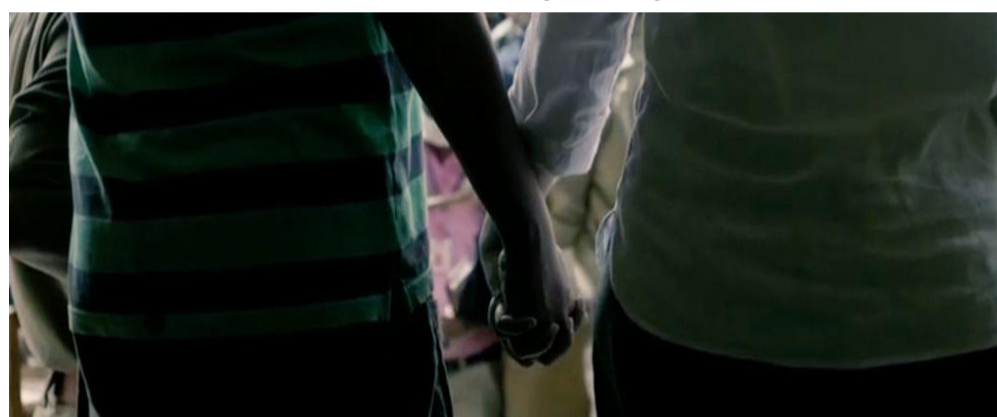
The movie's audio elements, including the music and the sounds of food preparation and consumption, heighten its intensity and thrill. They add depth to the movie's unsettling themes and make even

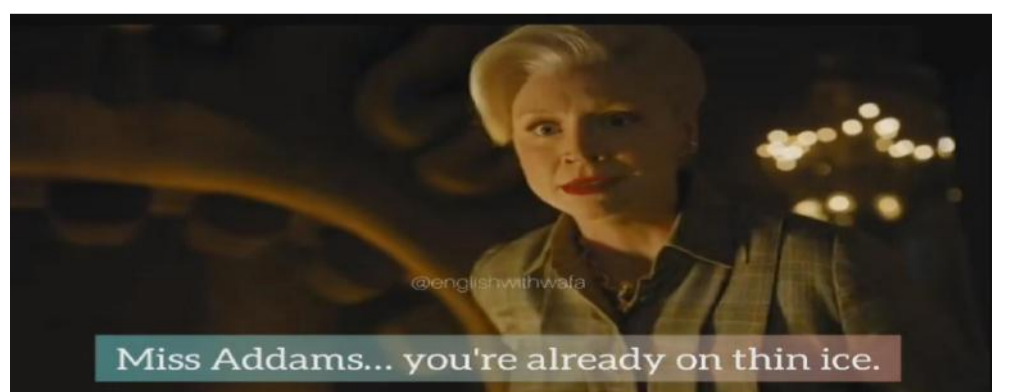

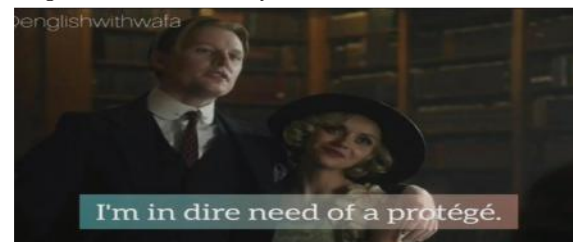


MESSAGE

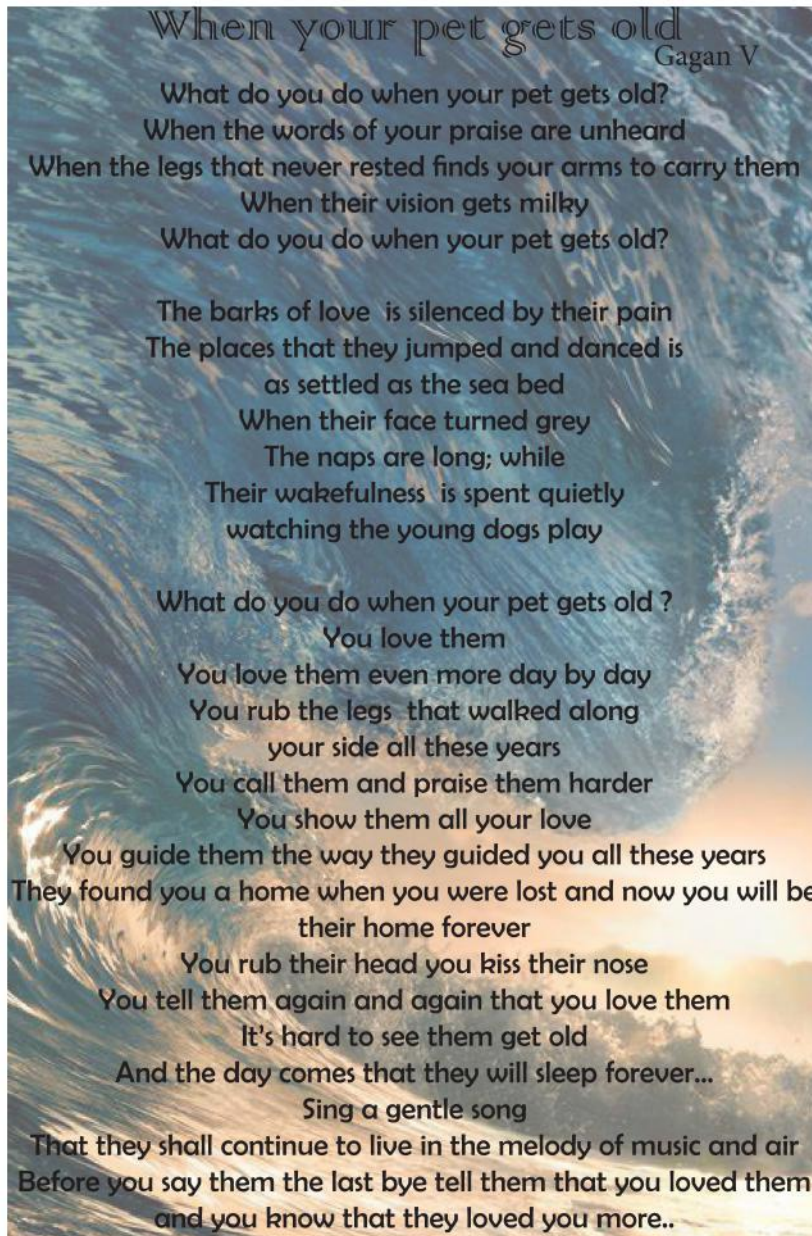
