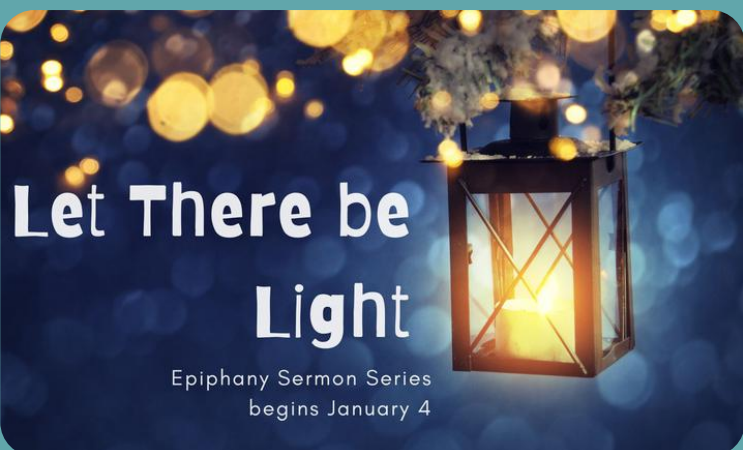

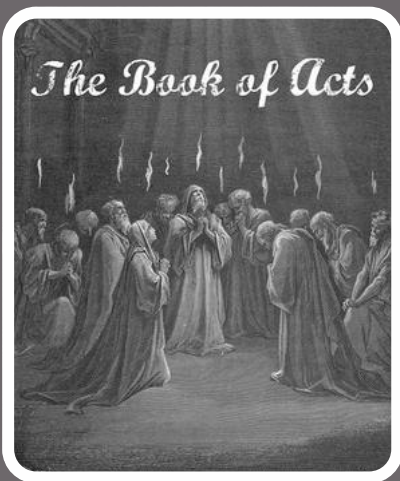


SUNDAY MORNING FAITH FORMATION

WINTER POP-UPS!

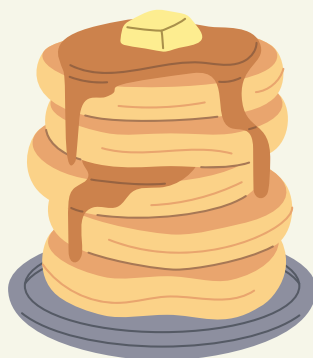

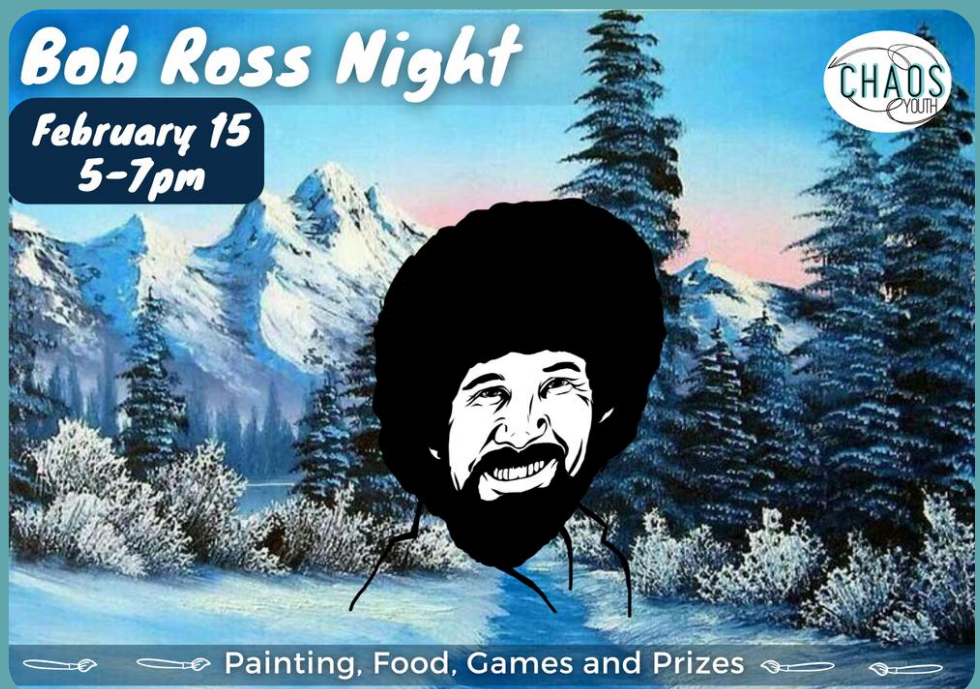
Game Night

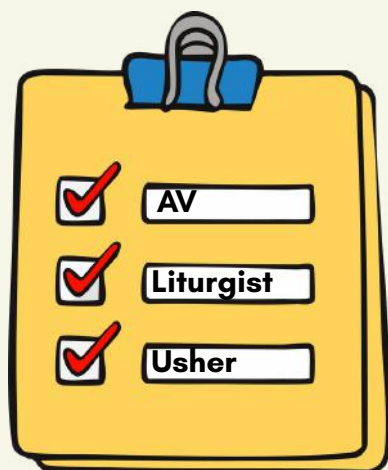

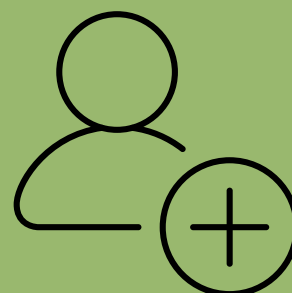
