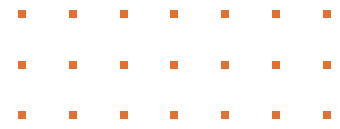
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Program Background

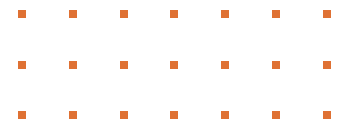

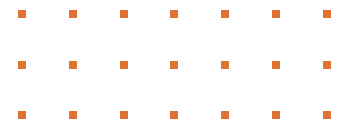

Workshop Details

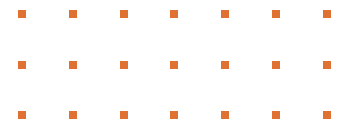


We strive to offer a variety of training structures, including online and in-person sessions, evening courses, weekend intensives, and more, to accommodate different schedules and learning preferences.

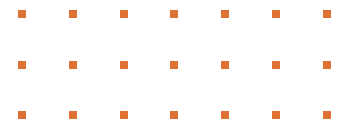
Flexibility

Application Process



Promotion Period

Before each set of workshops begins, we share all the details you'll need to decide which ones are right for you. During the promotion period, you'll find information about workshop topics, dates, registration instructions, and more. Registration Period

When registration opens, you'll have the chance to secure your spot in the workshops of your choice. Registration operates on a first-come, first-serve basis, so it's important to act quickly as spaces are limited. Be sure to review all workshop details and confirm your availability before signing up. Registration closes once all spots are filled.

Selection Model

Our selection process is designed to be fair and accessible. Most workshops are open to everyone on a first-come, first-serve basis. However, for certain advanced workshops, we may ask for proof of skills or experience to ensure participants are prepared for the material. Additionally, a small number of spots are reserved for clients referred by our Workforce Development and Business Services teams to meet specific community needs.

Additional Documentation

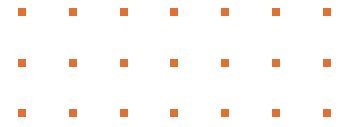
For certain advanced workshops, additional documentation may be required to ensure participants meet the necessary prerequisites.

This could include:

- Letter of Support: A brief letter from your employer confirming your role and their support for your participation.
- Proof of Skills: Evidence of prior experience or training relevant to the workshop, such as certificates, transcripts, or a portfolio of work.
- Other Prerequisites: Specific requirements outlined in the workshop details, such as a completed application for related training or proof of employment.

Please review the workshop descriptions carefully to determine if additional documentation is needed. All required materials should be submitted at the time of registration to secure your spot.

1 Commitment

Participants are expected to attend all of their workshop sessions to ensure they gain the full benefit of the program and qualify for a Certificate of Completion.

Active participation during discussions, group activities, and assignments is encouraged to create a dynamic and collaborative learning environment
