Cucumber sandwiches, coronation chicken, union flags and even a dash of Pimms – the perfect recipe for a nation-wide bash, as we celebrated amongst family, friends and neighbours the coronation of King Charles III.

I don't know if you're anything like me and you keep slipping back to a 'God save the Queen' when the national anthem comes on (even more awkward when leading prayers in church!), but these things do happen when one era concludes and a new one begins.

I hope that, however you were able to celebrate it, you did so safely and happily. Times of transition are marked by a certain nostalgia for the past and what has come to an end, joy at the prospect of something new and hopefulness for what lies ahead. This can all be hard to maintain with the backdrop of increasing hostilities between nations, pressing problems on our shores and significant uncertainty about the future economically, politically and even spiritually.

It is at such times that I find great comfort from this short verse from the New Testament: "King Jesus is the same yesterday and today and for ever" (Hebrews 13:8). It is a reminder that, even though monarchs, like the seasons, come and go, there is something that remains fixed, firm and reliable amidst it all: a King whose way is love, who is full of both grace and truth. Elsewhere He is described as the "King of Kings" (Revelation 17:10), another reminder that all political rulers are, ultimately, accountable to Him – which can be a wonderful relief in uncertain times, in times of transition.

May you know something of the security that comes from His rule and reign at this time.

One of the responsibilities of the Parish Church Council (PCC) is to ensure that the services provided each Sunday are of a format that meets the needs of the church congregation and wider community, and faithfully proclaims the gospel message.

Earlier this year the PCC discussed the present format and felt that the service of Matins was not easily understood by many people today, particularly the many visitors throughout the year and those who come to prepare for their marriage in the church: it was also felt that Communion is so significant an act in our faith that it should be celebrated more often.

Our initial thought was to replace the Matins service with a communion service, but after consultation with some members of the congregation it became clear that there were many who felt Matins was a very important form of worship and one which they wished to see continue at St Mary's.

The PCC therefore decided that for a trial period we would on the third Sunday of each month alternate Matins with Morning Praise and have a second communion service on the fourth Sunday of each month. We hope that this service pattern will meet the needs of all worshippers and we will listen to feed back over the coming weeks and months.

I wanted to take a moment to share a bit about our monthly all-age service of worship which we call Rise 'n Shine. It's at 9.30 on the first Sunday morning of each month and the idea is that it is the one time in the month where we can come with our families (both younger and older generations) and not be split up during our time of worship.

No two months are the same as we sing a mix of contemporary songs and traditional hymns, often engage in an activity together, interact in a 'lively' way, pray together and hear a message from the Bible to strengthen our faith in God.

The idea is that some who might find our more traditional services awkward for whatever reason (because of unexpected interruptions from other family members, for example!) can be completely at ease amidst the shorter, more 'dynamic' service format.

Those enquiring about baptism in the church can come and get a taste for something that engages young and old alike. We are always open to new ideas, new people getting involved and helpful resources that will have a great impact, so if you would like to share something then please do get in touch with me or someone you else see up at the front during those services.

And finally, if you've never been because you're nervous about such services, please do come and 'try it out' one Sunday – it would be a joy to have you with us!

ReVive@5

In the midst of chaos as always in my house, I realised the time was already 4.15pm on Sunday and it was time to leave for ReVive@5, (One of Dedham's contemporary services held on the 4th Sunday of the month).

My eldest 16 year old daughter Annabel always comes with me which I love! The ReVive@5 in April was another example of rejoicing and enjoying the fellowship of the church congregation. Refreshments can be enjoyed from 4.30pm whilst meeting new people arriving for the first time and receiving the word through worship, prayer, teaching and prayer ministry.

Over the past few months we have followed a series of preaching on different characters from the Bible: from David the Shepherd before he became King and John the Baptist, as well as Andrew and Thomas, Josiah and Jacob.. We are lead each time by different preachers and guest speakers, including Rev Phillip. Excitingly we have Tim Abbott, 24/7 Prayer Lead for prayer spaces in Schools, and Mark Wood from

The Korban Project, visiting over the next few months.

After the service for the past few years, I have lead with other leaders, a 'post revive' youth group for Secondary School aged young people, We have a number of activities and games, together with sharing food, whilst we chat about an array of topics including faith, the environment and exams. We currently have between three and six young people join us each month, and I think the favourite activity so far has been the fire pit and toasting of marshmallows - a central feature when we had our youth combined parish camp out in August last year in the Vicarage garden. Any secondary school aged young people would be very welcome to join us.

ReVive@5 is inclusive of any and all ages. When I asked Annabel what three words describe ReVive@5 and the group after the service, she replied "fun, informative and interesting." If you haven't already, give it a try – you will receive a very warm welcome.

Volunteer helpers are also required to assist with the youth group after the service. If you are interested in being part of this, do let Rev Phillip or the Parishes Office know.

Hope for the Education of Children in Sierra Leone.

I recently visited Sierra Leone and witnessed an amazing scheme which supports the secondary school education of children in that country. Intelligent, determined children from desperately poor backgrounds who would not go to secondary school without help. Most of the children will go on to have fulfilling careers or to start their own businesses.

The Government of Sierra Leone abolished secondary school fees in 2018 but poor families cannot afford the other costs of attending secondary school. The UK charity, SLEDT, arranges for uniforms, textbooks, exam fees and additional lessons.

Often the children receive a solar light, desk and chair for evening study and a mattress. SLEDT supports bright children with the potential to develop their lives. Qualifying children must achieve a score of over 280 in their final primary school exams which generally places them in the top four in their large class.

SLEDT liaises with head teachers and assesses family backgrounds before selecting children for the scheme. Can you imagine a bright, enthusiastic child denied education? This scheme helps a few. The track record of the scheme is eye catching. The first six children of the current scheme have reached the end of

their secondary education, four have continued to further education including university and the other two have secured good jobs. All the other forty two children in the programme are working hard and progressing well at their schools.

SLEDT stays in contact with all supported children. A small investment in the education of children who will go on to build professional careers or start businesses has a sustainable impact on the development of Sierra Leone. I met some of the children on the scheme in

was cruelly mocked on his short journey. Foday has just graduated from university. He is immensely determined but he would not have received his education without the help of SLEDT who have also provided a wheelchair.

You cannot miss the potential of the children on a visit to Kroo Bay Primary School in the slums of Freetown. I will return to Sierra Leone to help with the development of the scheme and meet some children starting on the programme.

SLEDT stands for Sierra Leone Education and Development Trust. It is a very small UK charity run by Kevin Curley who is totally dedicated to helping the education of some children in Sierra Leone. SLEDT spends the absolute minimum on overheads. It employs no paid staff, has no office and owns no vehicles.

Almost every penny raised by SLEDT goes to pay directly for education or mobility assistance in Sierra Leone. The local team of eight in Sierra Leone are all unpaid volunteers headed by Chernor Barrie, a law student. Their commitment and enthusiasm are infectious.

Eleven months ago I welcomed Iryna Omelchenko a Ukrainian refugee into my home. She arrived with her whole life in her suitcase and spoke only six words of English. Her previous life in Ukraine had been full and productive; she had family living nearby, a job she loved, and hobbies and interests which kept her busy and fulfilled. She used to volunteer on a regular basis for a charity called Mom Plus Me who supported orphans, many of whom were disabled and women and children escaping domestic violence.

Fast forward to Christmas 2022. Ukrainians generally celebrate Christmas very differently to us in the UK – different date and different traditions. Whilst really enjoyable it was also really challenging as Iryna felt a long way from her home and her sisters. Late one evening in one of our many conversations just before bedtime, Iryna became quite distressed. She felt useless because she was unable to do anything to help the people left back home.

We had spoken several times about her charity work, so I suggested that we should do a fund raiser for Mom Plus Me

who were in great need of funding and practical resources, for an ever expanding group of people, who desperately needed help.

The charity event took place at Ardleigh Village Hall on Saturday March 4th, which was very close to the first anniversary of the war. We spoke to the founder of the charity before the event to get an update on their current activities. We discovered this now also includes supporting families who have been bombed out and who have nowhere to go. I was particularly touched by one of their projects.



The bombing has destroyed much of the infra structure in the cities in Ukraine. No electricity means no lighting or heating and in high rise buildings no water or sanitation, as the pumps cannot work. A 100 place orphanage without any electricity was unable to provide the children, (many of them severely disabled and wheelchair bound) with any hot drinks or food. They had no means of heating the building in sub-zero temperatures with thick snow on the ground.

Mom Plus Me provided every child with thick, warm clothing and set up a wood fired field kitchen which ensured the children got at least one hot meal

and drink daily. We displayed pictures of the children being fed outside in the snow. This made us even more determined to raise as much money as possible!

The event was a huge success!! I was humbled at the generosity of local people particularly at a time when so many people are struggling financially. The tables in the hall were piled high with the most amazing home-made cakes, over 70 raffle prizes, new things, plants, tombola, bric-a-brac and so much more.



There were several things about the event which stood out for me, and there was such a lovely atmosphere at the event. The £2 entrance fee for adults included a voucher for a cuppa and a piece of cake. You could hear people meeting old friends for the first time in ages, many of them stayed for ages to chat, drink tea and eat cake. All of the helpers: friends and family, hosts from the local Ukrainian Support Group, representatives of both Dedham and Ardleigh Church, the Horticultural Society and the Great Bromley WI were absolutely fantastic.

Many people both helpers and visitors remarked on the friendly atmosphere of the event. The generosity



of those who donated homemade cakes, raffle prizes, plants and goods for us to sell was overwhelming. At the end of the event we still had a vast amount of stuff left but nothing was wasted. Everything left was passed on to other charities in the area, so nothing was wasted and the ripple of kindness was magnified.

In the weeks prior to the event I had two concurrent nightmares – not enough to sell and not enough people attending the event. The reality was very different. We raised £2260 on the day which was AMAZING! With other donations sent from people who were unable to attend and with further tickets sold for the last of the raffles drawn at the Wooden Fender on March 24th I was able to send £3450 to Mom Plus Me via PayPal at the end of March. Iryna and I and everyone at Mom Plus Me would like to say a monumental THANK YOU to everyone who participated in the event!

Your kindness is making a significant difference. We continue to run an online crowd funding campaign through Just Giving and have raised £2135 so far. From the Archives - Dedham in June 1897

The British NEWSPAPER Archive The Evening Star, Ipswich, Friday June 18th 1897.

THE SHOOTING AFFAIR AT DEDHAM.

At Essex Assizes on Thursday, before Mr. Justice Mathew, John Denny (on bail) was indicted for causing grievous bodily harm to Rachel Balls, with intent to murder her, on February 16th, at Dedham. A second count charged the prisoner with feloniously wounding the prosecutrix with intent to do her grievous bodily harm. Mr. C. E. Jones appeared for the prosecution, and Mr. Muir for the defence. Mr. Jones said the prisoner was in the employment of Mr. Dunnett, of Dedham, and was a man of perfectly good character, and the prosecutrix was the wife of another

man in Mr. Dunnett's service, and also a man of exemplary character. Balls and the prisoner, so far as was known, were on good terms, though there was one little circumstance which had slightly ruffled the even tenor of their way. On Tuesday night, February 16th, Mrs. Balls was in her kitchen alone, her husband, who was a shepherd, being away at some farm attending to his duties. She had a lighted lamp in her hand, and hearing some noises in the road, out of curiosity opened the lobby door, and was about to go into her bedroom. The light she was carrying would show that someone was moving about the house, and also, of course, would show the position of the person who held the lamp. At the moment she entered the lobby she was struck in the face and

elsewhere several times with some shot. She became insensible from fright and shock, and remembered no more until her husband found her in the lobby bleeding from wounds in the face. It was evident, Mr. Jones continued, that the prisoner had had some drink that night, and that he got the gun, a double-barrelled one, from one his master's sheds. At about half-past eleven the same night, two or three minutes after the shots were fired, prisoner went to house of neighbour named Emeny, and when Alfred Emeny came out the prisoner said to him I have shot someone down at Balls'; go and look what I have done."

MR. E. BEARD, land agent and surveyor, Colchester, produced a plan of Mr. Balls' house, while evidence bearing out the opening statement was given by the prosecutrix, Alfred Emeny, and Robert Emeny. In cross examination both of the last two witnesses said they had never seen the prisoner worse for drink, and they had always found him a peaceable and quiet man.

FREDK. W. BALLS, the husband of the prosecutrix, said that on the Saturday previous to February 16th, he met the prisoner. They exchanged "good nights," the prisoner, however, adding an offensive remark. Mr. Balls asked, "What's the matter " and prisoner replied, "You and your wife have been scandalizing me and my wife." Witness added that on the night of February 16th he found that six panes of one of the windows were broken by the firing.

DR. JAMESON deposed that he found the prosecutrix suffering from nervous shock, and from three or four pellet wounds in her face.

JOHN HUBBARD stated that he met the prisoner on the roadway, and the latter alleged that Mrs. Balls had been raising scandal about him. MR. JONES: What did you say? WITNESS: I said, "Never mind, John, what the women say." [Laughter.]

Evidence was also given by Mr
Norman Dunnett and Police-sergeant Hatt,
who stated that he found 80 shot marks
on the frame the window in Mr. Balls'
house. There were also numerous marks
of pellets on the partition of the bedroom,
while the curtains of window were also
riddled. Witness produced the curtains,
and a piece of the partition. Policeconstable Ponder deposed to arresting the
prisoner in a chaff-house on Thursday at
Hill Farm, Dedham. Prisoner was in a very
dark place, and covered over with two
sacks, and in a very exhausted condition.

MR. MUIR, in addressing the jury, contended that no motive had been suggested for the prisoner to shoot with intent to murder anyone. If it had been the intention of the prisoner to murder anyone it was not likely he would have remained in the position he did when firing, but would have gone close up to the window, or at any rate fired as low as he could through the window, instead of high, for the pelletmarks were found the top of the partition and the window-frame, and some even on the ceiling. In fact, there was not the slightest intention on the part the prisoner to injure anyone but merely to alarm and scare, and possibly to do a little injury to the property. The Jury found the prisoner guilty only of unlawfully wounding the prosecutrix.

HIS LORDSHIP said the prisoner had given way to a malicious feeling and to drink, and it was very fortunate for him the injuries to the prosecutrix were not more serious. He (the Judge) should take into consideration the prisoner's excellent character, and should sentence him six months' hard labour.

Note: The trial took place just four days before the Diamond Jubilee celebrations.

From the Archives - Dedham in June 1897

Report on Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee celebrations in Dedham.

The British NEWSPAPER Archive Essex Standard -Saturday 26 June 1897.

Loyal Dedham celebrated the Jubilee by a series of Dinners, Teas, and Sports and an elaborate display of decorations etc. The fine morning was ushered in by the bells chiming a peal, whilst the Union Jack floated from the old church tower. At 1pm Messrs Saunders and Sons entertained about 70 of their employees, tenants, and friends to a most excellent repast at the Marlborough Head Hotel, the chair being occupied by the head of the firm, Mr. NAT SAUNDERS.

At 2pm a procession of school children, headed by the Ipswich Town Band, paraded up the street, and afterwards filed up to the church, where a short service was conducted by the Rev H. BIDDELL (curate-in-charge in the regrettable absence of the VICAR). The band was accompanied by the organ during the service and at its conclusion played the National Anthem.

The company afterwards adjourned to the old Grammar School playground, kindly lent by Mrs Penrose where a lengthened programme of athletic sports was carried out by a committee of the following gentlemen: - Dr. C. E. D. Malle, Mr, C. D. Malle, Rev. H. Biddell, Messrs. H. Evans, Percy Clover, and Mr. J. E. Saunders, jun.

After an interval the children adjourned to the new Grammar Schoolroom, where they and persons of over 65 years of age to a meat tea provided by a committee consisting of Re. H. Biddell, C. Fairhead, A. Thurston, E. Clover, A. Dunnage and W. Griffiths sec. Tea being ended the company again adjourned to the playground, and at the

conclusion of the sports dancing was kept till 9pm.

Also, at 1pm, Mr. Cottee gave a substantial repast to his employees at the Stud Farm, Lamb Corner.

Bustin' out all over

The longest day of the year is always a bittersweet point in my year, as although it means the height of summer is just around the corner, it also means the days are getting shorter again. But that's glass-half-empty thinking and there's too much going on to dwell on it.

The garden is already looking glorious with deep pink alstroemeria and shrubby Salvia microphylla 'Cerro Potosi' contrasting with deep blue, purple and ultramarine delphiniums towering to six feet.

Roses are peaking in every bed and border; there are spikes of richly coloured iris backed by the white racemes of wisteria, plus lilies and lupins, and alliums taking over from the last of the tulips. I've been exceptionally pleased with the display of tulips I planted late last autumn – delicate shades of pink, peach and apricot contrasted with the

blue Camassia leichtlinii and have been utterly glorious. But they're done now, and I've cut back the stems so the leaves blend better among the rest of the planting while they slowly die back. Once the foliage has yellowed, I can safely cut them back to ground level.

With so much abandon in the borders, plants can quickly collapse – as like as not the minute you turn your back on them – so make sure your stakes are in place. Tall plants like delphiniums, those with large flowers (poppies and peonies) and those with both (hello, dahlias) will almost always require additional support. If you haven't done this in April or May when everything is supposed to grow through tidily, it's time for some emergency staking. This can be more difficult as plants are bigger and taller, so inserting stakes and tying stems in can lead to damage, and the whole flipping thing snapping clean off. If it happens, just tidy it up with some sharp secateurs, pretend it didn't happen and move on. Match the strength of the stake or other support to the plant you want to restrain, but don't tie them in too firmly – let them move gently with the wind.

Gardening Notes

After months of planting and nurturing seeds in the greenhouse and the danger of frost well past, my less hardy plants – cucumbers, melons, tomatoes, zinnia and dahlia - can now be planted out. Of course, the particularly paranoid would never say never with the British weather, so keep some fleece handy in case temperatures drop in the early days of the month. If you have box hedging, now's a good time to trim it (sorry but if it needs a harder cut back, then you really should have done it last month). Prune when you're sure of a few dry days so the cut ends have chance to callus over and reduce the risk that box blight fungus, brought by wetter weather, will penetrate and damage your plants.

While I can whizz over the box with a hedge cutter or hand shears, it takes a more delicate touch on the chrysanthemums I'm trying to grow for the show. For exhibition flowers, I need one spectacular flower so will 'disbud' to

keep the main central flower bud, but remove all the side buds and shoots. In contrast, I want bushier plants with plenty of flowers in my borders, so will pinch out the leaders on these varieties to encourage more side shoots.

The 'June drop' reminds me to give some attention to fruit trees and bushes this month. The drop will take care of some fruit but for the healthiest fruit and better quality crop, it's worth thinning plums, pears and apples by hand. With fewer fruits, there's less demand on limited nutrients and everything should ripen well. You can find recommended spacing between fruit online: for instance, it's 10-15cm between pears and dessert apples.

I can also thin gooseberries while they're still unripe, removing every other fruit, so that what remains can swell to a good size, and sweeten in the sunshine, before harvesting them in July. With summer's arrival, I can also prune stone fruit – cherries, plums, greengages, peaches and nectarines – without the risk of silverleaf. As ever, there's plenty to do so bust out the tools (sorry) and get in the garden.
