Our History


Pembroke College Oxford, founded in 1624, is an inspirational venue right in the heart of Oxford, which integrates award-winning modern architecture with beautiful traditional buildings. There is nowhere quite as impressive or cost-effective as our state-of-the-art development.

Pembroke expanded its footprint in April 2013. The 'Rokos Quad' was officially opened by HRH The Duke of Kent KG, marking the formal unveiling of a new quadrangle and the first new foot bridge in the heart of Oxford for nearly 100 years.

As well as superb en-suite student accommodation, the new buildings provide state-of-the-art meeting rooms, a multipurpose auditorium seating up to 170, outdoor social spaces and a café.

The Pichette Auditorium

The beautifully crafted, oak-panelled Pichette Auditorium is a cleverly designed, flexible space with built-in state-of-the-art AV facilities and excellent acoustics. Removable loose seating and a sectionable balcony area allow the space to feel intimate enough for groups as small as 30-50, as well as spacious enough for larger groups all the way up to the maximum capacity of 170.

Fully retractable raked seating transforms the room from a full theatre to a blank canvas. A partially retractable wall opens into a side room for increased space. Accessible from the loading bay for large kit deliveries. There is no more flexible an auditorium than the Pichette.

Auditorium Foyer

A convenient registration and refreshment break out space directly outside the Pichette Auditorium. Can also be used for stand-alone drinks receptions. French doors open onto the Rokos Quad offering an open-air option for guests to enjoy in fine weather.

The Foyer also boasts a 'Box Office', which is the perfect location for either registration or a cloakroom.

Farthings Café

Farthings Café is open Monday - Friday, and offers a delightful casual area for guests to break out in between sessions, sit with some work, relax or meet other delegates over a cappucino. The space can also be used in evenings and weekends as a private exhibition space/poster board sessions or for drinks receptions, and works well in conjunction with the Foyer for larger events.

The Harold Lee Room

Accessed over a charming footbridge, and often described as 'the best meeting room in Oxford', The Harold Lee Room is a prestigious location for high-level meetings and drinks receptions. The dual aspect floor-to-ceiling windows offer picture-perfect views looking back over the traditional Chapel Quad and old City Wall, and forward over the modern Rokos Quad.

A private terrace facing the famously beautiful neighbouring Campion Hall creates a welcome break out for daytime refreshments or drinks on a fine evening.

The in-built wirelessly-connected projector and screen discreetly tucks away into the ceiling when not required, meaning this space is also perfect for a drinks reception or dinner.

The Henderson Seminar Rooms

Pembroke Hall

Built in 1848 and set in Chapel Quad, Pembroke Hall is a fine example of early Victorian Gothic architecture boasting a small cupola, a roof built to the hammerbeam design and a large tower with a niche holding a statue of King James I who granted the College its Foundation Charter in 1624.

With its fine stained glass windows, chimney piece of Painswick stone and portraits of the founders, other benefactors and former Masters of the College, dining in Pembroke's Hall is a richly memorable experience—invite your guests to soak up the candle-lit atmosphere of old Oxford tradition.

The tables in the Hall can be adjusted to suit your numbers with a maximum capacity of 150 guests in formal banquet style (top right image), or 168 guests in "student style" (bottom right image).

Whether you are looking for a relaxed informal dinner in spectacular surroundings or a formal banquet experience, look no further...Pembroke Hall is therefore the perfect venue to meet all your dining needs.



Finding Us


We're located on Pembroke Square just off St Aldates in central Oxford. Oxford has excellent road and rail links, and is not far from major airports.

By Rail

Oxford Station is well-connected by rail to most major UK cities. For information on train times and operators, please consult the National Rail website. From Oxford Station it is a 10 minute walk to Pembroke College. There is a good taxi service from the station, and numerous buses go to St Aldates (the road closest to College).

By Coach/Bus

There are excellent and frequent coach services (the Oxford Tube) from central London to Oxford. The Oxford Tube runs 24 hours a day, and stops outside St Aldates when coming from London. Pembroke College is just across the street. Please check National Express for coaches from other UK cities.

By Car

Parking in Oxford is limited, so we recommend using the five <u>Park and Ride</u> car parks, located on Oxford's ring road, which are all well-connected by bus to the centre. Alternatively, there is an underground car park in the <u>Westgate Shopping Centre</u>, just over 5 minutes walk from College. Please note that many of Oxford's central streets (including St Aldates, next to College) are closed to traffic during the daytime from 7.30am-6.30pm.

By Air

Pembroke's closest major airport is London Heathrow - <u>airline buses</u> go directly to Gloucester Green bus station. Oxford also has a small airport (Kidlington - OXF) which flies to a number of national and European destinations.
