THE FOUNDATION

Objective:

The Diocesan Youth Department is dedicated to supporting the growth and spiritual development of youth across the Diocese. Coming out of the COVID-19 pandemic and Hurricane Dorian, the department has placed emphasis on rebuilding and rejuvenating youth ministry through leadership, vision, and engagement.

Membership:

Of the approximately 26 churches in our Diocese, 15 report active youth (with increases in AYA members) and/or children's ministries.

Vision:

We seek to make our parishes and communities more receptive to and inclusive of young people while cultivating their faith in God. We seek to respond to the Holy Spirit as young Anglicans, making use of our time, talent, and treasure for the advancement of the church, our communities, and the world.

Mission:


The mission of the Anglican Diocesan Youth Department is to acknowledge the worth and inherent value of young people.

Goal:

To empower and equip Youth Ministry within the Diocese of The Bahamas and the Turks and Caicos Islands to live out their faith actively and meaningfully. Our aim is to foster their inclusion in parish life, nurturing their spiritual and character growth, and supporting their development as responsible, engaged, and faithful individuals.

Structure (Modus Operandi):

Implemented through Parish Youth Councils (PYC) and diocesan networks.



YEAR IN REVIEW

The Strategy

The DYD continues its ambitious targets with adjustments to better serve the youth of the Diocese and those who support them. Our events this year were in large part guided by the Diocesan Theme 2025: "Family Matters: Strengthening Our Homes, Strengthening Our Faith," inspired by Joshua 24:15. At the same time, our overall work is informed by Youth Advocates, the National Development Plan: Vision 2040, and developing partnerships.

Targets:

- Integrate goals and policies into youth ministry at the diocesan and parish levels.
- Expand virtual platforms (website, YouTube, LinkedIn) for inclusive engagement.
- Encourage churches to maintain consistent and diverse digital content.
- Celebrate youth leader achievements.
- Create and distribute relevant ministry resources.
- Strengthen outreach and support to TCI and Family Islands.
- Provide training and certification to youth leaders.
- Promote social awareness campaigns (Pastoral Care, Tamar Project/Family Violence Prevention, Mental Health, Suicide Prevention, Blood Drives and other related campaigns). By focusing on these targets, the DYD hopes to make a holistic and lasting impact on the lives of youth and leaders across the Diocese.

Initiatives 2024–2025

- Strategic Planning: The DYD Strategic Plan, first commissioned by Mrs. Tiffany Sweeting and prepared by Mr. John Darville, continues to guide development. The current review includes educational sector leaders and plans to bring in family and home support as a new pillar.
- **Digital Growth**: YouTube and LinkedIn added to social platforms, broadening engagement especially with the 30+ age group.
- **Publication Ministry**: *Via Advent* was digitised, reaching 286 youth and 40 parents/adults.
- Parish Visits: Parish youth groups engaged through sessions on communication, music, fellowship, and guest speakers.
- Youth Manuals: Completed and ready for digital release in December 2025.
- Divisions: Archdeaconries subdivided to encourage stronger bonds and support.
- Youth Advocates Seminar: A hybrid event held August 2–23, 2025. Workshops included child protection, mental health, bible study, Youth mentorship programs, parent communication and financial planning. Plans are underway to duplicate this event for the youth (13-25 years).

- DYD Youth Month (September): Featured annual Back-to-School Services and Anniversary Celebration Services across The Diocese (September 28).
- **DYD Advocacy Campaigns**: Launching the first annual Diocesan Youth-in-Service Day on Saturday, 1st November 2025.
- Fundraiser: A Walk-a-thon was held in May to raise funds for the DYD Ha
- Track & Field Event: The Diocesan Youth Department Alpheus "Hawk" Finlayson Track and Field Classic 2025: Family Edition (October 4, 2025), honouring Roscow Davies and family for contributions in sports and the church.
- Pastoral Care: Ladies of Virtue Youth Manual Training, Family Island visits with the Prayer and Healing Ministry, Inagua, Eleuthera, Bimini, Exuma
- Youth Council: Meets every other month via Zoom. Topics include best practices, event planning, and parish needs.
- Parish Event: Ignition, ACW Leadership Seminar, Hope for Kids Conference, Ladies of Virtue, Ladies of Virtues, The Rose Ministry Young Ladies Retreat, Youth Recognition Vacation Bible School
- Community Advocacy Campaigns: Disability Empowerment Month Dollar Day.

 Partnered with the Public Hospital Authority for suicide prevention | Bosses & Brunch
- National Youth Month (October): Combined Youth (CYM/AYA/Joshua etc) (within Divisions) to meet every Friday in October. Meeting themes under consideration; Fellowship, Worship, and Prayer and Healing.
- **Provincial Commission**: Held the 24th annual PYC meeting virtually in March. Youth Forum scheduled for September 28, 2025.

Training & Development

- National Youth Leaders Certification (16 weeks): Focused on adolescent development and safeguarding.
- Safeguarding Certification: Completed through the Ministry of Youth, Sports and Culture.
- Youth Advocates' Seminar: A hybrid event held August 2–23, 2025. Workshops included training in mental health, PCM Parenting communication module, bible study, Youth mentorship programs, parent communication, financial literacy PCM Parenting module, DYD Manual, Power Up!!, and child protection. Supported by Pastoral Care, corporate sponsors, and NGOs.
- Al Tools: To harness GPT, Al automation, and Al agent technologies to grow youth ministry, boost productivity, and increase our community drive.
- Additional training opportunities will be scheduled through government partnerships and other diocesan ministry programs.



CHALLENGES ENCOUNTERED

ISSUES AFFECTING MINISTRY

- Broken Communication Network: Youth Leaders, Church Administrators, Clergy, Vestries and parishioners are not aware of access points for youth impacting programs both by our churches and this office. Revamping communication channels like What's App groups and social media platforms toward an information delivery and marketing campaign and for networking events is in the planning phase.
- Integration with Parish Ministry: Youth work often remains isolated. Stronger alignment is needed between youth and wider parish life.
- **Funding Limitations:** Activities remain limited by central funding. Communication has stated with strategic corporations to establish long-term partnerships.
- Gender Imbalance in Leadership: Parish youth officers are predominantly female.
- Succession Planning & Unclear Organisational Structures: Parish Youth Ministry will likely be in a transitional leadership phase within the next few years. Incorporating dissemination of this information through the proposed DYD Information and Marketing campaign.

GOALS FOR THE UPCOMING YEAR

INITIATIVES FOR 2026 AND BEYOND

- Establish a Digital Youth Resource Library as a hub for training and ministry materials.
- Host Bi-Annual Leadership Boot Camps to certify youth leaders in ministry, safeguarding, conflict resolution and lay counselling.
- Expand DYD Seminars to include youth as participants.
- Launch Bi-Annual Sports Clinics across Family Islands.
- Strengthen Holistic Health Advocacy, focusing on major issues reported by the Public Health Authority (PHA). This year mental health and low blood supplies were top of the list. Partnering with the Hospital Chaplaincy to create an annual Blood Drive campaign and strengthen community impact in the medical field.
- Build a **DYD Support Network**, reconnecting and connecting former leaders and parents across The Diocese with current and out of parish youth advocates.
- Re-establish a Mobile Youth Ministry Unit for Family Islands.
- Create new **programming for ages 25–35**, offering relevant training, growth and community systems.
- Relaunch **Educational Competitions**, starting with **Speech**, in the framework of Toast Masters.
- Expand combined Youth Group **Meetings by Division** concept to TCI and The Family Islands.
- Incorporate family-style parenting workshops and support groups.
- Partnering with the Hospital Chaplaincy to create an annual **Blood Drive** campaign and strengthen community impact in the medical field.

- Anniversary Service September 27, 2026.
- Combined Youth Group Meetings by Division October 2026.
- DYD Hawk Classic- October 31, 2026.

- Reestablish the **Archdeaconry Youth Commission** to support diocesan events.
- Support parish-led programs in arts, clubs, and emotional intelligence.
- Partner with Pastoral Care Ministries for youth-focused programs in prayer, healing, mentorship, and family life.
- Strengthen the Provincial Youth Commission with:
 - o Virtual provincial worship events.
 - O Shared digital resource repository.
 - O Annual youth exchange.
 - o Standard assessmenttoolsformeasuringimpact.
 - o Province-wide mentalhealthawarenessinitiative(May2026).

CLOSING REMARKS


