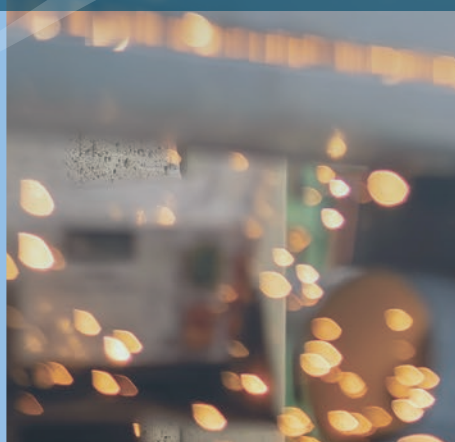

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CAREERLINK PROGRAM AT JOHN SEPTIMUS ROE ACS

As part of the JSRACS CareerLink program,
our students spend every Tuesday off-campus
either studying for a certificate or on
work placement with a host employer.

There are two options for the CareerLink program:

OPTION 1

VET Course in Certificate II, III or IV
+
Work placement during the exam break blocks
(and term time at the conclusion of the course)

or

OPTION 2

No VET course.
Work placement only each Tuesday
and block placement during exam breaks



CERTIFICATE II IN ANIMAL CARE

Course duration: 3 terms

Training provider: Applied Vocational Training (AVT) @ Landsdale Farm
71 Evandale Road, Darch

This course will provide you with the knowledge and skill to approach, handle and care for a range of companion and farm animals. Students learn workplace safety in the animal care industry and the fundamentals of handling and approaching animals. Important aspects of animal care are taught, including feeding practices, first aid, and animal behaviour. Students must be prepared to work outdoors.

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected to be completed.
- Students are to make their own way to Landsdale Farm on Tuesdays.
- This course can be studied in either Year 11 or Year 12.
- Safety apparel is required for this course (e.g., steel cap boots, gloves and sun protection).

CERTIFICATE II IN AUTOMOTIVE VOCATIONAL PREPARATION

Course duration: 3 terms
Training provider: Automotive Institute of Technology
@ Motor Trades Association (MTA)
253 Balcatta Road, Balcatta

This qualification will introduce you to the practical skills and knowledge used in the automotive trades. You will learn a broad range of skills to help you decide which area of automotive you wish to follow.

Successful completion of this qualification provides you with the opportunity to enter an apprenticeship to become an Automotive Light or Heavy Vehicle Mechanic or Automotive Electrician.

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected.
- Safety apparel is required for this course (e.g., steel cap boots).
- Please note: this course has limited places and entry is competitive.
- This course can be studied in either Yr 11 or Yr 12. If students miss out in Yr 11, they can complete a year of work placement to gain valuable experience and reapply for the course in Yr 12.

CERTIFICATE II IN BUILDING AND CONSTRUCTION

Course duration: 2 years

Training provider: North Metropolitan TAFE Balga,
Loxwood Road, Balga

This course will provide you with the practical skills and knowledge required to work in the building and construction industry. You will learn to use hand and power tools, construct wall frames, install flooring, interpret plans, measure and calculate the right amount of materials for the job, levelling operations, work with scaffolding safely at heights, and workplace health and safety.

Successful completion of this course may be credited towards a pathway in an apprenticeship program.

- 110 hours of work placement in total over 2 years is mandated for this course.
- During work placement, students must be prepared to travel to various work sites across the metro area early in the morning (parent commitment component).
- Safety apparel is required for this course (e.g., steel cap boots).

It includes routine procedural, clerical, administrative or operational tasks requiring technology and business skills. Future employment roles include accounts and record keeping, administrative support and customer service.

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected to be completed.
- Students are to make their own way to AWA on Tuesdays.
- This course can be studied in either Yr 11 or Yr 12.

This qualification prepares you to carry out a mix of specialist and moderately complex administrative or operational tasks that require self-development skills. Future employment roles involving some supervisory responsibilities include small business management, project officer, marketing, advertising, and customer service advisor.

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected to be completed.
- Students are to make their own way to AWA on Tuesdays.
- This course can be studied in either Yr 11 or Yr 12.
- This course will provide you with an educational pathway into university as completion of a Certificate IV is indicative of a 70 ATAR score. Please see university enrolment requirements for the course you are interested in applying for (e.g., some universities expect an A grade in General English for this admissions pathway).

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected to be completed.
- Students are to make their own way to FEC on Tuesdays.

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected to be completed.
- Students are to make their own way to FEC on Tuesdays.
- Due to the sensitive subject matter involved in this course, only students who display maturity and work readiness will be considered.
- This course will provide you with an educational pathway into university as completion of a Certificate IV is indicative of a 70 ATAR score. Please see university enrolment requirements for the course you are interested in applying for (e.g., some universities expect an A grade in General English for this admissions pathway).

Course duration: 3 terms
Training provider: Fremantle Education Centre (FEC)
West Perth annexe
City West & Lotteries House, 2 Delhi St, West Perth

This qualification is for those with a genuine interest and passion for the care and education of children up to the age of five years. You'll learn how to interact and foster the development of children, supporting their wellbeing and learning while working within legal requirements.

Attributes you will need for this course include:

- enjoy working with children and able to relate well to them
 - enthusiastic, tactful, patient and a sense of humour
 - calm, alert, observant and active
 - problem-solving skills with the ability to communicate simply and clearly
 - good fitness level to be able to lift children and childcare equipment.
- 160 hours of work placement is mandated for this qualification.
 - Students are to make their own way to FEC West Perth each Tuesday.
 - Exam breaks will be used for work placement, as well as some term time. Holidays may be used to catch up on any missed hours (negotiated with host employer).
 - This course can be studied in either Yr 11 or Yr 12.
 - Please note: current influenza vaccinations are required for work placement and possible police clearance .

This training program will provide you with the foundation practical skills and theory knowledge required in electrical installation and servicing. You will learn a broad range of skills to help you decide if you wish to follow the electrical pathway, such as electrical wiring and terminations, electrical theory, hand and power tools and using electrical diagrams.

Successful completion of this course may be credited towards a pathway in an apprenticeship program or to other trade areas such as data communications, security and electronic servicing.

- Pre-requisite: Strong score in the electrical apprentice Readiness Assessment (RA) test and aptitude in Mathematics is required for this course.
- 150 hours of work placement in total over 2 years is mandated for this course.
- During work placement, students must be prepared to travel to various work sites across the metro area early in the morning (parent commitment component).
- Students are to make their own way to CET Joondalup on Tuesdays.
- Safety apparel is required for this course (e.g., steel cap boots).

You will implement the latest health, fitness, and training principles into your programs, as well as learn nutritional information to strengthen your ability when conducting fitness tests and appraisals with your clients.

Future employment opportunities include: Gym Instructor, Fitness Coach, Group Exercise Instructor, Fitness Manager.

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected to be completed.
- Students are to make their own way to Diamond Fitness Osborne Park on Tuesdays.
- Students who successfully complete this course in Year 11 and show suitable aptitude will be considered for the Certificate IV in Fitness in Year 12.

This qualification is required in order to become a Personal Trainer and is specifically for those students interested in helping others achieve their health and fitness goals.

Business is a key focus, where you will learn how to set up and prepare for your own small business and learn basic marketing and sales skills necessary to acquire clients.

- Pre-requisite: Certificate III in Fitness.
- Students are to make their own way to Diamond Fitness Osborne Park on Tuesdays.
- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected.
- This course will provide you with an educational pathway into university as completion of a Certificate IV is indicative of a 70 ATAR score. Please see university enrolment requirements for the course you are interested in applying for (e.g., some universities expect an A grade in General English for this admissions pathway).

Level 1/100 Stirling Street, Perth

This course is suitable for people who are naturally caring and wish to pursue a career in the practical health care environment. It focuses on helping people with their activities of daily living. Future employment opportunities include Assistant in Nursing (AIN), Disability Support Worker and Personal Care Assistant (PCA).

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is expected. Placements are conducted in Aged Care facilities, depending on industry availability.
- Students are to make their own way to Health Science Hub (HSH) Perth each Tuesday.
- Students are required to purchase HSH scrubs (approx. \$80), as well as the HSH Medic Kit (approx. \$170).
- This course can be studied in either Yr 11 or Yr 12.
- Please note current influenza vaccinations are required for work placement and possible police clearances.

This pre-apprenticeship will provide you with practical skills and knowledge required for a career in the plumbing and servicing industry. You will learn skills in basic plumbing, how to weld using oxy-acetylene and how to cut and join sheet metal.

Successful completion of this course may be credited towards a pathway in an apprenticeship program.

- 150 hours of work placement in total over 2 years is mandated for this course.
- Exam breaks will be used for work placement, as well as some term time. Holidays may be used to catch up on any missed hours (negotiated with host employer).
- During work placement, students must be prepared to travel to various work sites early in the morning (parent commitment component).
- Safety apparel is required for this course (e.g., steel cap boots).
- Please note: Hepatitis A & B immunisations are recommended.

This qualification will provide you with foundational knowledge in how the human body works, how disease can prevent normal functioning, as well as the basics of medication management. You will also learn how to research, reference, and report at university level so that you will have an advantage moving into studying a bachelor's degree.

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is to be completed.
- Students are to make their own way to Health Science Hub (HSH) at Murdoch University each Tuesday.
- Students are required to purchase an HSH polo top (approx. \$50).
- This course will provide you with an educational pathway into university as completion of a Certificate IV is indicative of a 70 ATAR score. Please see university enrolment requirements for the course you are interested in applying for (e.g., some universities expect an A grade in General English for this admissions pathway).
- Please note current influenza vaccinations are required for work placement and possible police clearance.

This qualification provides a pathway to work as a retail sales consultant in any business that sells beauty or cosmetic products and services. This can include beauty and hairdressing salons, retail outlets and department stores. Make-up application and ear piercing are also components of this course.

- At least 55 hours of work placement per semester is to be completed.
- Students are to make their own way to North Metropolitan TAFE Joondalup on Tuesdays.
- Students are required to purchase the TAFE make-up and brush kit (approx. \$400) as well as the TAFE uniform for beauty students (approx. \$100).
- This course can be studied in conjunction with Certificate II in Salon Assistant (each course is offered every second year, on a rotating basis).
