Kenosha Public Library has four neighborhood locations, two outreach vehicles, and is opening a children's library in the summer of 2024. With a team of 84 dedicated team members, KPL serves as the resource library for the Kenosha County Library System. The Kenosha County Library System is comprised of KPL and Community Library, which has two locations nestled in Salem Lakes and Twin Lakes.

The Bookmobile, a 40 ft. rear engine bus vehicle acquired in 2004, provides mobile outreach services throughout the city and county of Kenosha.



Book Truck

Joining the Outreach fleet in 2019, a smaller book truck was added servicing a number of schools and assisted living facilities, delivering titles to homes, and appearing at events.





The Kenosha Public Library Board of Trustees seeks a consensus-building and community-oriented leader to be the organization's next Library Director. This individual will guide the Kenosha Public Library (KPL) and Kenosha County Library System (KCLS) into the future by continuing to embrace a diverse and growing population and offering relevant and first-rate spaces, collections, programs, and services. Building upon a solid history of community engagement, the new director will be an advocate for intellectual freedom and open access to information. They will also be a champion for ensuring our libraries remain a welcoming, safe and supportive environment for all members of the community, regardless of background or socio-economic status.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

To be successful in this position, you will need to be:

A TALENTED ADMINISTRATOR who:

- Embodies unquestionable integrity and high ethical standards.
- Has a proven track record of effective fiscal management and budgetary planning.
- Empowers staff with the authority, accountability, and resources to carry out delegated tasks.
- Oversees and develops additional alternative resources for services and facilities, including grants and corporate support.
- Demonstrates the ability to inspire and motivate others through compelling storytelling, vision casting, and leading by example.



AN EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATOR who:

- Provides timely, accurate, and relevant information on critical issues to the Board of Trustees, Library System members and partners, library staff, community partners, and the public.
- Communicates with community residents, library customers, and library staff with openness, responsiveness, and humility.
- Listens attentively with respect.
- Serves as an eloquent, passionate, and visible spokesperson advocating for the library, the services it provides, and the constituencies it serves.
- Demonstrates a sense of humor and joy in their work.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

To be successful in this position, you will need to be:

A STRATEGIC THINKER who:

- Demonstrates strong analytical skills and applies them to planning and problem solving.
- Considers all parties' interests and perspectives in creative problem-solving.
- Excels in collaborative short-range and long-range planning as well as plan implementation.
- Makes wise, fair, and timely decisions under pressure based on reliable data.
- Maintains an awareness of local, system, state, and national issues and trends that might have an impact on library services and funding.

A RESPECTED COMMUNITY PARTNER who:

- Collaborates with educational, cultural, social service, and corporate entities to enhance services to community residents.
- Demonstrates political acumen and effectiveness.
- Acts with a high level of integrity and develops relationships based on dependability and honesty.
- Models tact and sensitivity when engaged in the private and public arena.
- Actively invests in the growth and development of a thriving and healthy Kenosha community through personal relationships and participation in professional and civic organizations.



AN INNOVATIVE AND VISIONARY LEADER who:

- Knows how to identify, capture, and use trends and insights to inform the big picture vision and then translate it into step-by-step actions.
- Demonstrates a high degree of resilience, adaptability, and emotional intelligence, with the ability to thrive in a fast-paced evolving environment and navigate ambiguity with confidence.
- Creates and uses library spaces in ways that make them destinations for exploration, innovation, education, recreation, and relaxation.
- Collaborates with library staff in planning, implementing, and evaluating library services and strategies.
- Fosters an inclusive, transparent workplace with a strong shared sense of purpose and a cohesive organizational culture.







QUALIFIED CANDIDATES will have:

- Master's in Library Science, or equivalent, from an American Library Association (ALA) accredited institution.
- Eligible for a Grade 1 Wisconsin Library Certificate.
- Minimum of 5 years successful public library and/or system experience with staff management and development of strategic direction.
- Minimum of 7-10 years experience working in a public library.

HIGHLY QUALIFIED CANDIDATES will:

- Exhibit a strong and positive commitment to embracing social justice and racial equity, diversity and personnel practices that ensure that the KPL culture encourages individual opportunity and excellence, regardless of race, gender, individual or cultural differences
- Model intellectual curiosity and demonstrates a commitment to personal lifelong learning.





LOOKING AHEAD

THE NEW LIBRARY DIRECTOR will be expected to:

- Champion a culture of intellectual freedom, reading, lifelong learning and 21st century literacies.
- In collaboration with staff and community stakeholders, provide vision and leadership for the development and implementation of a new strategic plan.
- Foster an organizational culture that embodies and values equity, diversity, and inclusion, reflective of the communities we serve.
- Establish and nurture partnerships with the school district, local organizations, businesses, and community stakeholders to make a positive impact on the lives of local residents.
- In partnership with the Kenosha Public Library Foundation, Friends of the Kenosha Public Library, and other stakeholders, advocate for funding necessary for enhancing the library's capacity to meet contemporary needs.

COMPENSATION

The Kenosha Public Library will offer an attractive and competitive salary, negotiable from \$113,900 commensurate with the qualifications and experience of the selected candidate.

In addition, a generous benefits package will be provided that includes annually:

- 96 hours of vacation with an increase to 136 total hours after one year of employment.
- 96 hours sick time, accrued monthly
- 10 paid holidays
- 4 days Personal Time Off, with half allocated on January 1 and July 1 each year
- Employer paid life insurance
- Participation in the Wisconsin Retirement System with an employer match of mandatory contribution.

THE SELECTION PROCESS

The selection process for the Library Director position is being led by a Search Committee made up of Board President Nancy Humphrey, Vice President Atifa Robinson, Former Board President Georgia Owens, Assistant Library Director Brandi Cummings, Business Manager Michelle Tucker and City of Kenosha Human Resources Director Samanthan Schuirmann.

Initial review and evaluation of candidates will be conducted by the Search Committee upon receipt of completed materials.

The Screening Interviews will be conducted by the Search Committee using Zoom or similar technology. It is anticipated that each interview will last at least 45-50 minutes. These are expected to take place in early July.

The final interview process will be conducted onsite in Kenosha, Wisconsin. It is anticipated that the final interview will include a variety of activities held over two days, which will include tours of all libraries, meet and greet sessions with library staff and community stakeholders, and a formal interview with the full Board of Trustees.

It is the intent of the Board of Trustees to keep the names of the applicants confidential. However, the names of the finalists will be released a few days prior to the final interviews. The following timeline, subject to change, has been established:
