive your lunch in our restaurant)

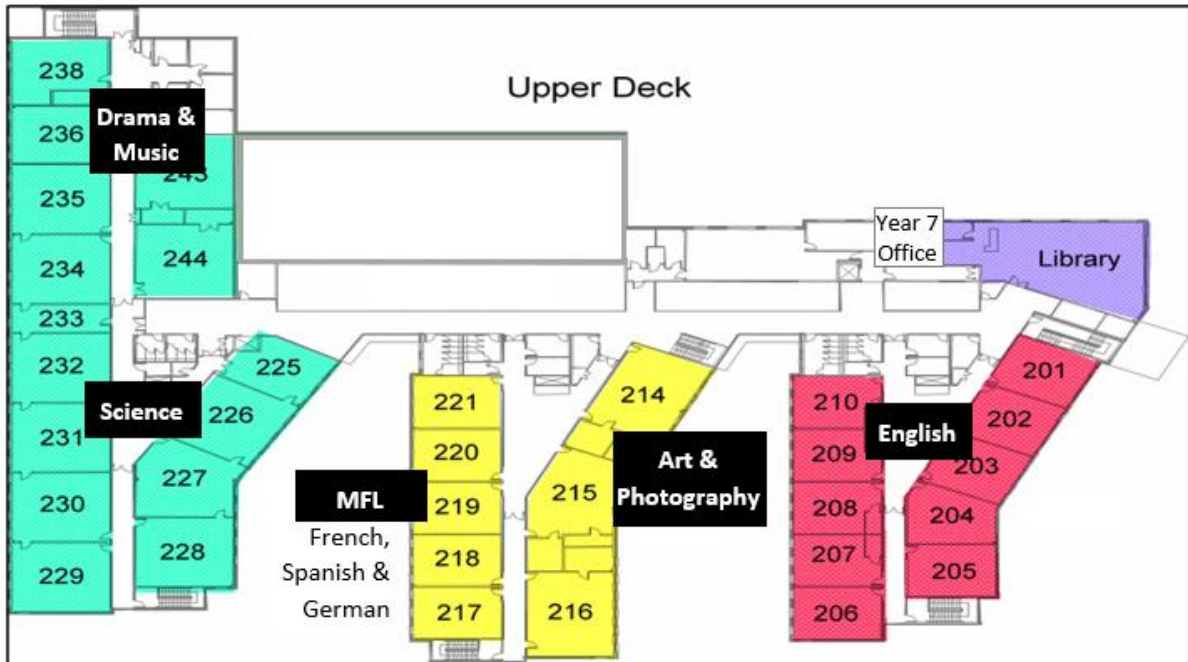

School Map

Westfield School is arranged over three floors, but we call them 'decks'.

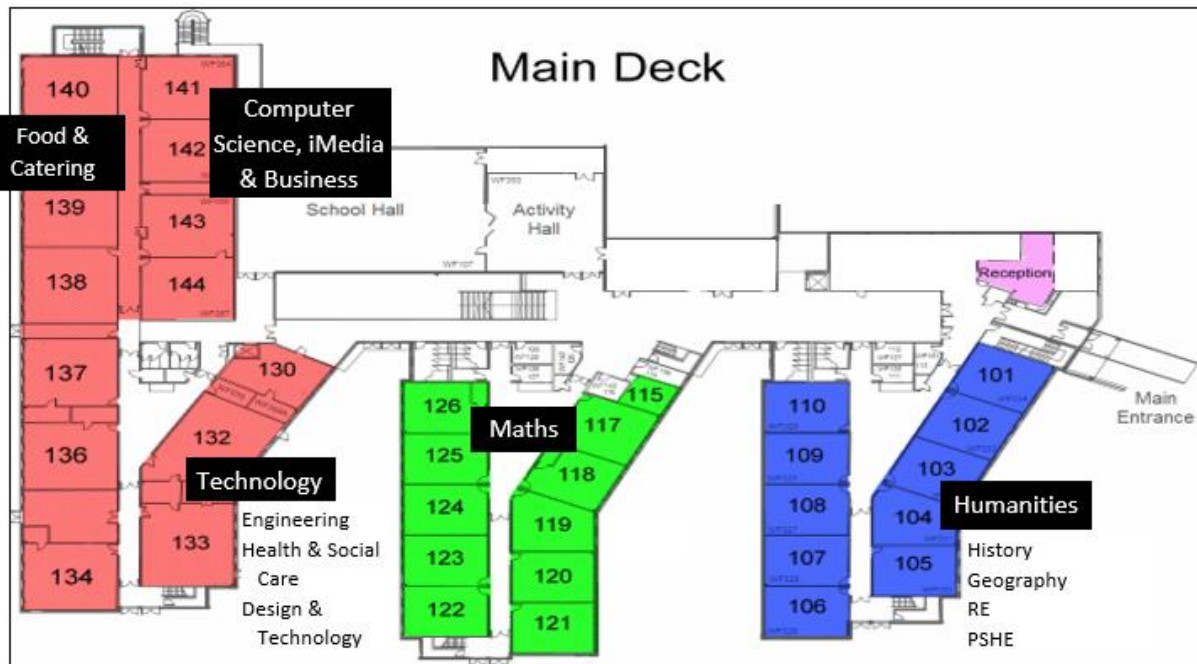
You will find most of your lessons on the upper deck and main deck. Each subject area has its own set of classrooms and each classroom has a number. Each deck has toilets and stairs so that you can reach the other decks.



Upper deck

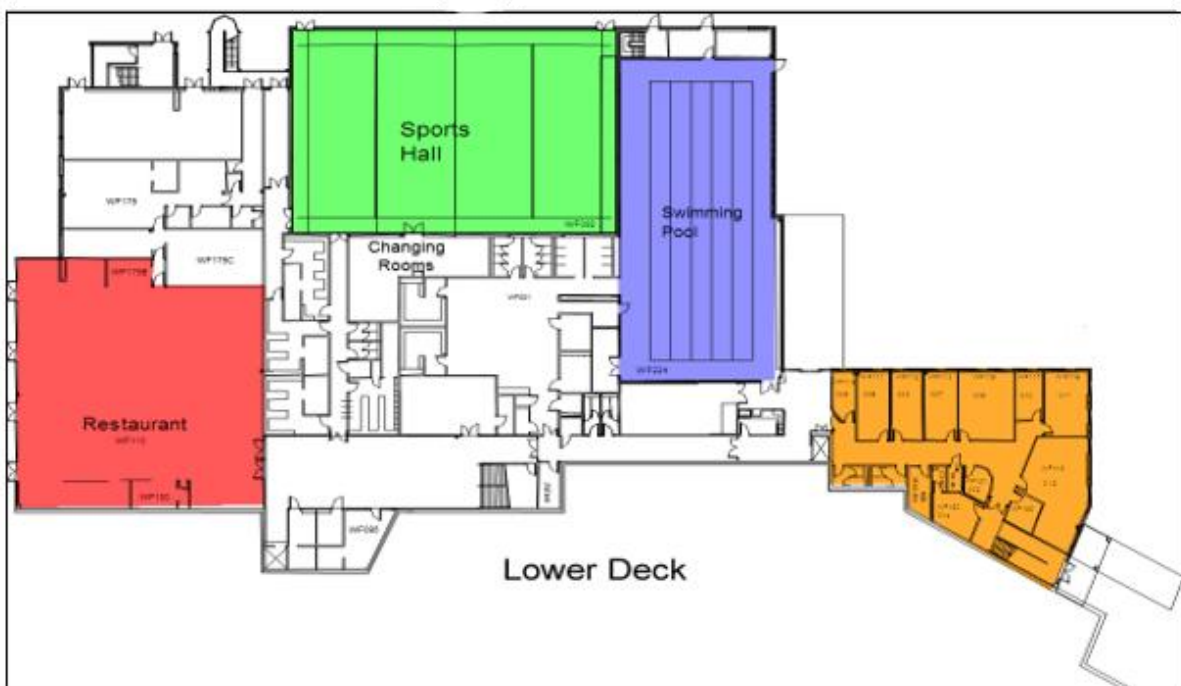
If a classroom number starts with a '2', that means they are on the upper deck (second floor). You'll also find our wonderful library and the Year 7 office (where Miss Blackburn and Miss Batty sit). on the upper deck.





Main deck

If it starts with a '1' then it's on the main deck (first floor). You'll also find the school halls (where you will have assemblies) and student reception (where you can go if you need help).



Lower deck

Our lower deck is where you will go for lunch in our restaurant. You will also have some of your PE lessons in the sports hall and swimming pool. Our learning support team have offices and classrooms on the lower deck.

Life at School

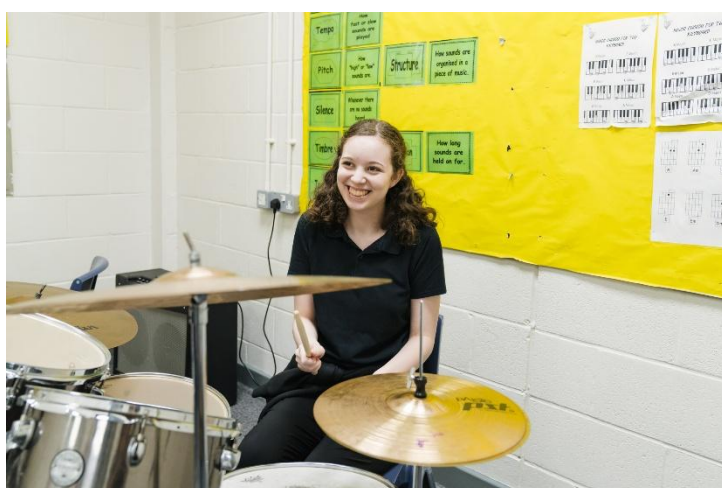
School day

The school day starts at 8.30am, and you are welcome to come into school from 8.10am so that you are ready for the start of the day. We start with registration, personal development time or assembly.

Lessons and subjects

There are five lessons each day, each one hour long, as well as a morning break and a lunch break. Each lesson will take place in a different room, with a different teacher. You can use the map to find your way around—or ask if you think you are lost.

You will study a wide range of subjects. Your teachers will teach

you in specially equipped classrooms. These include science laboratories, drama and dance studios, swimming pool, gym, design and technology rooms and indoor and outdoor PE facilities.
