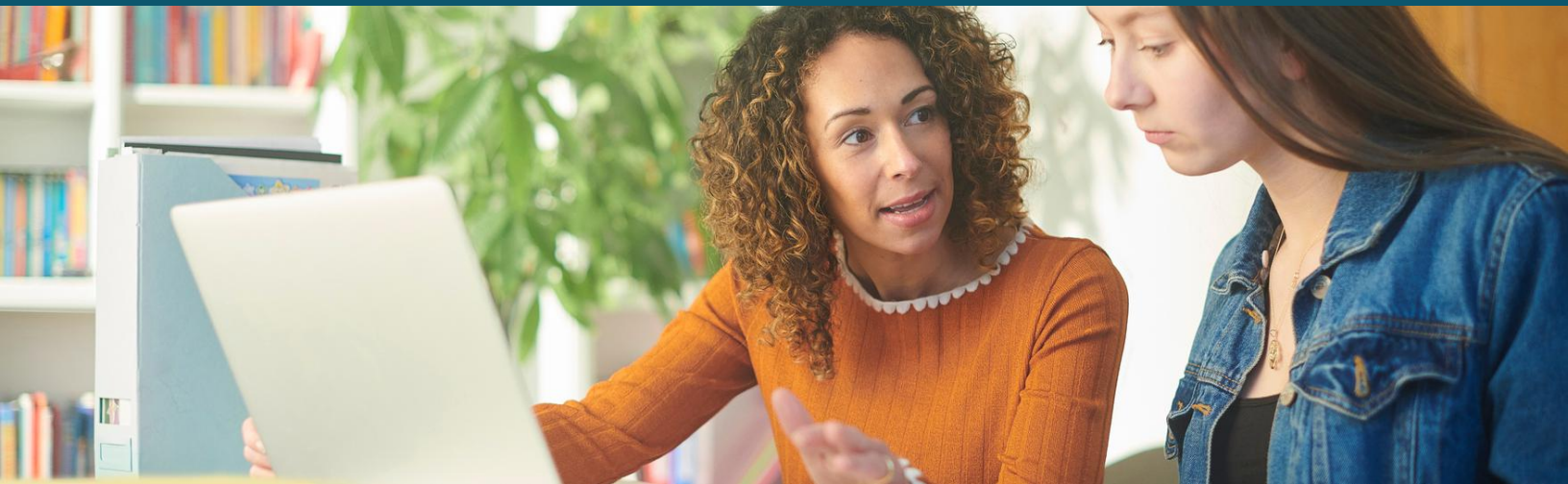

Pursuing a Program of Study expands post-high school opportunities by coupling classroom instruction with opportunities for internships, mentorship, earning industry credentials, and gaining college credit all before graduating high school. # Career & Technical Education



## CTE Programs of Study

Career & Technical Education (CTE) programs prepare secondary, post-secondary and adult students with academic, technical, and professional skills. CTE is split into various career clusters that relate to high demand careers (Learn more [here\\*](#)).

CTE Programs of Study are course work sequences that begin in high school and continue after graduation. DCPS currently offers 28 CTE Programs of Study across 17 schools. There are four additional areas of study at specific charter school locations.

About seven charter schools offer CTE Programs of Study. These courses introduce opportunities for students to earn **industry-recognized certifications**, obtain college credit and acquire work experience.

### Why do industry-recognized certifications matter?

- They verify a mastery of skills;
- They expose individuals to diverse career pathways;
- Employers regularly use certifications as criteria for hiring, promotion, and/or pay increases.

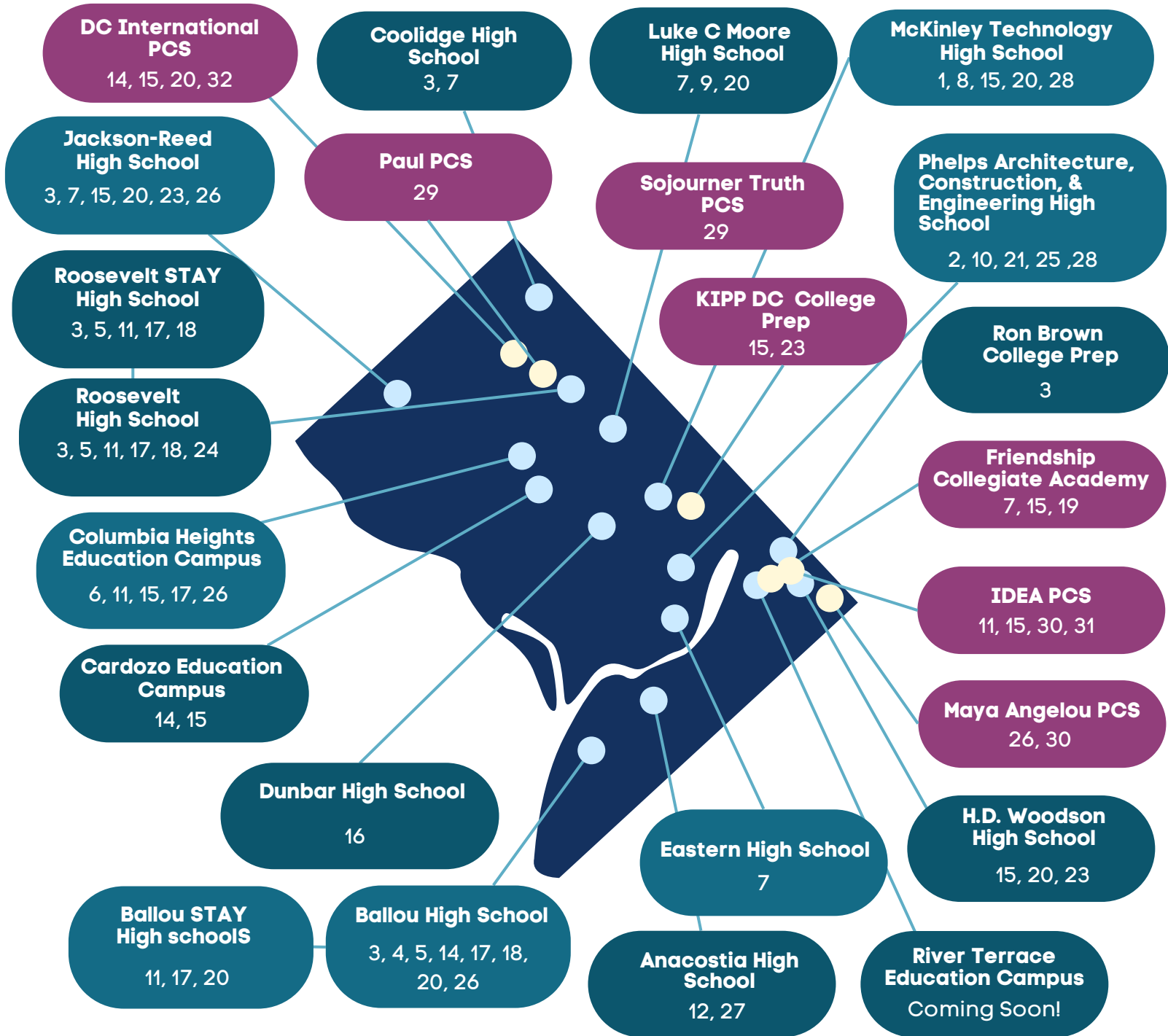

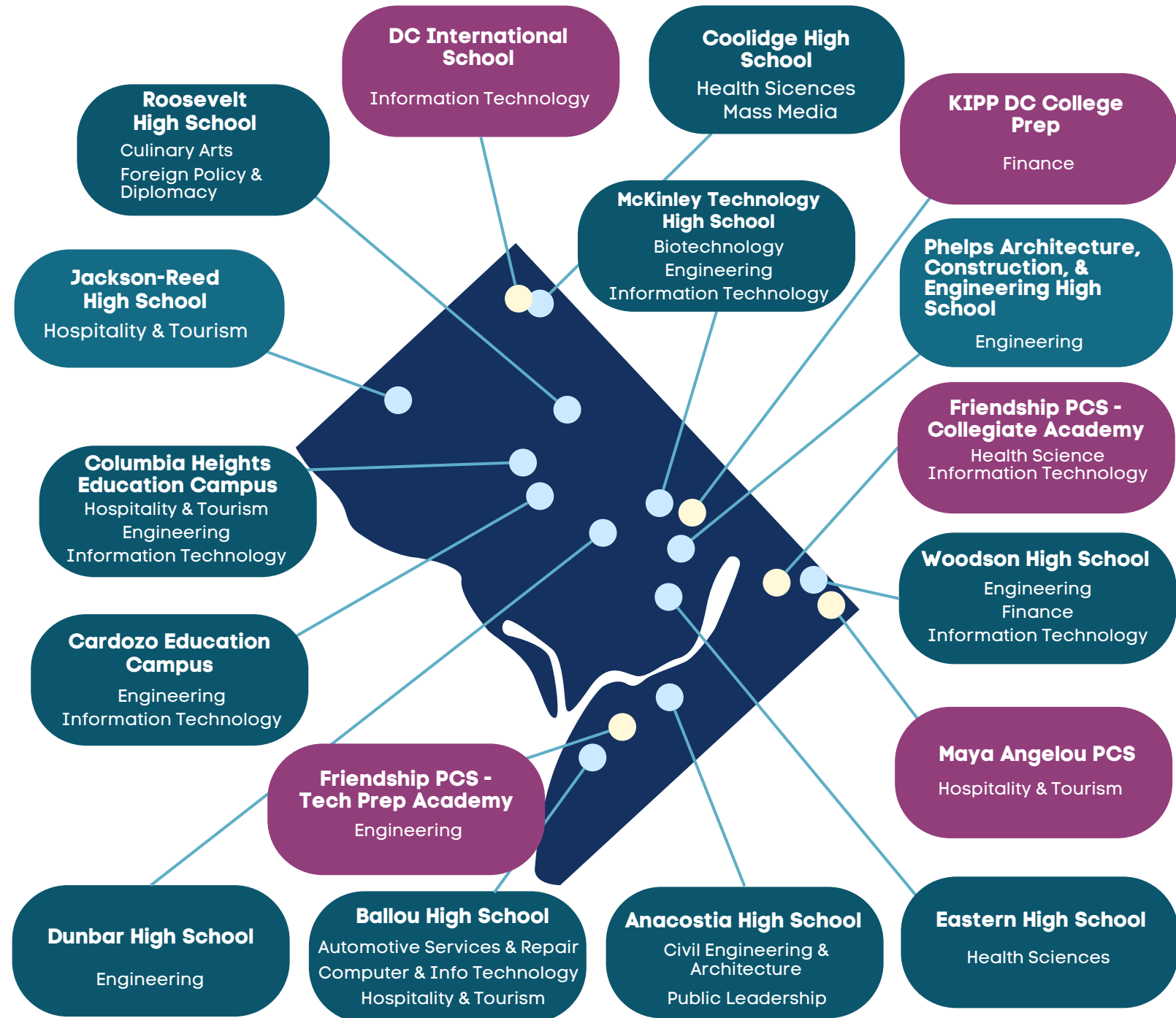

## What if I am not able to graduate high school after 4 or 5 years, are there programs in DC to help get me back on track?

Yes, there are numerous programs available to help you recover incomplete credit hours towards your high school diploma.

### Non-Traditional Pathways to Success:



### DCPS Opportunity Academies

Opportunity Academies give students that are behind in credits to graduate with a personalized learning program.

Opportunity Academies are available in the following schools:

- Ballou STAY High School
- Luke C. Moore High School
- Roosevelt STAY High School

These Opportunity Academies offer special education (SPED) services for students with disabilities. Students receiving SPED services on a certificate track program are not eligible to transfer.

High school students meeting the following criteria may be referred for a school-initiated transfer to an Opportunity Academy:

- 1.) 16 years of age or older
- 2.) 6 or more credits off track of graduation (based on year of 9th grade enrollment)

## High School Equivalent Certificates

If you are unable to graduate high school with a traditional diploma, there are multiple programs available to earn a high school equivalent certificate for future educational or employment opportunities.

### National External Diploma Program (NEDP)

 Online Program Available

The NEDP is a task-based education that qualifies as a High School level diploma when completed. This program focuses on nurturing your existing skills into college and career ready understandings of common core material, life skills, and career prep.

Adults can demonstrate high school-level skills through the completion of a portfolio including life skills and academic tasks.

### GED Prep Programs

 Online Program Available

The GED is a four-subject high school equivalency test that measures skills required by high schools and often requested by colleges and employers.

The GED focuses on:

- Mathematical Reasoning
- Reasoning through Language Arts
- Social Studies
- Science

The District of Columbia GED Program Office (GEDPO) is an official GED testing center under the GED Testing Service (GEDTS). GEDPO serves as the single source in DC for administering the GED. GEDPO offers GED testing in English and Spanish.
