






## THE CREATION AND BIRTH OF THE BUSHBABY....



I was born in Japan in 2018, as a Toyota pick-up with a two-seater cabin, model GRJ 79. After a stopover in the Middle East, I was brought to the workshop of the company "Extrem Fahrzeug" in Schwenningen, Germany.



Based on their experiences with rental vehicles with roof tents in southern Africa. Manfred and Maya had already given a lot of thought to what would become of me and communicated this to the experts at Extrem. So they combined their knowledge with the ideas of Manfred and Maya and developed a homely space miracle in which you can live comfortably when the weather demands it and, above all, spend time outdoors easily and comfortably. The first destination should be southern Africa, where in many places you can't buy everything around the corner and therefore need a lot of cooling and storage space. By the way, I was named Bushbaby because these little African animals are small, fast and pretty and can move quickly anywhere - as I am supposed to do in a wide variety of landscapes. And of course because Manfred and

Maya love bush babies.





In place of my loading area, a living cabin made of insulated aluminum sandwich was installed, with a roof tent running the entire length over the driver's cabin, a roof window, side windows, a door at the rear and some flaps to make everyday life easier. The cabin width is divided into three parts: kitchen and bench, with the aisle in between. There is a 100 liter water tank, a boiler, an auxiliary heater and lithium batteries that store the solar energy from the three panels so that we can charge and use our devices.

My V6 engine drinks from two tanks that hold 90 and 105 liters of gasoline respectively. I need between 16 to 20 liters per hundred kilometers, of course depending on how I drive and how I drive. Of course, I have four-wheel drive that can be switched on manually, a gear reduction and a differential lock so that I can get through rough terrain. However, my height (2.65m, with roof box approx. 3m) is the biggest obstacle, or at least causes the most fears.

Since everything wasn't technically perfect, the "vehicle upgraders" in Neuheim/Switzerland upgraded and improved it. So today everything works perfectly and a socket allows you to work outside - as we all know, it gets dark very early in southern Africa. On my roof and the former bike rack there are three huge boxes attached to lashing rails in which tents, spare canisters, snorkeling gear and everything that is not used so often is stowed away.

I am particularly proud of my inner life. The cabinets, made of the finest quality wood, have folded doors so that no (or at least very little) dust gets in. A bench hides a huge material box, the batteries and the emergency toilet (portapotti with bag principle). Thanks to an additional open storage space, it not only allows you to sit comfortably but also offers an emergency shelter, just like the floor on which you can make a bed with mats if the roof tent has to remain closed exceptionally for weather or safety reasons. The drawer with two separate refrigerators can be used to freeze or cool according to your needs.

Thanks to cupboards and drawers we can carry a huge amount of household items and clothes, games, books and whatever else we need. A small pull-out table allows you to work or eat inside. Of course, you can also illuminate the living room with numerous lights and there are enough sockets and USB ports.

The bed on a board with a ship's mattress can be lifted up to the tent when the tent is opened, which takes about two minutes and is always the first thing to do in a new place, so that the entire interior offers standing height.

One of the most brilliant things about me are the outside flaps. For example, they make it possible to remove the table and chairs when the tent is unopened, to store workshop equipment for my maintenance or for small breakdowns, and to store the kitchen. This can be accessed both from inside and outside. The two-flame gas stove is attached to the flap on the outside, so that cooking can be done with little effort - connecting the gas hose to the bottle hanging outside.

To improve the comfort and to ensure vital mosquito protection, Manfred and Maya have a mosquito tent with them and a tarp, a fine sheet, can be pulled into a rail on both sides of me so that I can sit under it in the shade.

Manfred and Maya are thrilled to be traveling with me and are very, very proud of me and of the implementation of their ideas!

## THE DESERT IS ALIVE


Our journey takes us westwards and the first thing we notice is the vastness and emptiness through which we drive hundreds of kilometers to the Barberspan Bird Sanctuary. We love this place, even though the campsite only consists of a meadow and we are allowed to use a toilet and a bathtub in a house instead of the dilapidated sanitary facilities - we once again prefer our outdoor shower. The salty pan is well filled and we process the experiences of Uganda next to it and go on game drives, where, among other things, we also see herds of the rare white-tailed wildebeest. Above all, we are enjoying being out and about again at our own pace - and eating and drinking less ©

#### **Encounters on the South African side**

The 3.8 million hectares (practically the same size as Switzerland!) Kgalagadi (pronounced Kchalachadi), right on the Namibian border, is officially called 'Kgalagadi Transfrontier National Park' and brings together the former 'Gemsbok Parks' of South Africa and Botswana under one cross-border border management together. The South African side is characterized by the two dry riverbeds of Auob and Nossob, along which the main gravel roads lead. This is the greenest place in terms of groundwater and because some water holes were drilled for strategic reasons during the First World War. These formed the basis for the existence of a sizeable animal population, which ultimately led to the founding of the national park in 1932. Even during the rainy season there is great heat and dryness here, which is why many antelopes, small animals such as meerkats and squirrels, birds of prey, snakes and lizards and also big cats live near the water. So it's not a Big Five Park, there are no elephants, rhinos or buffalos and also no zebras. The resident animals are used to tourists' cars and the clicking of cameras and can be found at the waterholes early in the morning and sometimes towards evening. Big cats in particular like to move on the streets, which create desirable, thorn-free paths and places to lie down for them.




#### Heat and warmth of heart

The thermometer often climbs above forty degrees, so people and animals move around early in the morning (at the moment you can leave the camp from sunrise at 6 a.m. to sunset at 7:30 p.m.), but during the day they seek shade under trees and enjoy the almost constant wind . It's nice that the temperatures usually drop to a bearable level at night; we rarely even find it cool. Since the road network and the number of camps are very limited, you soon meet and know each other, standing together at the sightings and exchanging ideas. So we meet exciting people everywhere and hear their stories, such as René and Etelvina from Friborg with their Alpine elevator mobile, Michi and Nadine, the Swiss who spend part of their vacation here, Ruan and Lissandra, bird nuts and farm managers from Komatipoort near the Kruger Park, Michele and Norbert, from Cologne, who, like us, has sold everything and has been traveling in her own car for almost two years, but now has to go back because Michele has to go back to work. We also get exciting information from Claudia and Martin, who take photos for National Geographic and spend months in the park, as well as from Heinz and Nadja, the people of Zurich, who took a three-month break and just wanted to say hello quickly and then spend a few hours with us at the table sit because we all enjoy chatting and being together. From all these encounters we take away much more than tips for great campsites...

#### A landscape that touches the heart

The landscape here is characterized by the two river valleys and the dunes in between. In addition to the animals - we discover at least one big cat every day! - it is simply the beauty of the green spaces, the red, yellow, gray and beige sand and the wind-swaying silvery grass interspersed with dark green trees that we like so much. Even if we don't see any animals, it's always exciting, varied and there's something to see. The hours before sunrise and after sunset are particularly impressive here, because the play of colors is simply breathtaking, especially when small, white clouds hang in the sky or thunder and rain clouds pile up.



#### Botswana side: Simple, wild and harsh

There is a campsite in both countries at the south gate of the park. In South Africa 'Twee Rivieren' with great infrastructure, wonderful coffee milkshakes and a very busy campsite, on the Botswana side 'Two Rivers' with four sites, a broken sanitary facility and a lot of peace and quiet. We enjoy both resorts at different times, preferring the peace and darkness of Two Rivers for sleeping. After a few nights in the fenced-in, busy camps of South Africa (Mata-Mata and Nossob), we complete the border formalities for Bushbaby and ourselves at the Twee Rivieren headquarters and take the rough sand and corrugated iron road to the east. Luckily it's a few degrees cooler and our main tank, which went on strike at times and caused us quite a bit of concern, is working perfectly again - tomorrow anyway, so we can now say we have a morning and an afternoon tank.



On the crossing over dunes and through depressions, which shakes and shakes, rocks and sways despite minimal tire pressure, into the Mabuasehube region of the park, on the Botswana side, we spend a night in Matopi, around a hundred kilometers away from any civilization on either side.

In the Mabuasehube area, the area is flat and characterized by salt pans, large, round, slightly lower-lying areas with saline soil that the rain temporarily fills with water. The camps are simple, meaning there is nothing at all, an outhouse or a basic shower and tap and often an open wooden roof for shade. Despite the high prices, the places in Botswana are run down and of course not fenced in. This means that animals, especially cats, can run through the middle of the camp, and we often hear about them lying down to sleep under the shade houses or even under vehicles - something we have experienced ourselves on previous trips. The pride of over ten lions, which we can observe up close at the first campsite, does not inspire fear in us, but it does inspire great respect, which can't hurt.

#### Thunderstorms and rain

While the mood for both of us is pretty good and peaceful, apart from a few small thunderstorms, cauliflower clouds often build up into high but very local thunderstorm towers in the evening. On many evenings, when we lie down early in our roof tent with the panoramic windows, we can watch the Milky Way and lightning in the distance. Manfred always wishes for a thunderstorm so that he can photograph lightning again and this wish comes true in Lefika, where we stand on the edge of the pan. The wind shakes Bushbaby and it ducks its head, so we close the roof for safety reasons, but the lightning is not so dramatic that Manfred cannot climb onto the lion-proof roof and go hunting for lightning from there. The next evening it will be even more gigantic, because the place offers 360 degree visibility and we are surrounded by thunderstorm cells, so that the lightning hunter is in seventh heaven.







#### Time to live what you dreamed of

Although for many the landscape seems desolate and one can probably get enough of it, it is exactly this landscape and this quiet, contemplative life that we have always imagined over the last few years. Not just driving, but also sitting and enjoying, not always looking for the animals, but also experiencing them visiting us in the camp, simply taking in the silence, beauty and seclusion without having to go to the next place. We still feel like our days are flying by. We can't get enough of the Kgalagadi and the only limit is the fuel tank. We carry three canisters of gasoline in the roof box, but the deep sandy roads and the slow driving with frequent gear changes - third gear is rarely used - cause our fuel supplies to dwindle quickly and the distances back to the civilized world are long and must be taken into account. The water and food supplies would last for some time, as we have converted one of our two refrigerators into a freezer and even meat for a longer period of time.







#### Bye bye Kgalagadi


After our last booked night we drive south to Tshabong in Botswana to fill our tanks. At the gate we hope to be able to book a few more nights in the Mpayathutlwa pan, which we liked best because there is water and a lot of animals there. The officer waves us off, another provider is responsible there and we have to contact them. This is difficult without a network, so we will postpone it until later when we have internet at the campsite in Tshabong. Before that, there were around 100 km waiting for us, which we would drive back. However, this route is worse than any other, deep sand, old asphalt and clay roads alternate and our poor bush baby has to endure a lot once again. When increasing the tire pressure, we have problems with the compressor hose, so we no longer dare to release air. Finally, we can fill up in Thshabong, fill up with air, get Pula (the Botswana currency, the same word as rain) and spend two nights here, during which we can also plan further - although it is practically impossible to escape the heat, because it seems to have the entire larger region under control for the time being.



It was time to catch up on cruising! Having cruised on the Mediterranean and done several trips with MSC on the South African coast line, it was time to do another one as the Splendida was returning to Europe to make way for a newly refurbished MSC Musica - the MSC Musica had visited our shores before and always had great reviews.

We were a group travelling together and to make it easier on us all, we booked our flights from the different parts of South Africa to arrive roughly the same time and then to meet at the Mugg and Bean for breakfast. I must say totally impressed with that idea and the service and food was superb. I am not one to enjoy the "food chain" options but in this case, King Shaka Durban, with their had limited choices., this was a good one.

We were met by the Cruises transfer company, Cruising South Africa, with ice cold water and a clear blue sky. The coaches were well kept and so far our excitement was tangible as we were about to leave our troubles behind for a few days. No internet, no wifi and preferably no issues at home or at the office.

I expected chaos at the port terminal as loading maybe 3000-4000 people of all ages, shapes and sizes would be challenging but luckily MSC had arranged all their "hands on deck" as it were and no shortage of assistance or people willing to assist.

We booked balcony cabins because after all, unlike Europe, we can't get off every day in a different dock, so we upgraded to balcony cabins to enjoy the view whilst being a bit private too.

There is always that bubble of excitement when I get to go on a holiday whether short or long and the sight the ship was just breathtaking. To think I was going to spend a few days floating around the Indian Ocean with newly found friends and generally enjoying the services of the Splendida for which there have been some mixed reviews.

I couldn't believe there were still people bringing food on board and fighting with security as to why they couldn't bring it along. One elderly couple eventually decided that the security guard was asking for the food because he was hungry and needed to feed his family. No amount of protesting on his side, could convince this couple that its just about rules and regulations and not because he or his family needed to be fed. I watched that for a while as it was hugely entertaining but then had to move as the queue was moving. Assistance for disabled passengers was available as was for large groups. The queue moved relatively quickly although I must say, there could be some refreshments or advice to bring refreshments because the wait to board could be as long as 2 to 3 hours while you move from baggage, to customs to checkin and get your cruise card.

We finally made it on board and into our beautiful cabins.

Hint: Before boarding a cruise, always check the packages, the upgrades and what facilities are on board. Scour the menus and opening times of the speciality restaurants. ## Classic Martini

A chilled gin martini served up in a graceful cocktail glass is one of the most elegant and sophisticated drinks around. The classic martini recipe is fairly simple—just gin, vermouth, and an olive or lemon peel (and possibly some orange bitters). The key is to stir the drink with lots of ice until it is very cold (forget what James Bond said about shaking it), then pour it into a chilled martini glass or coupe to keep everything as cool as possible.

This dry martini is made with five parts gin to one part dry vermouth, which gives the drink a lovely aromatic quality. If you prefer the cocktail even drier, you can lower the proportion of vermouth to ¼ ounce—but don't leave it out altogether or your drink won't be a martini at all (just a glass of cold gin with an olive). That said, there's no wrong way to enjoy this drink. Over the years people have come up with a long list of martini cocktail variations that are all delicious: You can use equal parts gin and vermouth for a Fifty-Fifty, use a combination of dry and sweet vermouths for a "perfect martini," add some olive juice to the mix for a dirty martini, or swap the olive for a cocktail onion to make a Gibson.

#### **Ingredients**

Makes 1 drink
Cracked ice
2½ ounces London dry gin, (Beefeater)
½ ounce dry vermouth, (Noilly Prat)
Green olive or lemon twist for garnish



#### **Preparation**

In mixing glass or cocktail shaker filled with ice, combine gin and vermouth. Stir well, about 30 seconds, then strain into martini glass. Garnish with olive or lemon twist and serve.



So think \*very\* carefully before you choose your dog. And think about getting two, rather than one, so I won't be so very lonely waiting for you all day. Eight or ten hours is just a workday to you, but it's an eternity for me to be alone.














Dricus Du Plessis knows the difficulty of the challenges ahead of him.

Currently ranked at No. 6 in the official UFC middleweight rankings, South Africa's "Stillknocks" has been perfect in his last seven fights, winning all but one by finish (four KO/TKOs, two submissions) and his last five under the UFC banner, UFC 285 saw Du Plessis (19-2) capture his latest and greatest victory yet over perennial Top 10 contender Derek Brunson in the closing seconds of round two. If the win wasn't enough to inch the former KSW welterweight champion toward UFC gold, his pre-fight comments and the aftermath certainly helped.

At UFC 285 media day, Du Plessis spoke on his title aspirations before describing himself and UFC bantamweight Cameron Saaiman as African fighters and that he'll take a belt back to the continent. The comments didn't sit well with Nigerian-born former and current champions Kamaru Usman and Israel Adesanya. the latter of which has since expressed his great desire to punish Du Plessis in the octagon as a result.

Hearing Adesanya's response was a surprise to Du Plessis and he thought any backlash overall was ridiculous. Du Plessis felt the reigning two-time champion may have not even watched the video to hear everything as it was said. Ultimately, the Hatfield, Pretoria native isn't bothered to have angered "The Last Stylebender."

"I never said it wasn't my intention," Du Plessis told Submission Radio. "It wasn't my intention because that's not what I said. It was never my intention, there was no intention involved. It was look at the facts what I said. I've never said the words 'more African' in my life. I didn't say they were not African. I stated facts. I am the only one in title contention ever born in Africa, live in Africa, reside in Africa, and train there every single day. That was my statement.

"Some people say I'm backpedaling, I never backpedaled. I'm sticking with that because that is the facts. I don't care how it came across, I care about what the fact is and what I said and that's what I said.




UFC middleweight champ Dricus du Plessis spoke to reporters after his title win over Sean Strickland at UFC 296, how the fight played out, feeling the audience shift loyalties during the fight, Dana White's scoring of the title bout, why he wants to fight Israel Adesanya next, and more.

"It seems to have struck a nerve with Israel Adesanya," he continued. "It seems like he likes to be whatever fits him best considering nationalities. He's referred to himself as a Kiwi, he's referred to himself as Chinese, he's referred to himself as a Nigerian. At the end of the day, he's born in Africa, he is African but he does not reside here and that is the fact. That is what makes me and him different. We are both born in Africa, but at the end of the day, my success is coming out of and from Africa. I live here, I wake up, I train, I fly from Africa to Las Vegas to go fight and I come back and that is the facts."

Despite newly-formed tensions and the makings of a rivalry, Du Plessis insists that it's one-sided and nothing negative from his end. The two may never end up being friends and Du Plessis is fine with that. In the cage is what matters to "Stillknocks" and no matter how he's treated by the champion, he'll recognize the talent of Adesanya.

"I don't know Israel personally at all," Du Plessis said. "As a fighter, I've always had mad respect for Israel Adesanya. I think he's an incredible, incredible fighter. In terms of that and legacy of being a really, really good fighter and being possibly one of the greatest middleweights to ever do it, unfortunately, his competition is the great Anderson Silva. But he's on his way there and I can never take that away. I can never take away the fact that he's incredibly brilliant.





"Like I said, he was born in Africa, he represents Africa 100 percent. But he does not reside in Africa. He hasn't resided in Africa for a very, very long time. That is the only statement that I made. In terms of being a fighter, he's absolutely incredible and anybody who says otherwise is ridiculous."

A lot of questions followed Adesanya's redemptive title capturing against Alex Pereira last month. Finishing "Poatan" with a wild second-round knockout, Adesanya tied their MMA series at one win apiece, providing the possibility for an instant trilogy. Instead, Pereira now prepares to make his light heavyweight MMA debut while Du Plessis can secure the next shot at Adesanya with a UFC 290 win over former champion Robert Whittaker on July 8.

The 29-year-old finisher in Du Plessis was expecting to be title bound immediately after his and Adesanya's recent results. For a moment, he even heard rumblings that negotiations were headed in that direction for July. If he had to guess, Du Plessis believes the promotion promised Whittaker a fight as well, leaving no other option.

Du Plessis could have always declined the unnecessarily risky challenge that is Whittaker. However, these are the kinds of opportunities he wants to get through whether it's before or after he obtains a UFC title.

"A lot of people are saying it's not the smart move to fight Whittaker and 100 percent, I agree with that," Du Plessis told Submission Radio. "I agree it's not the smart move, but I'm not here to be smart. Otherwise, I would've stayed in school and finished my studies, went to go work at a bank, wear a suit to work every day, and do some corporate life. That's not the life I chose. I chose to be a warrior, I chose to be an entertainer, and at the end of the day, I'm a fighter. That's what I do. I fight.

"I don't want to get that title shot based on some hype created by, I don't even know what, some guy who has the title who's behaving like a little child and overreacting and now the fight is happening because of that. I want to deserve my title shot. I don't want to be handed a title shot. I'm going to deserve my belt, and that's why I wanted that Whittaker fight."

In the middleweight division, Whittaker has become somewhat of a championship fight without a title on the line. "The Reaper's" only two losses in his 14-fight run at 185 pounds came against Adesanya and a win over Du Plessis will lead him to his desired trilogy.

Regardless of having to wait and get through the toughest challenge possible before a title fight, Du Plessis is ecstatic to potentially add a legacy-boosting win to his resume. As has been the story of his 21-fight career, Du Plessis expects to find the finish against his Australian counterpart.

"Every single person in the middleweight division, if you can find a way to get to that belt without fighting Robert Whittaker then that's a plus," Du Plessis said. "I think if you look at Marvin Vettori, he fought Whittaker after he fought for the belt. If you look at Paulo Costa, they made sure he didn't fight Whittaker. If you look at most of the guys that fought 'Izzy,' at the end of the day, you have to realize that Pereira didn't have to fight Whittaker so out of the Top 5, nobody fought Whittaker, really, out of that Top 5. Nobody has fought Whittaker before they had to fight for the belt because they know Whittaker is just going to run through everybody like he has. There's never gonna be another contender. He's just going to beat everybody before they get a chance to fight for the title.

"If you look at that stat, the UFC knows Whittaker is the champion in the universe where Adesanya wasn't there."




# History of Women's Sport



The origin of organized women's sport can be traced back to the 6th century B.C. Although the ancient Olympic games were initially organized in honor of the 12 Olympian Gods of Greece, 5 of which were women (Hera, Athena, Artemis, Demeter and Aphrodite), in the middle of the 6th century BC, the Greek government banned all women from any sort of participation in the competition. The ancient Greek women formed their own competition – 'The Heraean Games' which took place every year and involved only one event – the stadion – which was a running competition similar to the men's event but 1/6 shorter. There are many key dates and many inspirational women who set standards and opened doors for many others along the way. We have listed just some of these to give an idea of how far women's sport has come since the 19th century.

The Relative Age Effect

Genes in Sport

1842 - Ann Glanville formed a crew of four female rowers who took part in local regattas often beating the men

1866 - Vassar College in New York fielded the first 2 women's amateur baseball teams

1884 - English woman Maud Watson won the first ladies singles title at Wimbledon and a few years later Ellen Hansell won the first women's tennis US open

1896 - The first women's collegiate basketball championship was played

1900 - 22 women (2.2 per cent) out of a total of 997 athletes competed in the Olympics for the first time over five sports (tennis, sailing, croquet, equestrian and golf)

1905 - The Camogie Association was founded in Dublin to organize and promote the women's sport of camogie in Ireland and across the world

1921 - The Women's Olympiad started the 1st women's international event and was seen as an important step for women's sport

1922 - The Women's World Games, held in Paris in 1922 included the first regular track and field competitions for women 1969 - The English Women's Football Association was formed 1972 - Title IX passed in the US stating that 'No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from

participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any educational program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance'

1976 - Nadia Comăneci, won 3 Olympic gold medals at the 1976 Summer Olympics and was the first gymnast to be awarded a perfect score of 10 in an Olympic gymnastic event





### Mary Decker and Zola Budd

1980 - Mary Decker was the first woman to run a mile under 4.5 minutes

1981 - The first women were co-opted to the International Olympics committee

1982 - The NCCA began sponsoring women's basketball

1985 - The United States national soccer team was formed

1991 - A historic decision by the International Olympic

Committee stipulated that any new sport seeking to be included had to include women's events

1991 - FIFA (the Fédération Internationale de Football Association) began the Women's World Cup

1996 - The Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) league was founded as the women's counterpart to the NBA

1999 - Carolina Morace became the first female coach of a men's professional soccer team in Italy

2005 - The organizers of the New York City Marathon announced they would be rewarding the female champion \$130,000, that is \$30,000 more than its male winner received. This may be the first time a sporting event ever paid more to a female than a male in the same competition

2012 - The London Olympics were the first games in which women competed in all sports on the program

2014 - Amélie Mauresmo, from France, became the first woman to coach a top male tennis player - Andy Murray

2014 - Michele A. Roberts was elected as the new Executive Director of the National Basketball Players Association, thus making her the first woman to be elected to the highest position of a major sport's players association within the United States 2015 - Tickets for the Women's Singles final of the 2015 US Open sell out faster than the Men's final, a first in tournament history 2016 - At the Olympic games in Rio, in 2016 a new record was set with participation of women at 45%: 5,176 out of 11,444 athletes 2019 - 33% of International Olympic Committee members are women

2019 - Serena Williams is the only woman in the Forbes list of top 100 highest paid athletes

### Challenges to gender inequality

Female participation in sport began a dramatic increase in the last quarter of the 20th century and the current rate of change is one of the major trends in the sport industry. But women who play sports today can still face many obstacles.

Speaking at the Women in Sport Summit in Melbourne last year, Kate Jenkins, the sex discrimination commissioner for the Australian Human Rights Commission, outlined a number of key challenges to gender equality in sport over the coming years. These include:-
